THE POWER OF LUV

Elloluv (Gilded Time) powered her way to a four-length victory in the GI Hollywood Starlet last month. She looks to kick off her 2003 campaign with another big win in today's GI Santa Ynez S. at Santa Anita. "We're coming into the race real well," trainer Craig Dollase said. "She's improving, and I'm looking forward to running her down the road. She's always trained like a good horse. I'm excited." The bay filly drops back to seven furlongs after her wire-to-wire win in the mile-and-a-sixteenth Starlet, but broke her maiden going six furlongs in the Hollywood mud in November. **Puxa Saco** (Dehere) showed her affinity for the Santa Ynez distance in her juvenile finale, taking the Nov. 16 Mocassin

S. at Hollywood by two lengths. Now an impressive four-for-five, the bargain-basement \$8,500 KEESEP yearling suffered her lone defeat when third behind Ivanavalot in her only two-turn try, the Brave Raj S. at Calder last September. **No Love Song** (Forest Wildcat) makes her stakes debut after posting a one-length allowance win over **Himalayan** (Mountain Cat) at Hollywood Dec. 6. Himalayan came back to beat optional claimers Dec. 31 and was haltered for \$80,000 by trainer Ted West out of that race. The dark bay has won three of her last four starts.

GOT CHAMPAGNE?

Got Koko (Signal Tap), who posted a 17-1 upset in the Dec. 28 GI La Brea S., gave her connections more reason to celebrate yesterday with a rallying 1 1/2-length triumph in the GI El Encino S. at Santa Anita. Sent off at a better-regarded 3-1 this time, the Texas-bred filly settled in midpack as longshots **Ponche De Leona** (Ponche) and **Ms Louissett** (Siphon {Brz}) cut out the early running. The bay kicked it into gear as those two faded, sweeping past the leaders from the outside as they headed into the stretch and drawing clear to best 2-1 favorite **Bella Bellucci** (French Deputy). "I had to move earlier than I wanted to because she was five, six wide," said winning jockey Alex Solis. "I was worried for a minute, but it turned out to be the right thing to do." Got Koko has now won five of her six starts on the main track. "This filly keeps surprising people, but I don't know why it's such a surprise," said Solis. "She doesn't quit." With the first two legs under her girth, the winner will be pointed for the third and final race in the La Canada series, the GI La Canada S. Feb. 8. Hong Kong's reigning Horse of the Year Electronic Unicorn got clear sailing into the stretch and accelerated brilliantly to easily win this race for the second consecutive year. Second in the 2001 G1 Hong Kong Mile, he geared up for another try at that event with a disappointing fourth in the G3 Chevalier Cup over course and distance Nov. 24, but rebounded to miss by a nose to Olympic Express (GB) (Bishop of Cashel {GB}) in the 2002 Mile Dec. 15. The odds-on favorite off that effort, the 'Unicorn' was allowed to settle towards the back of the field early before being asked to take closer order at the three-furlong marker. Wide into the stretch, the dark bay powered to the front with 250 meters to run and drew clear as much the best, giving jockey Robbie Fradd his third straight Stewards' Cup. He had also won in 2001 with Fairy King Prawn. "I had a freer run today, but he's done it so well," said Fradd. "In the Mile last time, he didn't like it on the fence and never travelled well until they straightened up. Today, drawn outside, he was happier with plenty of room and I was always pretty confident." The next race in the Triple Crown series is the 2000-meter G1 Hong Kong Gold Cup Feb. 22, an event likely to attract G1 Hong Kong Cup hero Precision (Fr). Riddledown was last seen at this oval finishing a distant 11th in the GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. in February, but erased the memory of that effort with an impressive front-running performance here. The chestnut followed his Grade I disappointment with a Churchill allowance score in May, then was off the board in three straight Grade III events before getting second in the Oct. 25 John Henry H. at Arlington Park. He set the pace once again in the Dec. 28 GII W.L. McKnight H. at Calder, but tired to be 11th. Allowed to set a soft pace on a daylight lead yesterday, the Irish-bred this time saved enough gas for the finish, holding Macaw safe under jockey Roger Velez. "[Trainer Niall O'Callaghan] called me and told me, 'Don't try rating him. Go to the front and hopefully they'll leave you alone,'" Velez said. "Well, that's what we did. He was running easy, and at the three-eighths pole I chirped to him and he really took off. I knew if anyone was going to come after me, they were going to have a tough time. He was really flying." THOROUGHBRED CORP CUTTING BACK IN BRITAIN The *Racing Post* reports that The Thoroughbred Corporation, continuing the restructuring that began after the death of owner Prince Ahmed Salman last year, will campaign a stable of just 10 horses in Britain next year. "We are cutting back and it is mainly a way of reducing expenses," The Thoroughbred Corporation's racing manager Richard Mulhall told *Racing Post*. "It is the policy we have had all the time that if horses don't turn out to be top notchers, we will bring them back to the States." Trainer Gerard Butler, who lost 11 horses in the move, will keep Group 1 winner **Elusive City** (Elusive Quality) and a two-year-old by Sadler's Wells. "It is very sad, but I wish the trainers who get them all the best. There are some very nice unraced and lightly raced horses among them," Butler said. "It is a huge loss to us, but we still have Elusive City and hopefully he can enhance their legacy." Of the three-year-old, the trainer said, "I'm very pleased with him. He looks a million dollars and every time I look at him I get a rush."

At Santa Anita...

Atswhatimtalknout (A.P. Indy--Lucinda K, by Red Ransom), a \$900,000 FTFFEB two-year-old who broke his maiden by a half length in his Jan. 4 debut at Santa Anita, goes next in a one-mile allowance test at the Arcadia oval Friday. The dark bay worked six furlongs in 1:11 2/5 yesterday morning. "He really picked it up the last eighth," trainer Ron Ellis told *The Blood-Horse*. "I knew they were going fast, but I didn't think they were going that fast." As for the decision to point for an allowance race instead of a stakes, Ellis explained, "Well, we're kind of walking the fine line between doing too much with him and getting it all just right."

Crackup (Distorted Humor--Lightly Go Lightly, by *Habitony), fourth in Saturday's GIII Santa Catalina S., bled in the race, according to trainer Rafael Becerra. "That's why he didn't kick in," Becerra said. "He had an excuse. We were running with good horses, but I think he's a good horse. [Saturday] wasn't his best day, that's all."

Southern Image (Halo's Image--Pleasant Dixie, by Dixieland Band) will make his next start in the seven-furlong GII San Vicente S. Feb. 1. The \$300,000 OBSMAR juvenile purchase made an impressive debut at Santa Anita Dec. 26, winning by three lengths. Explaining the decision to send the colt right into stakes competition, trainer Mike Machowsky said, "It gives him a little more time out of his maiden race. He ran big that day, and he's obviously doing well. We paid a lot of money for him, so we're taking a shot at the big time. He's training good and if he runs like his maiden race, he'll be tough in the San Vicente, too."

Three-for-four over this course, **Johar** comes off a rallying 1 1/2-length score in the nine-furlong GI Hollywood Derby Dec. 1. He stretches out to a mile and a quarter for the first time for owner/breeder The Thoroughbred Corporation. **The Tin Man** has tried 10 furlongs once before, leading from gate to wire to take the GI C. L. Hirsch Memorial S. at Santa Anita Oct. 6. He makes his first start since tiring to be fourth in the mile-and-a-half GI Breeders' Cup Turf, where he was beaten just three lengths by Eclipse finalist High Chaparral (Ire). **Harrisand**, a Belmont Park allowance winner in May, returned after a six-month layoff to make it two in a row in a 10-furlong allowance test at Hollywood Dec. 8, where he had **National Anthem** back in second. He has won two of three tries at the San Marcos distance.


