

JUVENILE SALE SEASON STARTS TODAY

At the 2002 sale, 114 two-year-olds grossed \$13,041,000 for an average price of \$114,395. Last year's topper at \$500,000 is now doing business as Truckle Feature. PAULSON DISPERSAL CALLED OFF

The Allen E. Paulson Living Trust Racing Age Dispersal, which was to be held Mar. 4, has been cancelled, according to Barretts Equine Limited. Among those scheduled to be sold were 2002 Horse of the

Year Azeri (Jade Hunter). The sales company was notified by the trustees' attorneys that the horses were "withdrawn from the sale after the relevant parties had reached a resolution of a dispute related to the disposition of the trust's remaining blood-stock." Michael Paulson, who celebrated when Azeri won the Eclipse Award a week ago, was pleased to have the dispute resolved. "It's a good feeling," he said. "My father always said look forward and never look back." Paulson intends to race Azeri this

year. "This is all pending approval in court, because it is a probate matter. Once we don't see any problems or opposition and all the beneficiaries agree to the settlement, the plan is to campaign Azeri in 2003. I believe it will take about 30 days for the legal matters to be consummated." The chestnut has been in light training since winning the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Oct. 26. "She's quite the athlete, so it shouldn't take long to get her back," Paulson added. "We will not go to Dubai. That would be too much to expect of her. Her health and well-being is paramount. She's such a fabulous athlete that it won't take long to get her back into shape." As for when Azeri might return, Paulson wasn't sure. "We don't have any races in particular in mind. Once we get court approval, we'll make sure of her well-being and that she is fully fit before we get her on track." Barretts' annual March sale of two-year-olds in training will take place as scheduled on the first Tuesday in March. "Needless to say, we are disappointed," said Barretts President Jerry McMahon, "and we regret any inconvenience that this may have caused our customers." The four consignors taking two-year-olds by Cherokee Run to Fasig-Tipton's Selected Sale at Calder later this month surely have good reason for optimism, even in these troubled times.

The Jonabell stallion has enjoyed some spectacular results at this sale over the past four years and, fortunately, so too have some of the purchasers. The \$875,000 paid by Stonerside for a filly in 1999 proved a wonderful investment, with the filly--Chilukki--collecting the title of champion two-year-old filly, together with earnings of over \$1,200,000.

A year later Michael Tabor paid \$1,950,000 for a Cherokee Run colt, which, as Yonaguska, developed into a Grade I winner at two and a dual Grade II winner at three before retiring to Vinery.

Then, in 2002, The Thoroughbred Corporation paid the fourth-best price of the sale when it splashed out \$720,000 for Cherokee Run's colt out of Swazi's Moment. Racing as Kafwain, this colt has yet to record his first Grade I victory, but it is surely only a matter of time before he does, judging by the way he chased home Vindication in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and Toccet in the Hollywood Futurity.

Although those efforts were around two turns, Kafwain reminded us that he retains plenty of speed with his smooth victory in the GII San Vicente S. over seven furlongs.

It is going to be interesting to see what Kafwain's optimum distance proves to be, because his sire was a highly versatile individual. After Cherokee Run had successfully stepped up the distance scale as a juvenile, it was fair to assume that he would stay reasonably well as a three-year-old, especially as his sire, Runaway Groom, had won two legs of the Canadian Triple Crown over 1 1/2 miles. Cherokee Run's excellent second to Prairie Bayou in the Preakness S. earned him a shot at the Belmont, after which he easily won the Dwyer S. over a mile and an eighth.

Trainer Frank Alexander commented after the Dwyer that: "The Belmont distance was probably just a little too far for him....He's really just a gritty little horse. I don't think a mile and a quarter will be too much."

However, defeats in the Haskell and the Travers inevitably cast doubt on Cherokee Run's ability to produce his best at a mile and a quarter and a very different policy was employed the following year, when Cherokee Run never tackled more than a mile. He showed his appreciation by winning the Breeders' Cup Sprint.

Cherokee Run was undoubtedly a highly admirable, tough racehorse, but the fact that he is by Runaway Groom out of a Silver Saber mare was bound to limit his appeal as a stallion--to the extent that his fee in his first four seasons was only \$7,500. In the circumstances he did very well to sire the graded-stakes winners Chilukki, Yonaguska, Dream Run and Silentea from the 105 named foals in his first two crops. I am prepared to forgive him for so far failing to sire a graded winner in that difficult third year at stud, which resulted in a crop of only 34 named foals.

It is well worth pointing out that Cherokee Run sired Chilukki from a mare who earned only \$12,920, Yonaguska from a once-raced daughter of Silver Ghost and Dream Run from a winner of \$11,054 by Naevus (a record which suggests he is a very good mate for mares by sons of Mr. Prospector).

With two-year-olds from his first crop achieving such impressive prices as \$875,000, \$350,000, \$250,000 and \$200,000 in February 1999, the chances are that Cherokee Run started to be treated with greater respect during the 1999 breeding season, which produced Kafwain and two other qualifiers for the Experimental Free Handicap.

Kafwain's dam, Swazi's Moment, failed by only a head to win the GII Princess S. over 8½ furlongs, but she was conceived at a time when her sire, the GII winner Moment of Hope, commanded a fee of only \$2,000. Interestingly, Moment of Hope--who did well over sprint distances after winning over a mile and an eighth--is a grandson of Damascus, who ranks as the broodmare sire of Chilukki.

Because it wasn't until the 2000 season that Cherokee Run's fee was raised to \$20,000, and then to \$25,000 for the 2001 and 2002 seasons, it is fair to hope that his current crop of two-year-olds will achieve even more than its predecessors. Among them are youngsters which sold for \$500,000, \$425,000, \$375,000 and \$300,000, and the four heading for Calder include a half-sister to the Grade III winner Meter Maid and a half-brother to the Grade III winner Old Topper.

Dead-heating Duo to Target Florida Derby

Gulfstream-based **Senor Swinger** (El Prado {Ire}) and **Ten Cents A Shine** (Devil His Due), who dead-heated in a Gulfstream allowance last Friday, will be pointed towards the GI Florida Derby Mar. 15. The allowance was the second start for Senor Swinger. "It's much too soon," trainer Mickey Goldfine said of the Feb. 15 GI Fountain of Youth. "Our immediate goal this winter will be the Florida Derby, with the ultimate goal being the Kentucky Derby. We think he has the ability to run in both races and we don't want to rush him." As for Ten Cents A Shine, trainer Ken McPeck said, "He's a big horse and we still have a lot of fitness to get him." Another of McPeck's runners, **Powerful Touch** (Touch Gold) will miss the Fountain of Youth after sustaining a bruised foot in a tough loss to Offlee Wild in the GIII Holy Bull S.

Mildly supported Grand Delight upstaged a talented field to claim the first leg of the Champion Sprint Series, the Bauhinia Sprint Trophy at Sha Tin yesterday. Last year, Grand Delight won the G1 Emirates S. over a mile in Australia before being sold to race in Hong Kong. His initial 10 starts in Hong Kong were over seven furlongs or a mile, but last month trainer John Size dropped the gelding back in trip and the result was an impressive score in the G3-HK Chinese Club Challenge Cup. Facing a tougher group this time, the bay came out slowly from the gates as Firebolt set a strong pace up front. Still leading 200 meters out, Firebolt appeared the likely winner, but Grand Delight hit full stride and he quickly narrowed the gap. All out in the final 50 meters, the eventual winner caught the Irish-bred a few jumps from the wire and inched clear late for the victory.

WEST NILE VIRUS FOUND IN FETUSES A small number of aborted equine fetuses in Kentucky have tested positive for West Nile virus, according to a statement released Monday by the Kentucky Association of Equine Practitioners. No link has yet been established between the mosquito-borne virus and mare abortions. From the 200 to 300 fetuses submitted to Kentucky's Livestock Disease Diagnostic Laboratory since the summer, the virus was found in approximately 40, according to *Daily Racing Form*.

LAWSUIT HALTS MOUNTAINEER RACING A lawsuit filed by the Mountaineer Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association has led to the cancellation of live racing at West Virginia's Mountaineer Race Track, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The suit, filed Monday in U.S. District Court in Wheeling, W.V., asked the court to issue an injunction prohibiting Mountaineer from engaging in interstate off-track wagering. According to the HBPA, the group and Mountaineer had a wagering agreement through the end of 2003 which allowed it to review the conditions 30 days prior to the end of a calendar year. At the beginning of November, the HBPA sent Mountaineer an amendment regarding the rescheduling of canceled race days. The two sides never reached an agreement on the amendment, making the deal null and void as of Dec. 31, according to the HBPA suit. In statement, the racetrack said it was cancelling racing, "while it attempts to clarify issues surrounding its contracts" with horsemen.

Boston Brat Sets (Another) Gulfstream Track Record:

In his last start, **Boston Brat** (Tour d'Or) set the Gulfstream Park track record of :56 1/5 for five furlongs when he came home a 9 1/4-length victor of a Jan. 17 starter allowance. Yesterday, the six-year-old gelding was at it again, this time equaling the track's 5 1/2-furlong mark of 1:02.47. Boston Brat went wire-to-wire in Monday's fourth race, a starter allowance event, and scored by 10 1/2 lengths. He equalled the track record set by Rare Rack in 1998. Boston Brat is trained by Mark Shuman and owned by Michael Gill.

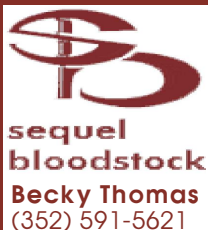
