DANEHILL FILLY TOPS MILLIONS OPENER

A dynamic new buying force emerged at Magic Millions yesterday with BBA Ireland's Adrian Nicholl snaring a A\$700,000 Danehill--Nuwira (Pleasant Colony) filly for a syndicate led by Magic Millions co-director and leading Australian businessman Gerry Harvey at the Yearling Sale at the Gold Coast, Queensland. Nicholl's previous forays to Australia have been to purchase fillies for a syndicate including Robert Sangster and Sam Vestey with successful

purchases including Danehill fillies Langoustine (Aus), La Lagune (Aus) and Milanova (Aus). Nicholl said Harvey was the underbidder on two fillies he purchased at the Easter Sale and had ended up taking a share in four fillies the international agent purchased. "So he decided if you can't beat them, join them, and he approached me to select some fillies for a syndicate driven by him, and I said to him yesterday, 'If you are going to target the best, they cost a bit extra,'" Nicholl said. "She was the star filly of the sale, she was a beautiful individual and a full sister to a Group 1 winner [Keeper {Aus}] and we gave top dollar for her, I wouldn't have gone much further," he added. Prominent equestrian Tim Boland, acting for Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa, was underbidder on the filly offered by Coolmore as agent. "We have 14 on the list and we will buy about eight," said Nicholl, adding the fillies would be trained by Tony McEvoy, Gai Waterhouse and Lee Freedman. The session marked the first major test of Australia's new X-ray repository system and vets were charging between A\$50 and A\$150 to view X-rays in the repository, with U.S. vet Steve Hance proving a popular source of advice. "I think it is a big help to have X-rays, especially if you are going to give A\$700,000 or that sort of money; it's good insurance for expensive horses, but in no way foolproof. It doesn't mean a horse with a fault isn't going to be a racehorse," said Nicholl. Magic Millions enjoyed a first session aggregate of A\$14,830,500 for 154 sold at an average A\$96,302. The sale resumes today at 11 a.m.

GENTLEMEN FILLY HEADS KEENELAND

Lovely Sage, a three-year-old [Gentlemen \(Arg\)](#) filly out of the Verbatim mare Speak Halory, brought a \$260,000 final bid to top Thursday's fourth session of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington. The chestnut, consigned by Brookdale Farm, Fred Seitz agent, was sold to Roger Devenport. "She brought just over what we expected for her to bring," said Brookdale Farm President Freddy Seitz. "The filly really stuck out in this sale, being from such a good family." The filly is the fourth live foal out of her dam, stakes placed Speak Halory. Halory, second dam to the saletopper, has produced Graded stakes winners Halory Hunter, Prory, Brushed Halory, Key Lory and Group winner Van Nistelrooy. Bolstered by a nine-length victory in a training race early in the Fair Grounds meet, the Maryland-bred filly further improved her image with a "perfectly timed" 1 1/4-length score in her debut over that track in a six-furlong maiden event Dec. 26. "She really is a nice filly. She has good conformation--really a nice package," added Seitz. The second highest price of the day was realized by a four-year-old daughter of recently deceased sire Pleasant Colony, out of Chelsey Dancer (Affirmed). Purchased for \$100,000 by Blandford Bloodstock, the half sister to Grade I winner Chelsey Flower was consigned by Warrendale Sales. The fifth and final session begins today at 10:00 a.m.

TOC CET AND SKY MESA SET FOR FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH **Toccet** (Awesome Again), winner of the GI Hollywood Futurity in his most recent start Dec. 21, and **Sky Mesa** (Pulpit), who won the GI Hopeful last summer, are slated to make their 2003 debuts in the GI Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Feb. 15. The former, currently in training with John Scanlan at Laurel, scored in six of eight starts last year for earnings of \$755,610. The John Oxley-owned and John Ward-trained Sky Mesa, who has the same connections as 2001 Florida Derby/Kentucky Derby winner Monarchos, was undefeated in three starts in 2002, including his final start as a juvenile, the 1 1/16-miles GII Lanes' End Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland Oct. 5. Other candidates for race, a major prep for the Mar. 15 GI Florida Derby, include multiple stakes winner **Trust n Luck** (Montbrook) and the Kenny McPeek-trained **Ten Cents a Shine** (Devil His Due).

MOCKINGBIRD FARM TOP BREEDER AGAIN

With earnings of \$11,175,975 in 2002, Mockingbird Farm, Inc. topped the list of leading individual breeders for the second consecutive year, according to statistics released by The Jockey Club Information Systems, Inc. Mockingbird Farm bred the winners of 516 races from 3,279 starts. Adena Springs, which bred the winners of 237 races from 1,374 starts, was second on the list with earnings of \$9,360,102. Completing the list of top 10 individual breeders are: Farnsworth Farm (\$8,697,245); John Franks (\$8,463,577); Allen Paulson (\$6,569,909); Edward P. Evans (\$6,115,347); Mr and Mrs John C Mabee (\$5,728,206); Charles Nuckols, Jr. and Sons (\$5,624,116); Juddmonte Farms (\$5,526,006); and Brereton C. Jones (\$4,233,626). HANDLE & PURSES UP IN '02 Pari-Mutuel wagering in the United States and Canada showed increases in total wagering and purses last year, according to figures released by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association and Equibase Company LLC yesterday. In "Thoroughbred Racing Economic Indicators," the two groups report pari-mutuel wagering in North America reached \$15,048,033,312, an increase of 3.19 percent from the 2001 figure. Total pari-mutuel wagering has increased annually since 1994. Total U.S. purses increased 0.63 percent to \$1,074,240,247. Racing was conducted on 6,578 days in 2002--down from 6,545 race days in 2001. The decline was attributed mostly to race-day cancellations caused by inclement weather in the fourth quarter. "In a year marked by economic declines in a number of areas, it is noteworthy that horse racing sustained positive growth in pari-mutuel wagering for the ninth straight year," said NTRA Commissioner Tim Smith. "Only a negative fourth quarter, due primarily to the loss of 28 racing days in December, prevented even higher handle growth for the year."

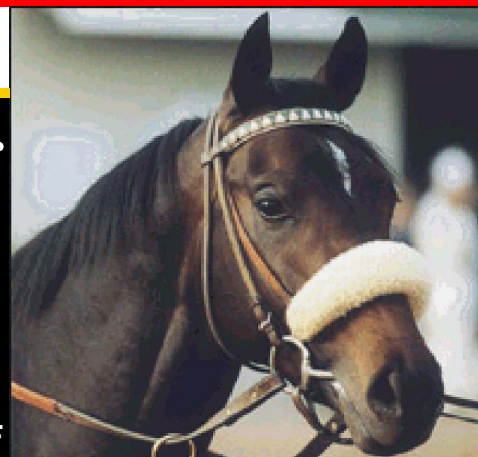

STATS PROVE INDUSTRY'S GOOD HEALTH

Horse Racing Ireland has published the statistics for 2002 at the end of its first full year in operation, with the overall figures providing further evidence of the Irish racing industry's general upturn. Among the results, the record prizemoney of €46.3 million showed an impressive increase of €4 million, or 9.4 percent on 2001, while sponsorship increased by €340,000 to a total of €6.5 million, 5.6 percent up on the previous year's total. Aggregate attendance was slightly down despite an increase in fixtures; however, on-course SP shops recorded a 4.2 percent increase and Tote betting increased from 2001 figures. The number of horses in training increased to an all-time high of 5,469, with new owner registrations up by 4 percent.
