field. Jockey David Flores believes the colt will relish the nine furlongs of the \$750,000 event. "The distance is going to be great for him," Flores said. "The more distance, the better, because he relaxes now and he has a long stride, so you can place him, wait and make a run. He's learning." Flores had the choice of riding **Atswhatimtalknbout** or

Domestic Dispute (Unbridled's Song) Saturday. "Domestic Dispute has been running really well," he said. "But **Atswhatimtalknbout** is a really good horse. We had a choice and I think we did the right thing."

Atswhatimtalknbout will try to exact his revenge on **Buddy Gil** (Eastern Echo), who beat him a nose in the GI San Felipe S. "He's doing just as good as he was before," said Buddy Gil's trainer, Jeff Mullins. Trainer Bob Baffert saddles **Domestic Dispute**, **Kafwain** (Cherokee Run) and longshot **Indian Express** (Indian Charlie). "Running a mile and an eighth, we're going to find out a lot about these horses," he said.

IT'S OFFICIAL: LONE STAR TO HOST 2004 CUP

The Is have been dotted and the Ts are crossed. Breeders' Cup Limited and the National Thoroughbred Racing Association yesterday announced that negotiations have been completed and a contract is ready to be signed that will make Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas the host of the 2004 Breeders' Cup. The 21st edition of the event will be run Oct. 30 next year and will be televised live on NBC. "We are delighted to make it official," said D.G. Van Clief, Jr., the president of Breeders' Cup and vice chairman of the NTRA. "The Dallas-Fort Worth area is one of the nation's great sports markets and Lone Star Park has done an excellent job of establishing first-class racing there. We also want to salute Governor Rick Perry, members of the Texas state legislature, Grand Prairie Mayor Charles England and the Texas Racing Commission for supporting next year's Championships." Added Lone Star President Corey Johnsen, "The signing of this agreement represents a true team effort, with virtually thousands of Texans involved. There is tremendous enthusiasm in the Lone Star State surrounding this championship event, and we're very excited to showcase horse racing in Texas to a world-wide audience." Opened in 1997, Lone Star will host the Breeders' Cup for the first time.

BELLE DU JOUR TO WELD

Connections of star Australian sprinter **Belle du Jour (Aus)** (Dehere) have decided to send her to trainer Dermot Weld in Ireland, rather than John Hammond in France as previously announced. According to racenet.com.au, Hammond said he felt that French racecourses would not suit the mare. "[Weld] seemed very happy to know that he is going to have her," her Australian trainer Clarry Conners told racenet.com.au. "He has asked me to call him so we can go over the plans for her." The five-year-old will likely target the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot in June and the G1 July Cup at Newmarket. Heroine of the G1 Golden Slipper S. at two, Belle du Jour ran fourth in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen last Saturday at Nad al Sheba in Dubai. She is booked to Danehill in September for a Southern Hemisphere-time cover and will return to Australia early next year.

Badge of Silver Preps for Blue Grass

Badge Of Silver (Silver Deputy), looking to get back on track after undergoing throat surgery last month, worked a mile in 1:38 at Churchill Downs yesterday morning. He is pointing for the Apr. 12 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. "He needed that," trainer Ronnie Werner said. "We gave him something to chase--gave him a rabbit. When he made the lead, he threw his ears forward and relaxed and when [the rabbit] came to him again, he kind of re-broke. He did it all the right way and it was what I wanted to see out of him. He came back well and it didn't near bottom him out." Jockey Robby Albarado was aboard for the breeze.

Trust N Luck off Derby Trail

Betting on **Trust N Luck** (Montbrook) in Pool 3 of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager has been suspended following the announcement that the colt has been taken out of consideration for the May 3 Classic. Trainer Ralph Ziadie told Churchill Downs officials that his three-year-old was doing well physically, but would skip the Kentucky Derby to possibly point for the May 17 GI Preakness S. "A mile and a quarter might be a little too tough for him," Ziadie explained. "A lot of horses can fall by the wayside after that race, and you don't want to go to the Derby unless you have a super horse." He added, "There is no chance we will change our minds." Trust N Luck was a distant second to Empire Maker in the GI Florida Derby last time out.

Wood Hopfuls on Work Tab

New York Hero (Partner's Hero), winner of the GII Lane's End S. at Turfway Park last time out, worked five furlongs in :59 4/5 at Aqueduct yesterday morning as he gets ready for the Apr. 12 GI Wood Memorial S. The Paraneck Stable runner galloped out six furlongs in 1:12. "I thought it was excellent," trainer Jen Pedersen said. "[Jockey Rudy Rodriguez, aboard for the work] never asked him for anything. I'm real pleased." She added, "I believe in my heart this horse hasn't peaked yet. He's still improving. Right now, he does what he has to do to win. We haven't gotten to the bottom of him yet." Also prepping for the Wood Memorial, **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) went six furlongs in 1:11 at Palm Meadows Training Center Tuesday. The New York-bred finished third in the GII Louisiana Derby last time out and was moved into second when runner-up Kafwain was disqualified for a positive drug test. **During** (Cherokee Run), possible for the nine-furlong event, went seven furlongs in 1:26 1/5 at Santa Anita yesterday. Trainer Bob Baffert said he would make a decision today regarding the colt's participation.

Roar Emotion Works

Roar Emotion (Roar), winner of last season's GII Demoiselle S., worked four furlongs over Belmont's training track yesterday in a bullet :47 3/5. The filly is coming off a runner-up finish in the Mar. 22 GIII Cicada S., her sophomore debut. "She did everything on her own this morning," said trainer Carlos Martin. "She came out of her last race great and she should move up five lengths." Possible next starts for Roar Emotion include the Apr. 18 GIII Comely S. at Aqueduct and the May 16 GII Black-Eyed Susan. The Comely S. could mark the return of juvenile champion **Storm Flag Flying** (Storm Cat). "It would be great to run in the Comely," Martin commented. "But it doesn't pay for her to run against Storm Flag Flying for \$100,000. Some people say we should run against Storm Flag Flying in the Comely because she hasn't run this year, but whether or not she's 100 percent, she's still a champion. I wouldn't mind hooking her a few months down the road in a Grade I race like the [June 28] Mother Goose or [July 19] Coaching Club American Oaks."

GILL BANNED AT DELAWARE PARK Delaware Park has informed owner Mike Gill that it will not accept any entries from his stable at its upcoming meet. It was previously reported that Delaware and several other tracks in the East would deny Gill stall space. Delaware, however, is believed to be the first to ban Gill from racing at its facility. Gill was notified of Delaware's decision in a tersely worded letter from Chief Operating Officer Bill Fasy. Fasy did not return a phone call seeking comment. The letter to Gill did not provide any explanation for the decision, but cited two state rules of racing that allow management to exclude individuals and entries based on its discretion. Gill, the leading owner in the country in wins and earnings, has also been informed by officials at Monmouth, Aqueduct, Calder and Philadelphia Park that he will not be granted stall space. He plans to open a training center in southeastern Pennsylvania, and will ship to nearby tracks. The Maryland Jockey Club has continued to offer him stalls. Gill, whose season has been shrouded in controversy, claims that rival trainers, jealous of his success, have convinced tracks to ban him. "It's not about bad tests or the leg incident," he said. "It's about track managements saying they don't want a dominant operation at their track. I wish they'd at least be honest about that so that people stop attacking my character."

CHAVEZ RETURN DELAYED Jockey Jorge Chavez, who has been sidelined since being injured in a spill in the Mar. 15 GI Florida Derby, will be out longer than originally expected. The initial diagnosis revealed no fractures, but a follow-up exam by Chavez's chiropractor in New York revealed compression fractures in two of the jockey's vertebrae and a hairline fracture in another. Chavez was injured when his mount in the Florida Derby, Midway Cat, broke down leaving the far turn, subsequently throwing Chavez face first into the ground. "If everything goes well, I'll go to rehabilitation," Chavez told *Daily Racing Form*. The 41-year-old jockey is hoping to make it back for the start of the Belmont meet, which kicks off May 7.

Thoroughbred Reporter John Harrell Dies:

John Harrell, a Thoroughbred industry and agricultural reporter for the *Louisville Courier-Journal*, died yesterday in a Louisville hospital after a brief illness. He was 37. Harrell began working for the *Courier-Journal's* Sports section in the late 1980s before becoming an award-winning journalist for the *Thoroughbred Times*. Six months ago, he rejoined the *Courier-Journal*. "It is difficult to grasp John's death because he was a good friend who also happened to be a journalist that I greatly admired and respected," said John Asher, vice president of racing communications at Churchill Downs. "He was capable of great things, and I have no doubt he would have achieved them if only given the time." Harrell is survived by his wife Laura and their four-year-old daughter Hannah. Committee Approves Slots for Senate Consideration:

A Louisiana Senate committee Tuesday approved a bill to allow slot machines at Fair Grounds Race Course in New Orleans. Passed by a 4-2 margin, the bill will now be sent to the Senate floor for consideration. The measure calls for the installation of 300 machines sometime this year, with the total eventually reaching 700. Fair Grounds is currently the only race track in the state that isn't allowed slots. Delta Downs is already operating slots, while Louisiana Downs and Evangeline Downs are preparing to install slots in the near future.

Teddy Beckett, racing manager to owner Khalid Abdullah, told the *Racing Post*, "Despite extensive and exhaustive searches and checks we were unable to locate the source of the contamination. We are very puzzled as to how this has occurred, but have every confidence in the integrity of the yard."

HQ HIT BY VIRUS

Newmarket has been hit by an outbreak of equine flu, it was revealed yesterday. With six separate yards already affected, local trainers were awaiting the outcome of tests carried out by the Animal Health Trust from two more stables. It is feared that those who have tested positive had previously been vaccinated, suggesting that a different strain may be in circulation. Movement of healthy horses has not been restricted at present, but the Jockey Club may take measures to do so should the disease spread further. "The clinical signs have been relatively mild and there hasn't been much in the way of severely high temperatures or very sick animals," AHT spokeswoman Jackie Caldwell told the *Racing Post*. "The most common sign has just been coughing, and they should all make a full recovery, although if the horses are rested while they are infected, their chances of rapid recovery are better. We couldn't say for certain at the moment whether the vaccine has broken down because the strain is very different from the strains in the vaccine or for some reason the antibody levels in the blood are not high enough in the vaccinated horses. We need to examine the virus carefully to see how it varies from the vaccine strain and also we need to examine the blood samples taken from the infected horses at the beginning of the infection."

ONLY WAY IS UP FOR ASCOT

Officials at Ascot racecourse were yesterday reflecting on a successful 2002 as they approach the first phase of the track's redevelopment. Revealing that total attendance was up by nine percent and pre-tax profits were up by 13 percent at £12.4 million on 2001, Ascot Chief Executive Douglas Erskine-Crum heralded "another excellent year." While it is as yet unknown whether that redevelopment will mean having to find an alternative venue for the 2005 Royal meeting, Erskine-Crum stated that the decision will be made based on "whether it will serve the interests of Ascot's customers and stakeholders to move the meeting to another venue." He also revealed that plans to build a left-handed all-weather track had been put on the backburner. "We looked at the issue of building such a track very seriously, but there are distinct difficulties with building an oval left-handed track at Ascot," he admitted. "The main problem is the levels of the track--the winning post is about 25 metres higher than the start of the old and new miles, which means a serious amount of levelling or building up would be required. It's definitely not something that will be combined with this development. But who knows what could happen in the future?"
