PICK SIX INVESTIGATION CONTINUES

An investigation into the Breeders' Cup Pick Six continued yesterday, with racing authorities expressing concern that consumer confidence in the system would be eroded by a discovery that bettors were able to manipulate their bets after races had begun or been held. An investigation was launched after it was discovered that one bettor, who has been identified by racing authorities as 29-year-old Maryland resident Derrick Davis, held all six winning tickets after singling the first four winners in the Pick Six, coupled with every horse in the last two. Racing authorities want to know if a computer hacker was able to alter the tickets after the first four races in the Pick Six bet had been run. "This could have very serious repercussions for this industry, at least in the short term," said Chris Scherf, executive vice president of Thoroughbred Racing Associations. "We are constantly looking to expand account wagering and obviously the system has to be foolproof or else we will have no credibility with the public." Breeders' Cup President D.G. Van Clief Jr., said that his office is committed to safeguarding the public from any intrusions into the betting pools or other forms of chicanery. "Our motivation in seeking this review is to ensure the complete integrity of all aspects of the Breeders' Cup, including the legal, state-regulated wagering that accompanies it," he said. "More broadly, in conjunction with our NTRA members, state racing commissions and other relevant parties, we will do our part to assure that confidence in the pari-mutuel wagering system is maintained, including related issues such as the security of totalisator systems and of any related, computer-based technology used in legal wagering."

ISLINGTON MAY REMAIN IN TRAINING

Islington (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), third in last Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, may stay in training as a four-year-old as connections ponder options for one of Europe's leading fillies. Islington finished. Peter Reynolds, manager of the late Lord Weinstock's Ballymacoll Stud, told *Racing Post*, "I would hope that Islington will stay in training next season. She's a lovely filly and she hasn't got that many miles on the clock, but I don't imagine there will be a decision until Sir Michael Stoute returns from Australia."

CAME HOME ARRIVES AT LANE'S END

Came Home (Gone West--Nice Assay, by Clever Trick) has arrived at William S. Farish's Lane's End Farm near Versailles, Kentucky, and will stand his first year at stud in 2003 for a fee of \$50,000. The winner of the GI Hopeful S. at two, the bay colt returned this season to annex the GII San Vicente S. and GII San Rafael S. before reporting home an impressive 2 1/4-length winner of the GI Santa Anita Derby. Unplaced in the Kentucky Derby, he bounced back to win the GIII Affirmed S. and GII Swaps S. and recorded the most impressive victory of his career when defeating older horses in the GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar. A half brother to GSW A.P. Assay, the sophomore was injured in his final start in last Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Radiographs taken of his left knee showed chips in the radial carpal bone, but surgery will not be required and he is expected to begin the 2003 breeding season as scheduled. Came Home retires with a record of 12-9-0-0 and earnings of \$1,835,940.

BACK ON TOP OF THE WORLD

Jose Santos was brutally honest. The reason he didn't just walk away?

"I have a family," he said. "I have to feed them."

Even if that meant winning a few races here and there and having to live with the indignity of being passed over for riders with half the experience and talent. It can't be easy, not when you go from being a star to an outcast. But you have to do what you have to do.

At least he wasn't alone.

Mike Smith didn't quit either, but he did bail on New York racing. His career path had followed Santos', step by frustrating step. He was the undisputed kingpin of New York until injuries got in his way. He couldn't seem to regain his momentum and after a while he wasn't winning many races, especially the ones that mattered. So he left for California in May of 2001, a desperate attempt to revive his career.

It wasn't working. At the 2001 Breeders' Cup he had just two mounts, neither of them on horses who appeared to have a serious chance. At least he made out better than Santos. He had one mount, a 13-1 shot named Volga in the Filly & Mare Turf. Between them, Santos and Smith had won 14 Breeders' Cup races, but no one wants a rider on what seems like an inexorable path to mediocrity.

"A slump like that is really tough, to be honest with you," Smith said. "I probably tried to pretend that it wasn't at first, but it was the hardest thing I ever went through mentally. I had never run into something like that in my career before. It had always gone up. I had never gotten to a point where things went down, and not only did they go down but they plummeted."

So Smith kept at it and waited for a break. So did Santos. They both hoped someone would remember how good they once were. After this Breeders' Cup, that won't be a problem. Between them they won three races, two by Smith, one by Santos.

What made it happen? They always could ride. They just needed to start getting on some horses who could run.

For both, injuries ignited their declines. Here's how it goes: a jockey loses his momentum and stops winning races. Because the jockey isn't winning, no one wants to give them any good horses to ride. Bad mounts lead to more losers. The slump worsens.

For the 41-year-old Santos, it began to turn around when he hired Mike Sellito as his agent. A former New York City cop, Sellito has worked magic. He solidified Santos' hold on the Christophe Clement barn and worked hard to convince new clients that his jockey still had it. Sellito got him better mounts and Santos didn't waste the opportunity. After having just 67 winners in 2001, he already has 154 this year.

"In the eighties I was on top for five, six years and then I had a terrible spill in 1992," he said. "My business went down terribly. Then this year, I started to get up again. It's been a rejuvenation."

Smith, 37, struggled in his first year in California and won just 95 races in 2001. But at least two trainers still had some faith in him. Laura de Seroux, a rising star in the business at age 50, tabbed Smith to be her stable rider. That meant he was given the mount on Azeri, one of his two Breeders' Cup winners. The other was the Bob Baffert-trained Vindication.

Meanwhile, Santos was doing nothing on the day and that wasn't supposed to change in the \$4 million Classic. He was riding a hopeless longshot named Volponi and only got the mount because Shaun Bridgmohan chose to ride Evening Attire. But Volponi ran so fast that all Santos had to do was hold on and steer. He crushed the field, giving his jockey the biggest pay day of his career.

"I'm on top of the world right now, believe me," Santos said. "To win this race is wonderful. People say it's a lot of money. That helps. But it's the prestige of winning a race like this that is most important to me."

Santos won't have to think about walking away for a long, long time. Neither will Smith. They had three Breeders' Cup winners among them. Give them good horses and they'll win races. It's really no more difficult than that.

Future of Rockingham In Doubt:

The future of racing at Rockingham Park in Salem, New Hampshire, is in doubt after Rockingham Venture, Inc., the owner and operator of the track, announced yesterday that it is exploring the development of the 170 acres which comprise the track. Officials at the track indicate that racing, "will continue for at least the next two years as we explore and pursue development plans with the town of Salem." The release goes on to say, "The community has been a great supporter of Rockingham, but we must all be realistic, after casinos opened in Connecticut, wagering on the races has dropped by 50 percent. We have explored every avenue to legalize video lottery in New Hampshire, but have not found the finish line yet."

Sellers Back In Winner's Circle:

Jockey Shane Sellers, who recently returned from nearly two years away from the races, booted home his first winner yesterday, guiding **Uncommon Queen** (Seattle Slew), a 3/4 sister to MGISW Excellent Meeting, to a popular nine-length maiden victory for trainer Frank Brothers in yesterday's sixth race at Churchill Downs. "I'm just happy," Sellers commented. "I knew it was just a matter of time. I knew Frankie was going to put me on one that I could make four or five mistakes on and still win. She's a nice filly." The 36-year-old native of Louisiana retired from the saddle nearly two years ago when he was injured during a post-parade incident at the Fair Grounds. He attempted a comeback last year at Arlington Park, but ended that attempt in short order when the pain in his knee became too great.

Posse Looking For Redemption in Iroquois:

Posse (Silver Deputy), impressive winner of the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup S. at Churchill Downs earlier this spring, headlines Sunday's GIII Iroquois S. beneath the Twin Spires. The colt, campaigned by Heiligbrodt Racing Stable and trained by Steve Asmussen, is making his first appearance since finishing a disappointing fourth to Whywhywhy in Saratoga's GII Sanford S. July 25. "He showed a lot of quality here in the spring," the conditioner explained. "We ran him opening week at Saratoga and he came back a little sick and we gave him some time. He's come back really well and we expect a good performance from him." The bay worked five furlongs in company with stablemate Easyfromthegitgo in 1:03 3/5 in the slop Tuesday morning. The six-year-old mare, fourth to Golden Apples (Ire) in this event a year ago, won the GII San Gorgonio H. last January, but was retired following a fourth-place finish in the Mar. 23 GII Santa Ana H. in order to be bred to Storm Cat. "She didn't take," trainer Ron McAnally explained. "Forty days after the scan, they realized she wasn't in foal. I've had her back with me since last summer at Del Mar." The California-bred faces a tall task Sunday, as the Las Palmas field includes Juddmonte Farms' MGSW **Tates Creek** (Rahy) as well as GI Yellow Ribbon S. runner-up **Voodoo Dancer** (Kingmambo). "She might need this race, but it should set her up for future races," McAnally added.

McCalmont and Machowsky, buying for owners Alan and Josh Tepper, had better luck when getting the two-year-old **Puma (Ire)** (Cairail {USA}), a 37,000gns Tattersalls Breeze-Up graduate, for Highclere Thoroughbred Racing for 160,000gns, with Wally Dollase and Vladimir Cerin also bidding into six figures. "The other people after him were also Californians so I figured that if I didn't get him I'd have to race against him," said Machowsky. "He was more than we anticipated, but I'd rather overspend slightly than have to meet him on the track." Dollase, using agent Johnny McKeever of McKeever St Lawrence, later bought **Meteor Storm (GB)** (Bigstone {Ire}), a French Listed-placed three-year-old for Criquelette Head-Maarek and owner Prince Khalid Abdullah for 110,000gns. "He was the one distance horse we wanted--he really fit the bill," said Dollase, who has had graded stakes success this year with Doc Holiday (Ire) and Mananan McLir (USA), both purchased at the 2001 Tattersalls Sale.
