ELLOLUV WINS SANTA YNEZ

Elloluv (Gilded Time) had only a maiden win to her credit when she was dismissed at 30-1 in the Dec. 14 GI Hollywood Starlet S., but the filly set the pace and drew clear to win that 1 1/16-mile contest by four lengths. Attracting greater respect in yesterday's GI

Santa Ynez S. at Santa Anita, she glided home a 2 1/2-length winner as the 9-5 second choice. Elloluv pressed the pace before swinging out four wide nearing the turn. She battled between foes on the bend, took a narrow lead into the stretch and pulled clear to the wire. According to winning

jockey Pat Valenzuela, "She was running relatively easy the whole way down the backside. When the two horse [**Puxa Saco** (Dehere)] got through on the rail, I was a little concerned that she might shake away from us, so I edged my filly up next to Corey [Nakatani] on **Himalayan** (Mountain Cat) and the last quarter mile, I just asked her and she took off." Winning trainer Craig Dollase targeted the Feb. 9 GI Las Virgenes as Elloluv's next start. JOHAR BEST IN TIGHT SAN MARCOS FINISH

Johar (Gone West) added yet another notch to his illustrious predecessor's belts as he battled gamely in the Santa Anita stretch to score in yesterday's GII San Marcos. In the money in eight of 11 starts as a three-year-old, including the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 7, the homebred closed out the season with a pair of nine-furlong victories; the GII Oak Tree Derby Oct. 13 and the Dec. 1 GI Hollywood Derby. Sent off the 2-1 second choice behind 9-5 choice stablemate **The Tin Man** (Affirmed), Johar was content to track the pace in seventh as **Grammarian** (Definite Article {GB}) cut out quick early fractions. Drawn wide at the top of the stretch and still in fifth with a quarter of a mile left to run, the Richard Mandella trainee rallied gamely in the final strides to reach the hard-running leader as The Tin Man ranged up alongside, but it was Johar who poked his nose over the wire first, in the process establishing a new course record. Mandella will target the first and second-place finishers to either the 10-furlong GII San Luis Rey H. Mar. 15 or the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic later that month. "All those little losses we had in the summer, he's kind of winning them now," he said. "I think he's just a horse that just gets better and better with age." Following in father's footsteps has pretty much been the story so far for Unbridled's Song. For a start, both he and his sire Unbridled inherited plenty of size from Unbridled's sire Fappiano, with Unbridled measuring 16.3 hands and his son now standing a full 17 hands.

The comparisons continued during their racing careers, with both father and son winning the Florida Derby and both landing one of the highly coveted prizes on Breeders' Cup Day.

Now the similarities seem to have extended to the early stages of their stallion careers. Both made a spectacular start at stud, with a pair of Grade I winners, including a Breeders' Cup winner, in their first crop. Almost inevitably, their second crops struggled to match their predecessors. Unbridled sired nothing better than a Grade III winner in his 1994 collection, whereas Unbridled's Song so far has just one Graded winner among the 68 named foals in his second crop. I should quickly add, though, that that Graded winner was Budha, who won the GI Wood Memorial S. on what proved to be the last of his four starts.

Although Unbridled's third-crop runners failed to make an impact as two-year-olds in 1997, two excellent fillies--Banshee Breeze and Manistique--eventually emerged from this crop. By the time they had finished, this pair had jointly collected more than \$4 million.

The question now is whether Unbridled's Song will make a similar impact with his third crop--and he needs to if he is to continue to justify his fee of \$100,000.

Emerging Stars..

This crop's only stakes winner last year was Net Force, at Sunray Park, but Domestic Dispute showed plenty of potential when he finished third (promoted to second) behind Toccet in the GI Hollywood Futurity. Now Domestic Dispute has added to his reputation with his decisive victory in the GII Santa Catalina S. and there is good reason to think he will continue to progress over slightly longer distances. His dam, the Bay Meadows Oaks runner-up Majestical Moment, is by Magesterial, a Group 2 winner over 1 1/2 miles in Ireland, and his second dam, Olay Monique, was by Drouilly, a Mill Reef horse with middle-distance bloodlines. Olay Monique also produced Dianes Halo, a Sunny's Halo filly who gained Grade I status with her win in the La Canada S. over a mile and an eighth.

Majestical Moment may not have a tremendously fashionably pedigree, but she raced 15 times in two seasons and her durability could prove helpful to Domestic Dispute. Unbridled's Song has had 76 percent starters to named foals in his first two crops, which is higher than Unbridled achieved with his first seven crops to the end of their three-year-old days.

Unbridled was undoubtedly a very good sire when he got it right--as he showed by siring Grade I winners of the calibre of Unbridled's Song, Grindstone, Banshee Breeze, Manistique, Anees, Red Bullet, Unshaded and Exogenous--but his percentage of graded winners stands at only 3.6 percent and his percentage of stakes winners at 6.9 percent. Needless to say, these figures fall a long way behind those achieved by such wonderfully consistent stallions as Mr. Prospector, Nureyev and Danzig, but I suspect that today's stallions, covering much bigger books than used to be the norm, are going to struggle to match their predecessors' impressive figures.

PIMLICO SPECIAL RETURNS IN 2003 Forced out of Pimlico Racecourses' 2002 lineup because of lack of funds, the Pimlico Special will return to 'Old Hilltop' May 16, the same day as the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. This year's 36th edition of the Special, won by Triple Crown hero War Admiral and current silver-screen sensation Seabiscuit, will carry a purse of \$600,000, down from \$750,000 in 2001 when Include won the 9 1/2-furlong event.

At Santa Anita...

Scrimshaw (Gulch), third in Saturday's GII Santa Catalina S. behind Domestic Dispute, came out of the 1 1/16-mile affair in excellent form, according to trainer D. Wayne Lukas yesterday. The Hall of Fame conditioner, who was satisfied with the colt's performance, noted that he has 'nothing planned' at the moment for the Bob and Beverly Lewis owned Triple Crown hopeful. "It's [only] January," commented Lukas. "And I might have been a little soft on him. I'm not worried about it."

GI Futurity S. winner **Whywhywhy** (Mr. Greeley) remains on course for Gulfstream's GI Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 15, according to trainer Patrick Biancone. Stablemate **Zavata** (Phone Trick), who won last year's GII Saratoga Special and GIII Tremont S. enroute to a last-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, "is a month behind Whywhywhy," in training. The bay colt is being readied for the \$75,000 San Pedro S. at 6 1/2 furlongs at Santa Anita Mar. 22. Biancone, who has won three races this meet, said he will remain at the South California oval for the winter before returning to the East at the end of the meeting [Apr. 20].

PLEASE NOTE: The G1 Telegraph H. at Trentham (New Zealand) was not staged yesterday after jockeys refused to ride due to dangerous course conditions. The race has been rescheduled for Saturday.

Second in his bow last November, Suzaka Dream cleared the maiden hurdle a month later and was facing winners for the first time in this contest as part of a 13-horse field. In tight quarters along the inside while traveling in mid-pack, the nearly black colt angled out for the drive under jockey Masayoshi Ebina and parlayed a powerful move through the lane into a confident win over second-choice T M Rikisan. Bamboo Juventus, 12th in last year's G1 Japanese Derby, wrapped up an otherwise disappointing three-year-old campaign with a game runner-up finish in the G3 Chunichi Shimbun Hai S. in December. Doing even more here to prove he belongs at this level, he was allowed to settled near the rear of the pack for much of the race, but unleashed a furious rally through the stretch to win going away for his first graded-stakes success. Jockey Hirofumi Shii, who also won this contest last year, said afterwards, "It was quite a tough race, but he showed a gutsy performance today."

At the moment--and it is still rather early to be making a lot of assumptions about Unbridled's Song--it seems that he is following Unbridled's example. His five graded winners represent only 2.5 percent of his named foals in his first three crops and his 11 Northern Hemisphere stakes winners equate to 5.6 percent (he has been a little unlucky in that he has some solid graded performers, including the Japanese colt Agnes Sonic, Werblin and Even The Score, which haven't won a stakes race).

I also ought to stress that stakes winners-to-foals statistics tend to discriminate against younger stallions, such as Unbridled's Song, who has a third of his output largely untried at stakes level).

I am sure his figures will eventually rise, if only because he will have received even better mares than normal following the 2001 Grade I successes of Songandaprayer and Unbridled Elaine. Unbridled himself benefited considerably from the successes of Unbridled's Song and Grindstone at the end of 1995 and early in 1996. The extra support he received in 1996 resulted in a vintage 1997 crop which contained Red Bullet, Anees, Unshaded, Broken Vow and Malabar Gold.

STUD FEE SET FOR FORBIDDEN APPLE *Forbidden Apple* (Pleasant Colony--North of Eden {Ire}, by Northfields), who will begin his stud career in 2003 at Arthur Appleton's Bridlewood Farm near Ocala, Florida, will stand for \$5,000. The eight-year-old, whose biggest score was in the 2001 GI Manhattan H., will make his final start in the Jan. 25 Sunshine Millions Turf at Santa Anita. Also a winner of the GII Kelso H. (twice) and the GII Belmont Breeders' Cup H., the Florida-bred horse won eight of 30 starts and has earned \$1,623,280 through ages three to seven.

MR. MELLON TO INDIA Graded stakes winner *Mr. Mellon* (Red Ransom--Mackie, by Summer Squall) has been sold and will stand at Ruia Stud near Poona, India. The four-year-old, who raced for Tom VanMeter and WinStar Farm, won last year's GII Arlington Classic S. and was second in the GIII Jefferson Cup S. He was a \$950,000 yearling purchase at the 2000 Keeneland September sales. His dam, Mackie, in foal to Mr. Prospector, brought a record \$5 million at the 2000 Keeneland January sales. Mr. Mellon was retired after sustaining an injury while running seventh in the Sept. 7 GII Del Mar Derby. A winner of three races in nine starts, the dark bay earned \$278,580. Mr. Mellon was sold in a deal brokered by Rachel Boffey of the Kern Lillingston Association and Ian Deane of Centaur Bloodstock

LITTLE CURRENT DEAD AT 32 1974 GI Preakness and GI Belmont S. hero *Little Current* (Sea Bird {Fr}--Luiana, by My Babu {Fr}) was reportedly euthanized Sunday after suffering from colic. Pensioned at Drs. Mark and Ann Hansen's Maverick Farm near Monroe, Washington at the time of his death, the 32-year-old stallion was one of only two surviving Belmont winners from the 70s, the other being 1979 victor Coastal. En route to a three-year-old championship, Little Current won four of 16 races, while amassing \$354,704 in earnings. Syndicated for \$4 million following a career-ending injury in late 1974, the homebred entered stud at Darby Dan Farm before moving to Buck Pond Farm. Following another move, this time to Good Guys Farm in Louisiana, Little Current found a permanent home at Maverick Farm. As a sire, he has 35 stakes winners to his credit, including Grade I winners Current Hope and Prize Spot.

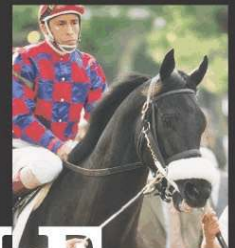

Freshman sire Commands (Aus), a son of leading sire Danehill (USA), continued to prove popular at this year's sales after agent James Bester paid A\$130,000 for Lot 180 to top yesterday's second session of the Inglis Classic Sale. Out of Marscay (Aus) mare Flannelle (Aus), the filly was offered by Mick Talty's Edenglassie Stud, agent. "She was absolutely the filly of the sale," said Bester. "In fact, [she was] the horse of the sale. She was Danehill in every fibre of her body, and she is out of a Marscay mare--a cross that has produced [G1 winners] Catbird and Camarena," he said. "For a Commands, she made a bit of money, but there are few better bred sons of Danehill and he was among Danehill's fastest sons, he nearly won the [G1] Galaxy [1100 meters]. On her pedigree, she certainly made her money, but she is the finest mover I have seen in years," he said. "She walked like all the best Danehills, and that is why a filly with a reserve of \$20,000 made \$130,000 with trainers like Paul Perry, Matt Smith, Tim Martin and John Morish--a huge number of people--all bidding on her." Commands' success at Inglis comes two weeks after averaging A\$105,714 for seven sold at Magic Millions, with a top price of \$A240,000 paid by Bart Cummings. Commands, a full brother to Danewin from Cotehele House (GB) (My Swanee {GB}--Eight Carat {GB}, by Pieces of Eight {Ire}), stood his first season at Woodlands Stud at a fee of A\$11,000. Coolmore's star freshman Fasliyev, who had 26 sell at an average \$111,660 at Magic Millions off a A\$27,500 fee, was also in demand, with emerging trainer Tim Martin giving A\$60,000 for Lot 60, a Fasliyev colt from Secretariat mare Country Custom. "She was among the best fillies in the sale, and she's definitely a two-year-old. She would have brought a lot more if she had been offered at Magic Millions," Martin said. "This is a good buyers sale. Buyers who did not get a chance at Magic Millions can get in here, and it has always been a good buyers' sale," said Martin, who gave A\$70,000 for a Belong To Me filly, amongst his four purchases thus far. With 207 horses to be offered at the final session starting Tuesday at 10:30 a.m., the Classic sale average is A\$29,662 for 205 sold for an overall gross of A\$6,080,750, but some vendors who expected plenty after a bullish Magic Millions sale have gone away disappointed with 77 horses passed in.
