ALL HE'S CRACKED UP TO BE?

Crackup (Distorted Humor) outkicked fellow Cal-breds to take the Nov. 2 Cal Cup Juvenile and took the measure of his nine rivals in the Dec. 7 NTRA Great State Challenge Juvenile, but goes for his first graded score

in today's GII Santa Catalina S. at Santa Anita. He faces several talented but untested three-year-olds in the 1 1/16-mile event, including **Our Bobby V.** (Majesterian). The gray colt disappointed with an eighth-place finish in his Del Mar debut, but rebounded to break his maiden by five

lengths at Santa Anita Oct. 6 and added a six-length allowance score at Hollywood Park Nov. 17. "His mind wasn't on business [in his first start]," trainer Bill Spawr said. "He came out of that race not really sick, but coughing a little bit, like he was getting a virus or something. But he's turned it around since then... he's been very professional since he lost. He just woke up. He just thought he was a kid playing in a field." Our Bobby V. makes his two-turn debut in the Santa Catalina, as does the \$550,000 KEEAPR purchase **Scrimshaw** (Gulch). The undefeated dark bay comes off a game victory in a Dec. 26 allowance over this track, where he zipped six furlongs in 1:08 1/5. From 64 previous runnings, just one Santa Catalina winner has gone on to Kentucky Derby success--Ferdinand in '86.

TATTERSALLS AND GOFFS AT ODDS

Five months ago, Tattersalls announced they were changing the dates of their fall yearling sales. On the new 2003 Tattersalls schedule, the Houghton Sale was set for Sept. 24-25, the October Sale was set for Sept. 30-Oct. 4 and the Autumn Sale, now known as the October Sale, Part 2, was to be held Oct. 15. Goffs responded to these changes yesterday with the announcement of their own restructuring. The 2003 Orby and Challenge Sales have been moved from Oct. 7-9 to Sept. 16-19, dates that were already occupied by the Tattersalls (Ireland) September Sale. "Having consulted with many of our clients who both sell and buy yearlings annually at Goffs, the clear majority is in favour of Goffs bringing forward the Orby and Challenge Sales," said Goffs Managing Director Matt Mitchell. He added, "While the need to make this decision was forced upon us, it has given us the opportunity to examine many options...the new dates will ensure maximum benefit for our clients and will strengthen the Goffs competitive position." Reacting to the announcement, Tattersalls has once again revamped its fall calendar. The Houghton Sale will revert to its former dates, Oct. 1-2, the October Sale Part 1 will run Oct. 7-11, and their Irish sale will be held Sept. 23-25. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony yesterday expressed extreme unhappiness with Goffs' decision. "We are deeply dismayed by this extraordinary decision by Goffs, which can not benefit clients of either Company, least of all Irish breeders," Mahony said. "In rearranging our sales dates to avoid congestion...we took painstaking care to avoid clashes with any other sale in the Northern Hemisphere...we would never have contemplated changes if they had involved clashes with competing sales." Mahony added that Tattersalls was advised of Goffs' discontent regarding the new calendar during a meeting called by the Irish Thoroughbred Breeders Association and offered to "make mutually acceptable changes" to the 2004 schedule if concerns remained after 2003. "It is with regret that we are altering our carefully thought-out sales dates changes, but having worked hard to establish the Tattersalls (Ireland) September Yearling Sale, we are not prepared to sacrifice its long term future or further jeopardise the interests of Irish breeders," he said.

BOSQUE REDONDO DEAD GSW Bosque Redondo (Mane Minister), who broke down just strides after finishing fifth in the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 25, was euthanized Tuesday morning. The six-year-old suffered two broken sesamoids and a condylar fracture in his right front leg in his final start. He underwent extensive surgery to repair the injury and seemed to be on the mend, but his condition had taken a turn for the worse and it was deemed necessary to put him down. "He just deteriorated the last four or five days and we don't really know what happened," co-owner John Toffan said. "We sent him up to [U.C.] Davis for an autopsy and I should hear something the first part of the week." According to a report in the *Daily Racing Form*, the chestnut had foundered in both front feet and was having problems with his coordination. Graded-stakes placed at four, Bosque Redondo enjoyed the best year of his career last season, winning the Tokyo City H. and the GII San Bernardino H. and running second in the GII San Pasqual H. and the GII Californian S. Overall, he had six wins and five seconds from his 17 starts for earnings of \$478,470.

WINDFIELDS BUYS INTEREST IN D'WILDCAT Windfields Farm has purchased a 50-percent interest in Grade I winner **D'Wildcat** (Forest Wildcat--D'Enough, by D'Accord) from David Shimmon and William Bianco's Fog City Stable. The five-year-old will race for the partnership in 2003, with Fog City as managing partner and Bob Hess Jr. continuing as trainer, before retiring to stud at Windfields in Ontario, Canada. Purchased for a sales-topping \$600,000 as a OBS March two-year-old, the chestnut romped to a 10 1/4-length win in the 2001 GIII Swale S. He was second in the Live The Dream H. and the GII Churchill Downs H. this year, but found himself in the winner's circle when the horses that finished first in those races were both disqualified. D'Wildcat capped his 2002 campaign with a win in the Nov. 16 GI Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash. He is being pointed for the Jan. 26 GII Palos Verdes H. "He is a brilliant runner with outstanding conformation by a great young son of Storm Cat," Windfields Vice President Noreen Taylor said. "He is also from the female family of another very successful Windfields stallion, Deputy Minister."

NO CHANGE FOR FASIG-TIPTON SUMMER SALES Fasig-Tipton announced yesterday that the schedule for its 2003 selected yearling sales program will remain unchanged. The Kentucky Sale is set for July 16-17, while the Saratoga Sale will be held Aug. 5-7. The Saratoga New York-bred Yearlings will be offered Aug. 10-11. "A number of calls from concerned sellers persuaded us it would be helpful to confirm our plans," President Walt Robertson said. "The recent discussions and announcement about yearling sales in Lexington this summer have had no impact in our schedule. FUTURE OF HIALEAH IN JEOPARDY Circuit Court Judge L. Ralph Smith of Leon County Florida (Tallahassee) has ruled that legislation passed last year allowing Hialeah Race Course to keep its racing dates without conducting a race meeting is unconstitutional and ordered the law struck from the books. The decision could force the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering to revoke Hialeah's racing license. Hialeah in suburban Miami has not run a live meeting since 2001 when Gulfstream Park filed a dates application that overlapped with Hialeah's regular dates, virtually putting the historic track out of business. The judge was ruling on a complaint filed by Gulfstream Park. "It never ends," Hialeah owner and President John Brunetti told *Thoroughbred Times*, referencing the long-standing lack of cooperation between the two tracks. "I guess we still have their attention." Dave Roberts, the director of the FDPMPW, indicated that the division has until the week of Jan. 20 to appeal the judge's decision.

Boston Brat Establishes New Track Record:

Boston Brat (Tour d'Or) set a new track record for five furlongs yesterday at Gulfstream Park, covering the distance in :56.35 seconds. The previous record of :56 3/5 seconds was set during the 1997 meet by MGSW Punch Line. Trained by Mark Shuman and ridden by Cornelio Velasquez, six-year-old Boston Brat took the \$16,000 starter allowance event by 9 1/4 lengths. He was claimed for \$12,500 by current connections out of a third-place finish at Delaware Park last June and has earned nearly \$80,000 while racing exclusively in allowance company for owner Michael Gill.

Walnford Stud Adds Two To Roster:

Walnford Stud near Allentown, New Jersey has added two new stallions to its roster--five-time graded-stakes winner **Mr. Sinatra** (Mining--Midnight Stroll, by Private Account) and **Gerosa** (Cherokee Run--Sky Meadows, by Conquistador Cielo), a half-brother to millionaire Dixie Dot Com and to the dam of GISW Siphonic. Nine-year-old Mr. Sinatra, who won graded stakes at three, four and five, started just once last year, running sixth for a \$100,000 tag at Aqueduct in January. He retires with a record of 62-13-6-10 and earnings of \$728,046. The Virginia-bred bay will stand for a fee of \$3,000. Six-year-old Gerosa, a \$300,000 Keeneland September yearling, won the first four outings of his career, including three Monmouth Park allowance races, but his career was compromised by injury. He made only seven starts and was retired after running seventh in an optional-claiming event at Delaware Park in October. He will stand for \$2,000.

Churchill Moves Two Stakes:

Churchill Downs has changed the dates of two of the stakes at its spring meet. The GIII Aristides H. (3yo/up, 6 1/2f) will now be run June 21, switching places with the GIII Locust Grove H. (3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8mT), which is now set for June 28. The schedule change was made in an effort to support the July 12 "Summit of Speed" at Churchill's sister track, Calder Race Course. The new date for the Aristides will provide an additional week between that event and Calder's GIII Smile H., part of the "Summit of Speed" program.
