JOHNNY LONGDEN DEAD

Hall of Fame jockey Johnny Longden, the only horse-
man to both ride and train a Kentucky Derby winner,
died Friday afternoon at his home in Banning, California.
It was his 96th birthday. Born in England and raised in

Alberta, Canada, Longden
started riding races in Utah,
getting his first winner in 1927.
His career, which spanned five
decades, included a Triple
Crown sweep aboard Count
Fleet, five wins each in the
Santa Anita and Hollywood
Derbies, four victories in the
Santa Anita H. and four in the
Hollywood Gold Cup. He was

the regular rider for such top horses as Busher, Noor,
Swaps and T.V. Lark, and was inducted into the Hall of
Fame in 1958. Longden's final ride was right out of a
Hollywood script. Making his swan song in the 1966
San Juan Capistrano H. at the age of 59, "The Pumper"
drove 7-1 shot George Royal to a photo-finish victory
over Plaque. He retired as the leading jockey of all time
with 6,032 winners from his 32,413 mounts, account-
ing for \$24,665,800 in purses. Just three years later,
he saddled Majestic Prince to win the Kentucky Derby
and the Preakness. He also conditioned stakes horses
such as Baffle, Jungle Savage and Money Lender before
hanging up his stop watch in 1989. He received a Special
Eclipse Award in 1994 in recognition of his career
and his work in co-founding the Jockeys' Guild.
Longden still ranks 14th on the list of all-time winning
jockeys. "There might have been riders as good, but
not any better," retired jockey Ray York, who rode
against Longden, said Friday. "In 1949, when I came
from the Fairs and went to Bay Meadows, in one race, I
bothered John leaving the gate and he walked over to
me in the jocks' room [after the race]. I thought, 'Uh
oh,' because he was my idol then and he's my idol
now. But he put his arm around me and...he just told
me, 'Now son, when you leave the gate, have a little
more hold of them horses, and beside that, I bet my
money, and you bothered me.'" Longden is survived by
his wife of 10 years, Kathy, daughter Andrea and son
Eric. Memorial services are pending.

Trust N Luck (Montbrook) proved that his Beyer

yesterday's GI Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park.
The wire-to-wire winner
of the final leg of the
Florida Stallion S. at
Calder Oct. 12, the
chestnut cut back to
seven furlongs and fin-
ished fourth behind
Supah Blitz (Mecke) in
the Jack Price S. for
state-breds Nov. 16
prior to closing the year in the What A Pleasure. Intent
on the lead, the Florida-bred outspurred **Midway Cat**
(Sir Cat) and was guided over to the rail entering the
backstretch. Confidently handled throughout by regular
rider Cornelio Velasquez, Trust N Luck began to assert
in upper stretch and was not seriously menaced en
route to the win. Favored **Ten Cents a Shine** (Devil His
Due) was never a factor and finished sixth, beaten 23

The race played out just about as expected, according to winning trainer Ralph Ziadie. "I wasn't surprised he got the lead," the Jamaican native admitted. "I looked at the form and thought he was the controlling speed. He's got natural speed and I don't think he will have trouble going longer." With that thought in mind, the conditioner laid out the near-term plans for his charge. "The way he ran today, he will start next in the [Mar. 15 nine-furlong GI] Florida Derby. Our plans have been [to run in that race] and then go on to the Kentucky Derby if he is good enough. One of my goals when I started training in this country was that I wanted to go to the Kentucky Derby. But I wouldn't go just to go. I wanted to have a horse that could win it." The situation was not so rosy in the camp of the beaten favorite, whose connections were at a loss to explain the effort. "I don't know what happened out there," commented trainer Ken McPeck. "Jerry [Bailey] said he quit running at the half-mile pole. Jerry thought he was bleeding and eased up. Then the colt took off again. We'll take a close look at him to see if we can find anything. Delago Brom proved he has the ability to match his stunning looks when he rocketed from near the tail of the field to win the G1 Cadbury Guineas from Tycoon Ruler. The latter set a fierce pace until the 800-meter mark, when he slowed the tempo and Thorn Park peeled out wide soon thereafter, inconveniencing the eventual winner, who regained his balance and stormed down the outside to breeze past a struggling Thorn Park with 100 meters to run. Delago Brom rebounded from a lackluster spring campaign to finish second to classy filly Innovation Girl in the G3 Debonair S. Feb. 1. He is entered for the A\$2.5 million G1 Doncaster H. at Randwick Apr. 19, but trainer Tommy Hughes Sr. said he would consider a start instead in the G1 Australian Derby over 2400 meters on the same day. "He [Thorn Park] would have had to improve a lot to beat us," said the 72-year-old winning conditioner. "I have always thought Delago Brom was a good horse and he is on target to be the best horse I've had."

Given the ease with which The Tin Man has handled off turf courses, his connections will likely be praying for a soggy October, as Santa Anita hosts this year's Breeders' Cup. Just an allowance winner at this time last season, the dark bay has rounded into one of this country's leading distance specialists. Second by a neck in the 11-furlong GII Del Mar H. Sept. 1, the homebred wired the field in the GI Clement L. Hirsch Turf Championship Oct. 6 over a mile-and-a-quarter, earning his way into the Breeders' Cup Turf. The pace-setter through the opening six furlongs over a yielding Arlington turf course, he gave way late to finish third and kicked off the new year with a game runner-up finish to Johar in the GII San Marcos H. Jan. 20. Sitting on go for this effort, the race was over in a matter of strides. Flashing his customary speed beneath jockey Mike Smith, The Tin Man coasted over the saturated turf course, covering the opening 3/4 of a mile in a pedestrian 1:15 3/5. Still well within himself turning for home, the gelding kicked clear and was taken in hand late. "He is such a cool horse," said the winning rider. "He really loves what he does. He's getting more and more professional all the time. The soft turf is absolutely his specialty." Winning trainer Richard Mandella said The Tin Man is probable for the 12-furlong GII San Luis Rey H. Mar. 15.

Lion Tamer made a mockery of what was supposed to be an East versus West battle with Scrimshaw (Gulch), powering clear to a daylight victory and becoming the first graded-stakes winner for his second-crop sire in the process. A solid second to subsequent MGSW Zavata in his May 27 debut at Belmont, the chestnut colt was not seen again for four months, returning to graduate by three lengths in Elmont Sept. 28. Given time to regroup from that effort, the Triple Crown nominee broke slowly in a Jan. 4 allowance, but rallied on the far turn and pulled clear by 7 1/2 lengths. Purchased privately by Michael Tabor from Peachtree Stables following that effort, Lion Tamer was the solid choice to make it three straight. Off a beat slowly again, the Todd Pletcher-trainee recovered quickly to stalk the early pace of Crafty Guy as Scrimshaw, restless in the gate, tracked from third. Lion Tamer easily reeled in the pacesetter in upper stretch and drew off to win impressively. Scrimshaw, the 2-1 second choice, tired to fourth. "This horse has shown brilliance at times," the winning conditioner commented. "It looks like he may be a special horse and we'll have to stretch him out now. I don't know where he'll run next, but I wouldn't rule out the [Mar. 15 GI] Florida Derby or the [Mar. 9 GII] Louisiana Derby or any other race at this time." After breaking her maiden at Keeneland in her fifth start Oct. 5, Belle Of Perintown was sent into the stakes fray and made it two in a row in the Nov. 2 Pocahontas S. at Churchill Downs. The bay did not fare as well in her two most recent outings, however, ending her juvenile campaign with a fifth-place finish in the Nov. 30 GII Golden Rod S. and starting 2003 with an eighth-place showing behind Lady Tak after rearing at the start in the Jan. 26 Tiffany Lass S. at Fair Grounds. Let go at double-digit odds off those efforts, she tracked Rebridled Dreams for six furlongs, strode to the front in the stretch and drew off to upset this field with an eye-catching performance. "She was unbelievable, fantastic," trainer Eddie Kenneally said. "My filly has been training well to the race. I was just concerned with her mental state after the last race, but I think that question has been answered." A maiden winner in two starts at two in Ireland, **Bowman's Crossing** registered a pair of wins as a sophomore in Hong Kong, ending the year with a 3/4-length victory over Gift in a premier handicap event on the International Races undercard Dec. 15.
