NEW ZEALAND SCORES DANEHILL HOME RUN

Nearly half of the small but select group of broodmares that were bred to Danehill on Southern Hemisphere time last year are heading to New Zealand after being purchased by Peter and Philip Vela's Pencarrow Stud. Danehill did not shuttle to Australia for the 2002 Southern Hemisphere breeding season, but the Coolmore Stud stallion was bred to just 48 mares on Southern Hemisphere time, with 38 of the mares owned by Coolmore and its partners. In a deal brokered by Adrian Nicoll, the chairman of BBA, Ireland, 20 of the Coolmore mares were bought by the

Velas and will be sent to Pencarrow in New Zealand within the week. "I met with Peter Vela while I was at the Magic Millions sale in January and, together, we chose the best 20 of the 38 mares that Coolmore and its partners owned," Nicoll explained. "Peter owns New Zealand Bloodstock, and selling the 20 Danehills in 2005 will be a great help for his sale. The scarcity value will be enormous--in the past, there have been as many as 40 Danehills at a single sale. I think this was a very smart move--everyone was very happy with the sale." Included in the sale were Group 1 winner **Twafeaj** (Topsider); stakes producer **Brise de Mer** (Bering {GB}), a half-sister to champion Halling; and **Tamarino (Ire)** (Caerleon), a half-sister to champion Northern Spur (Ire). The mares were bred in Ireland, then sent to Australia to foal. Coolmore will likely sell the progeny of the remaining mares in the group in Australia.

SIGHTS SET ON LA CANADA

A small field of five line up for today's GII La Canada S. at Santa Anita, with **Got Koko** (Signal Tap) angling to be only the third filly to sweep the La Canada triple. The Texas-bred will recognize a few familiar faces in **Bella Bellucci** (French Deputy) and **Bare Necessities** (Silver Deputy), who finished second and third, respectively, behind her in the Jan. 19 GII El Encino S., but will likely face her stiffest challenger to date with the presence of trainer Bobby Frankel's **Sightseek** (Distant View). Sightseek made her belated debut at Saratoga last summer, but has since proven herself a first-class filly with consecutive victories in the Oct. 9 GIII Raven Run S. at Keeneland and the Nov. 29 GII Top Flight H. at Aqueduct. Stepping up to Grade I company in her latest, the Juddmonte homebred found the classy Affluent a half-length too much for her in a game runner-up performance in the seven-furlong Santa Monica H. Jan. 25. She will stretch to two turns for only the second time in her career this afternoon with a new jockey in Pat Valenzuela. Frankel, who indicated Sightseek has been training well of late, said, "I don't have any questions about the distance." One filly that has proven herself at this distance is Michael Tabor's Bella Bellucci. A winner going nine panels in a Saratoga allowance test last summer, the gray likely found the seven-furlong La Brea too short, where she she came from last of 10 to be fourth. Sent off as the chalk in the El Encino, she rallied to be second without seriously threatening Got Koko.

BREEDER OF SILVER CHARM PASSES AWAY

Mary Loo Wootten, the breeder of champion three-year-old colt and Kentucky Derby winner Silver Charm, died Feb. 3 at her Long Island home. She was 69. Wootten, who had suffered from pancreatic cancer, was active in horsemen's issues in her home state, serving as a director of the New York Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and treasurer of the New York State Jockey Injury Compensation Fund. She was also active in backstretch issues, chairing an HBPA scholarship fund and working with an alcohol abuse program for backstretch workers. She is survived by her husband, Gordon; a son, Michael; and daughter, Jennifer. A memorial service is scheduled for Feb. 26 at the Bridgehampton Presbyterian Church, Bridgehampton, N.Y. Contributions may be made to Johns Hopkins University, to the attention of Dr. Ralph H. Hurban.

STRANGE CASE AT GULFSTREAM There is an investigation underway to determine why a veterinarian amputated the leg of a horse that was euthanized after breaking down in a race at Gulfstream Park Monday. Casual Conflict, a nine-year-old gelding running for an \$18,000 tag, suffered a fractured right front cannon bone during the seventh race and had to be put down. The horse's body was moved to the backside, but when Dr. Caroline Gall, one of the track's assistant veterinarians, went to document the reasons for the breakdown, she discovered Casual Conflict was missing his right front leg. Gall reported this to track vet Dr. Mary Scollay, who in turn informed track security. The horse ambulance driver, Doug Kickbush, told security he saw a veterinarian's truck pull up just as he was unloading the dead horse. A description of the truck helped security identify the vet, who then returned the missing limb. Casual Conflict was trained Mike Shuman, who is leading the standings at the Gulfstream meet with 35 victories. Shuman said he was tired of reporters bothering him about the missing leg. "If it were anybody else there wouldn't be any question," he said. "It's very simple. The vet [who Shuman refused to identify] called me right after the breakdown and asked if he could have the leg to examine, much the same way a human doctor looks at a body to see what went wrong." Dr. Tom Brokken, a respected vet who works at both Calder and Gulfstream, was not suspicious of that explanation. "That makes sense to me," he said. "The vet is young and he was probably looking for answers. I've had owners ask me to look for a reason when a horse breaks down. If I did it, I'm sure there wouldn't be any questions asked. Because it's Shuman and [owner Michael] Gill, everybody's asking questions." The body of Casual Conflict, along with the leg, was transported to the University of Florida's Veterinarian School for examination. Dr. Sidney Kollias-Baker, who heads the school's test lab, said the examination would take at least four weeks.

Coming off a fourth-place finish as the 2-1 chalk in the Nov. 30 GIII Generous S. on the Hollywood lawn, Man Among Men was sent off at a generous 9-1, but turned back the late bid off odds-on Empire Maker for the score. Eighth behind Kafwain in his career opener last June, the Triple Crown nominee switched to the grass to break his maiden at Del Mar, then took the restricted Pinjara S. at Santa Anita. Back on the dirt in his sophomore debut, the chestnut settled in third for six furlongs, took over as they raced into the stretch and held Empire Maker safe. Trainer Gary Mandella said he would consider the Mar. 8 GIII El Camino Real Derby, Mar. 9 GII Louisiana Derby or Mar. 16 GII San Felipe S. for the winner. Empire Maker, making his first start since running third in the Nov. 30 GII Remsen S., was well back early, made a run at the top of the lane, but flattened out late. "He's physically fit, but he's not real razor-sharp mentally yet," jockey Jerry Bailey said.

Thanks to a victory in the G1 Grand Criterium S. in France as a two-year-old, Okawango was named highweight two-year-old colt in said country. Lightly raced since, the bay hit the place spot twice in three starts in 2002 for trainer Christiane Head-Marek: the G3 Prix Edmond Blanc in April and a conditions test in May that concluded his four-year-old year. Now under the tutelage of trainer Richard Mandella, he'll make his 2003 bow with the addition of both Lasix and blinkers.



NEW TRIPLE CROWN IMMINENT Britain could stage a new £5-million Summer Triple Crown and Grand Slam in the near future, according to the British Horseracing Board, who are set to announce the details next month. In a move to counter the waning interest in the current Triple Crown comprised of the 2000 Guineas, the Derby and the St Leger, the BHB are looking to put together a series of races in three stages. Horses that capture the Derby, Oaks or Coronation Cup at Epsom or the Prince of Wales' S. at Royal Ascot, would qualify as winners of the first leg of the Summer Triple Crown. The series will completed by the Eclipse S. at Sandown and the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot in July. There will be a £1 million bonus on offer for completing the Triple Crown. There will also be the opportunity to complete the Grand Slam by winning the International S. at York in August, which would mean a further £4 million to connections. "The Board has given the go-ahead to the initiative," Alan Delmonte, the BHB's communications manager, said yesterday. "However, there are still many details that need to be finalised...we would expect to make a formal announcement as a launch sometime towards the end of March."

GOVERNMENT CLOSE IN ON STUDS

Ireland's stud farms will have to submit details of money made by standing stallions as part of new measures by the government, *Irish Racing online* has revealed. The provisions, introduced as part of the Finance Bill, will allow profits to be scrutinised by the Exchequer for the first time. Last year, the government refused to end the tax-exempt status of stallions despite fears the budget might include these measures.
