LEADING THE CONGA LINE

The new and improved **Congaree** (Arazi) turned another brilliant performance yesterday afternoon, kicking away impressively in the final furlong to win the GII San Pasqual H. at Santa Anita. The chestnut had turned in a tour-de-force in the GI Cigar Mile Nov. 30 at Aqueduct, crushing a tough field by 5 1/2 lengths while covering the distance in 1:33. That effort earned him a Beyer Speed Figure of 120 and overwhelming support at the windows as he went postward in the San Pasqual as the 4-5 chalk. After bobbling slightly at the start, Congaree settled into a stalking trip on the outside as **Freedom Crest** (To Freedom) showed the way from **Hot Market** (Cee's Tizzy) down the backstretch, clicking off

fractions of :47.71 and 1:11.50. Jockey Jerry Bailey asked for a bit more on the far turn and the favorite responded, cruising up to head Hot Market at the top of the stretch. The race was essentially over at that point as Congaree drew off smartly under a hand ride to post the

six-length victory. "He was the best horse in the race coming off that big mile, but I gave him plenty of time in between," said winning trainer Bob Baffert. "But he's been relaxing. He could have gone a mile and a half today." Baffert was hesitant to indicate the five-year-old's next start, but said that the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 29 was a possible target. At three, Congaree ran third in the GI Kentucky Derby after setting the six-furlong split of 1:09 1/5 and mirrored that effort in the GI Preakness S. After a brief vacation, he annexed the GI Swaps S., but sustained a knee injury when third in the GI Jim Dandy S. in August and wasn't seen again until May 27, 2002, when he won the GIII Lone Star Park H. He rebounded from a pair of subsequent disappointments to win the GII Del Mar Breeders' Cup Mile Sept. 2, then tried the turf with little fanfare in the GII Oak Tree Breeders' Cup Mile, running seventh in that Oct. 5 test. *San Pasqual chart, p2*

UPSETTING THE APPLE CART

Making just his eighth career start, 29-1 **Point Prince** (Youmadeyourpoint) had the goods to land the GII Appleton H. at Gulfstream yesterday afternoon. The bay has come a long way since debuting victoriously for a \$12,500 tag at Calder just over a year ago. Claimed from Stanley Ersoff out of that win, he won at the \$35,000 level at Gulfstream last January before moving to Kentucky. Following a third in an Apr. 27 allowance at Churchill, a race in which Belmont hero Sarava ran second, he made his turf debut May 30 under the Twin Spires and defeated subsequent MGSW Grammarian in a one-mile allowance. He was then shipped out to California for the GIII Cinema Breeders' Cup H. at Hollywood, but bore out badly and was vanned off the track following that June 30 event. After an eighth-place effort, beaten four lengths in a Del Mar allowance July 27, Point Prince headed back to Dale Romans' barn at Churchill and gave a good account of himself in his most recent outing, battling throughout before losing by a half-length in a Nov. 24 allowance. Able to draw in off the also-eligible list, the Team Valor colorbearer rated in midpack through the opening half mile, but reached contention quickly on the far turn. The longshot collared pacesetter **Krieger** (Lord At War {Arg}) at the head of the lane and turned back that resurgent rival for his first stakes success. "The owner Barry Irwin [of Team Valor] came to me last fall and told me they had a horse for sale at Calder," said Romans, "and that he wanted to buy him and give him to me to train. I don't know what they paid, but I think it was substantial [\$85,000]. He's been training so well that I asked the owner to let me run him in here and it paid off. He's a Florida-bred and could run in the Sunshine Millions [Jan. 25]." The 9-5 favorite **Balto Star** (Glitterman) stalked the pace early before backing up in the lane to finish eighth.

Baileys Edge didn't begin his racing career until May of his four-year-old season, when he romped by eight lengths at **Prairie Meadows**. He went on to win four more races for trainer **Don Von Hemel** before moving to **Steve Margolis'** shedrow for 2002. The dark bay had mixed success on the Kentucky circuit, winning once in five starts, a seven-furlong **Keeneland** allowance Oct. 20. He followed that win with a second in a money allowance at **Churchill** Nov. 17 and was sent off as the second longest shot on the board in his second attempt at stakes company. Baileys Edge trailed the field early as **Bet On Joe (Unaccounted For)** set a hot pace of :21.52 and :44.18, but he reeled in the field with a rail-skimming rally, hit the front in deep stretch and found the wire in time. "He [Margolis] just said, 'Be patient. I expect him to run well,'" said winning rider **Gary Boulanger**. "I figured I'd saved every bit of ground I could, and when I asked him he really responded for me." Now based at **Palm Meadows**, Baileys Edge could make his next start in the 6 1/2-furlong **GIII Deputy Minister H.** at **Gulfstream** Feb. 9. The 6-5 favorite **Day Trader (Phone Trick)** chased the pace early, but faded in the stretch.

JUNGLE POCKET RETIRED Japanese champion **Jungle Pocket (Jpn)** (Tony Bin {Ire}–Dance Charmer, by Nureyev) has been retired due to chronic muscle pains and problems with his left front hoof, according to *Kyodo News*. Stud plans have not been announced for the newly turned five-year-old. Racing in the colors of Katsumi Yoshida, the bay captured the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) in the spring of his three-year-old season before concluding his 2001 campaign with a late dash to take the G1 Japan Cup. Those victories saw him named champion three-year-old and Horse of the Year of 2001. At four, Jungle Pocket ran second in both the G1 Tenno Sho (Spring) and the G2 Hanshin Daishoten. Physical problems kept the colt from being sent to England for a tilt at the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S., but he returned to the races in an attempt to defend his Japan Cup title. He finished fifth, beaten just 1 3/4 lengths, to Falbrav (Ire) in that Nov. 24 test, but could only manage seventh in the G1 Arima Kinen Dec. 22 at Nakayama. He heads to stud with a record of 13-5-3-2 and earnings of \$5,788,198.

ONLYCOOK HALF OFIT (c, 4, Siphon {Brz}--Quarrel Over {MGSP, \$151,472}, by One for All), third in a pair of Saratoga claiming events last summer while still under the care of trainer Charles Simon, remained on the sidelines until resurfacing in the barn of trainer Dale Roman. For Romans, the chestnut returned a winner over the yielding turf at Keeneland Oct. 16, but couldn't extend his winning streak last time out when he came home second by 3 1/2 lengths at Churchill in another soggy allowance affair Nov. 21. Given modest support at 5-1 odds here, the colt tracked a lazy early pace through six furlongs, angled wide turning for home and edged clear late to score by 1 1/4 lengths over Colonial Bay (Pleasant Colony). The \$80,000 FTKJUL yearling purchase is a half to Suivi (Diesis {GB}), GSW & GISP, \$244,750. Lifetime Record: 10-3-3-2, \$103,284.
