BANKS HILL LIKELY TO PREP IN U.S.

Banks Hill (GB) (Danehill) could prep for the Oct. 26 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf with a run in the Sept. 28 GI Flower Bowl

Invitational at Belmont or in the Oct. 5 GI Yellow Ribbon at Santa Anita. The four-year-old filly parlayed an impressive 5 1/2-length victory in last year's Filly and Mare Turf at Belmont to an Eclipse Award as the top turf mare in the U.S. Of a possible Flower Bowl start, Banks Hill's trainer Andre Fabre told the *Daily Racing Form*, "It's first choice because she knows the course. She's doing fine. Her last two races were pretty good." In her most recent start, Banks Hill ran second behind Rock of Gibraltar in the Sept. 8 G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp.

ZAFEEN HEADS MILL REEF FIELD

Zafeen (Fr) (Zafonic) will start as the likely favourite in today's G2 Mill Reef S. at Newbury after posting a career-best effort when a three-parts of a length second to Elusive City in the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville last time out Aug. 25. He started his season by filling the runner-up berth in a Salisbury maiden July 5 before returning to the same track for his only win July 26.

Cassis (Danzig) started her racing life with victory at Lingfield June 29, but then went straight to pattern company and finished second in the G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket July 9. Her only other racecourse appearance yielded a sixth-place finish in the G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh Aug. 11, but she had a legitimate excuse for that performance as she didn't take the journey to Ireland well. The bay filly has solid claims if fully recovered. **Miguel Cervantes** (Danzig) is the Ballydoyle representative and the July 27 Curragh maiden winner merits the utmost respect.

GRAEME HALL TO WINDING OAKS Multiple graded stakes winner **Graeme Hall** (Dehere--Win Crafty Lady, by Crafty Prospector) will take up stud duties next season at Eugene and Laura Melnyk's Winding Oaks Farm near Ocala, Florida, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The five-year-old stallion captured the GII Arkansas Derby and GII Jim Dandy S. as a three-year-old. He won last year's GII Eclipse H. and GIII Stuyvesant H. and was second in the GI Cigar Mile H. On the board in 15 of 22 starts, Graeme Hall won seven races and earned \$1,147,441. He will stand his first season at stud for a fee of \$7,500. The Melnyks purchased the former 1,100-acre Mockingbird Farm last year and renamed the historic property Winding Oaks.

COLTS SHARE TOP BILLING AT KEENELAND Two colts shared the top price of \$60,000 at yesterday's session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington. Hip number 3350, a son of Partner's Hero out of the Raise a Bid mare Out of a Cannon, brought that session-topping bid. Consigned by Charlton, as agent for Welcome Here Farm, the bay yearling was purchased by Halvorson Bloodstock. Hip number 3530, a gray colt by Fantastic Fellow--Cliff Lake (Mining), also brought \$60,000. Consigned by Four Star Sales, agent, the yearling was purchased by Von Flew. Through 10 sessions, the average sale price is \$81,180--down 23 percent from the \$105,234 recorded during the same period last year. The median fell one percent, from \$37,500 a year ago to \$37,000 this year. The cumulative buy-back rate of 23 percent is down 18 percent from a year ago. The 13-day sale runs through Saturday. Bidding begins at 10 a.m. daily.

Saratoga Sets Purse Records:

Saratoga set records at its recently completed 2002 meeting, paying out its highest daily average purses and average overnight purses. Average daily purses rose 2.83 percent to \$615,711, and the average overnight (per race) was \$42,751, a 4.81 rise from last year's record. "Saratoga is the standard bearer for the industry," said Mike Lakow, racing secretary and handicapper for the New York Racing Association. "It is the best meet around and its purses should reflect that quality."

Ariel Smith Suspended:

Monday wasn't a very good day for 1999 Eclipse Award-winning apprentice jockey Ariel Smith. Thursday got even worse. On Monday, Smith's horse Wicklow Miracle came over and impeded Jeremy Beasley's horse Sorrento Sara in the fifth race at Calder. Smith's horse was disqualified from first to last. On the way back to the jock's room, according to state steward Walter Blum, Smith took his helmet and hit Beasley over the head from behind, causing a concussion and opening a wound that required eight staples. Yesterday, Calder stewards suspended Smith seven days for the riding infraction, plus another 20 days for an altercation after the race. While the stewards were going over the incidents with Smith, the jockey got perturbed, walked out of the hearing, slammed a door through a wall, and ripped a water cooler out of the wall in the jock's room. In addition to the 27 days suspension, the stewards fined Smith \$1,000 for the wall, water cooler and beligerence to racing officials. They also order Smith to pay all of Beasley's medical bills.

2001 Breeding Statistics Released:

In statistics released yesterday, The Jockey Club reported that 4,445 stallions covered 63,793 mares in North America last year. Live foal reports have been filed on 34,605 foals of 2002, as of Sept. 9. The statistics are approximately 90 percent complete. "We provide these statistics as a service to the industry, but their completeness depends entirely upon the cooperation of every breeder," explained The Jockey Club's vice president of registration services Matt Iuliano. "Nevertheless, the returns filed on time support our earlier projection of 35,600 registered foals of 2002." Reflecting the impact of Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome during the spring of 2001, Kentucky suffered a 14.6-percent decline in live foals. Last year, the state had a reported 13,693 live foals of 2001. This year, the number is 11,697 foals of 2002. A complete listing of the 2001 breeding statistics can be viewed at home.jockeyclub.com.

FORMER TATTERSALLS CHAIRMAN MAHONY DEAD

Denis Mahony, former Chairman and a Director of Tattersalls (Ireland), died Wednesday. He was 65. Mahony was named a director of Ballsbridge Tattersalls in 1979 before being promoted to Chairman of Tattersalls (Ireland) in 1986 after the firm moved to its present location at Fairyhouse. Mahony stepped down after 13 years at that post in 1999 and named his son, Edmond, as his successor. The funeral will take place this Saturday at 3:30 p.m. at St. Keenan's Church, Duleek, Co. Meath, with the burial following at Kenstown Cemetery.

YAVANA'S MAY TARGET TORONTO The Mark Johnston trained **Yavana's Pace (Ire)** (Accordion {Ire}, who became the oldest horse to win a G1 race in Europe when successful in the Credit Suisse Private Banking Pokal at Cologne Aug. 11, may join stablemate **Zindabad (Fr)** (Shirley Heights {GB}) in the G1 Canadian International at Woodbine later this month if he satisfies connections with his performance in Sunday's G1 Preis von Europa at Cologne. If the 10-year-old gelding does take the Canadian route, he will travel on Tuesday, but Zindabad--third to Golan (Ire) and Nayef (USA) in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 27--starts his journey today. "As long as he runs well in Germany, I'm happy to let him join Zindabad in Canada, and we have a plane on standby," Johnston told *Racing Post*. "His win in Cologne was richly deserved following five seconds in G1 races, and when finishing fifth in the Prix Gladiateur at Longchamp he was as game as ever, but didn't enjoy the ground." Of Zindabad, who was disqualified in last year's G1 Canadian International, Johnston added, "If he runs well, there is the question of the Breeders' Cup Turf or the Japan Cup. Essentially, he's a horse that's best kept fresh, and last season I regretted taking the Japan route with him. Against that, while I want to keep him fresh for the Sheema Classic in Dubai next year, his profile on the stallion market would get a huge boost if he won in Canada."

NEXT DESERT OUT FOR SEASON

Germany's star sophomore **Next Desert (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}) is out of this year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 6 and will not race again this season. The colt has not run since winning the G1 BMW Deutsches Derby (German Derby) at Hamburg July 7. "He has had a slight fetlock problem and, although it's not serious, we're giving him a good break to get over it," trainer Andreas Schutz told *Racing Post*. "He's leaving the yard this week and will spend the winter at his owner's stud, but will be back in training next year." Schutz, who also saddled **Salve Regina (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) to finish second to Next Desert in the German Derby, revealed plans for the G1 Preis der Diana winner: "The distance of Sunday's Group 1 Preis von Europa at Cologne is more suitable than the G1 Prix de l'Opera [at Longchamp Oct. 6], and this will be her last race of the season. She will probably stay in training next season also."
