CONQUISTADOR CIELO DIES

Champion **Conquistador Cielo** (Mr. Prospector--K D Princess, by Bold Commander) was euthanized Tuesday at Claiborne Farm near Paris, Kentucky. He had been suffering from founder in his left front leg. "It was sad, sad for me and sad for all of us here,"

Claiborne Farm Manager Gus Koch told *Thoroughbred Times*. "He was a very likeable horse--a nice horse and we hated to lose him. He spent his entire career here and we feel fortunate for that." The 23-year-old stallion became the first of Woody

Stevens's record five straight Belmont S. winners when he captured the 1982 renewal of the Classic. Only six days before his Belmont victory, the bay dominated the field in the GI Metropolitan Mile, winning the race in track-record time of 1:33. Conquistador Cielo was named 1982 Horse of the Year and was the season's top three-year-old colt. Injured while running third in the GI Travers, he retired to Claiborne in 1983 and went on to sire Grade I winners Marquetry, Wagon Limit, Norquestor, Conquistarose and graded stakes winners Forty Niner Days, Lexicon, Alannan and Mi Cielo. From 16 crops to race, Conquistador Cielo is the sire of 65 stakes winners and the earners of over \$55 million. This year, the stallion was represented by the juvenile Lone Star Sky, winner of the GIII Bashford Manor S.

The victory of Starrer in Sunday's Bayakoa H. was a significant one for her sire Dynaformer, as it propelled the son of Roberto to a position as the season's leading sire of North American stakes winners.

Dynaformer has taken quite a journey since he retired to stud at Nathan Fox's Wafare Farm in Midway, Kentucky, to stand the 1990 breeding season at a fee of \$5,000. Dynaformer came off the track with a very respectable race record, albeit one which showed him some way short of the best of his contemporaries. In three seasons, Dynaformer won seven races and \$671,207, and after winning a Saratoga maiden from five starts at two, he peaked the following season when he captured the GII Jersey Derby, GII Discovery H. and Lucky Draw S. He failed to add to his stakes tally the following season, but he did set a new track record for a mile and a half on turf at Keeneland.

By Roberto out of the Grade I-winning His Majesty mare Andover Way, Dynaformer was closely related to both champion turf horse Sunshine Forever and to multiple Grade I-winning millionaire Brian's Time (both by Roberto out of mares three-quarters related to Andover Way). This pair offered a mixed omen as to Dynaformer's prospects. Sunshine Forever, retired a year before Dynaformer, ultimately proved very disappointing and was eventually exported to Japan; Brian's Time, retired to stud in Japan in the same year that Dynaformer commenced his stud career, was a tremendous success in that country, siring 12 Group 1 winners.

Horse of the Year Two-time Breeders' Cup Classic Winner #1 Freshman Covering Sire

ASIAN SEASON

With several major European contenders knocked out by injury or sickness, Hong Kong-trained horses won three of their four international races last Sunday, proving that they are just as capable of stepping up to the plate in international Group 1 company as their contemporaries in Japan and Australasia. It was Hong Kong racing's biggest day ever in Group 1 company, and a great tribute to the system they have evolved. I think I say, about this time every year, that the winter Asian circuit, now including Australia, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, and Dubai, has emerged as a real big-money opportunity for all but the top Classic horses--and even some of them are in action, certainly at the Dubai World Cup meet at the end of March.

Besides the locals, the other big winners on the day were the French; specifically, the Haras du Mesnil operation of Henri and Antonia Devin, who, amazingly, bred two of the day's four Group 1 winners. One of them, the 10-furlong Cup winner Precision, was bred by Mme Devin and sold as a yearling to go to Hong Kong. He becomes the third Group 1 winner from Anabaa's first crop, joining Amonita (champion two-year-old filly in France in 2000), and Anabaa Blue (French Derby winner at three, 2001). But an even bigger win for the Devins was Ange Gabriel, who won the 12-furlong Vase, defeating last year's Arc second Aquarelliste for the second time in Group 1 company this year, with ex-French trained Falcon Flight completing the trifecta for France in the Vase.

In many respects the Vase was a re-run of the June 30 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud (G1), in which Ange Gabriel, then 16-1, seemingly benefitted from a mulish display by Aquarelliste, the 3-5 favorite, who just didn't want to know that day, and couldn't even

get past the Fabre-trained Polish Summer for second. The real Aquarelliste showed up in Hong Kong, but Ange Gabriel beat her fair and square. Polish Summer finished fifth Sunday, beaten around four lengths.

But, even more than Anabaa, Sunday's big winning sire was the Haras de Mesnil's Kaldounevees, a son of Caro's best French sire son, Kaldoun, but from a fairly obscure female family which hadn't produced a sire since Ole Fols, son of Tudor Minstrel, in California in the late 60's. Kaldounevees was trained by the wily John Hammond and in typical Hammond fashion, won two Group 3s at one mile in France as a four-year-old in 1995 (in the second of them he defeated the cult sire sensation Fraam). Then the rubber met the road. He ran second in a 10-furlong Group 1 in Germany, fourth in the Arlington Million, then another second in the Man o' War (11 furlongs that year) at Belmont Park. It's another one of those cases where he maybe wasn't the best horse around, but he was a legitimate Group 1 horse who was always right there in the big races. Among milers, horses like Grand Lodge and Distant View were like that. Know who else was? Noverre. But more about him in a minute.

This is relevant in Kaldounevees' case because he has now had Terre A Terre--winner of the G1 Prix de l'Opera last year and the G1 Dubai Duty Free earlier this year--in his first crop, and now another dual Group 1 winner, Ange Gabriel, in his second. This makes Kaldounevees the French answer to [Hernando](#), who has sired two French Derby winners (Holding Court and Arc second Sulamani) in his first three crops. And what great value these 'staying' sires are. Oldest foals for both are five-year-olds of 2002. Hernando stands next year for £12,000 at Kirsten Rausing's Lanwades Stud, and Kaldounevees has just been bumped to €15,000. One has two French Derby winners in his first three crops, and the other has a dual Group 1 winner in each of his first two crops. Hear that train whistle (could have been a harmonica)? Time to Get on Board.

Then There's Alflora...

Mention of Hernando brings me to Niniski, a dual St. Leger winner by Nijinsky II who stood at Lanwades (where he was succeeded by his son Hernando) for the wily Kirsten Rausing (I should interrupt myself to say here that I really, genuinely do admire wily people. I wish I was wily myself). In his seventh crop, Niniski sired Lomitas, who made such a good start at stud in Germany that Sheikh Mohammed brought him to Darley. In his ninth crop, Niniski sired Hernando. In between, in his eighth crop, Niniski sired a horse called Alflora. Now, Alflora was out of a fast Bold Lad mare who was a half sister to the great Ardross. He was trained by Clive Brittain and after being tried over longer distances, won the first of four group races over one mile when he sprang a 20-1 shock in the 1993 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot.

It was a big gamble for the Shade Oak Stud in Shropshire to stand a group winner over a mile as a jumping sire, but he was out of a half sister to Ardross, and it was there he went to stud in 1995. His first crop are now six-year-olds, and last weekend he had the winners of two good Novice Chases in England from that first crop: a horse called Paxford Jack won the £50,000 Doncaster Sales Future Champions Novices' Chase at Cheltenham; and Farmer Jack, another six-year-old from Alflora's first crop, won a good race at Haydock. The name's Niniski: Sire of Sires. Two more impressive performances in the jumping division last weekend: Ireland's top staying hurdler Limestone Lad notched up win number 34 at Navan on Sunday and a second-season French-bred chaser, Fondmort (by Arctic Tern's successful jump sire son, Cyborg) won the Tripleprint Gold Cup over 21 furlongs at Cheltenham. You can pencil him in now as the winner of the Cathcart Chase (second-season chasers, 21 furlongs) at Cheltenham next March.

Give Me an F...

The most important four-letter word in horse racing: F-O-R-M. Time and again it's been demonstrated to us that a horse doesn't have to be an undefeated champion to make a sire. As mentioned above, Grand Lodge and Distant View are examples of milers who mixed with the best but didn't win them all, and now have gone on to be significant sires. A lot of people will have gone off Noverre, who closed out a disappointing--and winless--four-year-old season with a lackluster eighth in the Hong Kong Mile. Besides that, he's a three-quarter brother to the disappointing sire Arazi. Never mind all

that. Noverre ran seven times at two, going 4-1-1; he won his first three starts (five to six furlongs), including the G3 July S. at Newmarket, and went on to win the G2 Champagne at Doncaster and place in two Group 1s, the Dewhurst and the Prix Morny. He ran seven times again at three, winning the French 2000 Guineas (though DQ'ed on a bad test), and the G1 Sussex S., and placing in the UAE 2000 Guineas (to Street Cry), the St. James's Palace S., the Jacques le Marois, and the Queen Elizabeth S.; Timeform rating--125. This year he ran--you guessed it--seven times, placing in five Group 1s (behind horses like Terre A Terre, Keltos, and Rock of Gibraltar), and running unplaced twice, once in the Atto Mile in Canada from an impossible draw, and last weekend in Hong Kong; Timeform rating--123. So, in his career, he ran 21 times. He went 5-7-4, which is 16 times in the first three. He won one Group 1, was DQ'ed from another, and placed in 10 Group 1 races. He was unplaced five times--three in North America, once in Hong Kong, and once DQ'ed. He might have his knockers at €15,000 at Kildangan, but I'm not one of them: I think he was plenty good enough to be a sire. Incidentally, another horse I love with similar ratings is Aljabr, a grey son of Storm Cat who stands at Shadwell in Kentucky, now down to a mouthwatering \$15,000 fee himself. Aljabr won Group 1 races at two, three, and four in 1998-2000. He was rated 121 pounds by Timeform after going unbeaten in three starts at two, including the (then) G1 Prix de la Salamandre, then had the same ratings as Noverre at three (125) and four (123). I give him a big shot to make a sire, too; like Noverre, like Kaldounevees, like Hernando, like Grand Lodge, like Distant View, he had the form.

Given his size and the fact that he was at his best at three, one wouldn't have expected too much of Dynaformer's first crop yearlings. However, he was actually represented by 10 individual two-year-old winners and although he didn't have a two-year-old stakes winner, he was responsible for Blumin Affair, who chased home Brocco in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Ultimately that first crop would contain five stakes winners, with Blumin Affair and Rabiadella garnering North American graded stakes victories.

Since then, Dynaformer has never looked back. He was transferred to Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky for the 1995 season to take advantage of the opportunities which his early success had brought and his fee has now risen to \$50,000. From 10 crops, he now has 52 stakes winners from 558 named foals (9 percent), including Grade I winners Critical Eye, Vergennes, Riskaverse and Collect the Cash.

Rather like Dynaformer, Starrer's dam To the Hunt was a talented runner who started her stud career with somewhat modest opportunities. Although she never won a stakes event, To the Hunt, a daughter of Re-launch, did win five races and nearly \$90,000, earning graded black type with a second in the GIII Next Move H. and a third in the GIII Rare Treat H. Her first matings were with I Am the Game and Carnivalay. However, the commercial value of her covering sires then improved dramatically, after the appearance of her 3/4-sister American Royale (by American Standard, a son of Re-launch's sire In Reality). Undefeated in three races at two, including the GIII Adirondack S. and Colleen S., American Royale retired with a lifetime record of six wins in eight starts after adding the GII Prioress S. and Blue Norther S. at three.

Initially, the upgrading didn't pay dividends. To the Hunt's Storm Cat colt Devon Lane won three races, but earned only \$6,317, and he was followed by a Deputy Minister colt who never raced. The next two years saw To the Hunt produce winners by Capote and Smarten, before Starrer appeared as her seventh foal.

That Starrer has turned out to be the best of To the Hunt's foals to date might not be surprising, as she owns a pedigree pattern which seems to reflect considerable thought. To start with, she is the product of the Roberto/In Reality cross. This pair has been working together for some considerable time and in the crop prior to Starrer, Dynaformer sired GISW Collect the Cash out of a mare by In Reality's son Valid Appeal. In Reality is out of a mare by Rough 'n Tumble, and Dynaformer has also demonstrated a very strong affinity for mares carrying Rough 'n Tumble's son Dr. Fager, particularly through Dr. Blum. He has three stakes winners out of Dr. Blum mares, including GISW Critical Eye and Blumin Affair, and Dr. Fager appears in three more of his stakes winners, including Collect the Cash and graded-stakes winner Rabiadella (out of a Dr. Fager mare).

We can also note two other very clever connections in this pedigree. Firstly, Rarelea, who appears as the granddam of Dynaformer's sire Roberto, is a sister to Delta Queen, dam of Advocator (sire of Starrer's third dam). Secondly, Dynaformer's broodmare sire His Majesty is out of Flower Bowl, and Flower Bowl's 3/4-sister Your Hostess is the granddam of Majestic Prince, the sire of Starrer's second dam.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters.
