**NINE ENTERED IN FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH**

Nine three-year-olds were entered yesterday for Saturday's GI Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park. The 1 1/16-mile race marks the return of Grade I winner

**Whywhywhy** (Mr. Greeley), who was installed the 5-2 morning-line favorite and will break from post five. The Patrick Biancone-trained colt vaulted to the top of last year's juvenile division with victories in the GIII Flash S., GII Sanford S. and GI Futurity, but he has not raced since finishing a disappointing 10th in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile last October at Arlington. **Trust N Luck** (Montbrook), 4-1 on the morning line, is coming off a dominant 11-length victory in the Dec. 14 What a Pleasure S. at Calder. Trained by Ralph Ziadie, the colt will break from post six. **Ten Cents a Shine** (Devil His Due), second in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. last November at Churchill Downs, dead-heated with Senor Swinger for a Gulfstream allowance victory at the Fountain of Youth distance on Jan. 31. The colt, 4-1 on the morning line, drew post position two for tomorrow's race.

**GOFFS & TATTERSALLS COME TO AGREEMENT**

Ending what had deteriorated into a sizable rift between companies, Goffs and Tattersalls (Ireland) have agreed to swap the sales dates for the 2003 Goffs Orby and Challenge Sale and the Tattersalls (Ireland) September Yearling Sale. The Tattersalls (Ireland) September Yearling Sale is slated to run from Sept. 16-18. A week later, the Goffs Orby and Challenge Sale will run from Sept. 23-25, with the Challenge Sale remaining a one-day sale. In a joint statement, Tattersalls (Ireland) Chairman Edmond Mahony and Goffs Managing Director Matt Mitchell commented, "We are pleased to have resolved any outstanding issues for 2003. Not only will the Tattersalls (Ireland) September Yearling Sale be reverting to its originally planned date, but also both companies have re-established the fundamental principle that competing sales dates should not be encroached upon without prior agreement. "So, if the weather doesn't allow me to do it the way I want, I'll just train him up to the Santa Anita Derby. Then I've still got four weeks to the Kentucky Derby."

With a flying finish, South African import Victory Moon denied Godolphin its fourth UAE 2000 Guineas by asserting over Western Diplomat in the closing stages of this contest. It was the second major win in the last week for trainer Mike deKock, who saddled Ipi Tombe (Zim) to victory in the Listed Al Fahidi Fort. De Kock said that Victory Moon would "probably" chase the Dubai Triple Crown, but didn't rule out a tilt at older horses in the third round of the Mar. 8 Maktoum Challenge. The second leg of the Triple Crown, the \$200,000 Al Bastakiya, will also be run Mar. 8. "We will wait and have a look at the conditions of both races, but the [Mar. 29 G2] UAE Derby is and always has been his main goal," de Kock said.

**MEDIA PUZZLE OUT OF SHEEMA CLASSIC**

**Media Puzzle** (Theatrical {Ire}), winner of last year's G1 Melbourne Cup, will miss the \$2-million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29 after sustaining an injury to his left foreleg. Trainer Dermot Weld remains upbeat concerning the six-year-old's recovery. "There are no major concerns," Weld told *The Age* yesterday. "Our head traveling lad Pat Doughty was monitoring the situation." Also the winner of the G3 Holden Geelong Cup in 2002, the chestnut has scored in six of 19 lifetime starts to date for earnings of \$1,554,495.

**INTERIM REPORT FINDS NO BETTING IRREGULARITIES** The National Thoroughbred Racing Association's Wagering Technology Working Group, in conjunction with its security consulting firm, Giuliani Partners, has released an interim report on steps the horse racing industry has taken to enhance wagering system security in the wake of last year's Breeders' Cup Pick 6 Scandal. The committee, currently reviewing hundreds of Pick Six and Pick Four wagers, has determined that the Breeders' Cup five-of-six winners contained no irregularities. In addition, no irregularities have been found in over 50 percent of the wagers investigated so far. "Significant steps have been taken and we have identified additional measures that will enhance overall security and improve standards," said Rudolph Giuliani. According to the report, the major tote companies have already installed progressive scanning software at all relevant U.S. wagering outlets to allow each outlet to detect in real time any attempted change to wagering selections after the fact. The accounting firm Ernst & Young is currently in the process of reviewing tote security systems. The company has completed its work at Autotote and will conduct reviews at the other tote companies in the next month. "While today's update is an interim report only, work is underway in each of the main areas identified by the working group late last year," commented NTRA Commissioner Tim Smith. "The industry remains fully committed to ensuring the integrity of its wagering technology and security systems." A final report on the group's findings is expected later this year.
