“OFF” AND RUNNING

Offlee Wild (Wild Again), who started the season with a win in the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream Park Jan. 18, will try to make it two in a row against eight rivals in the GI Fountain Of Youth S. this afternoon. The dark bay, a \$325,000 KEESEP yearling, was off at 27-1 in the Holy Bull, but belied his odds to post a game head victory in what was his stakes and two-turn debut. Trainer T.V. Smith was not the least surprised that his colt handled the route. “I never had any doubt he would go a distance of ground,” Smith said. “Fact is, I think he will go a lot farther than he went in the Holy Bull.” Offlee Wild prepped for his first Grade I try with a bullet five furlongs in :57 2/5 Wednesday. He will face a tougher field here, including **Whywhywhy** (Mr. Greeley), who reeled off three graded-stakes wins last year, capping the streak in the one-mile GI Futurity at Belmont. Sent off the 5-2 favorite in the GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile, he faltered to finish 10th. The chestnut, who makes his first start since the Breeders’ Cup, arrived from California Wednesday. He will race with blinkers off for the first time.

HARMONIOUS AFTERNOON AT GULFSTREAM

Gold Mover (Gold Fever) was the odds-on choice, but she couldn’t catch **Harmony Lodge** (Hennessy) in the GIII Shirley Jones H. at Gulfstream Park yesterday afternoon. With jockey John Velazquez in the saddle, Harmony Lodge battled **Forest Heiress** (Forest Wildcat) through fast fractions, then put that one away and opened up to win by three lengths. “It couldn’t have worked out any better,” Velazquez said. “We broke on top so I just let her go and she was game the whole way.” The five-year-old mare had scored her first graded success in her first start of the campaign, taking the Jan. 12 GIII First Lady H. at six furlongs. She had been off the board in two prior attempts at seven-eighths, but had no trouble handling the added ground yesterday. She will be pointed for the Hurricane Bertie S. Mar. 16. Gold Mover, who had won four of five prior tries at the track, was making her first start since romping home in the Safely Kept H. at Arlington Park Oct. 26. Under heavy pressure from jockey Jerry Bailey on the far turn, she never threatened the winner while just managing to hold off **Nonsuch Bay** (Mr. Greeley) for second. Champion **Xtra Heat** had one of the few off-the-board finishes of her career when sixth after being held off the pace in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint last October. Second over a muddy Aqueduct track in the Dec. 14 Garland of Roses H., the diminutive speedster returned to her winning ways with a front-running 2 3/4-length victory in the What a Summer S. at Laurel Jan. 18.

Carson Hollow won the first four starts of her career, culminating with a two-length victory in the GI Prioress S. last July. She suffered her first defeat when a nose short of You in the GI Test S., but returned to the winner's circle with a wire-to-wire score in the Sept. 14 GIII Floral Park H. Carson Hollow battled on the front end in the Breeders' Cup Sprint before tiring to 13th.

Fly Me Crazy, claimed for \$62,500 last December at Calder, makes her fourth start for the team of owner Mike Gill and trainer Mark Shuman. The chestnut mare was second in the Dec. 29 Sober Jig S. at Calder and again in Gulfstream's GIII First Lady H. before running fourth in the Jan. 25 Sunshine Millions Sprint S. last time out.

The Tin Man, a wire-to-wire winner of the GI Clement Hirsch Memorial H. last October, tired to fourth after setting the pace over a yielding turf course in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. The dark bay gelding was just a head short of Johar in his return in the Jan. 20 GII San Marcos H. **Continental Red** missed by just a neck in this race last year, but returned to narrowly take the GII San Luis Rey H. at the same 1 1/2-mile distance. The chestnut gelding ended 2002 with a victory over the main track in the Great State Challenge Classic S. at Sam Houston in December and returned this year to finish eighth over the dirt in the Jan. 25 Sunshine Millions Classic S. at Gulfstream Park. **Special Matter** won the GIII C. F. Burke H. at this course and distance last October before ending his campaign with an eighth-place effort in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup. Woodbine Releases Stakes Schedule:

Woodbine Entertainment Group, which operates Woodbine Racetrack in Toronto, has released a record stakes schedule for 2003, with total purse distribution of \$19 million. The highlight of the program is the \$1.5 million GI Canadian International, which will be run along with the \$750,000 GI E.P. Taylor S. on Oct. 19. The races will likely not serve as Breeders' Cup prep races this year, as racing's Championship Day is scheduled just six days later at Santa Anita. Other highlights on the schedule include the Sept. 14 GI Atto Mile; the first leg of the Canadian Triple Crown, the \$1 million Queen's Plate June 22; the final leg of that series, the \$500,000 Breeders' S. Aug. 9; the half-million dollar Labatt Woodbine Oaks June 8; and the GI Selene S., also for sophomore fillies, May 19. Woodbine opens the doors on its 2003 season Saturday, Mar. 22.

Another Purse Increase at Tampa Bay Downs:

With the handle up 23 percent to date, Tampa Bay Downs will raise purses 5 percent effective Feb. 20, it was announced yesterday. This is the second purse hike of the meet, following a 6-percent boost Jan. 30. "The Tampa simulcast signal continues to flourish despite soft on-track figures," Tampa Vice President and General Manager Peter Berube said.

Burning Roma Returns:

Burning Roma (Rubiano) returns to racing in today's Tampa Bay Breeders' Cup at Tampa Bay Downs. The five-year-old has been off since finishing 10th in the GIII Stuyvesant H. last November. Last year, the five-year-old defeated subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Volponi to take the GII Meadowlands Cup H. and ran third in the GI Carter H. On the board in 17 of 23 starts to date, Burning Roma has won 10 races and earned \$1,205,537. The 1 1/16-miles Tampa Bay Breeders' Cup will be his first start on the turf.
