SADLER'S WELLS COLT TOPS ORBY OPENER

A colt by top sire Sadler's Wells led the bidding at yesterday's opening session of the Goffs Orby Yearling Sale in Kildare, Ireland. The bay, consigned by Timmy Hyde's Camas Park Stud, was purchased for €825,000 by Demi O'Byrne. He is out of Puck's Castle (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}) and is a half brother to group placed Emerald Peace (Ire) (Green Desert). His second dam is Irish champion juvenile Pass the Peace (Alzao). "The Sadler's Wells/Shirley Heights cross has been a winner before," commented O'Byrne. "Let's hope it can be again." The underbidder on the session topper was Irish bloodstock agent Brian Grassick. The second-highest price at Tuesday's session was brought by hip number 85. The son of Danehill is the first foal from the winning Selkirk mare Marlene-D and brought a final bid of €700,000 from John Warren. "He was a very imposing individual with wonderful conformation," Warren commented. The colt sold in utero for 100,000gns at the 2000 Tattersalls December sale. He will be trained by Michael Stoute. After the close of business Tuesday, Matt Mitchell, Goffs Managing Director, commented, "Trade is solid, with strong competition for the better lots." The sale continues today at 11 a.m.

NOVERRE TO KILDANGAN STUD Champion miler **Noverre** (Rahy--Danseur Fabuleux, by Northern Dancer) will commence his stud career in 2003 at Darley's Kildangan Stud in Ireland. The blaze-faced bay is currently in training for the G1 Champion S. Oct. 19 at Newmarket. Winner of the G2 Champagne S. and the G3 July S. at two, Noverre finished first in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, but was disqualified for a medication violation. He captured the G1 Sussex S. in August and was the highweighted three-year-old colt over a mile in England. This year, he finished second to Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) in the Sussex and third to Nayef and Golan (Ire) in the G1 Juddmonte International S. A great-grandson of fabled broodmare Native Partner (Raise a Native), Noverre is a three-quarters brother to multiple champion Arazi (Blushing Groom {Fr}). "Noverre is a horse with a lot going for him," said Sam Bullard, Darley's head of nominations. "He was exceptionally tough and a ferocious battler, and precocious enough to get off the mark over five furlongs in May as a two-year-old. He's from one of the finest families in the book, and is a strongly made, very attractive horse well worth coming to see once he's at Kildangan." For more information, go to www.darleystallions.com.

LEFT BANK DIES **Left Bank** (French Deputy--Marshesseaux, by Dr. Blum) died Monday after a severe bout of colic. Shortly after equalling the Saratoga track record while winning the G1 Whitney Aug. 3, the five-year-old came down with colic and had surgery. He was retired from racing and sent to Ashford Stud near Versailles, Kentucky to recuperate. Left Bank, running in the colors of Michael Tabor, set a track record at Belmont Park while winning the seven-furlong G11 Tom Fool H. He also won last year's G1 Cigar Mile H. and G1 Vosburgh. On the board in 16 of 24 starts, Left Bank won 14 races and earned \$1,402,805.

MANHATTAN CAFÉ RETIRED **Manhattan Café (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence--Subtle Change {Ire}, by Law Society), a disappointing 13th in Sunday's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, has been retired from racing with a leg infection, according to a report in *Japan Today*. Trainer Futoshi Kojima told reporters on Monday that the four-year-old is possibly suffering from tendinitis. The Japanese star won the 2001 G1-JRA Kikuka Sho (Japanese St. Leger) and G1-JRA Arima Kinen Grand Prix, as well as this year's G1-JRA Tenno Sho. He won six of 11 starts and earned \$4,164,517.



BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

Medaglia d'Oro Works

G1 Travers S. winner **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}) worked a bullet six furlongs yesterday at Belmont Park in 1:13. Jockey Aaron Gryder was in the irons. "I've worked him four times, but today was the most impressive he's worked," Gryder said. "He is a great work horse, anyway. He'll go six furlongs in 1:16 if you want, or he'll go in 1:12 if you want. Today, he warmed up great and really acted like he wanted to get into it." Medaglia d'Oro, who galloped out seven furlongs in 1:25 4/5 yesterday, will likely ship Oct. 21 to Arlington Park for the Breeders' Cup Classic. Trainer Bobby Frankel also sent out Classic hopeful **Milwaukee Brew** (Wild Again) to work a half mile in :47 2/5 yesterday.

Lido Palace to Skip Classic

G1 Woodward S. winner **Lido Palace (Chi)** (Rich Man's Gold) will not be supplemented to this year's Breeders' Cup Classic, co-owner John Amerman said yesterday. Amerman had been considering making an \$800,000 supplemental payment to make the horse eligible for the \$4-million race. Though Amerman said he believed Lido Palace was the best older dirt male in the country and would have liked a chance to prove it, he did not believe putting up the money to run in the Classic was necessarily practical. "It strikes me that if the Breeders' Cup and the NTRA wants to make this a true world Thoroughbred championship, they've got to come up with a supplemental situation that works for horses from both the Southern and Northern Hemispheres. If a horse is born in the Southern Hemisphere, he is almost automatically excluded. I believe it would be very easy to solve this without affecting the whole Breeders' Cup payment system that much, but they have chosen not to do anything about it." Amerman said Lido Palace will now be pointed for the Nov. 29 \$400,000 G11 Clark H. at Churchill. "It's certainly not quite the same purse, but I think we'll do very well. Then we'll have a fresh horse for 2003."

This current year always looked likely to give an important window on the future prospects of Deputy Minister's male line. The early exportation of his sons French Deputy and Dehere (who was responsible for weekend GISW Take Charge Lady) left Silver Deputy and Salt Lake as his leading proven sons. The question for 2002, as far as the Deputy Minister line was concerned, was how well his freshman sons--Awesome Again, Deputy Commander and Touch Gold--would fare. That question was made all the more intriguing by the fact that the most successful sons of Deputy Minister to date have tended to be speedy sorts, whereas Awesome Again, Deputy Commander and Touch Gold all had top-class form at mile and a quarter and, in the case of Touch Gold, even a mile and a half.

Awesome Again, Deputy Commander and Touch Gold were all members of the outstanding 1994 crop sired by Deputy Minister, which contained nine stakes winners including additional GISW Fabulously Fast and Toyo Rainbow, a millionaire in Japan. Although the three were contemporaries with similar aptitudes, circumstances conspired to ensure that they rarely met in meaningful head-to-head competition. Awesome Again was unraced at two and at three captured the Queen's Plate and GII Jim Dandy S. before running third to Deputy Commander in the GI Travers S. He was a revelation at four, when skillful handling saw him go undefeated through a six-race season which culminated with a triumph in an epic renewal of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, which also featured Silver Charm, Swain, Victory Gallop, Coronado's Quest, Skip Away, Running Stag, Touch Gold, Arch and Gentlemen.

Deputy Commander was also unraced at two, but was one of the stars of the summer at three, scoring GI wins in the Travers and Super Derby. He ended the season with a second to Skip Away in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but at four started only three times, his best finish coming when second in the GII Californian S.

Touch Gold was more precocious than his paternal relatives, four juvenile starts resulting in a win in a six-furlong maiden at Woodbine, a second in the Swynford S. and a third in the GIII Grey Breeders' Cup S. Touch Gold began his three-year-old season by winning a six-furlong Santa Anita allowance in 1:09.4 and taking the GII Lexington S. by 8 1/2 lengths. In the GI Preakness S., he grabbed a quarter when going to his knees at the start, but recovered to finish fourth, beaten only 1 1/2 lengths by Silver Charm. The effects of that injury were to trouble Touch Gold throughout the balance of his career, but he was still able to put together back-to-back wins in the GI Belmont S. (ending Silver Charm's Triple Crown bid) and GI Buick Haskell Invitational. Touch Gold's four-year-old career was limited to four starts, but he did win an allowance contest at Churchill Downs, running the fastest mile seen at that track in 30 years and finished second, beaten only a neck, to Arch in the GIII Fayette S. *Cont. p. 4*

Given their race records, it would not have been reasonable to expect the trio to sire a slew of juvenile winners, but it was extremely encouraging to see the weekend reveal promising first season graded-stakes scorers for Awesome Again and Touch Gold, who are now stud companions at Frank Stronach's Adena Springs Kentucky.

Awesome Again struck first with his son Toccet, who took his record to three wins in four starts with a game victory in the GI Champagne S. Not to be outdone, Touch Gold evened the score Sunday, when Composure gained a decisive victory in the GII Oak Leaf S.

What is particularly encouraging in view of Awesome Again's and Touch Gold's own background is that they were able to get these graded-stakes winning juveniles out of mares with relatively stout antecedents. Toccet is the first foal of Cozzene's Angel, a daughter of the late-developing Cozzene. Cozzene's Angel herself did show a little precocity, as she was second and third in minor stakes at two. In all she won three races, \$72,420 from 23 starts spread over three years. A half sister to the minor stakes winners Miss Walkie Talkie (by Miswaki) and Courtly Canoe (by Fight Over), Cozzene's Angel has a pedigree with a decided Gallic background. Her dam Charming Pan (by Trepan, a French-bred grandson of Bold Ruler), won just once, but she was half sister to French listed scorers Chartino and Canaletto. A daughter of Iron Duke (by the great French sire Sicambre), Canaletto has gone on to great success as a broodmare, producing four stakes winners, including the group scorers Simon du Desert and Venize. Since this pair are by Kaldoun, a son of Cozzene's sire Caro, they have the same grandsire and granddam as Cozzene's Angel. Canaletto herself can also boast a close relationship to a good runner as she is three-quarters sister to the GI Hollywood Derby winner Charming Duke, who is by Iron Duke out of a half sister to Canaletto's dam. Toccet's pedigree is a complete outcross at five generations, although we can at least note that there is a modest precedent for the cross, as Deputy Minister's Louisiana-based son Mr.

Sparkles has a minor multiple stakes winner out of a Cozzene mare.

Composure also has a pedigree with more than a hint of European influences. Her dam Party Cited, a daughter of Alleged, began her career in England, where she was Group 1-placed at two and Group-3 placed at three. Campaigned in North America at four, Party Cited captured the GIII Yerba Buena and Bayakoa H., and was five times graded stakes placed, including a second in the GI Santa Ana H. and third in the GI Beverly Hills H. A half sister to English listed winner Dehoush, Party Cited is out of the Blushing Groom mare Dream Play. In turn, Dream Play is out of Go On Dreaming, a dual stakes winner and a daughter of Ohio blue hen Dan's Dream, the dam of seven stakes winners. Like Toccet, Composure owns a pedigree which is predominantly an outcross. She does have War Admiral 5x5x6, and the three-parts related Tom Fool and Spring Run are in the fourth and fifth generations. There are at least three other stakes winners bred on the Deputy Minister/Alleged cross, including Deputy Minister's group winner Mongol Warrior. Deputy Minister and his sons have also done extremely well with mares carrying Blushing Groom, the sire of Composure's second dam. We can't leave Toccet and Composure without noting a potentially important similarity between their pedigrees: both their broodmare sires are out of mares by Prince John, an influence found close up in the background of a number of Deputy Minister-line stakes winners, including champion Open Mind and group/graded stakes winners French Deputy, Forest Camp, Mongol Warrior, Star Minister and Run Softly.

THE VIRTUES OF CONSISTENCY

Last week's Tattersalls Houghton sale defied this year's select sale trend (down 25 percent) by remaining relatively level (marginally up) from last year. Yesterday's opening session at Goffs' Orby yearling sale was the third significant 'middle-market' sale, or tier--following Fasig-Tipton July and Keeneland September Books 2-3--to come close enough to last year's figures to suggest again that the \$100,000-average sale is looking far more solid than the select tier above it.

From Pounds to Euros...

Though we're now in Euros instead of Irish punts (or francs, for that matter), once you do the conversion, it was a very respectable session: gross up seven percent, average up eight percent over last year's corresponding session, and up five percent over last year's two-day Orby average. One of the really helpful things about Euros at the moment is that they almost exactly equal dollars, so when we say 182 yearlings grossed €20,146,000, and averaged €110,692, that means just about the same thing as if you said it in dollars. The drop from the record 2000 sale to 2001 for the two days had been 10 percent in gross and 15 percent in average; yesterday and today may not reach the record €43.6-million gross, or the €124,000 average achieved in 2000, but the numbers look--as with Houghton last week--like they'll be up on last year rather than down, which is plenty good news for European breeders.

The Big Guns...

Last week, Coolmore and the Maktoums spent 60 percent of the sale's gross. At yesterday's session, the game's biggest hitters made up less of the market. Sheikh Hamdan, traditionally the strongest Maktoum buyer at this sale, led yesterday's session with eight purchases totaling €2,665,000, while Demi O'Byrne signed for six, totaling €2,330,000, and John Ferguson three, for €875,000. Gainsborough was not in action. Among them, the three big hitters bought 17 yearlings--nine percent of the listed sales--for €5,870,000, which was 29 percent of the session's gross. In this middle tier, their impact was less than half the impact they had at Houghton. Three prominent agents: John Warren, McKeever St. Lawrence, and Peter Doyle, were able to fill a lot of their orders, spending over €1 million each. Among them, the three bought 28 yearlings yesterday, spent over €4 million, and averaged over €145,000. That alone shows there is plenty of demand when the big boys step aside.

The Big Picture...

Fasig Tipton July was able to sustain an average of \$97,815 this year, selling 37 percent more horses and posting an \$8.6-million gain in gross (also 37 percent), while Keeneland July and Saratoga combined dropped almost \$50 million in gross, and a combined 32 percent in average. September Books 2-3 saw 1,057 yearlings drop 12 percent in gross, and 17 percent in average, immediately after Book 1's percentage drops were approximately double--down 26 percent in gross and 31 percent in average. Now, after Houghton's trend-defying performance, with what just about everybody agreed was an outstanding catalogue both on paper and physically, Goffs' opening Orby session gained seven percent in gross and eight percent in average, to €110,692. The trend is crystal clear: top down, middle strong, sustained demand for the \$100,000 horse in Europe as strong, if not stronger, than in America.

Here's the real story about the middle market. Let's assume for the moment that the Euro and the dollar are at parity--it's close enough. Then we'll combine Fasig July, September Books 2-3, and Goffs' opening day. Last year: 1,428 yearlings grossed \$130,789,600, and averaged \$91,589. This year: 1,564 horses grossed \$129,632,700, and averaged \$82,885. The number sold is up nine percent, the average is down 10 percent but the gross was down less than \$1 million, down just one percent. So there's still plenty of money for horses at this level, which is very good news.

Stud Fee-sibility

These numbers raise the issue of stud fees, too, of course. Presuming the numbers through the rest of Goffs and Tattersalls October next week remain relatively stable, it seems clear that there is a broad-based yearling market which will justify viable stallions standing for \$15,000 (€15,000)-\$30,000 (€30,000). In this middle tier, which encompasses 2000-2500 yearlings, there is a case for stallions whose yearlings can average 3x stud fee, and whose medians are 2x stud fee. The market has spoken loud and clear, and it's telling us what breeders can afford to pay, at today's prices, to sustain this broad and vital market tier. The top stallions, and the top of the market, that's a different league. Stallions who are at the top, or who aspire to the top justify stud fees above \$30,000. But mid-range stallions don't, and any who happen to be standing for more than \$30,000 will find mares hard to come by as long as breeders pay attention to the monetary relationship between breeding mares and selling yearlings. By the same token, there are going to be some good buys for breeders this year: Smart Strike at a career-low for \$20,000 just as he's proving himself a name to be taken seriously, is an early example.

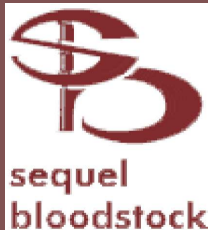

October 12, 1920...In the final race of his career, three-year-old **Man o'War** defeated 1919 Triple Crown winner Sir Barton in a match race at Kenilworth Park. Sent off at odds of 1-20, Man o'War won by seven lengths for his 14th consecutive victory.

October 12, 1966...**Damascus**, owned by Edith Bancroft, broke his maiden at Aqueduct Racetrack, winning by eight lengths.

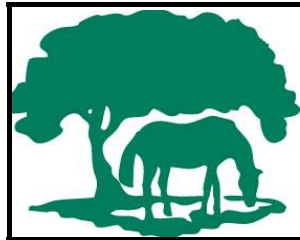
October 13, 1927...**Arlington Park** opened. The track, built by H. D. Brown, had a steeplechase course and a polo field and was adjacent to tennis courts, a golf course and a one-mile training track.

October 13, 1956...At age four, 1955 Horse of the Year **Nashua** won his last race, the Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Park.

October 13, 1984...At age nine, odds-on favorite **John Henry** won his last race, the Ballantine's Scotch Classic at the Meadowlands. He earned a \$500,000 bonus for winning both the Scotch Classic and the Turf Classic at Belmont Park September 22. He retired with then-record earnings of \$6,597,947.

The juvenile was highly impressive when accounting for Discreet Brief (Ire) by 3½ lengths at Headquarters and will bid to follow in the hoofprints of Balanchine and Cape Verdi, who both tasted Classic success for Godolphin after starting their racing careers in Sangster's ownership.

GOSSAMER MULLING MILAN Trainer Luca Cumani's **Gossamer (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) is set to return to action this weekend Sunday's G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua at San Siro racetrack in Milan. The G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner's participation hinges on the state of the going, as she has a known preference for cut in the ground. "Gossamer could run in the mile Group 1 in Milan on Sunday, but it will depend on the ground and we are waiting to hear of news of the ground at San Siro," Cumani told *Racing Post*. "She is in fantastic form and hopefully she can run there before going onto run in the Breeders' Cup Mile." Following her Classic success at the Curragh May 26, Gossamer finished last in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 21, then returned to form when third to Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) and Banks Hill (GB) in the G1 Prix du Moulin at Longchamp Sept. 8. She was again foiled by unsuitable track conditions when scratched from her latest engagement in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot Sept. 29.

MARIONNAUD TO PADDOCKS Dual Group heroine **Marionnaud (Ire)** (Spectrum {Ire}--Raghida {Ire}, by Nordico {USA}) looks set to be retired from racing and will continue her career as a broodmare. Trained by Jim Bolger, Marionnaud captured the G3 Derrinstown Stud 1000 Guineas trial at Leopardstown May 12 and, most recently, the G3 Coolmore Stud Home of Champions Concorde S. at Tipperary Oct. 6. "We will probably call it a day with her after that," Bolger told *Irish Thoroughbred Marketing*. "I had a race in America in mind for her, but she is now unlikely to travel. Hopefully she will be covered by either Danehill or Galileo."

LEGENDS TO REGROUP FOR CHAMPIONS DAY Legendary former jockeys Yves Saint-Martin, Lester Piggott, Geoff Lewis and Joe Mercer will team up with current top riders Pat Eddery and Johnny Murtagh for a special presentation ceremony at Newmarket on Champions' Day Oct. 19 to celebrate the 125th anniversary of the G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. Each will represent one decade in the recent history of the race that they won 16 times between them. Newmarket's most valuable contest of the year was first run in 1877 and there are surviving winning jockeys from each decade back to the 1950's, when Lester Piggott rode the first of his five Champion Stakes winners aboard Petite Etoile in 1959. Piggott's quintet of victories spanned 33 years as he went on to triumph on Pieces of Eight (1966), Sir Ivor (1968), Giacometti (1974) and Rodrogo de Triano (1992). Geoff Lewis won aboard Silly Season in 1965 and more famously when successful on Lorenzaccio in 1970 at the expense of the great Nijinsky. Joe Mercer won the race twice, both times partnering Brigadier Gerard in 1971 and 1972. France's Yves Saint-Martin won three Champion S. renewals, Flying Water (1977), Vayrann (1981) and Palace Music (1984). Pat Eddery also won three Champions, on Vitiges (1976), Pebbles (1985) and Bosra Sham (1996), whereas Johnny Murtagh has one on the board, Kalanisi two years ago.
