ANOTHER GUILTY PLEA IN SCANDAL

Glen DaSilva, one of three individuals implicated in the bet-rigging scandals that exploded after the Breeders' Cup, pled guilty yesterday to one count of money laundering and one count of conspiracy to commit wire and computer fraud in Federal District Court in White Plains, New York. Chris Harn, the admitted mastermind behind the schemes, pled guilty last month to similar charges. Derrick Davis, the third individual involved in the scandal, is expected to plead guilty this morning. DaSilva will be sentenced March 11 and could be sentenced to 25 years in prison. Though he has not entered into a plea bargain agreement, prosecutors have recommended that he get a prison sentence ranging from 21 to 27 months. DaSilva's lawyer, Ed Hayes, said his client was basically an honest person whose judgment was clouded by a drug problem. "Here's a young man who got involved in something he shouldn't have and he's going to take his medicine, which isn't going to be fun," Hayes said. "He's been saying, 'What was I thinking of?' He knows that it was a stupid thing to do. He was misusing drugs at the time and was unemployed and did some foolish things." Davis, Harn and DaSilva were fraternity brothers in the 1990s at Tau Kappa Epsilon at Drexel University. Despite his guilty pleas, DaSilva tried to distance himself from the actual Pick Six bet that aroused suspicion when Davis held the only six winning tickets purchased on the wager. He said he was only involved in prior schemes and had no knowledge that Davis and Harn were conspiring to collect fraudulent winnings in the Breeders' Cup. He also said he had no knowledge that Davis was involved in any way until his name surfaced at a later date. "I was under the impression that it was just Chris and I," he said. "Chris placed the bets and changed the bets. I just opened the account." It was not clear whether or not Harn and Davis intended to cut DaSilva in on their Breeders' Cup winnings, which exceeded \$3 million before they were caught.

Falvelon Sharp Ahead of Title Defense...

Falvelon (Aus) (Alannon {Aus}), in search of a third consecutive victory in the Hong Kong Sprint, upped to Group 1 status this year, looked well in his final serious pre-race work, covering the final 400 meters in a sparkling :22.1 beneath his regular rider Damien Oliver. "He felt good, comparable to the last couple of years," Oliver said. "If anything, he's probably even more relaxed this year now that he's so accustomed to being here." The six-year-old defeated America's Morluc by a head in 2000 and by an even narrower

margin a year ago. His trainer wouldn't trade places with anyone. "I think we've again got the right horse here," commented Dan Bougoure, who added that at today's barrier draw he'd prefer "the five, six or seven spot."

Eishin Preston No Longer an Unknown...

An unheralded 25-1 outsider when he won the G1 Hong Kong Mile in 2001, **Eishin Preston** (Green Dancer) arrives in the colony off an identical prep race as he did a year ago, a runner-up finish in the G1 Mile Championship at Kyoto Nov. 17. The five-year-old, entered for the 2000-meter Cup this time around, is undefeated over the Sha Tin turf, successfully stretching out in distance to win the G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup this past April. The bay two-minute licked one lap around the Sha Tin all-weather track yesterday morning and connections are cautiously optimistic about the weekend. "I will give him a fast workout [this morning]," said trainer Shuji Kitahashi. "We have no idea what is going to happen in the race, but it's fingers crossed."

Ekraar Tanned and Ready To Run...

Ekraar (Red Ransom) almost stole the show in last year's G1 Hong Kong Vase, leading nearly every step of the way beneath Frankie Dettori before getting caught in the final jump by Japan's Stay Gold (Jpn). The five-year-old son of Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Sacahuista is lightly raced with just three starts this season and comes in off a third-place finish in the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club e Coppa d'Oro at Milan Oct. 20. "I hope he can go one better this time," said Ekraar's regular work rider Ross Arnott. "I am very happy with him. He has had a month in Dubai before coming here and flourished in the sun." Dettori has the return call on Sunday.

Ange Gabriel...In the Footsteps of Terre A Terre...

Antonia Devin is no stranger to success at the International meeting. Her filly Terre A Terre (Fr) made a splash in last year's G1 Hong Kong Cup, charging late to finish third, 1/2 length behind Agnes Digital and Tobougg (Ire). Devin's colors will once again be on display when G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris winner **Ange Gabriel (Fr)** (Kaldounevees {Fr}) takes his spot in the G1 Vase. "His program this year has been geared with this race in mind," Henri Devin commented. "He is very well and I am very hopeful that he will do better than Terre A Terre did last year." The gray colt is expected to do his last bit of serious training on the turf this morning. Jockey Thierry Jarnet will ride on Sunday.

Ulundi Out of Hong Kong Cup...

Ulundi (GB) (Rainbow Quest) has been officially declared out of Sunday's G1 Hong Kong Cup. According to reports from the track veterinarian, the gelding arrived from his trans-continental trip with a high temperature and nasal discharge Monday morning. The seven-year-old, who is currently being treated for his travel-related illness, did not show sufficient improvement upon further examination Wednesday morning, hence the decision to rule him out of the weekend's lineup.

WHYTE TAKES IJC South African native Douglas Whyte defeated 11 other champion jockeys from all over the world to bag a bonus of HK\$200,000 in Wednesday's fifth renewal of the All-Star Hong Kong International Jockeys' Championship at Happy Valley Racecourse in Hong Kong. The two-time champion rider in Hong Kong, who collected 19 points throughout the three-part series, edged German champion Andreas Suborics by four points, thanks to the help of a win aboard Danehill Warrior in the contest's third and final leg. "This is one of the highlights of my career, especially as it is my first meeting back after a rough period, in which I was banned for seven racing days," Whyte explained. Jockey Yutaka Take, a 10-time riding leader in his native Japan, eked out a third-place finish with 12 points while four-time French champ Olivier Peslier nabbed fourth place with 10 points. Whyte's triumph represents the first score for Hong Kong in the International championship. Edgar Prado, a three-time leading jockey by number of winners in the United States, finished in a tie for ninth with British champion Frankie Dettori.

NYRA ALTERS TRIPLE TIARA, OFFERS BONUS

The New York Racing Association will restructure its Triple Tiara series for three-year-old fillies beginning next year. The first leg, the nine-furlong G1 Mother Goose S. June 28, will see its purse boosted from \$250,000 to \$300,000. It will be followed July 19 by the 1 1/2-mile G1 Coaching Club American Oaks, whose purse will increase from \$350,000 to \$500,000. The series will be completed by the 10-furlong \$750,000 G1 Alabama S. at Saratoga Aug. 16. Any sophomore filly to win all three of the events will be awarded a bonus of \$2 million. "Three-year-old fillies compete in the shadow of their male counterparts and we think they deserve more appreciation than that," explained NYRA Chairman and CEO Barry K. Schwartz. "Winning all three races is a very difficult challenge and one that deserves a significant reward. We believe ultimately that this will become the filly counterpart to the Triple Crown." The one-mile G1 Acorn S., previously the opening leg of the Triple Tiara, is set next year for Friday, June 6.

SYMPOSIUM OPENER KEYS ON INTEGRITY

Perhaps the silver lining to the black cloud of the Breeders' Cup Pick Six scandal is that racing industry leaders have exhibited unprecedented cooperation in working together to swiftly and aggressively address security, integrity and public perception problems. Those concerns were underlined at the 29th Symposium on Racing in Tucson, Arizona yesterday. "This is about how we control the validity of our livelihood," said John Walzak, chief operating officer of the Ontario Harness Horse Association. Walzak moderated the key morning session on "Integrity of Technology" in which speakers reviewed the swift and decisive steps taken to date to restore the public's confidence in the pari-mutuel wagering process. Greg Avioli of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association presented a timeline of the scandal's aftermath and voiced a common opinion that "very positive things will come out of this." The three major totalisator companies have already developed and tested new software to transmit betting data in secure ways and will complete installation at all tracks early next year. An industry-wide security audit is underway and communication with regulators, the media and the public has been excellent. Magna Entertainment Corporation, the New York Racing Association and Churchill Downs Inc.'s tracks have worked together to establish new rules aimed at restoring confidence in the wagering process and minimize odds changes after races have begun. Representatives from two high tech security vendors described software tools that will categorically audit and track the flow of betting data and ensure that tampering with pools becomes impossible.

Keeping It in Perspective...

In an earlier "National Issues and Perspectives" session, Lonny Powell, chief executive officer of Racing Commissioners International, echoed similar themes when stating that "we have a closet full of issues in terrible need of a good cleaning." Powell briefed the audience on steps agreed to at a Tuesday meeting to implement a uniform national workers' compensation insurance program for the entire industry. Dr. Scot Waterman outlined the progress achieved in just 12 months in building the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium from scratch. Over \$800,000 in contributions have been raised from 26 different industry groups to fund research in banned substances and build relationships with regulators. Early in 2003, the consortium will be incorporated as a non-profit organization, elect a board of directors, and hire a full-time executive director. In addition, Jay Hickey of the American Horse Council described looming issues that may surface in the years ahead to negatively impact the racing industry. Two problem gambling lawsuits--along the lines of class action litigation against the tobacco and gun industries--have been filed against lottery and casino interests. This trend could potentially spill over to racing. On another front, a new IRS auditing manual aimed specifically at uncovering tax violations by horse owners was circulated last spring to IRS examiners. These are issues that will be followed closely. The Tucson Symposium on Racing continues through Fri., Dec. 13.

Churchill Downs Incorporated has brought on Clifford Goodrich as president of Arlington Park and senior vice president of CDI's Illinois operations. In his 19 years at Santa Anita, Goodrich went from assistant general manager in 1980 to president, chief operating officer and board member. He spent the last two years as chief executive officer of the California Thoroughbred Horsemen's Foundation Inc., a non-profit organization that oversees the in-house medical and dental clinics for backstretch employees. Steve Sexton, who has been president of Arlington and head of CDI's Illinois operations since August 2001, has been named senior vice president of Kentucky operations and will serve as president of Churchill Downs and Ellis Park. Both Goodrich and Sexton will also oversee CDI's Trackside off-track betting operations in their respective states, and Sexton will manage CDI's interest in Kentucky Off-Track Betting Inc.

Pick Four, Pick Six Return to Hawthorne:

Beginning with tomorrow's live racing program, Hawthorne Race Course will reinstate wagering on Pick Four and Pick Six pools. Both wagers have been suspended since Nov. 9 in light of the Breeders' Cup Pick Six scandal, but officials at Hawthorne explained that adequate measures have been undertaken by Autotote and AmTote to provide better security for the wagers. Currently, added security measures have been installed in Ohio, Maryland and New York and only bettors in those jurisdictions can bet into the pools. There is a Pick Six carryover of \$11,000 on Friday's card.

OWNERS VAT BOOST

Racehorse owners in Britain received a welcome boost when the UK Government granted a three-year continuation, until 2005, of the VAT Registration Scheme. The scheme allows owners to recover VAT (value added tax) on the costs of ownership, such as a horse's purchase price and training fees, so long as they can prove that their racing activities are conducted in a businesslike fashion and that they attempt to generate income. The Racehorse Owners' Association and BHB welcomed the extension and Jim Furlong, the ROA's president, told *Racing Post*, "If it were to discontinue, it would wipe away much of the anticipated increases in prize money." Lord Donoughue, chairman of the BHB's VAT Registration Working Group, added, "I am delighted that BHB's highly professional contribution to the review has been rewarded with the Government's very welcome decision in support of a key British industry."
