Among the 560 entries at the initial yearling entry stage Dec. 4 Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum has the largest contingent, with 67 horses entered, while Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum has 40. Susan Magnier has 29 entered, while Michael Tabor has 25 yearlings engaged. "The Derby Dream has started for the owners of 560 yearlings," Stephen Wallis, managing director of Epsom racecourse, commented. "The Vodafone Derby is the race that matters and the increased number of yearling entries this year reflects the continued strength and appeal of the race. We wish all 175 different owners and breeders the best of luck."

As a pointer to which colt will land the Eclipse Award for two-year-old male, the Breeders' Cup Juvenile has a record second to none, with 14 of its first 18 winners completing the double. Unfortunately, this always fascinating contest has proven a less reliable guide in two other areas. It has so far been a conspicuous failure as a direct guide to the following year's Kentucky Derby, with Chief's Crown and Timber Country being the only ones to finish as high as third at Churchill Downs. Also, winning the Juvenile has been a far-from-automatic ticket to comparable success as a stallion, with none of the winners--not even the ones which led their generation--proving beyond doubt that he is as outstanding at stud as he was on the track.

It would have been a different story had Storm Cat held Tasso's last-gasp surge in the 1985 contest, but as things stand, the most successful stallions among the winners are Chief' Crown (AEI 2.37) and Unbridled's Song (AEI 2.18).

Several of the others have certainly had their moments, though. Capote has several Grade I winners to his name, headed by the 1996 Juvenile winner Boston Harbor; Success Express has seven Southern Hemisphere Group 1 winners; Is It True sired Yes It's True; and Rhythm is responsible for the Melbourne Cup winner Ethereal.

Among contemporary juvenile champions...

Of the winners in the early 'nineties, Fly So Free hit the bull's eye with Captain Steve, Arazi finally tasted Grade I success through Congaree and Brocco has Grade I-winning daughters in the U.S. and Australia.

Then there's Gilded Time, who became the first undefeated winner of the Juvenile when he took the 1992 race. This Vinery resident has underlined that he is good value at his 2003 fee of \$15,000 by siring Elloluv, a surprising, but decisive winner of the GI Hollywood Starlet S. From a sizable number of starters in 2002, Gilded Time has also been represented by that very tough distaffer Mandy's Gold, winner of the GI Ruffian H., and the very fast French gelding Crystal Castle, a winner at Group 3 and Group 2 levels in Europe.

These important winners represent something of a breakthrough for Gilded Time. Although he has enjoyed graded stakes success in the past with such as Elaborate, Time Limit, Early Flyer, Added Gold, Old Topper and Lasersport, he had not enjoyed Group I success in the Northern Hemisphere until Mandy's Gold scored over a mile and an eighth at Belmont in September. Part of the explanation could be that there aren't a lot of Grade I races contested over the distances which normally bring out the best in Gilded Time's stock (of his previous major winners, only Added Gold and his Brazilian Group 1 winner Band Gypsy had won a graded stake beyond seven furlongs).

The fact that Gilded Time's final clocking of 1:43.40 in the Juvenile was three fifths of a second slower than Eliza's time in the Fillies raised questions at the time about whether he was truly at his best around two turns. Unfortunately, he never got a chance to confirm his stamina. Thanks to prolonged problems with his feet, he had been off the track for a year before he finished a very creditable third in the Breeders' Cup Sprint. That excellent effort suggested that Gilded Time would make up for lost time in 1994, but he came out of the Malibu S. with an ankle chip and Vinery stepped in to buy a majority interest.

The popular choice to earn her fourth graded victory, Diamond Biko finished second to the phenomenal filly Fine Motion (Ire) (Danehill) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth Commemorative Cup at Kyoto Nov. 10. In a bit easier here, Diamond Biko rated well off the leaders after the break, but jockey Olivier Peslier opted to send his charge to the front just before the half after pedestrian fractions up front. She was never seriously threatened from there and galloped home for the confident win. "It was a wonderful riding performance by Olivier," said trainer Kazuo Fujisawa. "Though she doesn't often get the lead that early, she is a horse with good speed and I thought Olivier did the right thing."

White Carnival helped wrap up a family affair in dashing style, as the filly, bred and owned by Grand Farm's Yoshiyuki Ito and trained by his brother Keizo, sprinted home for the facile score and her first stakes success. Since breaking her maiden in June, White Carnival had failed to live up to her promise that she displayed in that contest--failing to make it into the winner's circle in four attempts--and went to post here as a longshot. Settled in fifth early, she quickly took control through the stretch and was under only a moderate drive to get the win.

As you would expect of a Vinery stallion in the mid-'nineties, Gilded Time received plenty of mares in his early years at stud--as many as 119 in 1997--but his crops of 2000 and 2001 are quite a lot smaller. Support has picked up again, though, with 104 mares in 2001 and 116 this year.

One of the features of Gilded Times' stallion career has been the success he has enjoyed with mares by Mr. Prospector and his sons. Crystal Castle is one of his 12 foals out of Mr. Prospector mares; his five foals out of Gulch mares feature the Grade II winner Elaborate and the stakes-winning Interminable Gold; his Grade II winner Added Gold is out of a Stutz Blackhawk mare; and the Grade III-winning Lasersport is one of his four foals out of Forty Niner mares.

Now he has sired Elloluv from a mare by Mr. Prospector's grandson Cryptoclearance. As Cryptoclearance gained three of his graded wins over 1 1/4 miles, it isn't so surprising that Elloluv is proving another exception to the general rule that Gilded Time's progeny possess more speed than stamina (even though her dam, Currency Quest, gained her stakes win over 5 1/2 furlongs at two).

It is also easy to see why Gilded Time would suit a daughter of Cryptoclearance. In common with several of Fappiano's other good sons, Cryptoclearance is rather narrow in front, whereas Gilded Time is a muscular, powerful individual with a broad chest and quarters.

Maryland Slot Revenue Distribution Causes a Stir:

An SEC filing has revealed that Maryland Ventures, a group comprised of Joe DeFrancis, his sister Karin and other former minority owners of Pimlico and Laurel Park, are slated to get 65 percent of the pretax revenue from slot machines at Maryland Thoroughbred tracks for the first five years that the slots are up and running. The Maryland Ventures percentage would drop to 50 percent after five years, to 40 percent after 10 years and would end after 20 years. A report in the *Washington Post* quoted "several of Maryland's legislative leaders" as remarking that "if too much money lands in the pockets of a small collection of wealthy track owners, public support for slots could evaporate." Incoming House Speaker Michael Busch, a democrat opposed to slots, added, "The idea of creating bonanzas for individuals out there is not something we as elected officials should be entertaining."

After torrential rains delayed the opening of the Tampa Bay Downs winter/spring meet this past weekend, things finally get underway this afternoon with a full 11-race card that is highlighted by the \$50,000 Inaugural S. for two-year-olds. Post time for the first race is 12:25 p.m.
