MARIENBARD LIKELY FOR JAPAN CUP

Godolphin's **Marienbard (Ire)** (Caerleon), the winner of Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, looks likely to end his 2002 campaign in G1 Japan Cup at Nakayama Nov. 24. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor yesterday told *Gulf News*, "Hopefully, he can round off a great year...with another win in the Japan Cup. That will be fantastic and great for the team." Bin Suroor

added that Marienbard's success in the Arc was not a complete surprise. "He had grown bigger and stronger, but what really made me think of him as winner was his attitude," he said. "He was a lot more professional and he knew what he had to do once he was on the track. Some horses take a while to mature...a lot of them run their best at five, and Marienbard is one of them." A trip to Japan would likely rule out a rematch with Arc third **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf. Marienbard had been quoted as the 5-1 joint-second favourite behind High Chaparral for the Turf.

LELLOUCHE FILLIES HEADING EAST

Trainer Elie Lellouche will bypass the Breeders' Cup with his talented fillies **Aquarelliste (Fr)** (Danehill) and **Bright Sky (Ire)** (Wolfhound), it was announced yesterday. The impressive winner of Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Opera, Bright Sky will tackle the 11-furlong G1 Japan Cup, which will be run at Nakayama instead of its usual venue at Tokyo. Aquarelliste, who was sixth in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, will also skip the Breeders' Cup and instead point for the G1 Hong Kong Vase at Sha Tin Dec. 5. "Both fillies came out of their races in very good order," said Lellouche yesterday. "If she gets an invitation, Aquarelliste will run in the Hong Kong Vase, and if Bright Sky gets an invitation, she will go for the Japan Cup. Nakayama, which is a small, right-handed track, makes it a more suitable race for Bright Sky than it would otherwise have been. It is also only 11 furlongs this year, so it is definitely worth her taking her chance in that race."

REPENT OUT OF CLASSIC

Three-year-old **Repent** (Louis Quatorze) has suffered a tendon injury and will likely be sidelined for the rest of the year. Trainer Ken McPeck said the injury was discovered after a routine gallop at Churchill Downs yesterday morning. The colt's left front leg will be scanned to determine the exact nature of the injury. "The tendon had looked a little suspicious and I didn't like the way it looked after he galloped this morning," McPeck said. He added, "I'm very optimistic he'll be fine, but we won't be able to make the Classic." Repent is expected to race again next year. The runner-up in the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile at two, Repent came back to win the Risen Star S. and the GII Louisiana Derby this year, but was a distant second to War Emblem in the GII Illinois Derby. He missed the Triple Crown due to a chip in his left front ankle, but came back after a 4 1/2-month layoff to be second in the Aug. 25 G1 Travers. He was most recently a disappointing seventh as the 17-10 favorite in the Sept. 28 G1 Jockey Club Gold Cup. The dark bay has five wins, three seconds and a third from 10 starts for earnings of \$1,255,660.

BUDDHA TO HILL 'N' DALE

GISW **Buddha** (Unbridled's Song--Cahooters, by Storm Cat), who was retired at the beginning of the month due to a back injury, will stand the 2003 breeding season at Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Lexington, it was announced yesterday. The three-year-old will stand as the property of Gary and Mary West for a fee of \$15,000 live foal. The lightly raced gray made his fourth and final start in the G1 Wood Memorial S. in April, beating Medaglia d'Oro, but was forced out of the Kentucky Derby with a bruised foot. Jim Bond stated, "This is the best horse I ever trained."

CLASSIC, \$4,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4m

GI Pacific Classic hero **Came Home** (Gone West) worked seven furlongs in 1:25.60 over the Santa Anita main track yesterday morning. Jockey Mike Smith, who picked up the mount on the three-year-old after his regular rider Chris McCarron retired, was in the saddle for the breeze. "I told Mike I wanted him to go in 1:26, so it was pretty close," trainer Paco Gonzalez said. The colt is scheduled to work twice more before the Classic. "That's all he needs," Gonzalez explained. He will ship from California to Arlington Park Oct. 23.

JOHN DEERE TURF, \$2,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/2mT

Falcon Flight (Fr) (Persian Bold {Ire}), a two-time graded-stakes winner over the Arlington Park turf course, worked on the grass at Santa Anita yesterday morning, going four furlongs in :50 1/5 around the dogs with jockey Pat Valenzuela up. He will likely be supplemented at a cost of \$180,000 for the Turf. "He worked beautifully," trainer Don Burke said. "I said to Pat after the work, 'Are we on track?' and he said, 'Are you kidding? You bet we are.' I don't clock my works, but when I heard the time, I couldn't believe it. He went so easy." The six-year-old returned from a lengthy layoff to annex the Gill Arlington H. July 27 and might have won the Aug. 17 GI Arlington Million had he not been shut off in deep stretch. Fifth, beaten a neck in that blanket finish, the bay was most recently an excellent runner-up to **Ballingarry** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in the GI Canadian International at Woodbine Sept. 29. "He came out of the race very well and, if everything goes well, we will make the first payment of the supplemental fee on the 15th," Burke, who will be making his first Breeders' Cup appearance, confirmed. The conditioner is bullish on his chances in the Turf, but plans to take the experience in stride. "We think that we're a legitimate threat to win it all," he said. "But, really, it's just another race. My task is to get him there at the top of his game. Am I excited? Yes, but am I going to treat it any different from any other race? No." Valenzuela, who rode Falcon Flight for the first time at Woodbine, has the return call.

No BC for Delta Form... Team Valor co-principal Barry Irwin said yesterday that GI Turf Classic third-place finisher **Delta Form** (Aus) (Marsday {Aus}) would not be supplemented to the Turf and will be pointed instead for the Nov. 24 G1 Japan Cup or the Dec. 15 G1 Hong Kong Vase. "Those races are free and worth more money," said Irwin, who would need to pay \$400,000 to run in the Turf. "I paid \$120,000 to supplement Star of Cozzene [third in 1991 Mile] and still lost money. It just doesn't make sense." Delta Form, a multiple-stakes winner in South Africa, scored his biggest U.S. victory when he defeated Breeders' Cup bound **The Tin Man** (Affirmed) in the GII Del Mar H. Sept. 1.

BESSEMER TRUST JUVENILE, \$1,000,000, 2yo, c/g, 1 1/8m

GII Grey Breeders' Cup winner **Wando** (Langfuhr) has made steady recovery from a minor cut suffered during the running of Sunday's race and remains on track for the Juvenile. "We pulled the bandage off this morning and the cut is healing very well," trainer Mike Keogh said yesterday. "The area looks nice and clean this morning, so we took him out and galloped a mile and a half." A son of the 1996 Sovereign Award-winning sprinter, Wando reminds his conditioner of his sire. "He's built a lot like Langfuhr," Keogh said. "He's a gentleman just like him, but Wando came around much faster." Tentative plans call for the chestnut to arrive at Arlington by Oct. 24.

NAPA SPRINT, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 6f

The names of several horses have unexpectedly been thrown into the ring for the Sprint. Before MGSW **Explicit** (Distant View) finished last in Saturday's GI Ancient Title Breeders' Cup H. at Santa Anita, trainer Ian Jory had said the five-year-old would have to win that race in order to earn a trip to Arlington. But Jory changed his tune yesterday. "He ran down the other day," he said. "He's going to work Monday at Hollywood. If he works well and doesn't run down, he'll go [in the Sprint]." Also pointing for the Sprint is **Swept Overboard** (End Sweep), who finished fourth as the 9-10 favorite in the Ancient Title. "He was a little tired after the race, but I think he'll benefit greatly from it. We'll go in the Sprint, absolutely," trainer Craig Dollase said. **Touch Tone** (Pick Up the Phone), who came back after more than a year off to be third behind Xtra Heat in Saturday's GIII Phoenix Breeders' Cup S. at Keeneland, is also going to try for a berth in the race.

RAJA BABA EUTHANIZED Former leading sire **Raja Baba** (Bold Ruler--Missy Baba, by *My Babu) was euthanized at Hermitage Farm due to the infirmities of old age. The 34-year-old stallion had stood his entire career at the Goshen, Kentucky, farm. "He was ready to go," Hermitage manager Bill Landes told *The Blood-Horse*. "Time had passed him by." A multiple stakes winner of \$123,287, Raja Baba went on to achieve great success in the breeding shed, with 62 stakes winners to his credit. Topping that list are a pair of Breeders' Cup winners, with champion Sacahuista capturing the 1987 Distaff and Is It True dethroning Easy Goer in the 1988 Juvenile. Raja Baba also sired Summer Mood, Canada's champion sprinter in 1985; Mexican Horse of the Year Gran Zar (Mex); and Grade/Group I winners Junius, Ride Sally, Royal Ski, Small Raja and Well Decorated. He was the nation's leading general sire in 1980 and topped the two-year-old standings that year as well.

NYRA Board Approves 2003 Schedule:

The Board of Trustees of the New York Racing Association has approved a schedule of 261 racing days for the 2003 calendar year. The schedule's lone significant change from 2002 is the addition of an extra week to the end of the Belmont Park fall meeting. Twilight racing will return to Belmont on Fridays during the spring meeting. Under the 2003 schedule, Aqueduct's 50-day winter meet will run from Jan. 1 through Mar. 9. The track's 38-day spring meet will run from Mar. 12 through May 4. Racing switches to Belmont for the track's 55-day spring meeting, which begins May 7 and runs through July 20. The 36-day Saratoga meet will begin July 23 and run through Sept. 1. Belmont's fall meet, scheduled for Sept. 5 through Oct. 26, will last 38 days. Aqueduct's 44-day fall meeting begins Oct. 29 and ends Dec. 31.

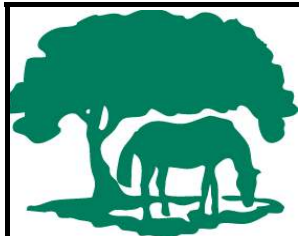
