**STRONG OPENER AT TATTERSALLS OCTOBER**

The Tattersalls October Yearling Sale opened yesterday in Newmarket, with hopes high that the auction could continue the trends started at the record-breaking Houghton Sale held two weeks ago. Admittedly, with a revamped format seeing the best lots selling yesterday and today, it is not possible to directly compare with previous renewals, but there was lively trade throughout with a full brother to G3 winner High Pitched (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) heading the proceedings. Consigned by Peter Stanley's New England Stud for breeder Cliveden Stud, the bay colt sold

for 375,000gns to Charlie Gordon-Watson. Bookmaker Colin Davey was the direct underbidder. "He is for Saeed Suhail and will be trained by Sir Michael Stoute," said Gordon-Watson. "We had been underbidder on a few at the Houghton so I am pleased to get him." Stoute has trained several of Suhail's top runners, including G1 English 1000 Guineas winner King's Best and Group 3 winner King of Happiness. During the first session of the auction, 29 lots sold for 100,000gns or more, compared to a total of 56 during the whole of last year's sale. The sale continues with the second select session today, beginning at 10 a.m.

**Lot 84 (c, Grand Lodge--Proskona, by Mr. Prospector)**

A Grand Lodge colt out of Proskona, sent over from the Tarry family's Islanmore Stud in Ireland and bred in partnership with the late Gerald Leigh, heads back across the Irish Sea. The half brother to the dam of G1 Prix Lupin winner Act One (GB) (In The Wings {GB}) was sold for 325,000gns to agent Brian Grassick, who saw off Godolphin representative John Ferguson. "He is for a partnership to go to Dermot Weld," said Grassick. "He is a nice correct horse and if he makes a racehorse, he has the pedigree to be a stallion." Proskona, a Group 2 winner in her racing days, is a half sister to champion broodmare Korveya, dam of Group 1 winners Bosra Sham and Hector Protector.

**Lot 191 (f, Swain {Ire}--Balistroika, by Nijinsky II)**

American breeder Betty Moran of Brushwood Stable consigned a Swain (Ire) half sister to leading British juvenile filly and MGSW Russian Rhythm (Kingmambo) through Voute Sales, who was sold for 300,000gns to Anthony Stroud's BBA. "She is for a foreign client and will hopefully be joining her sister with Sir Michael Stoute," said Stroud.

**Lot 185 (Dr Fong--Aquaglow {Ire}, by Caerleon)**

A colt from the first crop of G1 St James's Palace S. winner Dr Fong (Kris S.) was purchased by bloodstock agent Peter Doyle for 260,000gns yesterday. From the consignment of John Troy, the bay yearling cost 65,000gns at last year's Tattersalls December sale. He is a half brother to stakes winners Attitre (Fr) and Silca Key Service (GB).

**NAYEF OUT OF CHAMPION** Trainer Marcus Tregoning yesterday ruled **Nayef** (Gulch) out of Saturday's G1 Emirates Airlines Champion S. at Newmarket. The four-year-old will be denied a bid for back-to-back successes after showing signs of a respiratory problem yesterday. Stable companion **Mubtaker** (Silver Hawk) was also ruled out of the 10-furlong contest by Tregoning, who commented in a statement to *PA Sport* yesterday, "Unfortunately Nayef will not now run in the Emirates Airlines Champion S. on Saturday. The early signs are that Nayef has contracted the same low grade respiratory infection that has affected so many of our horses this season. It is a blow for his owner and breeder Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum as another Champion S. had looked a serious possibility. The turnaround time has been about a month so he will not be going to America. Mubtaker will not run either. He was found to be wrong, too, so plans are on hold, but I'm hoping he may stay in training."

**DANCETHRUTHEDAWN RETIRED** Canadian champion **Dancethruthedawn** (Mr. Prospector--Dance Smartly, by Danzig), owned and bred by Sam-Son Farms, suffered a hairline fracture to her right front ankle and has been retired from racing. The injury was discovered after the filly's fourth-place finish in the Oct. 6 GI Spinster. "She didn't seem comfortable in the race," Sam-Son's Tammy Samuel-Balaz told *The Blood-Horse*. "[Trainer] Mark [Frostad] took the x-rays as a precaution going into the Breeders' Cup [Distaff]. That would have been her last race. She's not lame and will not require surgery. All she needs is stall rest." After winning last year's Queen's Plate and Woodbine Oaks, Dancethruthedawn was named Canada's champion three-year-old filly. This year, the filly won the GI Go for Wand H. and was third in the GI Personal Ensign H. She retires with seven wins in 16 starts and earnings of \$1,609,643.

## BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

### CLASSIC, \$4,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4m

**Pleasantly Perfect** (Pleasant Colony) will not be allowed to race in the Oct. 26 Classic under Illinois's bleeders rules. The four-year-old bled from the nose after winning the Oct. 6 GI Goodwood Breeders' Cup. He also bled after a workout last February, so he is considered a two-time bleeder. Under Illinois rules, he cannot start for 30 days from the last occurrence. Trainer Richard Mandella told the *Daily Racing Form*, the Goodwood was the first time Pleasantly Perfect had bled after a race. "We X-rayed his lungs and they were clean. We think he might have hit his head on something. Maybe it was a phenomenon of the heat," he said.

### F/M TURF, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/4mT

Cliveden Stud's **Fraulein (GB)** (Acatenango {Ger}--Francfurter {GB}, by Legend of France), who scored her first Grade I victory in the E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine Sept. 29, will forego the GI Filly and Mare Turf and instead be retired to begin life as a broodmare. The three-year-old filly, campaigned by British trainer Edward Dunlop, ends her career with four wins in 11 lifetime starts, with earnings of \$549,033. "They rang us at 5:00 this morning and pulled the plug on us," said assistant trainer Peter Boothman, who was tending to the filly at Arlington Park. "The boss [Dunlop] had a meeting with the owners and decided to go ahead and retire her on a winning note. The field was coming up very strong." Boothman also indicated the possibility of firm ground helped make the decision, as the bay did her best running on soft ground.

### NAPA SPRINT, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 6f

**Gygistar** (Prospector's Music) may be forced to miss the Sprint after suffering a deep cut on his left front hoof, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. The three-year-old, winner of the GI King's Bishop S., suffered the injury while in his stall last Friday night. Trainer Mark Hennig plans to pre-enter Gygistar in the Sprint, but admits "we're going to have to get lucky," in order for the colt to run.

### LONG JOHN SILVER'S JUVENILE FILLIES, \$1,000,000, 2yo, f, 1 1/8m

Trainer Bill Helmbrecht announced yesterday that **Moonlight Sonata** (Carson City) will not start in the Juvenile Fillies and will instead be aimed towards the Green River S. on the turf at Keeneland Oct. 24. The William Geist-owned two-year-old had made a case for herself as a possible starter at Arlington Oct. 26 when she scored a 1 3/4-length victory over the same course in the GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S. Sept. 28. "We decided to stay away from the 'big ones' for the time being," explained Helmbrecht. "She's training well, and, physically, she'd have no problems with it. However, mentally, I'm not sure she's quite ready for that big a step."

**FOURSTARDAVE DIES AT BELMONT**

**Fourstardave** (Compliance--Broadway Joan, by Bold Arian), who became a Saratoga legend by winning at least one race at the Spa for seven straight years, died yesterday morning at Belmont Park. The 17-year-old gelding suffered an apparent heart attack while jogging over the training track. "They brought him from the farm in Ocala to be paraded this Saturday for the New York Showcase day," trainer Leo O'Brien told *The Blood-Horse*. "He had spent the last 10 days riding out at the farm so this wouldn't be so stressful on him. I sent him out for a little jog this morning at 10:30 a.m. and he had a heart attack and died. It's tough on these old horses when you move them around like that." At Saratoga, the gelding won the 1990 and 1991 GIII Daryl's Joy S. He also won the Spa's Albany S. and West Point H. twice and the Empire S. He raced 99 times with 21 victories and earnings of \$1,636,560. "He gave us so many thrills, and I guess he went doing the thing he loved the most," O'Brien commented. "I can't believe how good he looked. He looked better than most my horses in the barn."

Freshman sire Distorted Humor didn't have to wait long to make an impact. His daughter Awesome Humor broke her maiden in April, before marching through the GIII Debutante S., the GII Adirondack S. and GI Spinaway S. A bone chip in her right front ankle ended Awesome Humor's season after the Spinaway, but while Awesome Humor had been assuming the lead among the East Coast fillies, another daughter of Distorted Humor, Humorous Lady, was beginning to make a name for herself on the West Coast. Humorous Lady began her career humbly enough, taking a \$40,000 maiden claimer at Hollywood Park on her second start. She then defeated California-breds in the CTBA S. at Del Mar and the Mid-Peninsula S. at Bay Meadows.

After the Mid-Peninsula S., in which she blistered the 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:02.72, Humorous Lady was purchased privately by S. David Plummer and transferred to the barn of Michael Smith. She made her first start for her new connections on Sunday at Belmont Park, and once again showed considerable early speed on the rain-soaked track, sprinting through early fractions of :21.91 and :45.23. Understandably, Humorous Lady began to tire in the stretch, but she still had enough left to hold off the hard-charging Fast Cookie.

Distorted Humor also has yet another highly promising two-year-old in the New York-bred colt Funny Cide. He broke his maiden by 14 ½ lengths on his debut, and came back to take the Bertram F. Bongard S. at Belmont in a new stakes record. He will start at short odds to at to his record in this weekend's New York Bred Showcase Day.

Oddly enough, like fellow freshman sire stars Elusive Quality and Tale of the Cat, Distorted Humor did not himself race as a two-year-old. He was in action early in his three-year-old career, however, winning a maiden at Gulfstream Park, and allowance races at Churchill and Keeneland, between February and June. Distorted Humor gained a first stakes victory in the six-furlong Screen King S. at Saratoga, and rounded out the season by adding seconds in the nine furlong GII Fayette S. (beaten a head by one-time world mile record holder Isitingood) and the GII Jerome H., and a third in the GII King's Bishop S. to his resume. At four, Distorted Humor started only five times, but earned a first graded stakes triumph with a 5 ½-length tally in the GIII Salvator Mile H., and he also finished second in the GIII Kentucky Cup Classic H. and third in the GII Philip H. Iselin H., while once again attempting to stretch his speed beyond a mile. Distorted Humor was better than ever in his final season, setting a new track record for seven furlongs in the GII Churchill Downs H., and also taking the GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup S. and the GIII Ack Ack H. He ended his career by gaining a first Grade I placing, finishing third in the GI Cigar Mile to Sir Bear and Affirmed Friend.

Humorous Lady is the first graded-stakes winner to appear in her direct female line. That shouldn't be taken to indicate that the family is without ability, however. Humorous Lady's dam My Glamorous One never won a black-type event, but she did finish second in the Santa Ysabel S. and fourth in the GI Fantasy S. A daughter of the Dewan stallion It's the One, My Glamorous One is a sister to the GII Young America S. third He's Tailor Made. Humorous Lady's granddam, Glamorous Siren, earned black-type with a third in the Torrey Pines S., and her third dam Lost Control was third in both the Cleveland Cotillion S. and Delta Queen H. It's not until the fourth dam Lady Joy that we come to a mare who produced a stakes winner. Lady Joy was actually a rather prolific producer as 13 of her 14 foals were winners headed by Terlago, a son of Terrang, who prevailed in the 1970 renewal of the Santa Anita H. Lady Joy herself was a sister to Oh Johnny, a winner

of several stakes events, the most prestigious of which was the 1956 Travers S.

Humorous Lady is another of those stakes winners bred on a generally disappointing "nick" or sire line/broodmare sire line cross, but with interesting inbreeding elsewhere in the pedigree. The cross of Mr. Prospector line stallions over Dewan line mares, which Humorous Lady represents, has, as far as we can tell, only produced one other stakes winner (an Australian listed winner). The key to Humorous Lady's pedigree is probably to be found in the relationship between Distorted Humor's grandsire Mr. Prospector and Humorous Lady's granddam, Glamorous Siren.

Both are by Raise a Native and are out of mares by sons of Nasrullah (Nashua and Never Bend respectively). The dams of both Mr. Prospector and Glamorous Siren have Bull Dog close up in their pedigrees, and Johns Joy, the sire of the granddam of Glamorous Siren, is closely related to Johnstown, who is in Mr. Prospector's pedigree as the broodmare sire of Nashua. The net effect is that Mr. Prospector and Glamorous Siren, who appear 2 x 3 in the pedigree of Humorous Lady, have very similar backgrounds.

### THE NEW OCTOBER SALE

The weather was foul--you can forget those fast-ground horses at Newmarket this week--but the action was hot, once the sale got going at the opening session of Tattersalls' revamped October Yearling Sale yesterday. By revamped I mean Tattersalls' has now adopted the Keeneland September principle of selling the best first: the week's best yearlings are selling in day-long sessions yesterday and today, with the remainder to come in split sessions, before and after racing Thursday and Friday, and before Saturday's big Champions Day card.

Consequently, interim results comparing sessions from last year's sale are completely irrelevant. Until this year, the sale's best sessions were the split Thursday-Friday sessions, but those don't correspond to Tuesday-Wednesday this year, because more are sold in one day-long session than in two split ones. So only at the end of the sale on Saturday will we all really know how it compares with last year.

Never mind, because yesterday's session averaged right around \$94,000 (57,549 guineas), marking the fourth time in four months a major sale or sale tier reported within shouting distance of a \$100,000 average: Fasig-Tipton July, Keeneland September Books 2-3, Goffs Orby (first two of three days) last week, and now October Tuesday. By the end of today's session (tipped by the Judges to be even stronger than yesterday's), over 2,000 yearlings in these second-tier sales and sessions will have grossed over \$180 million on both sides of the Atlantic hammering the point home beyond dispute: there is a big demand for \$100,000 yearlings, wherever, and in whichever currency, they are sold. The breeders, and certainly the stallion managers, judging from the Kentucky stud fees now being announced, are getting the message.

Yesterday's biggest buyer, for once, was not the Maktoums or Coolmore, neither of whom signed for a yearling. Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estates signed for nine: seven colts, by six different sires, and two Unfuwain fillies, but yesterday's big gun was agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, who signed for 13 yearlings totaling over 1.5-million guineas. Charlie does buy for some Maktoum interests, but he buys for lots of other people, too, and yesterday he bought five for between 42,000 and 55,000gns. Plus he bought three of the seven yearlings which sold for 250,000gns-plus (a little over \$400,000), including the session-topping Indian Ridge colt, at 375,000 gns. Interestingly, the other four 250,000-plus yearlings fell to four other agents: one each to Brian Grassick, Blandford Bloodstock (Joss Collins), Peter Doyle, and Anthony Stroud. John Ferguson, Sheikh Mohammed's buyer, signed for six yearlings, averaging just over 100,000gns.

Though he didn't top the charts yesterday, Sheikh Hamdan and his Shadwell team have been very busy re-stocking the racing stable. Since the beginning of the September sale through the end of play yesterday, by my unofficial count, Shadwell has signed for 49 yearlings in the last five weeks, for a total of around \$16 million, which is an average of a little over \$325,000. Their organization has gained increasing respect the past few years as one of the most professional operations going, and without much fanfare they are assembling what could be a powerful stable of juveniles for 2003. They're very good at supporting breeders who support their own stallions, too, which in turn encourages breeders to support their stallions; get a good one by a Shadwell stallion, and you can count on it getting a serious look by their team. That's good business.

There has been much discussion in Britain the past few weeks of an investigative reporting program on BBC called Panorama (sort of a '60 Minutes'), which aired on Arc night and purported to reveal some of the corrupt aspects of racing. Strangely, within the industry, the program has given rise to a lot of debate about the relative importance of The Jockey Club (now principally regulatory), the British Horseracing Board (administrative), and the Racecourses (some of the most important of which are owned by an arm of The Jockey Club). The relationship among these various entities which claim responsibility for the Industry is also complicated by an ongoing investigation into the industry by the government Office of Fair Trading, which got involved initially because of complaints by the bookmakers, but which threatens to report back with unthinkable ideas like deregulation of racing dates. It's all just so complicated; it almost reminds me of America, except there we get the various States mixed in the pot as well. The problem impacts me, as someone who tries to assemble and interpret statistics; it's a nightmare. The so-called official statistics are usually riddled with qualifiers (we have this, we don't have this). Don't even ask who decides what qualifies as black type, or a Pattern Race, in which countries. As somebody said to

me the other day, if baseball's statistics were this screwed up, nobody would watch it. That's just a little thing to most people, but it's typical. How this industry manages to survive with the administrative structures that exist is a miracle. The rules vary from state and country to country; there is no cohesiveness, there is no unity, little vision, and not much democracy, either. We pretty much have to take what gets kicked out, and work with it as best we can. You couldn't make this mess up; only human beings could have 'evolved' it. Everybody has a bitch, a gripe, and an idea. I have an idea, too: start over. Scrap it all, build up an international organization responsible for the industry and answerable to its stakeholders. Organize it properly. Well, a guy can daydream, can't he? Dream On.

## FIVE ROYAL DAYS AGAIN

Ascot's Royal meeting will be staged over five days again in 2003, it was announced yesterday. Having expanded the existing four-day meeting to five in celebration of the Golden Jubilee this year, the intention had been to restore the old format from 2003, but officials have decided to keep the extra Saturday (June 21). "The fifth day was a great success this year," Chief Executive Douglas Erskine-Crum said yesterday.
