THAT'S FINAL

Final Destination (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}), who ended her Southern Hemisphere career with three straight wins, kept her Northern Hemisphere record unblemished with a half-length score in the GII Buena Vista H. at Santa Anita yesterday afternoon. The five-year-old captured the G1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas and G1 Bayer Classic in 2001 and added a victory in a New Zealand handicap last March in her final start in her native country. She made her U.S. bow after an 11-month vacation, wiring the field in a Hollywood allowance test Dec. 11, and was the second choice trying American stakes company for the first time. A tracking third for six furlongs, the dark bay rallied to the lead in deep stretch and held **Garden in the Rain (Fr)** (Dolphin Street {Fr}) at bay for the win. Trainer Bobby Frankel believes the mare will be even better in the future. "She doesn't even look that good right now," he said. "I think she's in an in-between stage, where it's just starting to turn the seasons and she's upside-down...our winter is their summer. I think she's got some improvement to do." Nearly four years ago, after Silverbulletday's impressive win in the Ashland S., I pointed out that her dam, Rokeby Rose, had disappointed with the likes of Northern Dancer and Blushing Groom, yet had succeeded in producing a champion to Silver Deputy, who commanded a fee of only \$7,500 at the time.

I went on to explain that Silver Deputy's career had consisted of two wins from two starts in the summer of his juvenile season before problems with one of his knees forced his retirement. Also, that he had followed in the footsteps of his great-grand sire Northern Dancer, moving south from his original base in Canada after his first juveniles had done very well.

"Silver Deputy's first three Kentucky crops have thoroughly justified his move," I wrote, "and Silverbulletday has helped fuel a rise in his fee from \$15,000 to \$40,000. It is going to be fascinating to see what Silver Deputy achieves with the better opportunities he is now receiving."

Those opportunities continued to improve, thanks to the sterling 1999 efforts of Silverbulletday and her talented supporting cast, which included Archers Bay, Grade III winners Cowboy Cop, Etbauer and Scotzanna, the durable Canadian performers Deputy Inxs and Crown Attorney and the good juvenile Deputy Warlock.

Pedigree Insights cont.

By the end of the year Silver Deputy ranked second only to Storm Cat on the leading sires' list and his fee for the 2000 season was upped to \$75,000.

It hasn't all been a story of onwards and upwards, though, as you can tell from the fact that Silver Deputy's fee was back down to its current level of \$40,000 by 2002. He had a very quiet time in 2000 and 2001, failing to come up with a single graded-stakes winner either year despite having had 140 runners in 2000 and 143 the following year. The only highlight was his daughter Poetically, Canada's champion two-year-old filly of 2000.

Of course, virtually every stallion is destined to suffer the odd below-par season, but those two consecutive disappointing years for Silver Deputy must have worried the breeders who had used him at \$75,000--especially as there seemed to be no obvious reason for the downturn, apart from the fact that most of his representatives had been sired at fees of no more than \$10,000.

Happily, it is beginning to look as though those disappointing years will soon be a distant memory. Silver Deputy's current three-year-olds are the result of his \$40,000 coverings in 1999 and they averaged over \$117,000 at the yearling sales of 2001, with a top price of \$525,000. What's more, the two-year-olds that will be flying the flag for Silver Deputy later in the year are the result of his first \$75,000 season. They averaged over \$133,000 at the yearling sales, helped by a pair of fillies which sold for \$700,000 and \$575,000.

The three-year-olds helped start Silver Deputy's resurgence last year, when Posse won the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup S., the Japanese-trained Atago Taisho took the G3-JRA Hakodate Nisai S. and Hussar finished second in the GIII Tremont S.

There has been a spate of winners from this crop over the last three or four months, with Something Silver getting 2003 off to a fine start with her win in the Dame Mystreieuse S.

Since then, Badge of Silver, Bayou Mist, Posse and Lone Star Deputy have all made it to the winner's circle.

Badge of Silver raised some exciting possibilities with his victory in the GIII Risen Star S.--his third wide-margin win from as many starts.

Silver Deputy's three graded winners from his 2000 crop were all bought at auction for unexceptional prices. Atago Taisho fetched \$125,000, \$10,000 more than Posse, and Badge of Silver was picked up for only \$85,000 at Keeneland.

Although Badge of Silver has yet to tackle more than 1 1/16 miles, his owner has hopes that he develops into a Derby horse. Of course, Silverbulletday--who is out of A Tom Rolfe mare-- showed with her win in the Alabama S. that Silver Deputy can get a top-class winner over 1 1/4 miles, provided he receives some help from the mare. He also sired Archers Bay, winner of two legs of the Canadian Triple Crown, from a daughter of the stamina-packed Val de l'Orne. It is in Badge of Silver's favor that his dam, the two-year-old winner Silveroo, is by Silver Hawk, an established source of stamina. Over the last four years, the average distance of the wins by Silver Hawk's numerous British runners has been 10.6 furlongs.

Silver Hawk has been a very respected member of Kentucky's stallion community for so many years now that it is easy to forget that he struggled for support in the early years of his career. His fifth crop, born in 1988, numbered only 16 named foals even though his fee had fallen as low as \$2,500 in 1987. Badge of Silver's dam, Hey Mama, had paid her first visit to Silver Hawk in 1985, with that mating resulting in Formidable Lady. This durable stakes winner at up to a mile and an eighth achieved the admirable rating of 115 on the Blood-Horse Free Handicaps as a three-year-old.

The next dam, Hey Mama, collected three minor stakes wins and a track record over 7 1/2 furlongs as a three-year-old and was by High Tribute, an Elmendorf stallion who enjoyed his finest moment when he won the Jerome H. over a mile.

This background doesn't make Badge of Silver a certainty to be suited by 1 1/4 miles, but he is in with a chance and he could easily be the one to provide Silver Deputy with his first Grade I success since 1999.

Fourth, beaten less than two lengths in the G2 Stayers' S. over 3600 meters Nov. 30, Ingrandire was given a bit of breather and was coming into this effort off a sixth-place finish in the Jan. 25 Alexandrite S. at over an insufficient 1800 meters. Stretching back out in distance as a 22-1 longshot, the bay colt sped to the front, was allowed to set pedestrian fractions along the inside and held sway late for his first graded-stakes success. ICE STORM CRIPPLES BLUEGRASS An ice storm has crippled central Kentucky, causing power outages at several major horse farms. Up to an inch of ice is coating trees and power lines, and Kentucky Utilities was reporting yesterday morning that 40,000 people were without power in Lexington alone. The towns of Midway and Versailles were said to be without power as well, and the utility company told residents that they could not predict when power would be restored. "It's amazing--some of the streets look like a war zone," said Lexington's Robert Williams, who operates Grassy Creek Farm in nearby Jessamine County. "We have a neighbor with some old trees, and they lost 80% of their mass overnight. The weight of the ice was so great that the branches just kept snapping off. It sounds like fireworks. I was out feeding the horses at two in the morning, and you just heard banging and popping noises. People were out watching the transformers blow all over town." The area has received just a dusting of snow, but a misty rain has fallen on the state for three days, and temperatures hovering right around the freezing area have caused icy conditions, with trees falling onto power lines and blocking roads.

MUTUEL FIELD TOPS FIRST FUTURE POOL The mutuel field, which has been favored in the first pool of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager in each of the first four years, was once again on top when this year's Pool 1 closed Sunday. The field, including all three-year-olds other than the 23 named in the pool, was bet down to 2-1, making it the strongest Future Wager favorite in the bet's history. Next in the betting was GIII Risen Star S. winner **Badge Of Silver** (Silver Deputy), who dropped from 50-1 on the Pool 1 morning line to 11-1. The GI Fountain Of Youth S. winner **Trust N Luck** (Montbrook) also saw his odds plummet, from 99-1 on the morning line to 19-1. Three colts were at 12-1 when betting closed--**Kafwain** (Cherokee Run), **Sky Mesa** (Pulpit) and **Toccet** (Awesome Again). Total handle from 34 states on Pool 1 was \$516,906, the third-largest single-pool total ever. Pool 2 opens Mar. 13 and closes Mar. 16. (Complete Pool 1 odds, p2)

First or second in all but one start while racing in France, Rouvres earned consecutive victories in an Apr. 4 conditions race and the May 16 G3 Prix de Guiche at Longchamp, then ended his European stint with a neck success in the June 2 G1 Prix Jean Prat. The heavy favorite to continue his streak despite the cross-Atlantic trip and the 8 1/2-month layoff, the dark bay was three-wide while pressing the early pace, closed to take the lead in deep stretch and edged clear.

Shuman Ties Mott's Mark:

Trainer Mark Shuman tied Bill Mott's Gulfstream Park record of 39 winners for a meeting Sunday, the 36th day of the 2003 meet. Shuman won two races Sunday to nab the tie. "This meet has been just great," Shuman said. "Our horses were in the right races, they got good draws and we just got lucky." Mott set the record in 1996 during Gulfstream's 64-day stand.

Options for Lion Tamer:

The next start for **Lion Tamer** (Will's Way), winner of Saturday's Gll Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream, is still up in the air, according to trainer Todd Pletcher. "He might be one of the best horses I've ever trained," he said. "He came out of the race in great shape and I'll keep him at Gulfstream for a few more days before taking him back to Palm Meadows. He may be a special horse and we'll have to stretch him out now. We've got a lot of options and a lot of races we could run him in."

Harlan's Holiday Preps for Donn:

Harlan's Holiday (Harlan) had his final prep for Saturday's GI Donn H. Sunday morning at Gulfstream, going an easy half in :49 3/5. "It was what I wanted," said Pletcher. "He's on track for the Donn and, barring any unforeseen circumstances, he'll be running in it." The winner of last year's Florida Derby won his 2003 debut at Gulfstream, taking a Feb. 2 allowance.

A 6 1/2-length winner of the **Dixie Belle S.** over this course and distance Jan. 31, **Explosive Beauty** was made the even-money choice to repeat here and did so convincingly. Stalking the early pace from the outside, she challenged on the turn, turned for home in front and increased her lead through the stretch. All three of her wins have now come at six furlongs, but trainer Norman Cole was hopeful she would go further. "The nice thing about this filly is that she breaks well, relaxes and lays up close," he said. "Then it's like pushing a button and she takes off. All this leads me to believe that she will stretch out and get a distance."
