HENRYK DE KWIATKOWSKI DEAD

Henryk de Kwiatkowski, the Polish-born sportsman and entrepreneur who purchased storied Calumet Farm in 1992, died from pneumonia Monday at his Bahamas residence. He was 79. De Kwiatkowski's death comes just one day after Calumet's **Re-**

gion of Merit (Touch Gold) stamped himself a Classic contender with a hard-fought victory in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby. Funeral arrangements have yet to be decided. The stuff of legend, de Kwiatkowski's bio on the Calumet Farm website reads like movie script. Born in Warsaw, Poland, he was forced into a Siberian work camp after the Soviet invasion of his homeland in 1939. After escaping through Iran and boarding the Empress of Canada, he was one of few survivors when that ship was torpedoed on its way to England. He

later flew Spitfires for England's Royal Air Force and earned a citation from the War Office after parachuting into Warsaw as a courier with messages for the Underground. De Kwiatkowski later emigrated to Canada, where he became a well-known production engineer at Canadian Pratt and Whitney Aircraft Corporation. He parlayed his knowledge of aviation, and in particular jet engines, into ownership of two successful companies: Kwiatkowski Aircraft Ltd. and Intercontinental Aircraft Ltd. De Kwiatkowski, who traced his roots in racing back five generations, became reacquainted with the Thoroughbred industry in the early '70s, and by the following decade his Kennelot Stables had on its roster such talented runners as Eclipse champion De La Rose and Horse of the Year and GI Belmont S. winner Conquistador Cielo. De Kwiatkowski also campaigned the successful stallion Danzig through the colt's brief but brilliant career, and was listed as the breeder and owner of two millionaires, Stephan's Odyssey and Danzig Connection.

The revival of Calumet..

After purchasing Calumet, de Kwiatkowski explained the allure of the great farm that has sent out a record eight GI Kentucky Derby winners. "To me it was more than a farm," he said. "It was a way of life that I have always respected. The elegance, the quality...Calumet personified all of this. They say that racing is the sport of kings. Well, this must be where one of the kings lived, without a doubt." Keeneland President Nick Nicholson expressed his sympathy in a statement yesterday. "The Thoroughbred industry has lost a passionate stalwart, and central Kentucky has lost a dear friend," said Nicholson. "From the day he rescued Calumet and vowed never to change a blade of grass, he won the hearts of all central Kentuckians and horse lovers everywhere." De Kwiatkowski is survived by his wife Barbara; daughters Michelle, Nicole, Arianne and Alexandria; sons Conrad, Stephan and Nicholas.

LION TAMER READIES FOR LANE'S END

Michael Tabor's **Lion Tamer** (Will's Way), set to make his next start in Saturday's GII Lane's End S. at Turfway Park, fired a bullet Sunday when he covered five furlongs in 1:00 flat at Palm Meadows Training Center. The Todd Pletcher trainee recorded the fastest of nine workouts at the distance. "He's excellent," said Pletcher. "He came out of the work great. He's ready to ship up [to Turfway] on Thursday." The chestnut, who will be making his first start around two turns, scored his biggest victory to date last time out in the GII Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream Park Feb. 15.

COMPOSURE TO ASHLAND

Dual Grade I winner **Composure** (Touch Gold) will make her next start in the Apr. 5 GI Ashland S. at Keeneland, according to trainer Bob Baffert. It is still undecided whether the three-year-old Bob and Beverly Lewis-owned filly will start in Churchill's May 2 GI Kentucky Oaks or the GI Kentucky Derby the following afternoon. A 3/4-length winner over Elloluv last time in the GI Santa Anita Oaks Mar. 8, the filly has won half of eight lifetime starts for earnings of \$731,300.

As a member of the Juddmonte team I may not be totally impartial, but is there a better broodmare in America (or anywhere else, for that matter) than Prince Khalid's extraordinary Toussaud?

When Empire Maker marched to the forefront of the Kentucky Derby betting with his highly impressive display in the Florida Derby, he improved Toussaud's record with her six foals of racing age to four Grade I winners (Chester House, Honest Lady, Chiselling and Empire Maker) and a Grade II winner (Decarchy). Her record is all the more remarkable because each of her five graded winners is by a different sire, as are her next two foals--a yearling filly by Seeking the Gold and a filly foal by Kingmambo, which arrived on the day of Empire Maker's victory.

Rise of an Empire..

Empire Maker's family was introduced to the Juddmonte broodmare band with the purchase in 1987 of his second dam, Image of Reality. The mare's price of \$500,000 reflected Image of Reality's achievements on the track, which included a victory over the champion filly It's In The Air in the GII Milady H. over 1 1/16 miles. Image of Reality's solid record as a four-year-old earned her a weight of 118 on the *Blood-Horse* Free Handicap for older females, just eight pounds below Glorious Song, the top dirt mare.

As a daughter of In Reality and a Cornish Prince mare, Image of Reality also had the attraction of having a pedigree free of some of the major sire lines, such as Northern Dancer and Raise A Native, and she had a good bottom line, too, tracing to the Aga Khan's high-class staying filly Teresina.

Image of Reality was in foal to El Gran Senor at the time of her purchase and she was returned to him in 1988, after foaling a filly later named Navarra. But for the fertility problems which dogged El Gran Senor's career, this brilliant racehorse--a Grade 1 winner from seven furlongs to 1 1/2 miles--would probably have proved every bit as exceptional as a stallion. Although some breeders considered him too big a risk for their best mares, El Gran Senor achieved 14-percent stakes winners among his foals, with a magnificent eight-percent winning at group or graded level to the end of last year. Few stallions ever match that sort of strike rate.

SANS SUPPLEMENT, DAM OF ITS ALL GREEK TOME, DEAD AT 29 Graded stakes winner and top broodmare **Sans Supplement** (*Grey Dawn II--*Tout Compris, by Tantieme {Fr}) succumbed to the infirmities of old age Monday at Sugar Maple. The Kentucky-bred mare was 29. The winner of the GII Alcibiades S. at three, the gray produced GII Tropical Park Derby winner at 12 before hitting paydirt with her seventh foal, turf champion Itsallgreetome. The mare produced 12 foals over 23 years before being pensioned in 1999.

Second Time the Charm..

Image of Reality's second mating to El Gran Senor resulted in Toussaud. Unfortunately, the mare was to produce only two more live foals, including the talented English colt Projection (by Topsider), but she had already done more than enough to justify her purchase. Navarra won the Gill Vineland H. over a mile and an eighth after being sold, and has since produced Grade III winner Indygo Shiner to A.P. Indy, who is scheduled to cover Toussaud later this spring.

Toussaud began her career with John Gosden in England. Her potential was pretty obvious from the moment she finished second of 21 in a maiden race on her only start at two and she duly developed into a Group 3 winner at three, when she beat the colts in the Criterion S. over seven furlongs, before returning to race nine times on turf in her native America.

Bobby Frankel sent her out to win the GII Wilshire H., GI Gamely H. and GII American H., and she was also a creditable fourth to Lure after a troubled passage in the 1993 Breeders' Cup Mile. Her chart underlined that she possessed that extremely valuable asset of being able to quicken significantly. "Finished well," "strong late rally," "strong finish," "closed with rush," and "quick gain between horses" were just some of the assessments of her performances.

The other notable aspect of Toussaud as a racehorse was that--in common with many other very talented performers--she showed plenty of temperament, especially during her morning works and at the starting gate. This quirkiness sometimes shows up in her progeny, and Empire Maker wasn't too keen to enter the gate at Gulfstream. Remember, though, that this feistiness can be a plus rather than a minus, as the Storm Cat clan has demonstrated.

Toussaud is a medium-sized, lengthy mare, with lengthy pasterns and powerful, broad quarters. She shares these attributes with her outstanding sire, who was probably also the source of her powers of acceleration. She has even inherited El Gran Senor's troublesome feet, but fortunately hasn't passed this on to any of her progeny.

Constructing a Champion..

Toussaud stands 16 hands, and her first foal, Arlington Million hero Chester House, is a little taller, with plenty of scope. However, the fact that both her grandsires, Northern Dancer and In Reality, stood only 15.2 hands made it likely that some of Toussaud's offspring would lack size. Sure enough, the excellent Honest Lady stands only 15.2 hands, despite being by Seattle Slew, and she was followed by Decarchy and the Gone West colt Civilisation, both of whom were small as yearlings. Size therefore became an important consideration in selecting Toussaud's 1999 mate and Unbridled, a 16.3-hands son of a 16.3-hands stallion, became first choice.

Unbridled also appealed strongly on several other scores. His pasterns were rather upright, which was a bonus for a mare who had passed on her weak pasterns to several of her foals, with the exception of the well-conformed Chester House (who is by Unbridled's grandsire Mr. Prospector). Another incentive was the fact that mating Toussaud to Unbridled created the same 4x3 inbreeding to In Reality which appeared in the pedigree of Unbridled's outstanding daughter Banshee Breeze, a triple Grade I winner in 1998. Supporting this was the 30-percent stakes winners that In Reality mares had produced among their 20 foals by Fappiano, plus the 1998 Kentucky Derby success of Real Quiet, who was sired by a son of Fappiano from a grand-daughter of In Reality.

Empire Maker was a very attractive and very athletic from the moment he was born, but he didn't start to develop into the star of Juddmonte's 2000 American crop until the second half of 2001. He then progressed to such an extent that he went into training with Bobby Frankel with high hopes that his ambitious name would prove to be entirely justified. Judging by the ease with which he travelled throughout the Florida Derby, he could well become an empire maker now that blinkers are helping him to concentrate better. The extra furlong of the Derby will be no problem to him and he must have every chance of going one better than Juddmonte's last Kentucky Derby challenger, the 2000 runner-up Aptitude.

But, as everyone knows, the road to Churchill Downs can be packed with pitfalls and the next seven weeks are going to be enjoyably nerve-racking for everyone involved with this exciting colt.

UAE DERBY NEXT STOP FOR OUTTA HERE

Outta Here (Dehere), winner of the Delta Jackpot S. at Delta Downs Dec. 21, arrived in Dubai Sunday and will make his next start in the G2 UAE Derby at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29, trainer Bill Currin told the *Thoroughbred Times* yesterday. "We only go for the big money," Currin told the *TTimes*. Currin, who owns the colt in partnership with Al Eisman, added, "He's been training perfect. I think he should be ready to go." The chestnut colt was scheduled to make his 2003 debut in the Palm Beach S. on the Gulfstream turf Feb. 21, but those plans were scrapped after an onslaught of bad Southern Florida weather set back his training schedule. Jockey Kent Desormeaux will partner the colt in the 10-furlong event.

Lady Pastel, heroine of the 2001 Japanese Oaks, had been held winless since taking the Shion S. in September of 2001. The five-year-old mare was 0-for-six last season, but did end the campaign with a third-place effort in the G1 Queen Elizabeth Commemorative Cup in November. Making her 2003 debut here, she settled midpack off a fast pace, was asked for her best as they raced into the stretch and rallied powerfully along the rail to get the victory despite lugging in slightly at the wire. "The reason she came in was that she lost a shoe," explained her jockey, Masayoshi Ebina, adding, "It was quite a powerful performance."
