BREW BUBBLES OVER CONGAREE

After a thrilling stretch-long battle, **Milwaukee Brew** (Wild Again) just got the better of odds-on **Congaree** (Arazi) in the \$1-million GI Santa Anita H., becoming the first horse since John Henry (1981-82) to win back-to-back runnings of the Big 'Cap. "The sheet guys [Ragozin] said I'd win the race," said winning trainer

Bobby Frankel. "That's why I ran him, really. They said he was on a good pattern and they thought he would beat Congaree today." The big bay was a patented stretch runner last year, following up his Big Cap victory with another in the GII Californian S. After a pair of thirds in both the GI

Hollywood Gold Cup and the GI Pacific Classic, he was sent to New York, but finished sixth in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, then closed out 2002 with a third in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Blinders were added for his six-year-old bow and worked well when he was in the game early before chasing Congaree home in the GII San Antonio H. Feb. 2. Jockey Edgar Prado had him in the game early from his outside post and the Stronach colorbearer was glued to Congaree's flank down the backstretch, then moved up on even terms as they turned for home. The pair raced in tandem through the stretch, with Milwaukee Brew asserting himself in the final strides over a valiant Congaree. "The blinkers helped him and he obviously likes this track," Prado commented. "Bobby told me to sit closer to the pace than usual, not to let Congaree get away. It worked out great." Congaree may have won more fans in defeat as he was giving away five pounds to the runner-up. "He ran as hard as he could possibly run, you can't ask for more," said jockey Jerry Bailey. "He gave me a kick when I asked for it, but the other horse was just up to the task today." *Chart, p2.*

ELEVEN LINE UP IN BIG EASY

Shippers from California and Florida will join some top locals in today's GII New Orleans H. at Fair Grounds. The royally bred **Mineshaft** (A.P. Indy) won his first three races in this country, including the Diplomat Way H. over this surface Jan. 19, but saw his streak come to an end when second to **Balto Star** (Glitterman) in the GIII Whirlaway H. Feb. 9. "I think the race sets up for him if he runs like he did the last time," trainer Neil Howard told *Daily Racing Form*. "Then we'll see if he's good enough." The dark bay adds Lasix this time and will also have to stare down **Learned** (Discover), who missed by just a nose in the Diplomat Way. From Florida is the eight-year-old **Best of the Rest** (Skip Trial), who wore down **Booklet** (Notebook) to win the \$1 million Sunshine Millions Classic Jan. 25 at Gulfstream. Coming from California are the trio of **Olmodavor** (A.P. Indy), **Sunday Break** (Jpn) (Forty Niner) and **Tracemark** (Conquistador Cielo). Olmodavor made his stakes debut in the GII Strub S. Feb. 1 and did a good job to get second behind runaway winner Medaglia d'Oro, with Tracemark third. Sunday Break has not run since finishing last as the favorite in the GI Malibu S. Dec. 26.

Unbeaten in three starts this season, Yell won the G2 Carlyon S. in January and was coming into this off a half-length victory over the highly regarded Fields of Omagh (Aus) (Rubiton {Aus}) in the G1 C.F. Orr S. over this track and distance Feb. 8. Choisir (Aus) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was sent off the 5-2 favorite off his third-place effort in the G1 Oakleigh Plate a week ago and showed the way as Yell shadowed that one's every move from second. The latter surged by with ease as the field straightened for home and kicked clear to best Innovation Girl, who had a perfect trip in fourth before rallying late into second. "He had a spell in September and we are reaping the dividends from that now as he's grown into a lovely horse that just keeps on improving," said stable foreman Wayne Hawkes. The winner could race next in the G1 Australian S. at Moonee Valley Mar. 22 or the G1 Darley S. at Rosehill Apr. 5. Redattore made it two straight since returning from a six-month break, going wire to wire in denying an accomplished field. Winner of the GI Eddie Read H. in 2001, the bay horse successfully handled the main track in taking the GII San Antonio H. a year ago, but he failed to win in his next four starts and was put away following a third to Sarafan and Beat Hollow (GB) in the Eddie Read July 28 at Del Mar. Trainer Richard Mandella had him ready to run off the layoff and Redattore responded, leading every step of a money allowance when winning by 5 1/2 lengths Feb. 8. He was scheduled to be ridden by Laffit Pincay, Jr., but that veteran took off his mounts after a fifth-race spill. Redattore was shadowed by Cayoke (Fr) (Always Fair) through comfortable fractions, then shook loose in midstretch as favored Good Journey gave chase. "I didn't care where Alex put him as long as it was first, second or third and I think he made a good choice," said Mandella. "It all kind of depended on what the others wanted to do. I think he'll probably run next at Fair Grounds in the Explosive Bid [GII, \$650,000 Mar. 23]." As for Good Journey, he will await the GII Maker's Mark Mile at Keeneland Apr. 11. "We got shuffled back a little bit further [than I wanted]," said winning rider Pat Day. "I left him with a little too much to do and not enough time to get it done."

Allamerican Bertie was bet down to 2-5 and lived up to the billing, strolling home to provide co-owners Bertram and Elaine Klein with a most appropriate 50th anniversary present. After a poor effort on the grass in the Gill Honey Fox H. Jan. 5, the homebred returned to the main track and wired her foes in winning the Gill Sabin H. Feb. 8. Jockey John Velazquez was riding the bay filly for the first time and allowed her to cruise up to the front at her own discretion. She got away with a :47.26 half and the race was over as she opened up on the field down the lane. "I was just like a passenger," said Velazquez. "All I had to do was make sure I didn't fall off." Winning trainer Steve Flint has high targets for Allamerican Bertie. "I think right now she's as good as any filly or mare in the country," he stated. "I know there is Azeri and I don't know whether we could beat her at a mile and a quarter, but I think we'll beat her at a mile and an eighth. The only way they are going to beat my filly is to run a speed horse at her early." Flint said that Allamerican Bertie would point for the Gill Louisville Breeders' Cup H. May 2 at Churchill Downs.

Maybe Red Bull does give you wings. He hadn't run in 3 1/2 months and had never tried either stakes company or two turns, but Rojo Toro proved up to the task, becoming a graded-stakes winner in just his third career start. The Triple Crown nominee aired by 9 1/2 lengths at first asking Sept. 21 at Turfway, then defeated subsequent GSW Offlee Wild in a 6 1/2-furlong allowance at Churchill Nov. 17. Training smartly for his return to action, the chestnut went up to take the lead after a half, put away Our Bobby V. (Majesterian) in midstretch and had enough in the tank to fend off stablemate Spensive. "He kind of didn't know what the first turn was about, and I had to give him his head to make the turn, and then he kind of ran off with me," explained winning rider Jerry Bailey. It was a last-minute decision to enter the undefeated colt. "I wasn't even going to run him until three days ago," said winning trainer Bob Baffert. "When Omega Code came out, I thought why not take a shot?" Baffert is undecided about the colt's next start.

Thady Quill came charging from midpack off the final turn and survived a claim of foul to win the Sandy Lane Barbados Gold Cup, giving Woodbine-based jockey Jono Jones and 84-year-old trainer William Marshall their fourth consecutive win in the big race. Second to subsequent Breeders' Cup Mile winner Val Royal (Fr) in the GII Oak Tree BC Mile in 2001, the six-year-old was winless in four starts last season and was making his Barbados debut off a fourth-place finish in the Feb. 1 Turf Paradise Breeders' Cup, which would mark his final start for owner Gary Seidler and trainer Bobby Frankel.
