Buddy Gil (Eastern Echo), a 26-1 outsider when he swept to a two-length tally in the GIII Baldwin S. on the Santa Anita lawn Feb. 23, was a more moderate 9-1 while switching to the main track for yesterday's GII San Felipe S. and it is likely his odds will be substantially lower next time. Unintimidated by the favorites in the field, the bay gelding closed from the middle of the pack to take the lead in deep stretch, then was all out to hold off **Atswhatimtalknabout** (A.P. Indy) to score by a nose. "I felt like I was on a 3-5 shot," said winning jockey Gary Stevens. "He really gave me what I wanted and put himself right into the three-year-old picture." NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

The traffic is building on the road to the Triple Crown. **AlyswEEP** (End Sweep) sped onto the highway yesterday with a front-running win in the GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct, while **Region Of Merit** (Touch Gold) and **Aristocat** (Tale of the Cat) joined the fray after running one-two in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby. While the result of the race at Tampa Bay was as expected, AlyswEEP posted an upset in the Gotham, sprinting to the lead soon after the start and powering clear in the stretch to take it by 4 1/4 lengths. "He's got speed, speed and more speed--and that's what racehorses need," winning trainer Pat Reynolds said. "He made the lead easy and the fractions were moderate. He won easy and he galloped out real strong. This is a step in the right direction." Region of Merit and Aristocat are also moving forward. The two were making their respective stakes debuts in the Tampa Bay Derby and were sent off the favorites in the 23rd running of the 1 1/16-mile event. Settled off the pace set by 34-1 shot **Hear No Evil** (Carson City), 8-5 choice Region of Merit drove to the front at the eighth pole and had enough left to hold off 19-10 Aristocat by 3/4 of a length, with Hear No Evil just another neck back in third. So where will the new kids on the block make their next stops on the Triple Crown trail? AlyswEEP's conditioner may consider taking on GI Florida Derby hero Empire Maker in the Apr. 12 GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct. "I don't want to be a 'rabbit' in any Grade I race, but as easy as he [won yesterday], we'll have to think about the Wood Memorial," Reynolds said. "He has a lot of Aqueduct wins [four-for-five on the inner track]. I'm thinking either Wood or Blue Grass." Trainer Christophe Clement indicated after the Tampa Bay Derby that Region of Merit would likely head to the Apr. 12 GI Blue Grass S., which is also the target of runner-up Aristocat. "We'll see how it goes, but the original plan was to go to the Blue Grass and he certainly ran well enough to stick with the plan," said his trainer, Todd Pletcher.

Upset No Surprise to Stevens...

Buddy Gil (Eastern Echo) did shock the crowd with his victory. The three-year-old had managed a 7 1/2-length score in the six-furlong Golden Bear S. at Golden Gate Fields last November, but followed that effort with a fifth-place finish in the Dec. 14 Gold Rush S. and a seventh-place effort in the Jan. 11 GIII Golden Gate Derby. Trying turf for the first time in the Baldwin, he charged from fifth under new jockey Gary Stevens to post the upset, and Stevens was expecting big things from his mount again yesterday. "I was on this horse for his last two works and they were sensational," he said. Tucked between horses as he raced off the early leaders, Buddy Gil was caught in traffic at the top of the lane, but found running room in the final furlong and burst through to take the lead, then gave it all he had to hold **Atswhatimtalknabout** (A.P. Indy) safe. "[Gary Stevens] had confidence, and when that guy's got confidence, we've all got confidence," said trainer Jeff Mullins, adding, "The Santa Anita Derby [GI, Apr. 5] is the next logical step."

Praise for the Runner-up...

Trainer Ron Ellis was pleased with the performance of **Atswhatimtalknabout**. "That's just what I wanted," Ellis said. "[Jockey David Flores] said he was climbing badly going into the first turn, but really settled in on the backstretch and got into the race. After that, David said he ran fantastic--he was really happy with the effort." Added Flores, "I thought he won it, but it almost doesn't matter because we know what we've got. He galloped out so strong I'm almost couldn't pull him up. He wants more distance--the more, the better. I think you'll see a different script in the Santa Anita Derby." Third-place finisher **Brancusi** (Deputy Commander), a maiden winner last time out, will head to the Apr. 12 GI Blue Grass S.

Domestic Disturbance...

GII Santa Catalina S. winner **Domestic Dispute** (Unbridled's Song), eighth early, made up some ground, but weakened late to be fifth. "This gives me one less option for the Kentucky Derby," jockey Jerry Bailey said. "He stumbled a little at the start and traveled wide in the backstretch, but he flattened out when I thought he'd be moving into contention." Trainer Bob Baffert said, "We're still trying to figure this horse out and I guess we haven't yet. I don't know where we'll go from here."

Region of Merit, sent off the favorite off a five-length allowance score in his two-turn debut at Gulfstream Park Feb. 15, settled in third as **Hear No Evil** led them through a half in :47.06 and six furlongs in 1:11.68. The chestnut closed to take the lead at midstretch and had enough of an advantage to hold off the late surge of **Aristocat** to the wire. "We think this horse is still learning and will improve," jockey Eibar Coa said. "He was struggling with the track a little. I don't think he ran as well as he can today, but he still won." The runner-up, second to Region of Merit in a sprint allowance at Gulfstream Park Jan. 11, had also tried a route of ground for the first time in his most recent outing, posting a 2 1/4-length tally at this distance Feb. 15. Trapped down along the rail while sitting off the leaders through the early going, the Michael Tabor colorbearer dropped back a bit on the far turn, then angled five wide and finished with good energy to be second. "I thought he ran very well," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "He was stuck down inside for a good part of the race and he lost ground on the second turn. But once he pushed his way out, he closed well. He was gaining on everyone at the end. All in all it was a good performance and hopefully something we can build on." **Strength Within** (Belong to Me), the 5-2 third choice after running second in the Feb. 15 GII Hutcheson S. last time out, was shuffled back early, made a mild early bid, but lacked a closing kick and could do no better than fifth. After picking up checks in his first two starts, Alysweep was dropped in against \$75,000 maiden claimers last Dec. 15 and came away with a 7 3/4-length victory--and a new home. Haltered after that start by owners Mark Doneson and Michael Dubb and trainer Pat Reynolds, the Florida-bred came back to take an allowance at Aqueduct Jan. 1, then closed from midpack to win the Fred C. Capossela S. Jan. 20. The chestnut ridgling failed to fire in his next outing, running sixth as the 6-5 chalk in the Feb. 22 Best Turn S. "We probably should have watched the Best Turn from my office at Belmont," Reynolds said. "It was a rough track and we worked a little fast before the race. But today he was nice and fresh and relaxed. I was pretty confident." Rebounding from that lackluster effort, Alysweep lead nearly every step en route to a decisive score. "He was just so comfortable out there," said jockey Richie Migliore. "He was really cruising and I didn't want to fight him. I just tapped him a few times inside the eighth pole to keep his mind on his business. I also wanted to see how he galloped out past the wire if I let him run a little. I was happy with the way he did it." Colita (Grindstone), the 5-2 favorite, was far back early and offered only a mild late bid, running fourth. A 9 3/4-length maiden winner at Calder in her juvenile finale Nov. 24, Ebony Breeze picked up right where she left off in her sophomore debut, taking the Jan. 11 Sandpiper S. going six furlongs at this track by 6 3/4 lengths. She stretched out to seven furlongs for her latest, the Feb. 1 Gasparilla S., and made it three straight as the 4-5 favorite. The odds-on choice to take yet another in her two-turn debut, the Kinsman homebred raced head and head with Gasparilla runner-up Crimson and Roses to the stretch, finally gained the advantage in the final furlong, then dug in late to turn back the challenge of Dakota Light. "I was a little concerned [about her going two turns for the first time], but she's a fit filly and in good form, so that makes it a little easier to stretch them out," trainer Bill Mott said. Added winning jockey Mark Guidry, "She was really relaxed underneath me and I could tell she wasn't straining at all. She lost the lead when we hooked up in the last turn, but it wasn't really time to press on her. When I went to a left-handed whip, she prevailed."

The runner-up in his only other appearance over the Golden Gate turf, Ninebanks ended his 2002 campaign with a second-place finish in the Nov. 29 Forty Niner H., missing by a head while trying the main track. The bay was back on the grass for his first start of the new year, but faded late to be 10th in the Barretts/CTBA Sunshine Millions Turf S. at Santa Anita Jan. 25. Facing three decidedly softer foes this time, the five-year-old dogged Surprise Halo through pedestrian fractions over the yielding course, went after the frontrunner as they raced down the stretch and prevailed after a heated battle. "That worked out pretty good," jockey Ron Warren Jr. said. "I just tried to make it a two-horse race from the outset. I didn't want to put too much pressure on Surprise Halo and set it up for the other two horses. I just tried to soften him up a bit so we could outrun him down the lane. I thought I'd go right on by him, but he came back with a couple of surges. The good thing about Ninebanks is that he'll keep his head in front if he makes the lead. Colorful Tour picked up his fourth consecutive victory over a muddy strip at Oaklawn Park Feb. 22, capturing the GIII Essex S. by a length and a half. The second choice in his bid to make it five in a row, the chestnut colt was quickest away from the gate and went right to the lead, battled Makors Mark (Son of Briartic) to the stretch, shook loose from that foe, then outfinished favored Crafty Shaw and Windward Passage to take the three-way photo for the win. "We knew he would go to the lead if we asked him and he did," trainer Noel Hickey said. Is the Apr. 5 GI Oaklawn H. his next goal? Hickey's answer was an emphatic, "Yes!" Jockey James Lopez blamed the favorite's second-place finish on a slow start. "He came out walking like he has been lately," Lopez said. "He seems to know the real running is going to come later and there's no use hurrying early. I was in a little tight going into the first turn, but once I got good position outside I thought he gave me a big effort." Added trainer Pete Vestal, "He has gotten into a habit of taking a few strides to get started. He breaks well, but takes 20 yards or so to get it together. It's something we have to work on." Windward Passage had to fight his way between horses for running room in the stretch and just missed. "I never could get a clear lane to run in," said jockey Donnie Meche. "On the backside he was just pulling against me wanting to run, but we had nowhere to go. I really think I would have won this race with just a little luck." MEDAGLIA D'ORO TO SKIP WORLD CUP

Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}) won't be making the trip to the Middle East for the Mar. 29 G1 Dubai World Cup, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. The four-year-old breezed seven furlongs in 1:26.80 at Hollywood Park Friday, but was not 100 percent after the work. "He didn't eat up [Friday] night and that's not like him," trainer Bobby Frankel told the *DRF*. "There's a virus going through my barn and a lot of my horses got sick." He added that blood work on Medaglia d'Oro came back fine, but that a trip halfway around the world was not what the doctor ordered. "The blood looks good, but there's stress in shipping," he said. However, if the colt bounces right back, he could still make the Apr. 5 G1 Oaklawn Park H.

EMPIRE MAKER TO WOOD MEMORIAL

Trainer Bobby Frankel said yesterday that **Empire Maker** (Unbridled), who took Saturday's G1 Florida Derby by the largest margin in the race's 52-year history when winning by a resounding 9 3/4 lengths, would make his next start in the Apr. 12 G1 Wood Memorial at Aqueduct. "I thought it over and decided we mapped out a schedule before [the Florida Derby] and I don't want to deviate from it," Frankel said. "I like having four weeks in between each race--it's kind of a rhythm thing that seems to work for him." He added, "If he's too fresh for the Kentucky Derby, he may not run well in the rest of the Triple Crown series." Impressed with the colt's facile victory at Gulfstream Park, Frankel first remarked, "He might have peaked too soon," but went on to say, "He has so much ability that he still may not even have run his best race." As for **Midas Eyes** (Touch Gold), who won Saturday's GIII Swale S. by 9 1/4 lengths, Frankel said the three-year-old could go next in the Apr. 12 GIII Bay Shore S. at the Big A or the Apr. 26 GIII Derby Trial at Churchill Downs. The May 3 GIII Withers S. is also a possibility.

ZIADIE PROUD OF TRUST N LUCK

Trainer Ralph Ziadie was not disappointed in the second-place Florida Derby finish of **Trust N Luck** (Montbrook). "He ran good, but a very, very good horse beat him," Ziadie said. "We weren't disgraced in any way. I'm proud of what he accomplished. He went a little fast, but the jockey [Cornelio Velasquez] had no choice after he broke so well from the one post. We weren't going to beat Empire Maker yesterday no matter what, but he ran a big race." The chestnut will go directly to the May 3 G1 Kentucky Derby. "He races very well fresh--look how well he did last time after a layoff," the conditioner said. Trust N Luck came back after a two-month break to take the Feb. 15 G1 Fountain Of Youth S. by 5 1/4 lengths.

INDY DANCER HEADED STRAIGHT TO DERBY?

Indy Dancer (A.P. Indy), who came from the clouds to be third in the Florida Derby, may also go straight to the May 3 G1 Kentucky Derby without another prep, trainer Todd Pletcher said yesterday. "Horses seem to be running very well with time off, and being fresh for the Derby wouldn't hurt," Pletcher said, but added, "I guess you could say we're still up in the air." The three-year-old came out of Saturday's race "sound as a dollar," according to the trainer. "Obviously we're pleased and happy with the way he finished," he continued. "But we would like to see him a little bit closer to the pace to have a chance. We may try to fine tune him a little bit more to see if we can get him to do that."

SENIOR SWINGER TO SPORTSMAN'S PARK

Senior Swinger (El Prado {Ire}), a distant fifth in the Florida Derby, is being pointed for the GIII Illinois Derby at Sportsman's Park Apr. 5. While trainer Mickey Goldfine didn't think his charge could have beaten Empire Maker Saturday, he felt the colt could have been closer. "I think the jockey [Edgar Prado] moved him way too early," he said. "If he hadn't done that, I felt we could have gotten second or third."

According to the *DRF*, Dr. Addison performed a procedure called a myectomy Thursday that is expected to prevent the problem from occurring again. But the success of the operation won't be known immediately. "You can't really tell in the morning, when they're not out there against other horses," Werner said. "We really won't know if it worked until he runs again."

"If it looks like he's healthy enough to make the Blue Grass, we'll get him up there 10 or 12 days ahead of the race," Smith said.

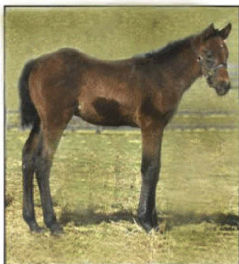
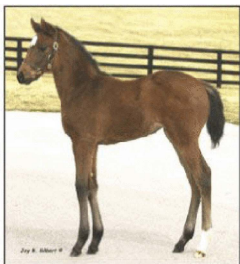
