TATTERSALLS FOALS SELL TODAY

Business resumes at Tattersalls in Newmarket, England this morning when the four-day December Foal Sale gets underway, but it won't be until the two select days, Friday and Saturday, that this auction hits full throttle. There is no mistaking the standout individual on paper, Lot 909, a first-crop Giant's Causeway filly out of G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Urban Sea (Miswaki). Urban Sea, half sister to the G1 2000 Guineas winner and first-season sire King's Best (Kingmambo), is the dam of last year's dual Derby hero Galileo (Ire) and recent Italian Group 1 winner Black Sam Bellamy (Ire). The mare's May 7-born foal, whose half sister made 1.1 million guineas 12 months ago, is consigned by the Irish National Stud for breeder Sunderland Holding Inc. Giant's Causeway has a dozen lots catalogued from his first crop, while other freshman sires represented include the brilliant duo Sinndar (Ire) and Montjeu (Ire) along with other top-class performers including Sendawar (Ire), King's Best and Diktat (GB). Lot 935 is a rare European representative for Japan's recently deceased record-breaking champion sire Sunday Silence. Offered by John Troy as agent, the colt is out of the Listed-placed Darrery (GB) (Darshaan {GB}). Lot 1194 is an own brother to last year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner Rose Gypsy (GB), while other well-related entries include: Lot 1265, a Royal Applause (GB) half brother to this season's G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Airwave (GB); and Lot 779, a half brother to the G2 Great Voltigeur S. winner Bandari (Ire) from the first crop of Trans Island (GB) (Selkirk). Danehill's entries include Lot 869, a filly out of the multiple Group 3 winner Delilah (Danzig) consigned from Goldford Stud as agent for Austerson Hall Stud. Sadler's Wells' team includes Lot 959, a colt out of Bella Vitessa (Ire) offered from David and Diane Nagle's Barronstown Stud. Tattersalls Marketing Manager Jimmy George said yesterday, "It's a good solid catalogue and a series of highly successful yearling sales will have undoubtedly instilled confidence in the pinhookers. The obvious standout is the Giant's Causeway half sister to Galileo and Black Sam Bellamy out of Urban Sea, but all the top European stallions are well represented and I think this year's group of first-season sires are particularly exciting." Selling begins at 11 a.m. today and then 9:30 a.m. from Thursday through Saturday.

Horseman are a notoriously superstitious breed. However those sort of concerns were clearly not in the mind of S. David Plummer when he payed \$1 million for the mare Roll Over Baby, Hip 13 at the 2002 KEEJAN.

Although Roll Over Baby, a stakes winner and producer, was in foal to Unbridled's Song, the big attraction at the time was that her current two-year-old was the undefeated and extremely promising Werblin. The esteem in which Werblin was held was underlined just one hip later when his yearling brother was knocked down for \$1.1 million.

As hoped at the time of her purchase, Roll Over Baby has become the dam of a graded stakes winner, but in one of the ironies which abound in this business, that horse is not the \$850,000 yearling Werblin, but his year younger half brother, Roll Hennessy Roll, who slipped through the September Yearling Sales for just \$52,000.

The \$1 million paid for Roll Over Baby in January represents a considerable advance on the \$4,700 at which she was an RNA at the Beulah August Yearling Sale of 1990, and the \$30,000 which she realized at the 1993 Keeneland November Sales. She has certainly earned her increase in value, however. An Ohio-bred, Roll Over Baby was a very tough customer in that state's restricted program. In 19 starts, she won 10 races and only failed to make the first three on one occasion. In Ohio-bred stakes, she won six times, with five seconds and two thirds, retiring with earnings of \$180,806. Roll Over Baby began her stud career by producing the Carson City colt, Majorbigtimesheet. Still competing in stakes at the age of seven, Majorbigtimesheet has amassed over \$300,000, earning black-type wins in the Westchester S. and Express H., and also taking third in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship. Roll Over Baby's second foal, the Phone Trick filly Laptop, was a \$160,000 yearling, but failed

to win in six starts, and was resold in foal to Scatmandu for \$42,000 at the Keeneland November Sales.

Roll Over Baby's third foal, a 1997 Brocco colt named Morocco, was her first foray into seven-figure production, fetching no less than \$2 million at the Barretts March Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. A winner of four races in 13 starts, Morocco has now earned \$129,740, without ever raising a shadow of a hope that he might be worth his purchase price. Morocco was followed by Werblin, who, as mentioned, made \$850,000 at the Keeneland July Sales. The son of Unbridled's Song was undefeated in two starts at two, but hasn't been seen out since this spring, when in three starts, he finished second in the San Pedro S. and third in the GII San Rafael S. and GII San Vicente S.

When we consider that Roll Over Baby, a one-time \$4,700 RNA is still only 13-years-old and has already produced a trio of graded-stakes performers, and offspring which have sold for \$2 million and \$1.2 million, we'd have to conclude that she's come a long way baby.

Into Roll Over Baby's offspring, it had been some time since the family has been of more than regional interest. Roll Over Baby is a half sister to two other Ohio-bred stakes winners; I'll Be Praised and Best Jest. Her dam, Sweet Praise, by Honey Jay, is a sister to Sweet Rejoice, winner of the restricted Queen City Oaks and Ohio Debutante S., and to the Valedictorian H. victress Mystic. The granddam Sky Tribute won just once, but she is a half sister to Sweet Audrey (by Honey Jay, and therefore a three-parts sister to the dam of Roll Over Baby), who rose from the Ohio-bred ranks to capture the 1980 renewal of the GIII Falls City H. Ultimately, the family does have some classic antecedents: Roll Over Baby's sixth dam Bongo is a three-parts sister to the Preakness S. victor High Quest, and from the same tail female line as Arts and Letters, Grindstone and Waquoit.

Roll Hennessy Roll, as his name suggests, is by Storm Cat's son Hennessy. In winning the GIII Hollywood Prevue S., Roll Hennessy Roll, has actually gone one better than his sire, who was second in the same race in a season in which he also won the GI Hopeful S., GII Sapling S. and GII Hollywood Juvenile Championship, and finished second by a neck to Roll Over Baby's frequent consort Unbridled's Song in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Roll Hennessy Roll is a member of Hennessy's third crop and Hennessy is already sire of 15 stakes winners, including last year's world champion juvenile, Johannesburg and other Northern Hemisphere group and graded stakes winners Wiseman's Ferry, Orchard Park, Keats, Distilled and Sunray Spirit.

MARKET STAYS STRONG BUT MANY ARE CHEAP

After Goffs sold 951 head last week for €18,152,000--an 11-percent rise in gross and nine-percent rise in average--Tattersalls opened its December Sale in Newmarket on Monday with the final significant yearling sale of 2002. Most of Monday's summary numbers make very impressive reading: number sold up 58 percent, gross up 88 percent, and the average up 19 percent. But buried at the bottom of those numbers is a more sobering statistic: the median, unchanged at 9,000gns (about \$14,625). At Goffs, 613 foals (weanlings) sold for a median of €10,000, up five percent from last year's median of €9,500.

Though the sales are taking place at the moment in Europe, overproduction is rearing its ugly head on both sides of The Pond. Good individuals by good sires bring big money, which is great if you have one of those, but with the number of mares being bred to sires the last few years, there's always another one around the corner. If fate deals you a moderate individual by anything other than a red-hot sire, the economic consequences can make pretty depressing reading. And heaven help you if your yearling or foal is by a sire whose name is out of the news, or by a sire with first two-year-olds who hasn't yet caught the attention of buyers.

Even really well-established and successful sires are not immune. Consider a few of these medians from this year's yearling sales, taken from Racing Update's 2002 Yearling Compendium, covering yearling sales through Tattersalls' October: **Diesis** (26 sold of 38 offered) - \$48,127; **Carson City** (27/34) - \$47,000; **Summer Squall** (18/21) - \$33,500; The venerable **Silver Hawk** (16/25) - \$32,000; **Cryptoclearance** (32/43) - a paltry \$10,250. Even last year's leading Sire, **Thunder Gulch** (19/26), had a 2002 yearling median of just \$55,000.

Some relatively successful stallions with just a few crops racing: **Distant View** (34/39) - \$21,000; **Holy Bull** (16/23) - \$20,000; **Pleasant Tap** (32/37) - \$17,250; **Langfuhr** (25/41) - \$15,000; **Pine Bluff** (9/11) - \$13,000.

Sires with first two-year-olds: **Formal Gold** (29/42) - \$31,000; **Deputy Commander** (46/68) - \$27,500; **Skip Away** (45/58) - \$17,000; **Favorite Trick** (30/42) - \$16,500 and **Gentlemen** (25/32) - \$12,000.

Guess wrong and you've had it. Even first-crop yearling sires got the treatment, witness the winners of the 1998 Triple Crown races: Belmont winner **Victory Gallop** (39/62) had a median of just \$25,000, while Derby and Preakness winner **Real Quiet's** median (45/53) was only \$11,000.

This trend continued at Goffs' foal sale last week. **Danehill Dancer**, one of the hottest young sires in Europe, had 23 foals sell (of 28 offered), for a median of €21,000. OK, they were out of 'moderate' mares, but he's standing for €30,000 next year. **Alhaarth**, another successful sire with first three-year-olds this year: seven sold (of eight), median € 22,000--stud fee for 2003: €20,000; **Desert Prince**, one of Europe's top freshman sires, also had seven of eight sell, his median €37,000. Among sires with their first foals 2002: Dubai World Cup winner **Almutawakel**--18/22, median €13,500; **Indian Lodge** (11/14)--€10,000; even **Namid** (27/33), whom the Judges liked, and had a lot out of mares with decent pedigrees--median €15,000. There's not a lot of margin for error at those prices. And then there's the plainly good yearling sale on Monday, the one with the 9,000gns (\$14,625) median.

Swing for the Fences...

The fact that so many sires are covering so many mares these days can mean only one thing: there aren't enough good mares to go around. And most of those good mares are in 'private' (non-commercial) hands. A record number of mares with holes in their pedigrees--especially weak first dams--are being overbred to stallions who you can make a case for.

When you get a good individual who vets (where appropriate), you will get 'all the money.' Otherwise, well, you can read the results. That's why commercial breeders these days survive on home run balls. Broken-bat singles don't pay. This is also why, in spite of the auction markets this year continuing to hold up well, stud fees for 2003 are dropping; otherwise they won't attract the mares.

Outstanding in a Field Study...

My most recent informal survey of 163 Kentucky stallions with announced 2003 stud fees who stood this year reveals the following: 12 advances, 80 the same, 71 declines. Nearly half are the same as this year, and otherwise declines outstrip advances 6-to-1. Oh, to be able to just breed a racehorse, and not worry about how it will sell: Shadwell's **Aljabr** (first foals this year), a son of Storm Cat who was a Grade 1 winner at two, three, and four-\$15,000; Claiborne's **Arch**, who had 35 yearlings average an impressive \$110,000 this year, stays at \$15,000. **Boundary**, a reasonably successful Danzig horse, also stands at Claiborne, and is down to \$10,000. **Formal Gold**, with those great Beyer numbers and 14 two-year-old winners, is also \$10,000, at Gainesway. Lane's End's pair of **Pleasant Tap** (\$15,000) and **Pine Bluff** (\$10,000) are both good, proven sires at knockdown prices; and even Ashford's **Stravinsky**, Europe's top sprinter of 1999 who had 64 yearlings sell (86 offered) for an average of \$81,830 (median \$53,049), has had his stud fee now halved since 2000, to \$17,500.

In this respect, it's a mighty cold climate in which a pretty attractive group of new stallions enter stud. I'll have more to say about these in due course, but I want to mention two in particular, who I hope don't get lost in the shuffle. Juddmonte is debuting a son of Cozzene called **Mizzen Mast**, for \$15,000. He loved fast turf and hated soft under Criquelette Head's tutelage, and won the Malibu and Strub on dirt for Frankel. He was a serious horse. And I think **Pure Prize**, at \$7500 at Vinery, is a great buy. Larry Ensor and I went up to Turfway for Kentucky Cup day during the September sale. In what turned out to be his final career start, Pure Prize annihilated his field in the Kentucky Cup Classic.

Larry called him the winner as they galloped to post; in fact, he was just as impressive that day as was Vindication in the Kentucky Cup Juvenile, and you know what he went on to do. Oh yes, and Pure Prize just happens to be by Storm Cat out of Heavenly Prize, so he's not short on pedigree, either.

Finally, can I put in my two cents' worth about the pedigree of Falbrav, the Arc ninth who won the G1 Japan Cup last weekend, completing a notable double for world-class rider Frankie Dettori. Since all pedigree theorists I know work from the assumption that "that which has worked before is more likely to work (again) than that which hasn't yet worked," it was a pretty good bet that, after Helissio won the 1996 Arc, every Slewpy mare in Europe would be sent to Fairy King. But Andrew Caulfield posed the question yesterday, why should Fairy King and Slewpy be such a potent combination? I have an opinion about that. I don't know why, but I am sure of this: unusually for a European stallion, Fairy King loved Nasrullah-line mares. He had 45 'A Runners' to the end of last year, and a massive 15 of them were out of Nasrullah-line mares. I guarantee you the percentage of Nasrullah-line mares in Europe in the years Fairy King was at stud--or that he was bred to--was a whole lot lower than a third. For whatever reason, and it may be to do with Fairy King being much more of a sprint-built and sprint-siring type than his full brother Sadler's Wells or their three-quarter brother, Nureyev, Fairy King just loved Nasrullah. For my money, that's the answer. Simple as that.

Roll Hennessy Roll's pedigree is something of an out cross with no duplicated ancestors in the first five generations. Roll Over Baby's sire, Rolling On Over, is a great-grandson of Hail to Reason, and Storm Cat and his sons have generally not been particularly successful with Hail to Reason-line mares, other than those descending via Stop the Music. Honey Jay, the sire of the second dam of Roll Hennessy Roll, does appear as broodmare sire of two Storm Cat stakes winners. Honey Jay is by a son of Balladier, as is Storm Cat's granddam, Terlingua, and Roll Hennessy Roll's dam, also carries Beanie M, a mare who is three-quarters related to Balladier.

Churchill Allowance Attracts Well-Bred Duo:

Roar of the Tiger (Storm Cat), a full brother to European champion Giant's Causeway, makes his American and dirt debut in today's ninth race at Churchill Downs. The three-year-old colt was a debut winner at Naas as a two-year-old for trainer Aidan O'Brien, but has not won since. Most recently, he ran fifth in the July 13 G2 International S. at The Curragh. Roar of the Tiger was purchased as a stallion prospect by Dwight and Perry Sutherland and is now trained by Lynn Whiting. "We trained him on the grass and he didn't show me much, but then we worked him on the dirt six furlongs out of the gate and he impressed me," Whiting said. "He's done well since then and if he runs the way he trains, I expect that he'll run pretty good." Today's ninth race, a one-mile allowance, also attracted **Mineshaft** (A.P. Indy), another well-bred colt making his American and main track bow. Mineshaft, previously trained by John Gosden and now under the tutelage of Neil Howard, is a full brother to Grade I winner Tomisue's Delight. A winner once in seven starts, the colt has been off since a second-place effort in a Sept. 13 Doncaster conditions event.

Judge T C to New York:

Multiple graded stakes winner **Judge T C** (Judge Smells--I'm Pretty, by Secretariat), who is currently the leading North American third-crop sire in 2002 with 74 winners, will head to Joe and Anne McMahon's McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds, LLC in Saratoga Springs for the 2003 breeding season. The 11-year-old stallion will stand for \$8,500 live foal. "Judge T C has it all," commented Joe McMahon. "He fills several important niches for breeders in the Northeast." The winner of the 1995 GII Fayette S. has sired Grade I winner Lady Shari, graded stakes winners The Judge Sez Who and Zone Judge; and multiple stakes winner Request for Parole. From three crops, the dark bay has 11 stakes winners and the earners of \$6,589,646.
