YELL SCREAMS TO DAVONA DALE WIN

In a parade of homebreds, Claiborne Farm & Adele Dilschneider's **Yell** (A.P. Indy) capped off an impressive day for her sire when she crossed the finish line first in yesterday's GII Davona Dale S. and gave A.P. Indy his third winner of the day at Gulfstream Park. The lightly

aced filly kicked off 2003 with a neck victory as the hot 3-5 choice in an allowance test over this track Jan. 16, but was a lukewarm 5-1 behind stakes-winning **Ivanavinalot** (West Acre), at 9-5, and 3-2 favorite **My Boston Gal** (Boston Harbor), undefeated winner of last fall's GII Golden

Rod S. Yell stalked the early pace set by Ivanavinalot, took over from that foe at the top of the stretch and drew clear late for the easy score. "I had a good trip," said winning rider John Velazquez. "You ride horses like this--they make you look good. I got her right where I wanted to be early, and when I asked her to move, she really responded." Yell will likely make her next start in the GII Bonnie Miss S. Mar. 14. WEATHER WOES FOR TOC CET

Due to the recent rash of bad weather in the Mid-Atlantic states, GISW **Toccet** (Awesome Again) missed a scheduled workout yesterday at Laurel, which would have been his first since he was sidelined with what owner Daniel Borislow has described as "bone remodeling" in his ankles, which is similar to shin splints. However, trainer John Scanlan continues to be impressed by the progress his colt is making and said he may have him ready in time for the Mar. 29 Private Terms S. at Laurel. "Nothing is definite and we have him nominated to a couple of spots, but I think the Private Terms would be a good, easy spot for his comeback race," Scanlan said. "He's doing fine. I think we can have him ready [for the Kentucky Derby] because he's that good of a horse, but we'll have to wait and see." Scanlan had hoped to have Toccet back on the worktab by yesterday morning, but did not want to take any unnecessary risks. Maryland was socked by 26 inches of snow earlier in the week and then got hit hard again by a rain storm Saturday. "Don't get me wrong, they have the racetrack in nice shape, but not nice enough for a horse like this," Scanlan said. "We won't work him for another four days now. At that time, he'll work three furlongs. He galloped this morning and that went fine." Scanlan hopes to use the April 12 GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct as Toccet's main Kentucky Derby prep.

ON THE WORKTAB

Omega Code (Elusive Quality), prepping for Saturday's GII San Rafael S., worked seven furlongs Friday at Santa Anita in 1:23.60, in company with Santa Anita H. hopeful **Kudos**. "The work was faster than I wanted to begin with, but everything worked out great."

Possible for the San Rafael is Bob Baffert's Panamanian invader **Indian Express** (Indian Charlie), who worked one mile Saturday in 1:39.60. "He worked good yesterday," Baffert said of the colt who won his only two starts in Panama. "He'll go all day, I think, but we can't get a line on him until he runs."

HIGH MAY TAKE MILE ROAD Trainer Aidan O'Brien may send **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) to Newbury to contest the G1 Lockinge S. over a mile May 17, it was revealed yesterday. In an unorthodox move, the Ballydoyle handler suggested that the dual Derby and Breeders' Cup Turf winner may drop back in trip on his four-year-old debut. "I'm really looking forward to High Chaparral this year," O'Brien told the *Racing Post*. "It might surprise a lot of people, but I wouldn't mind looking at the Lockinge as a starting point for him. He's a horse with plenty of pace and the only reason he didn't go for the Guineas is that we had the other horses for the race. It's only a possibility, though, and in the end we will be looking at all the big mile-and-a-quarter and mile-and-a-half races." O'Brien also issued an upbeat bulletin on **Hawk Wing** (Woodman) as he prepares for the season ahead. Runner-up to Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) and High Chaparral in the 2000 Guineas and Epsom Derby, respectively, last year, his campaign will be geared around his versatility over various trips. "Hawk Wing is a fine, big horse and as such you certainly wouldn't expect him to go backwards from three to four," O'Brien commented. "He was probably unlucky to come up against Rock Of Gibraltar and High Chaparral last year. He has also always wanted fast ground and he was unlucky last year in the sense that he never got it. He's effective at a mile and we'll be looking up to a mile and a half with him."

 Buddy Gil, a maiden winner over one mile at Bay Meadows last October, romped home a 7 1/2-length winner of the six-furlong Golden Bear S. before running fifth over a sloppy track in the Gold Rush S. last December. He returned this year to finish seventh in the Jan. 11 1 1/16-mile GIII Golden Gate Derby last time out. Making his first start for trainer Jeff Mullins and trying the turf for the first time, the bay gelding raced three wide while sitting off the early pacesetters. He rallied five wide into the stretch and closed powerfully to overtake King Robyn in the closing strides. "[Mullins] said to put him where I wanted to and that I should be just off the pace and that when I pushed the button, the horse would be there for me," said winning rider Gary Stevens. "It sounded to me like I was riding a 1-9 shot instead of a 20-1 shot; that's just the confidence Jeff had." It was a reunion for the trainer/jockey duo, even if Stevens didn't remember it. "I thought this was the first horse I had ridden for Jeff," admitted Stevens. "But he pulled the old win picture out of his office the other morning--1981 at Le Bois Park. His very first win and I rode for him. We were both 18 years old, so this was kind of cool."

Olympic Express put together an outstanding four-year-old season in Hong Kong, including a 3 1/2-length victory over Precision (Fr) (Anabaa) in the G1 Hong Kong Derby in March. Off the board in the G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup in April and the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup the following month, the gelding returned to finish last of 14 in the Nov. 24 International Sprint Trial at Sha Tin, but more than made up for that loss with a 49-1 upset of the G1 Hong Kong Mile Dec. 15. The Ivan Allan trainee was coming into this off a fourth to Electronic Unicorn in the G1 Stewards' Cup Jan. 19. Drawn widest of all, Olympic Express broke alertly, but was unable to tuck in early on and raced three wide for the opening 600 meters. Still deep, but racing with cover around the far turn, Olympic Express found clear running turning for home, took over inside the final furlong and outgamed Dr More for the win. "He has done very, very well to win today after an interrupted preparation," the winning trainer explained. "He had a temperature last week, he was off his feed for two days and two nights and he had to miss a gallop. But he's such a good horse with a tremendous will to win and he always gives his best." The winner, out of a half sister to Gainesway stallion Lear Fan, is likely to take another crack at the Queen Elizabeth II Cup Apr. 27 and will also be entered for this year's Singapore Airlines International Cup, according to Allan.

Congaree (Arazi) drilled six furlongs shortly before noon yesterday at Santa Anita in 1:11.81. After the work, trainer Bob Baffert proclaimed, "If he can walk tomorrow, he's going in the Big 'Cap.'" Congaree, coming off a win in the Feb. 2 GII San Antonio H. will be ridden by either Victor Espinoza or David Flores after Jerry Bailey, who rode the five-year-old in his last three races, elected to ride **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}) in the million-dollar race. "When [juvenile champion] Vindication got hurt, I lost my bargaining power with Bailey," Baffert joked yesterday. "Now I'm like a bulldog with no teeth."

Saturday, Santa Anita

SAN CARLOS H.-GI, \$200,000, 4yo/up, 7f

Crafty C.T. (Crafty Prospector), off since finishing third in the GI Cigar Mile last November, worked a bullet six furlongs at Santa Anita Saturday in 1:10.80. "We were looking to go about 1:11," commented trainer Howie Zucker. "He just shaded that and we're going to run next weekend so the horse has to be ready and that [workout] should put him ready."

Cigar Mile runner-up **Aldebaran** (Mr. Prospector) remains possible for the seven-furlong race. "It all depends on the weather," according to trainer Bobby Frankel. **Kona Gold** (Java Gold) worked five furlongs Sunday at Santa Anita in a bullet :58.40. "We're going to look at the weights and decide," trainer Bruce Headley said of the sprint champion's participation in the San Carlos. "He was beaten six lengths [in the Palos Verdes H.] and he's nine years old. He's got to get something like 118, because I don't want to be under pressure to retire him. If I have to carry the weight and keep getting him beat, then I'm going to get more pressure. But if I can have him competitive, then I can stay a while." Weights for the San Carlos are due out Tuesday.

BIG A CANCELS AFTER FIFTH Racing was called off after the fifth race yesterday at Aqueduct when heavy rain caused unsafe track conditions. The Hollie Hughes H., scheduled to be run yesterday, will be re-opened to original nominees and will be run Mar. 2. Live racing is expected to return to the New York track on Wednesday, with a first post time of 12:30 p.m. Other tracks forced to cancel live racing yesterday include, Turfway Park, Mountaineer, Charles Town and Philadelphia Park. Turfway, which received an additional three inches of snow, cancelled for the ninth straight day. The Florence oval has been forced to cancel a total of 11 times so far during the Winter/Spring meet. Among the casualties of recent storms is the \$50,000 Dust Commander S., which was originally scheduled for Feb. 15 and later redrawn for yesterday's card. According to track officials, the mile event for older horses will not be rescheduled with the \$50,000 Tejano Run S., also for four-year-olds and up, coming up Mar. 15. Live racing is scheduled to resume Wednesday, with a 5:30 p.m. first post.
