**FIJI FIRES UP KEENELAND OPENER**

Champion **Fiji (GB)** (Rainbow Quest), in foal to super sire Danehill, had all the credentials to lead a strong opening session at the Keeneland November Sale and did so in style, attracting a final bid of \$3.1 million from Brushwood Stable. Reiley McDonald signed the ticket. "I'm glad you called when you did, because I ran out of guts," McDonald told Mrs. Moran by cell phone following the sale. "She loves a good fight and she likes to be there for the big ones," he said, referring to Mrs. Moran. "She was here to look at all of the big mares before she had to go back to Pennsylvania. This was the one she had to have. We had a telephonic communication and she called me when the bidding got to \$2.5 million. I was out of gas, but she had plenty left." **More on Keeneland, p2-4**

**XTRA HEAT SOLD TO CLASSICSTAR**

The ClassicStar LLC partnership of S. David Plummer, Tony Ferguson, Thom Robinson and John Parrott, which purchased 18 head at Keeneland's opening session, added another buy: they privately acquired top sprinter **Xtra Heat** (Dixieland Heat). The deal was concluded yesterday morning for a price tag of \$1.5 million and stipulates that John Salzman Sr. will remain the trainer for her 2003 campaign. "At the Breeders' Cup, we expressed an interest to the people at Taylor Made," explained Ferguson. "We dropped out of the bidding at \$1 million Sunday night, but yesterday morning we reconsidered, Frank Taylor approached the ownership group and struck a deal. This provides us a fantastic opportunity to put together a broodmare band with this quality of horse. With Xtra Heat, Above Perfection and Humorous Lady, we feel we have a great chance of building a successful broodmare band. We have been looking for speed in the mares we have bought and they fit the bill." The four-year-old went through the ring unsold at \$1.7 million Sunday night at Fasig Tipton.

**Fiji's Star Turn**

Selling as the property of Newgate Stud Farm, **Fiji** earned an Eclipse Award as champion turf female for her four-year-old campaign which saw her capture six of seven starts, including the GI Yellow Ribbon S. and the GI Gamely Breeders' Cup H. Out of the tough stakes mare Island Jamboree (Explodent), Fiji bankrolled \$894,129. "Horses like Fiji rarely come onto the market and probably won't again," said Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's director of sales.

**Nothing Flat About Her**

Just a few minutes after he signed the ticket for Fiji, Reiley McDonald was the successful bidder on Hip 260, **Flat Fleet Feet** (Afleet), at \$2.3 million. McDonald played this one close to the vest, saying only that the purchase was for "a very well-known commercial breeder who wishes to remain anonymous...The person really does not want their identity revealed. All I can say is that hopefully, in a few years, you'll find a lot of Flat Fleet Feet foals back in the sales." In foal to Storm Cat, the nine-year-old was a MGSW of \$727,041. She was consigned by Three Chimneys Sales as agent.

**Queen for a While**

**Kalookan Queen** (Lost Code), as Hip 20, was the first mare to reach seven figures Monday. This multiple Grade I-winning sprinter, who twice defeated males, was acquired by Courtlandt Farm for \$1.85 million. "We thought that she was just gorgeous," said Courtlandt owner Don Adam. "She is one of the best I've seen in a long time [physically], and so attractive. She has a nice pedigree and an excellent race record. She was the number one choice on our list. The price was fair, but I would say that we were prepared to go even higher than that." Fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint--one spot ahead of Xtra Heat--Kalookan Queen is heading right to the breeding shed. "I am going to talk to Mr. Waldman to see if we can get in and breed Kalookan Queen to Storm Cat," Adam continued. "We have no plans to sell her or her foals back. Over the past years, it seems like we have sold more good ones than we kept. We want to begin to replace some of our mares of lesser value with better ones. We have 27 mares in our broodmare band, more than is ideal. Maybe when the market becomes better for sellers, we'll try to sell."

**Youth Will Be Served**

This year's sale featured the first weanlings from some eagerly awaited young sires, including Kentucky Derby hero Fusaichi Pegasus. A colt by the Mr. Prospector stallion was the second highest priced weanling on the day at \$725,000. Agent John McCormack had the highest bid for the bay colt out of Party Cited (Alleged), whose catalogue page doesn't mention that his two-year-old half-sister Composure captured the GI Oak Leaf and was second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. "He is a very nice horse with a very good pedigree," McCormack noted. "Fusaichi Pegasus is one of the most exciting stallion prospects to come around in many years. He seems to be stamping his stock, too. This colt looks a lot like his father. He was a brilliant racehorse. Let's hope his progeny race the same way that he did. I wasn't sure how high we would have to go since it's hard to tell exactly what the market is going to support. But I thought the price was fair. I gave around \$650,000 for a Fusaichi Pegasus weanling this year in Japan, so it seems right." McCormack indicated that the youngster would remain in the U.S. and would likely be offered for sale again next year.

**Showing the Way**

Leading buyer of the day was ClassicStar, whose 18 purchases were topped by GISW **Hookedonthefeelin** (Citidancer), a six-year-old mare in foal to Deputy Minister. "We bought 18 head today [for gross receipts of \$9.56 million] and I was the underbidder on a lot of them," said S. David Plummer, co-principle of ClassicStar. "We look for Grade I winners if we can, but we feel we have to raise them and sell babies out of them, so we have to stop at some level. We were thrilled to finally get this mare. It was a tough day today. There were a lot of great buyers and a lot of great horses. [Hookedonthefeelin] will go to our farm here in Kentucky. We have shares in a lot of stallions, so we have to think about who we will breed her to."

**Classic Connections**

A pair of full siblings to recent Kentucky Derby winners were cataloged for yesterday's opening session. Hip 87, a full sister to Monarchos, was bought back after bidding stalled at \$475,000. The bay filly was consigned to the sale by Darby Dan Farm, agent for owner J.D. Squires. Hip 116, the seven-year-old mare Silver Spirit, sold for \$85,000 in foal to first-year weanling sire High Yield. Consigned by Greenfield Farm, agent, the full sister to 1997 Derby hero Silver Charm was purchased by Bonnie Arnett.

**What They're Saying At The Sales...**

**Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland:** "It seems that the sellers have adjusted to the market and the buyers have jumped on board. The 'jewels' as we like to refer to them all brought large sums of money. This was a satisfactory beginning to the sale. We had more seven-figure horses during this year's session compared to last and I am surprised that the gross went up. We are also very pleased with the low number of buybacks."

**Don Adam, Courtland Farm:** "It seems right now that the market is more favorable on the buying side of things this year. In my view, [Kaloookan Queen], in previous years, would have sold for significantly more money."

**Andreas Putsch, 6C:** "I think that the market has been a bit spotty. The good horses are selling for good money. I also think the catalogue is a bit spotty, but for what there is, they are bringing a lot of money." Putsch purchased Veil of Avalon (Thunder Gulch--Wind in Her Hair {Ire}, by Alzao), in foal to Giant's Causeway, for \$1.25 million. "This is one of the best female families in all of Europe. The price was just at the outer reaches of where I thought she would be. I had to go a little higher than I expected."

**Bill Farish, Lane's End Farm:** "The market feels solid to me right now. It's been very good so far. But sometimes the buyers are on the horses you think they'll be on and sometimes they're not. The market just didn't support this one," referring to RNAd hip 89, Ring of Fire, for \$900,000.

**THINGS FALLING INTO PLACE FOR CLIFTON...**

For Beth Clifton, raising horses has always been a labor of love. That's why parting yesterday with Salty Gal (Cox's Ridge) was bittersweet.

"When I put her on the van for the final time, I have to tell you, I was bawling my eyes out," she admits.

Clifton's relationship with the 10-year-old mare dates back to her racing days. Purchased as a two-year-old by the late Prince Fahd's Newgate Stud Farm, the dark bay was winless in six starts for trainer Neil Drysdale on the West Coast before Clifton acquired her. She promptly broke her maiden in her first start for her new connections, but was never able to get through her first allowance condition and was retired following her four-year-old campaign. The choice of a stallion for Salty Gal was easy, according to Ray Clifton.

"It was really a no-brainer," he said. "There were a bunch of crosses to \*Turn-to and it had proven to be successful in the past."

Her first foal is Mongoose (Broad Brush), a \$370,000 yearling purchase, who stamped himself a Classics contender in a freshman campaign which included a win in the Cradle S. at River Downs. A distant third in the Gil Spiral S. the following March, the bay began to turn the corner at the end of his three-year-old season, commencing a four-race winning streak which was capped by his win in the GI Donn H. this past February.

"You've got to be thrilled out of your mind when that happens," Beth Clifton commented. Added Ray, "It kind of validates what you are trying to do when you breed a Grade I winner. For a small operation, it's great."

Success has not been confined to racetrack performance this year for Clifton. A grey colt by Unbridled's Song, raised at Clifton Farm, was sold for \$800,000 at this year's Keeneland September Sale. And now, the mare with which Beth Clifton has been associated for over six years, realized \$1.75 million during yesterday's opening session at Keeneland. So, is there anything that can fill the void that's been left?

"Yep," Clifton says with a smile. "I've got her three-year-old filly by Atticus. I don't know yet who we will breed her to. She's beautiful."

Like mother, like daughter.

**STRONG STUFF**

Now, that--as I find myself saying at just about every sale these days--was instructive. With fewer catalogued than in last year's opening session (in which only 50 percent of those catalogued actually sold), yesterday's opening session of the Keeneland November sale saw 22 percent more sell than last year, for 21 percent more money--the gross jumped more than \$10 million to \$58,851,500. Yesterday's average of \$316,406 was down just 1 percent from last year. Palpable relief. Big demand. Strong Sale.

In fact, yesterday's session returned almost exactly comparable figures to Tuesday last year. We'll see today whether this year is just that bit stronger, or whether the session strength is reversed from last year (when Tuesday was stronger). One thing for sure yesterday, though--it was really cookin'. Not for every horse, admittedly--there were plenty of buy-backs, and the median did drop 6 percent from last year. But the ones they did want brought good money.

A total of 30 horses sold for final bids of \$500,000 or more--27 mares or fillies, and three weanlings; in fact, it was the mares and broodmare prospects that were the strongest. The most important fact about the 27 mares is that two-thirds of them were bought for America, including nine of the 27 bought by the session's leading buyer, ClassicStar LLC. Also the buyers of saletopper La Gueriere at the Wimborne dispersal this summer, and saletopper Above Perfection at Fasig Sunday night, ClassicStar led the charge of nine different American buyers for 18 of yesterday's top 27 mares. Only four Europeans bought the other nine, led by Newsells Park Stud, which bought five mares for \$500,000 or more and were the session's second leading buyer overall.

Two of the Big Three first-year weanling sires had \$500,000+ sales: Fusaichi Pegasus had a \$725,000 colt, and War Chant had a \$610,000 filly; so it's Giant's Causeway's turn today. The high foal yesterday was a Seattle Slew colt, for \$800,000.

## PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

I have a wish list on a well-known internet shopping site but I don't suppose there is any point in adding the thing I would really like--a broodmare daughter of Miswaki.

The Walmac Int'l veteran has been having a very rewarding time this year in his role as a broodmare sire, especially in Europe, where he began his racing career 22 years ago. Miswaki's broodmare daughters have been represented by the very talented but ill-fated Landseer, winner of the G1 French 2,000 Guineas; Sadowa, who took the G2 Italian 1,000 Guineas; the Irish-trained Black Sam Bellamy, recent winner of the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club; and the fast filly Danehurst, who last week followed up her win in the G2 Flying Five with a victory in the G3 Prix de Seine-et-Oise. Danehurst won the French prize by a head from Captain Rio, another fast performer out of a Miswaki mare.

Then, last Saturday, Miswaki's daughters added another G1 win to their tally when the Aga Khan's unbeaten Dalakhani wore down Chevalier to take the Criterium International over a mile. This son of Darshaan and Daltawa looks a first-rate classic prospect over 1 1/2 miles next year.

Dalakhani is the latest in a lengthy line of good winners out of Miswaki mares, following such successful horses as his famous half-brother Daylami (a seven-time G1 winner in France, England, the U.S. and Ireland), Hernando (French Derby), Galileo (Derby and Irish Derby), Johann Quatz (Prix Lupin) and Dr Fong (St James's Palace S.).

So what is it that makes some of Miswaki's daughters such good producers? After all, Miswaki wasn't out of the very top drawer as a racehorse, despite his G1 win in the Prix de la Salamandre. He was officially rated 9lb inferior to Storm Bird as a juvenile and his nine starts in America as a three-year-old yielded only one stakes win.

The answer must lie in his conformation and his bloodlines. Although he is on the small side, Miswaki possesses plenty of strength and is free of any major physical flaws. His pedigree is also ideal for a sire of broodmares.

His sire, Mr. Prospector, is well established as the dominant force on the North American Broodmare Sires' table and he currently appears to be heading for his sixth consecutive championship. Moving on to Miswaki's dam Hopespringseternal, she was by Buckpasser, who topped the Broodmare table three times despite having had only around 150 broodmare daughters. And then there is Miswaki's second dam Rose Bower. This very good two-year-old, winner of the Matron S., was by Princequillo, who headed the Broodmare table as many as eight times during the '60s and '70s.

Another factor which has contributed to Miswaki's success is his lack of Northern Dancer blood. His daughters are doing very well with Sadler's Wells, a son of Northern Dancer; and Danehill, a horse closely inbred to Northern Dancer's dam.

The Aga Khan must be delighted that Dalakhani is shaping up as a possible heir to his excellent sire Darshaan, who died during the 2001 covering season (when his fee was IRE75,000). **Caulfield cont. p6**

As a grandson of Mill Reef, Darshaan must have been an obvious choice as the 1999 mate for Daltawa, who had already produced Daylami to Doyoun, a son of Mill Reef. Although not as speedy as Doyoun, who won the 2,000 Guineas, Darshaan had three races as a juvenile, compared to Doyoun's one. What's more, he won two of the three, taking a mile maiden by six lengths prior to winning the G2 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. Darshaan continued to improve between two and three, establishing himself as a really good performer with his victory over Sadler's Wells and Rainbow Quest in the Prix du Jockey-Club, and it must be in Dalakhani's favour that Darshaan's stock generally improves with age.

Dalakhani has already gone one better than Daylami by winning all three of his juvenile starts, including two Group races. Daylami won his first two starts, including a Listed race, back in 1996, but was then beaten into second place in the Criterium de Saint-Cloud over 1 1/4 miles.

Daylami's first progeny will be two-year-olds of 2003. The Aga Khan has five of his yearlings and it is interesting that his filly out of the Shirley Heights mare Akdariya is inbred 3x3 to the great Mill Reef. Another of his Daylami colts is out of the dual classic winner Ebadiyla, who is out of a Darshaan mare and therefore creates 3x5 to Mill Reef. The mares which the Aga Khan sent Daylami in his second season included Dabtiya, a 3/4-sister to Darshaan by Shirley Heights; Kaliana, a mare by Mill Reef's Derby-winning grandson Slip Anchor; Shamarzana, a daughter of Darshaan; and the French Oaks winner Vereva, who is out of a Mill Reef mare. It looks as though His Highness has high hopes of this type of inbreeding.

**NTRA TASK FORCE MEETS** Formed in the wake of the the Breeders' Cup Pick Six controversy, the National Thoroughbred Racing Association Wagering Technology Group met for the first time Monday and established several initiatives. The Task Force has reviewed the available facts concerning the investigation into the wager by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board and has begun to review the tote systems security measures presently being taken/considered by the Churchill Downs--Magna Entertainment--New York Racing Association group as well as the current field study in this area by the Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau. In addition, the group is discussing input already received from customers, fans and industry constituents. "The incidents now under investigation represent a wake-up call to which our industry is responding vigorously," said Tim Smith, NTRA commissioner. "We are committed to identifying and implementing all reforms necessary to assure the integrity of racing's wagering systems." The group will meet again Thursday.

**OFFICER TO GAINESWAY** One of the nation's leading two-year-olds of 2000, **Officer** (Bertrando--St. Helens Shadow, by Septieme Ciel) will enter stud in 2003 at Gainesway Farm in Lexington, Kentucky for a fee of \$12,500 live foal. He will be limited to 115 mares in his initial season. Purchased for \$700,000 at the Barretts March Sale, the California-bred captured his first five career starts in impressive fashion, capped by the GI Champagne S. Held up in last place early by a confident Boeuf as Gallery God assumed his customary front-running role under Christophe-Patrice Lemaire, she made smooth progress before the final turn where her jockey was forced to take a pull. Quickening to challenge Authoress and Thierry Jarnet inside the final furlong, Boeuf drove his filly past that rival in the final strides to record an afternoon stakes double for himself and conditioner Dominique Sepulchre.

In doing so, she deservedly lost her maiden tag on the first try at stakes level. In hindsight, her debut 2 1/2-length second to Etoile Montante (USA) at Deauville Aug. 31 looks strong form based on that filly's subsequent performance when runner-up to Six Perfections (Fr) in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac. Arikaria was fourth in a conditions event at Maisons-Laffitte Sept. 17 before finishing third in a similar event at this track Oct. 3. Taken to the front in the early stages of the contest by the champion jockey, she was challenged on all sides in the straight, where she wandered right under pressure. Headed by Healing Music and Thierry Jarnet with 50 yards remaining, she gamely answered the call of her rider to force her nose back in front in the shade of the post.

Trainer Aidan O'Brien saddled a one-two-three in last year's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud and he holds an entry of eight in Saturday's €150,000 contest. **Brian Boru (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), winner of the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster Oct. 26, is expected to be withdrawn at today's stage, leaving **Powerscourt (GB)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and **The Great Gatsby (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}), who were second and fourth in that contest respectively, to represent the Ballydoyle conditioner. He may also elect to run maiden winners **Alberto Giacometti (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells {USA}) and **Delacroix (USA)** (Gulch {USA}) in the 10-furlong event. Heading the domestic contingent is the Andre Fabre-trained **Graikos (GB)** (Rainbow Quest {USA}), who was third behind Saturday's G1 Criterium International winner Dalakhani (Ire) in the G3 Prix des Chenes at Longchamp Sept. 22 before winning the G3 Prix de Conde at that track Oct. 20.

**ROB WATERHOUSE GRANTED STAY**

Rob Waterhouse was granted an immediate stay against his disqualification in the NSW Supreme Court on Friday. Waterhouse was initially fined A\$78,000 and suspended from bookmaking for two years for giving associate Peter McCoy odds of 500-1 on horses that started at 3-1 or shorter. He appealed and the penalties were reduced to A\$19,500 and nine months suspension. In granting the stay, Justice Peter Young said he was concerned that the Racing Appeals Tribunal had gone beyond its jurisdiction and breached the Human Rights Act by, "denying a man the right to work." Justice Young will hand down a decision in two weeks, during which time Waterhouse may attend the races but cannot operate as a bookmaker.

**GAI WATERHOUSE FACES STEWARDS CHARGES**

Trainer Gai Waterhouse has been charged by Racing Victoria stewards with giving misleading evidence in an ongoing inquiry regarding circumstances surrounding the scratching of Victoria Derby contender **Platinum Scissors (Aus)** (Danehill {USA}) last Thursday. The colt was rasing \$2.50 favorite when scratched at 6 p.m. "The false evidence was that she had said that the horse had worked, trotted and cantered, at the Flemington track, on Thursday morning," said chief steward Des Gleeson, addressing media on the steps of Racing Victoria headquarters at Flemington after the inquiry Monday afternoon. Waterhouse, who declined to comment, must return on Friday when the inquiry will resume.
