ABUNDANT BLESSINGS AT KEENELAND

Four years ago, at Keeneland July, a colt who came to be known as Fusaichi Pegasus sold for \$4 million. Two years ago this month, a four-year-old filly named Blissful fetched another \$4 million. And yesterday, during the second session of the November Breeding Stock Sale, a three-year-old filly named **Bliss** (Mr. Prospector) completed the trifecta for her venerable sire and her coveted dam Angel Fever when bidding again reached \$4 million at the Lexington sales pavilion. The unraced full sister to Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus, in foal to super sire Storm Cat, was consigned by Stone Farm, as agent for breeder Arthur Hancock III and Stonerside Stable. She was purchased by David Plummer's ClassicStar LLC. "We wanted her," Plummer admitted. "We bought one other mare earlier that we liked real well, but this was our pick of the sale, so we wanted to try and buy her. We knew she wasn't going to be cheap, we knew we'd have to pay what she was worth. So we just had to do our best and keep going. We are going to take her to our farm in Lexington and probably breed her back to Storm Cat." Of the filly's price tag, Plummer added, "We thought she would cost between \$3.5 and \$4.5 million. That was our guess, but we were prepared to pay what we had to pay. The mare being a full sister to Fusaichi Pegasus was most important. The idea is that it's hard to get the very very best mares and we wanted a few nice mares." *Keeneland coverage cont. p. 3*

MEDIA PUZZLE TAKES THE CUP

An avalanche of offshore money ensured **Vinnie Roe (Ire)** (Definite Article {GB}) displaced stablemate **Media Puzzle** (Theatrical {Ire}) as favorite for yesterday's Melbourne Cup, but the tough chestnut, the most-hyped contender in the wake of his Geelong Cup win, made Vinnie Roe chase him all the way along the 450-meter Flemington straight before scoring an emphatic two-length win. "All credit to this horse, I got there a bit too early but he was just too good," said winning jockey Damien Oliver. **Sandmason (GB)** (Grand Lodge) and **Hatha Anna (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) vied for the lead early, ensuring plenty of pace, with **Beekeeper (GB)** (Rainbow Quest) and **Pugin (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) caught wide behind the leaders. Media Puzzle tracked Vinnie Roe, who settled in 10th position. At the 1400 meters, Sandmason stole a three-quarter length lead while Pugin coasted to a perfect position two lengths away third, with Vinnie Roe shadowing him. At the 1100 meters Media Puzzle managed to get shuffled back behind **Daliapour (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). Coming in to the home turn at the 600 meters, Vinnie Roe began in earnest but with trademark catlike stealth, Oliver had maneuvered Media Puzzle through on the inside to burst clear at the 350 meters and shoot to a three-length lead at the 200 meters. Durable stayer **Mr. Prudent (Aus)** (Phizam {NZ}), winner of the 2001 Sydney Cup, was fourth from the rear and rallied late to give veteran trainer George Hanlon second place ahead of Beekeeper, who maintained his position against a fast-tiring Vinnie Roe. "This is a wonderful day," said trainer Dermot Weld, "This is very special; this is one of the special moments in life. I was so thrilled turning for home to see my two horses fighting out the Melbourne Cup. You know, they've come 12,000 miles to do this," he said. "Vinnie Roe, for a four-year-old, has run a wonderful race, he hasn't let us down, it was a big run on a track that was too firm for him, but he'll be back. Today was Media Puzzle's day," he said. "Two years ago after he ran fourth in the English St Leger, I said that he could win the Melbourne Cup. In fact, he fractured his pelvis quite badly and stood in a box for four and a half months and we've brought him back to today." Weld is the only international trainer to take the Melbourne Cup offshore, having won with Vintage Crop (Ire) in 1993. For Godolphin, the Melbourne Cup remains as elusive as ever. The internationally dominant team has now placed in the race three times.

Oliver Dedicates Win to Lost Brother

Soaring high in the saddle as he passed the post first in the Melbourne Cup aboard Media Puzzle, Damien Oliver reached skywards, sending kisses and words lost in his tailwind toward the heavens. Grinning to himself, he slapped his thigh heartily, right where the name "J. Oliver" was printed. The 30-year-old multiple premier-ship winning rider donned the breeches of his 33-year-old brother Jason, who failed to regain consciousness after sustaining head injuries in a fall at Belmont racetrack in Perth, and died last Tuesday. "It's going to be hard to keep this together," Oliver said to interviewer and former jockey Johnny Letts, who trotted alongside with a pony and a microphone as Oliver slowed his mount. Oliver is almost always referred to as a champion, and on Tuesday at Flemington the jockey renowned for his shrewd judgment gave a champion performance in the broadest sense of the word. For at least an hour after returning to scale, Oliver demonstrated consummate professionalism, fighting back a flood of tears while obliging with interview after interview. "Mate, Melbourne Cups don't mean a thing to me anymore. I'd give it back right now to have my brother back," he told Letts.

The Bless Report...

Arthur Hancock, who bred the \$4-million sale-topping mare **Bless** (Mr. Prospector), saw a lot of talent in the unraced three-year-old. "This mare never raced after fracturing a bone in her knee during a thunderstorm," Hancock explained. "When you watch her out in the field, she's a flyer. She's gonna make a heckuva broodmare." Explaining why he sold Bless, Hancock added, "You've got to sell horses to pay the bills. I guess that's the main reason we sold her. I think it's ironic. She was in the same stall here as Fusaichi Pegasus and brought the exact same amount of money." Of the overall strength of the two-day old November sale, Hancock added, "I think the market is excellent. Mares are selling great today, but they have a lot of quality. This is the best breeding stock sale in America. I never know what to think before a sale, but horses are great investments." John Adger, bidding on behalf of Stonerside, was the underbidder on the prized mare. "Our limit was \$4 million," Adger said. "Our last bid was always going to be \$3.9 million. She was from a priceless family and it might be different if we didn't still own part of the family. Mr. Plummer could possibly get his money back on the first foal he sells back." Stonerside owns Angel Fever's 1995 foal by Forty Niner and will race an Unbridled yearling filly out of that mare.

Seattle Slew Filly Top Weanling...

A filly by Triple Crown winner Seattle Slew topped the list of weanlings sold yesterday. The bay, out of GSP Artful Pleasure (Nasty and Bold), was consigned by Eaton Sales, agent, and was purchased for \$640,000 by bloodstock agent John Ferguson. The weanling is a half sister to Grade I winner Peeping Tom (Eagle Eyed). "She is a lovely filly," commented Ferguson. "She's a sister to a Grade I winner with a lot of black type in her pedigree. I'm happy to get her."

Hip 321 -- *May Star (f, 3, Unbridled--Trolley Song, by Caro {Ire})* Consigned by Michael Byrne, agent; Purchased for \$360,000 by Audley Farm

May Star, a full sister to Unbridled's Song, was offered in foal to Giant's Causeway. The mare is carrying a colt, according to a fetal sex determination test. Jens von Lepel, general manager of Audley Farm, which purchased the colt for \$360,000, said,, "We liked her very much because she is in foal to Giant's Causeway and carrying a colt. We thought, based on what we saw yesterday, that she would make a lot more money than she did. We were very pleased to get her for this price. She was the number one mare on our list for today. We tried to buy on Monday, but the market was very strong. We like to buy in this price range, but it's tough to find a good horse. We will wait and see with the foal. It's possible that we will sell him back as a yearling." Audley Farm, the breeder of GI Ruffian H. winner Mandy's Gold, is located in Virginia.

Hip 435 -- (*c, wnlg, Giant's Causeway--Truly a Dream {Ire}, by Darshaan {GB}*)

Consigned by FitzGerald/Keogh, Agent XVII
The weanling Irish-bred colt by Giant's Causeway went unsold at \$575,000. He is out of the winner of the G3 Prix de Royaumont in France and the GII E.P. Taylor in Canada, from the family of French GSW Truly Special and G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Cerulean Sky

Hip 343 -- *Nannerl (m, 5, Valid Appeal--Allouette, by Proud Birdie)* Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent; Purchased for \$1.25 million by ClassicStar

"We loved her pedigree and the fact that her offspring have sold well," S. David Plummer said of his \$1.25-million purchase. "We are constantly looking for good fillies and mares. We are not in the business of racing colts, so we look for fillies with nice pedigrees that will make good broodmares."

Hip 344 -- *Nasty Storm (f, 4, Gulch--A Stark is Born, by Graustark)* Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent; Purchased by Frank Stronach for \$1.075 million

Nasty Storm is nominated to the GII Churchill Downs Distaff this weekend, a race she won a year ago, but Stronach is not sure that she will run. "We'll take a look at it and make a decision. But we basically wanted to have her as a broodmare. I thought that it was a fair price, in line with what I expected for the most part. I think that the market has been fairly strong so far. The good horses seem to be selling for good money."

Hip 371 -- *Rose of Tara (Ire) (m, 6, Generous--Flame of Tara {Ire}, by Artaius)* Consigned by Glennwood Farm Voute Sales, Agent III; Purchased by Chiefswood Stables for \$1.95 million

Chiefswood, a small farm north of Toronto, is owned by Robert Krembil. He was assisted by local agent Jim Schenck. Chiefswood bought a pair of yearlings at the 2001 September Sale and was back again this past September for another two purchases; a Pulpit filly for \$240,000 and a Storm Cat-Lilac Garden filly for \$950,000. The Storm Cat is a full to SW February Storm and a half to Hong Kong SW and G1SP Electronic Unicorn and Kentucky Oaks winner Blushing K.D. This was their first trip to the November Sale. "This is an upper-end purchase for us and it's the most money we've ever spent on a single horse. She was a very good-looking individual and well-conformed, but what really appealed to us was the dam and the entire female family. She had a lot going for her. In foal to Storm Cat, she makes a nice addition to our broodmare band. This wasn't the only mare we were after, but she was certainly one of our priorities." The farm's broodmare band numbers 16 with this purchase. The mare will be taken to Canada so that the foal will be eligible for Canadian-bred incentives. Krembil expects to race the foal. "We breed to race," he explained.

Hip 407 -- Starine (Fr) (m, 5, Mendocino--Grisonnante, by Kaldoun) Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent; Purchased by Newsells Park Stud for \$1 million

Robert Acton, adviser to Klaus Jacobs, said of the Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Turf winner, "Our initial assessment is that we will send her to Newsells and will breed her next year. She is very correct and the good thing is that she can be bred to almost anything. The price was as high as we were going to be willing to go to get her." Alice Chandler, whose Mill Ridge consigned the mare, said, "I am very happy with the sale. I thought the price was fair. We had to enter her as a broodmare prospect because at the time the sale closed, [trainer] Bobby [Frankel] was unsure what was going to happen with her for the rest of the year. If we offered her as a racing prospect and something showed up on X-ray, the buyer would have a right to turn her back. She's a lovely mare. She shipped over here just one day after she arrived at Mill Ridge and everyone that saw her was very impressed with her. I don't think the fact that she was offered as a broodmare prospect only impacted the price."

Hip 447 -- Warrior Queen (m, 5, Quiet American--Call Me Fleet, by Afleet) Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent; Purchased by BBA (Ireland) for \$2 million

Adrian Nicoll of the BBA Ireland signed the ticket for Jim Fleming. Fleming, a native of Australia, owns Tyrell Stud Farm outside of Sydney. He campaigned Hula Angel, winner of the 1999 Irish 1000 Guineas. "She's a wonderful racemare," Fleming commented. "We look for mares that have been strong at the racetrack. Knowing that she was carrying a colt was definitely a factor in our decision [mare was fetal sexed before the sale]. We don't have any mares at home with this kind of pedigree, but right now there are no plans to send her to Australia. She is an American mare and this is where she should stay. We came here thinking that the market would be down, but that wasn't the case with this mare." Warrior Queen will be boarded at Spendthrift Farm.

Nicoll added, "Jim and I go way back. I bought Hula Angel for him. We thought the mare was outstanding. She was an excellent racemare and had a lot of speed, which is something we look for in a mare. She's in foal to A.P. Indy, what more needs to be said? We thought she was the best of the day. She was the one we've been targeting for the past few days."

Tom Van Meter, whose Eaton Sales consigned the mare added, "That was awesome. She is one of the best mares that I have ever seen in 10 years of selling horses. She has a ton of quality, she could run, she's from the family of Storm Bird. Mr. Fleming kept asking me 'how much is she going to bring?' He must have been back to the barn five times to see her."

ORIENTATE TO GAINESWAY Orientate (Mt. Livermore--Dream Team, by Cox's Ridge), winner of the Breeders' Cup Sprint, has been purchased for stud duty by a partnership consisting of Graham J. Beck's Gainesway Farm in Lexington and Arrowfield Stud in Australia. The four-year-old, who will shuttle between the two stud farms in 2003, will stand the Northern Hemisphere season for \$25,000 live foal, payable November 1. A Southern Hemisphere fee has yet to be announced for the leading sprint champion candidate for 2002. "Orientate has come full circle at Gainesway," said the farm's Director of Sales Michael Hernon. "We bred, raised and sold him to Bob and Beverly Lewis, through trainer D. Wayne Lukas, to race and now he will return to stud alongside his sire, Mt. Livermore. That's the way the game is supposed to work." Obviously "thrilled with the acquisition," Arrowfield Stud owner John Messara commented, "This is a horse for the times in Australia. He has got everything we look for, and most importantly, he will provide the outcross which has succeeded so well with the Northern Dancer blood predominately in Australia." The winner of the Indiana Derby as a sophomore, the colt came into his own this year with an impressive string of graded victories, including the GII A.G. Vanderbilt H. Aug. 11 and the Sept. 1 GI Forego H. The winner of 10 of 19 races over three seasons, Orientate retired with earnings of \$1,716,950.

CLASSIC'S STAR ON THE RISE

David Plummer has a fairly simple and straightforward strategy when it comes to the sales. "Buy the best, breed to the best, sell the best." The Nevada resident is well on his way to fulfilling at least the first of those goals after one seven-figure horse yesterday and two more today at the Keeneland November Sale.

Born in Japan and raised in Hawaii, Plummer never spent any time on or near a horse farm, yet took an interest in the game while a student at the University of Utah in the mid 1970s. He wrote his Master's thesis on the topic of "Tax Shelters in Horse Racing," and has been involved in horses ever since.

"The first horse I ever owned was Voom Voom, which was given to me by Preston Madden," explained Plummer. "He wasn't a bad horse, but I mismanaged him terribly. If the horse wasn't good, it was because of me."

He eventually became involved in quarter horses and was the leading breeder of quarter horse winners in the world from 1988-1992. He began to move into Thoroughbreds in 1990 and owned interests in horses like Danzig Connection and Twining. It has been only recently that he and his partners, who collectively operate as ClassicStar LLC, have begun to focus on building a quality broodmare band. Plummer serves the group as its president and general manager and, at the request of his partners, handles the bidding inside the pavilion.

In its current form, ClassicStar has been around for just over 2 1/2 years. In addition to Plummer, the group includes Thom Robinson, Tony Ferguson and "silent" partner John Parrott. All three of Plummer's partners are executives with a company named Gastar, an "exploration and production company with a focus on natural gas assets in the U.S. and Australia," according to the company's website. Plummer is the fourth largest individual stockholder in the enterprise.

The 53-year-old credits Kentucky horseman Rick Littrell of Viking Stud with helping to maintain his interest in the business, even when times were not so rosy.

"He has always been very encouraging and kept me in the game," Plummer says. "I wouldn't be nearly as involved in this business right now if it weren't for him. He's been incredibly helpful."

And while the resources ClassicStar has brought to Lexington might be something other than natural, they are plentiful. Plummer expresses his hopes for the future simply and succinctly. "We hope to be competitive in a competitive market."

This is the time of year when two-year-old stakes over a distance of ground take on a particular significance. Saturday's GIII Nashua S. revealed two colts who we might hear more about as classic hopefuls in Added Edge and the runner-up Outer Reef, a beautifully bred son of Pulpit.

Added Edge, who was making his first start away from Woodbine, took his record to four-for-four with this convincing victory. He had previously won a maiden event, which he followed up with wins in the Silver Deputy S. and Swynford S.

Added Edge is a member of the third crop of Mr. Prospector's son Smart Strike and is his 11th stakes winner. Six of those stakes winners have scored in 2002, and in addition to Added Edge, they include Portcullis, who captured the Canadian classic Breeders' S. and GIII Toronto Cup, and Tenpins, whose stakes wins include the GII Washington Park H. and GIII Fayette S.

Added Edge is out of Sweet Nostalgia, who won the Cleopatre S. and Four Winds S., and gained a graded stakes credit with a third in the GIII Churchill Downs Breeders' Cup H. Sweet Nostalgia has been making a fine start to her stud career as Added Edge is her fourth winner from four foals, the others include Gold Memory, a stakes winner of \$252,151, who also finished second in the GIII Arlington Matron H. Since Gold Memory is by Mr. Prospector's son Crafty Prospector, she is a three-parts sister to Added Edge.

Sweet Nostalgia's sire is the Grey Dawn II stallion Mr. Redoy, and this might be significant since Smart Strike's granddam No Class bred champion Canadian

two-year-old Grey Classic to the cover of Grey Dawn II. Added Edge's granddam Maritza, by the Crimson Satan horse High Roll raced primarily in Puerto Rico where she was champion imported filly at both two and three.

Maritza was the only stakes winner produced by her dam Tudor Gleam, herself a half sister to the very speedy Shimatoree, but she has a half sister, Elease Baby, who produced Release the Lyd, a stakes winner who was also placed in the GII Adirondack S. and GI Selima S., and the South African graded stakes winner Sprinting Light. In tail female the family goes back to a sister to the prominent French sire Ajax, a horse who had a tremendous influence on North American racing through his sons Bull Dog, Sir Gallahad III and Case Ace (broodmare sire of Raise a Native) and his daughter, La Troienne.

Added Edge has a rather intriguing pedigree pattern as he is 4 x 5 to the sisters Sequence (granddam of Mr. Prospector) and Miss Fleetwood (granddam of High Roll, the broodmare sire of Added Edge). Since Added Edge's stakes winning three-parts sister Gold Memory is also by a son of Mr. Prospector, this pattern might be significant.

Reportedly, Added Edge is to be pointed towards the GI Kentucky Derby, and his prospects of getting the trip seem encouraging. Smart Strike stayed well enough take the GI Philip H. Iselin H. over 1 1/16 miles, and his two highest earners, Portcullis and Tenpins, both stay well. Added Edge's distance prospects are also helped by the fact that he is out of Mr. Redoy, whose sire Grey Dawn II is a stamina influence, and who himself won the GI Charles H. Strub S. and GIII San Gabriel H. Given that Smart Strike's offspring have been improving with age, Added Edge looks one to bear in mind for the future.

ENRIQUE SARASOLA DIES Enrique Sarasola, owner of **Helissio (Fr)** (Fairy King {USA}), has died following a long illness, it was announced yesterday. He was 65. The San Sebastian-born self-made businessman was famed for his connection with the Elie-Lellouche-trained colt, who powered away with the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp in 1996, recording a five-lengths success from Pilsudski (Ire). "He was a man who loved horses and racing and had all the qualities that go with that," Lellouche told the *Racing Post*. "He was a good man, and I trained all his biggest winners." Helissio also captured two renewals of the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, the G1 Prix Ganay and G1 Prix Lupin for Sarasola, owner of the La Zarzuela racecourse in Madrid between 1992 and 1996. He also owned **Vert Amande (Fr)** (Kenmare {Fr}), who took the G1 Prix Ganay in 1993, having finished third in the previous year's Arc, and **Partipral (USA)** (Procida {USA}), winner of the 1995 G1 Hong Kong Vase and the G3 Gran Premio Memorial Duque de Toledo at his track in Madrid.
