CITY BACK IN TOWN

Elusive City (Elusive Quality) will return to the races Saturday on Lingfield's polytrack in the £75,000 ladbrokes.com Spring Cup. Gerard Butler's G1 Prix Morny winner may face **Membership** (Belong To Me), third in last year's G2 Gimcrack S., in the seven-furlong contest. Meanwhile, trainer Aidan O'Brien has an entry of 19 for the €70,000 G3 Castlemartin and La Louviere Studs Gladness S. at The Curragh Apr. 6. O'Brien's nominees are headed by **Hawk Wing** (Woodman), **Hold That Tiger** (Storm Cat) and **Van Nistelrooy** (Storm Cat). The seven-furlong contest was used as a prep last year for Johannesburg. Dermot Weld has also entered last year's National S. winner **Refuse To Bend (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells).

INDY DANCES INTO FLORIDA DERBY

Trainer Todd Pletcher's **Indy Dancer** (A.P. Indy), a disappointing seventh in the GIII Risen Star S. Feb. 16, worked five furlongs in 1:02 2/5 yesterday at Palm Meadows and is scheduled to make his next start in Saturday's G1 Florida Derby. The bay colt, owned and bred by Werth-eimer Farms, emerged as a classics threat with a sharp 3 1/2-length victory in an entry-level allowance race at Gulfstream Jan. 4, but looked flat in his first stakes attempt at Fair Grounds. "He just ran poorly [in the Risen Star]," said Pletcher. "He might have been a little bit wide, but really, he just never got on track that day. We expect he will do better Saturday. He ran very well at Gulfstream last time, and we know he likes the track. That was an important factor in deciding to run him in the Florida Derby."

Widely hailed as "the fighting tiger" because of his gut-wrenching tenacity, Northerly belied his nickname with an emphatic four-length victory in Monday's G1 Australian Cup at Flemington. Gold Cup winner Mr. Trickster took the lead early, but Northerly stalked him for 300 meters and inched forward before taking command at the 1400-meters marker. Don Eduardo, pushing forward to present his challenge, wilted quickly as Northerly turbo-charged away with his head held high. Northerly's breeders Neville and Sue Duncan flew from Melbourne to Perth in the wake of Northerly's emphatic win to collect Western Australian breeder of the year honours at a WA Thoroughbred Breeders' Association party on the eve of the Perth Magic Millions sale. Although Northerly never entered the sale ring at the Belmont complex, he is an intrinsic part of the resurgence of bloodstock in WA. The gelding will head to Sydney for the remainder of his autumn campaign with trainer Fred Kersley, who said he would defer consideration of overseas invitations for the immediate future.

LION TAMER HEADS TO TURFWAY

Trainer Todd Pletcher's **Lion Tamer** (Will's Way), winner of the GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 15, will likely skip the Florida Derby and instead aim for the Mar. 22 GII Lane's End S. at Turfway Park. Purchased by Michael Tabor after a dominating 7 1/2-length allowance win at Gulfstream Jan. 4, the chestnut ran off with the Hutcheson by six lengths in his first start for his new connections. Lion Tamer, who has won three of four starts for earnings of \$146,000, also breezed a half-mile in :49 3/5 Sunday at Palm Meadows.

SANTA CATARINA RETURNS WEDNESDAY

A prominent filly on the two-year-old scene last year, trainer Bob Baffert's **Santa Catarina** (Unbridled) will make her freshman debut Wednesday in Santa Anita's second race, a \$56,000 allowance/optional claiming event going a flat mile. Gary Stevens is slated to ride. Owned by Bob and Beverly Lewis, Santa Catarina won just once last year, but finished second in the GI Del Mar Debutante S. and the GI Frizette S. at Belmont. She concluded her season with a third to eventual champion Storm Flag Flying in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile S. at Arlington in late October.

TEN CENTS A SHINE SIZZLES AT SANTA ANITA

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas had one of his newest pupils, **Ten Cents a Shine** (Devil His Due), out on the Santa Anita track Monday morning for a swift five-furlong work in :59.40. The Ken and Sarah Ramsey-owned sophomore, who was a lackluster sixth last time in the GI Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park, recorded the second fastest of 15 works over the distance. A winner of two of four lifetime starts with \$80,120 in earnings to date, the colt may make his next start in the GII San Felipe S. at Santa Anita Mar. 15.

Winestock provided country Victorian trainer Terry O'Sullivan a fairytale first Group 1 victory. Purchased for only A\$21,000 at last year's Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale, the gelding broke quickly before being settled in fourth position under Brett Prebble. As the field fanned at the turn, Winestock powered home from out wide, closing an eight-length gap impressively to get the win. Prebble is about to begin a riding stint in Hong Kong, but said he would like to partner Winestock in the A\$1 million Heroic Championship for Inglis sale graduates at Randwick Apr. 19. "He's still learning," Prebble said. "He beat them out of the gates by 1 1/2 lengths and overraced early. He needs good horses to test him and stretch him."

At the risk of antagonising every stallion owner in Florida, I think it is fair to generalize that most of the stallions in the Sunshine State are there because they have a chink in their armor. Either they are blue-blooded individuals whose performance fell some way short of the highest level, or they are very good racehorses with bloodlines that are less than fashionable. Of course, that doesn't stop some of them developing into highly effective progenitors, Notebook and Montbrook being two good current examples.

Arthur I. Appleton's Bridlewood Farm has enjoyed success with both types of stallion. The farm's stallion roster for 1999 featured Skip Away's sire Skip Trial, a multiple Grade I winner who had struggled with the handicap of being a son of the unexceptional Bailjumper. Also on the team were two young stakes winners who owed their chance at stud more to their exceptional bloodlines than to their achievements on the track. The homebred Stormy Atlantic, a Storm Cat colt from the celebrated Rough Shod II family, had done well without making his mark in graded company; and Jules, a second-season sire, had the attraction of being a Forty Niner horse from the outstanding Natalma family.

In fact, Natalma is Jules' third dam, which means that his second dam, Raise The Standard, is a half sister to Northern Dancer, Arctic Dancer (dam of the brilliant La Prevoyante) and Spring Adieu (second dam of the exceptionally successful sire Danehill).

Raise The Standard has also played a major role in adding to her family's fame. Mated to Halo, she produced the magnificent broodmare Coup de Folie, whose team of five Group winners is led by Machiavellian, another of Europe's best stallions. Raise The Standard was later mated to Halo's son Devil's Bag. Although the resulting filly, Bonita Francita, was only a minor winner, she has been doing very well as a broodmare. Her three stakes winners include Jules and the G1 Prix Morny winner Orpen, while her first foal, Black Penny, is now the dam of the Classic-winning filly Bluemamba.

Unfortunately, Jules' racing career established that he wasn't quite as special as some of his relatives. There wasn't much wrong, though, with his record at two, when he followed up a spectacular 14-length debut win with a close second in the GII Cowdin S. and a victory in the GIII Nashua S. over a mile. His final juvenile start saw him finish over four lengths behind the lightly-weighted The Silver Move after being impeded in the GII Remsen S. over nine furlongs. His efforts were rewarded with a weight of 116 pounds on an Experimental Free Handicap dominated by Boston Harbor.

Jules' performance in the GIII Nashua S. prompted his trainer Alan Goldberg to speculate that Jules would stay 1 1/4 miles. "With this horse, I don't think distance will be a problem. I might be wrong and I know that a mile and a quarter hits a lot of them over the head, but he was running at the end."

Unfortunately, Jules' limitations were exposed by four defeats in the run up to the GI Kentucky Derby, including a fifth in the GII Blue Grass S., and Jules was never asked to tackle a mile and an eighth again. After an allowance win over six furlongs in June, he showed that he retained plenty of ability by taking the Long Branch S. over 1 1/16 miles, but his career then came to an end in the Housebuster S. over six furlongs. The next stop was Bridlewood, where Jules initially commanded a fee of \$5,000. *(Pedigree Insights cont. p4)*

Juvenile champion Eishin Champ, making his first start since winning the G1 Asahi Hai Futurity S. last December, was second choice in this Japanese 2000 Guineas trial. The colt settled in fourth early, rallied powerfully in the stretch and just got up in the final strides for a narrow victory. "It has been three months since his last race, so he wasn't as fit today," commented winning rider Yuichi Fukunaga. "It was a tough race and he kept fighting to the closing stages." Favored That's the Plenty (Jpn) (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}) lost a shoe early in the race and finished sixth.

Osumi Haruka, off since finishing seventh in the G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies last December, rated in mid-pack and delivered a brilliant challenge in the home stretch to just get up for a neck win. "She is a very gutsy horse since this was an especially tough race," said winning rider Katsumi Ando, who just became a JRA jockey Mar. 1. "I had a spill in the seventh race, so it was great to come back and win this race."

Neither Stormy Atlantic nor Jules is still at Bridlewood. Stormy Atlantic's early successes have seen him follow that well-worn track from Florida to Kentucky, whereas Jules--to the best of my knowledge--is in Brazil, having apparently attracted only 15 mares in Florida in 2002.

This slump in Jules' fortunes was almost guaranteed to be followed by a notable success and, sure enough, he is now in the news as the sire of the surprising Peace Rules. Having sold for only \$35,000 as a two-year-old, Peace Rules has now completed a trio of stakes wins, proving that he is equally at home on dirt and turf. Although he lasted the 1 1/16 miles of the Louisiana Derby far better than most of his talented opponents, there has to be some doubt about whether he will be equally effective over 1 1/4 miles. His breeder, Ronald Chak, reportedly expected to breed a sprinter when he sent Hold To Fashion to Jules. Hold To Fashion gained both her wins over sprint distances and the next dam, the stakes-winning Toga Toga, was rated 110 on the *Daily Racing Form* Free Handicap for female sprinters.

Add in the fact that none of his four great-grandfathers--Mr. Prospector, Devil's Bag, Speak John and Greek Answer--ever won a stakes race beyond a mile and an eighth and you have to question Peace Rules' prospects of getting 1 1/4 miles. He has surprised everyone before, though, and may yet do so again.

Nonsuch Bay spent the majority of 2002 battling against the toughest fillies in the country and proved herself a class act by taking the GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont last June. After off-the-board efforts in the GI Alabama S. and the GI Gazelle H., she finished second in the Pebbles H. over a sloppy Belmont track in mid-October. Shelved for the remainder of the year, Nonsuch Bay returned to run a solid third to Harmony Lodge in the seven-furlong GIII Shirley Jones H. at Gulfstream Feb. 14. The chestnut was appreciative in her return to routing and took plenty off the crowd's money, as well. A tracking fourth through six furlongs under jockey Jorge Chavez, she took command at the top of the stretch and looked the consummate professional as she dispensed with her competition with ease.

The unprecedented move comes as a result of an agreement by the 84 active members of the Racecourse Medical Officers Association (RMOA) to withdraw their services Apr. 6 if their current demand to almost double their daily fee is not met. "We want €500 per day to cover increased costs," Dr. David Molony, Chairman of the RMOA, explained to *Irish Racing online*. "It's not all about money though, as we are finding it increasingly difficult to attract new members under the present rate."

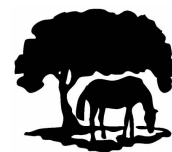

Magic Millions Perth Premier Yearling Sale, with 307 lots catalogued, begins its two-day run today at the Belmont Sales Complex. Durham Lodge has 15 yearlings on offer and 10 of the Western Australian stud's offerings are by Scenic (Ire), who stood at Durham in 2001 at a fee of A\$13,200 before he was reinstated at Collingrove Victoria with a subsequent fee hike to A\$22,000. The best-performed Southern Hemisphere son of Sadler's Wells to date, Scenic has stood in four states so far and his progeny averaged A\$38,121 for 33 sold in 2002. Collingrove sold the Robert Sangster-bred Scenic in 1999 to Durham Lodge but, courtesy of star performers including four-time Group 1 winner Universal Prince (Aus) and G1 George Ryder S. winner Lord Essex (Aus), the Dewhurst S. winner was promptly leased back to Collingrove for the 2002 season. He has 31 yearlings catalogued for Perth. Current leading Australian stallion Serheed, who has edged out Danehill via the exploits of his star son Northerly (Aus), has five colts and two fillies listed from his final crop. Yearlings by recently deceased sires Metal Storm (Fr), Don't Say Halo and Melbourne Cup winner Rogan Josh (Aus)'s sire Old Spice (Aus), are on offer, along with 15 first-crop yearlings by Heytesbury Stud's Second Empire (Ire). The rangy G1 Grand Criterium winner is from Welsh Love (Ire), a half sister to Flame of Tara (GB). The catalog includes a dozen yearlings by vastly underrated sire Tribu (Aus), who has had 63 runners and 37 winners. Magic Millions will be hoping significant Malaysian and Singaporean purchasers, who were absent in 2002, will attend this year. Relying on a predominantly local bench in 2002, the sale suffered an 11.6-percent drop in average and 31.6-percent fall in gross. Last year in Perth, 228 from 334 offered sold at an average of A\$18,482 and an aggregate of A\$4,214,000; a significant drop on 2001 figures for Western Australia's major sale. Bidding begins today at 6 p.m. and continues on Wednesday at 4:30 p.m. The Autumn session of the sale will be held on Friday.
