BEAUMONT BELLES

A solid group of three-year-old fillies will go postward in today's GII Stonerside Beaumont S. at Keeneland, headed by graded-stakes winners **Midnight Cry** (Smart Strike), **My Boston Gal** (Boston Harbor) and **Chimichurri** (Elusive Quality), as well as **Elegant Designer** (Suave Prospect), who has a four-race winning streak in hand. Midnight Cry ran second to Elegant Designer in the



Great State Challenge Juvenile Fillies Dec. 7, then made an eye-catching sophomore bow in winning the GIII Stonerside Forward Gal S. at Gulfstream Mar. 14. Stonerside has set up a \$200,000 bonus to any filly who can sweep the Forward Gal, the Beaumont

and the Stonerside S. at Lone Star May 24 and Midnight Cry will be tough to handle in the second leg of this series. One who could be up to the task is **Bird Town** (Cape Town). The Marylou Whitney homebred gave subsequent GSW Yell a run for her money in a two-turn allowance at Gulfstream Jan. 16, missing by just a neck after a stretch-long duel. She came back at the same track to trounce the field by 12 1/2 lengths in the Charon S. Feb. 23, an effort which earned her a 100 Beyer Speed Figure.

An even dozen will face the starter in the \$500,000 GII Arkansas Derby Saturday at Oaklawn Park, one of three major Kentucky Derby preps that afternoon. The Arkansas Derby will be the final leg of the national Big 3 Pick 3 wager, which will also include the GI Wood

Memorial at Aqueduct and the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. from Keeneland. **Region of Merit** (Touch Gold) defeated **Aristocat** (Tale of the Cat) in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 16. This will be the third meeting between the two colts. Shipping in from California is **Man Among Men** (Gentlemen {Arg}), who surprised current Kentucky Derby favorite Empire Maker in the Sham S. Feb. 7. Ten Cents A Shine, who had been expected to run in the Arkansas Derby, will instead run in the Blue Grass (*see p2 for the story*).

Ten Cents A Shine Rerouted

Originally scheduled to make his final Kentucky Derby prep in Saturday's GII Arkansas Derby at Oaklawn Park, Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Ten Cents A Shine** (Devil His Due) will take his place alongside his owner's **Badge of Silver** (Silver Deputy) in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. "It looks like there is going to be a big field in Arkansas and if you draw the outside there, you have no chance to win," trainer D. Wayne Lukas commented, despite the fact that the last three winners of the race broke from posts 11, 10 and 10, respectively. "This horse is training great. I have him where I want him physically, but he's not where I want him mentally. We need to step up and get in the fray though or we'll be lost on the first Saturday in May." In his first start for his trainer, Ten Cents A Shine was unplaced in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 16, but came back to work a solid mile in 1:38 2/5 at Santa Anita two weeks later. Jockey Mike Smith will be in from California for the mount.

Lion Tamer Gets Another Chance

Lion Tamer (Will's Way), fourth as the favorite in the GII Lane's End S. at Turfway Park Mar. 22, may get another opportunity to prove that he can handle a distance of ground as he was pronounced yesterday a likely starter in Saturday's Blue Grass S. Trainer Todd Pletcher, who will also be represented by **Indy Dancer** (A.P. Indy) in the GI Wood Memorial and **Aristocat** (Tale of the Cat) in the GII Arkansas Derby on Saturday, has tabbed jockey Cornelio Velasquez to pilot the chestnut colt, who earlier this winter won the seven-furlong GII Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream Park.

'Talk' Needs Focus

Atswhatimtalknbout (A.P. Indy), fourth as the 3-2 favorite in last Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby, may need some sharpening up. "I'm going to work him in blinkers and see if he's more aggressive," said trainer Ron Ellis of the colt, who shipped to Kentucky yesterday morning. "It's not a definite [that he'll race in blinkers]. He's a little bit of a lazy work horse...he probably needs them. I haven't put him on them to this point because he was always doing so well, but now that he ran one race that wasn't up to par, we've got to kind of pull out all stops."

Ocean Terrace to Lexington

Gill El Camino Real Derby hero **Ocean Terrace** (Saint Ballado), who lost his unbeaten record when eased in the GI Santa Anita Derby, will likely make his next start in the GI Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland Apr. 19. "He bled at about the half-mile pole in the Santa Anita Derby," said trainer Bob Hess, Jr. "but not enough to get him beat 47 1/2 lengths. Mostly, I think it was because he went too fast early. Kent [jockey Desormeaux] protected him once he felt he was bleeding." Hess indicated that a start in the May 3 GI Kentucky Derby would hinge on the colt's performance in the Lexington.

Who Wants Ten Most Wanted?

Jockey Pat Day, who piloted **Ten Most Wanted** (Deputy Commander) to an impressive victory in the GI Illinois Derby last Saturday, has not yet committed to ride the colt in the GI Kentucky Derby, according to trainer Wally Dollase. "He gave me the impression he would stay with Ten Most Wanted," said Dollase, "but if he wins the Blue Grass, he might consider another horse. Right now, he's playing it a little cool." Day has the call aboard **Offlee Wild** (Wild Again) in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland Saturday afternoon.

'Buddy' Will Breeze Monday

Buddy Gil (Eastern Echo) will breeze Monday at Santa Anita before shipping to Kentucky Tuesday, Apr. 15. "He'll probably work a half [mile], if we can hold him down to a half," said trainer Jeff Mullins. He may go three-quarters. Gary [jockey Stevens] will work him." Since transferring to Mullins' barn, Buddy Gil has gone unbeaten in three starts, taking the GIII Baldwin S. and the GI San Felipe S. prior to his victory in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 7. He bled in that race and was placed on the bleeders' list in California; state regulations require that he must breeze five furlongs in 1:03 or better at least 14 days after the incident. Monday's work will not count towards getting off the bleeders' list.

From \$7,500 claimer just four starts back to graded-stakes winner, Patton's Victory's rise through the ranks has been nothing if not meteoric. The dark bay romped by 14 lengths as an 11-1 outsider in a Hoosier \$7,500 claiming event Oct. 4, then returned from a four-month freshening to win an Oaklawn \$7,500 starter allowance race Feb. 9. A 10-length winner in a \$10,000 starter allowance Mar. 2, he ran a 101 Beyer when beating \$35,000 optional claimers at this trip Mar. 16. Sent to the fore here under jockey Alex Birzer, Patton's Victory was allowed to lope along on an uncontested lead through six furlongs in 1:12 flat, opened up by three lengths turning for home and was full of run late to stave off the challenge of Colorful Tour. "I felt confident midway around the first turn when no one came up to challenge him," said Birzer. "The rest was nursing that lead." Post-time favorite Windward Passage (Captain Bodgit) showed little and finished sixth.

ANALYSIS OF SELECTED DERBY CONTENDERS

by Jerry Brown

Empire Maker (Unbridled)--ran well but not too fast last year, then jumped out of his skin in his second start this year. A six-point move from a two-year-old top doesn't kill a horse, especially one with a late-developing pedigree--look how much the dam's other runners improved with age. This horse has a lot of things in his favor--he's fast, has the pedigree and is trained by a guy who has been getting a lot of good numbers recently. On the other hand, he only has one good figure, and it remains to be seen what effect that effort will have. It's interesting to note that short-term patterns have changed a little with the last two Derby winners, both of whom peaked a little earlier and ran a big figure in March, and it is too soon to know whether this is a trend. If Empire Maker pairs up he'll look something like War Emblem, and if he backs up a couple of points he'll look like Monarchos coming into the Derby.

Indy Dancer (A.P. Indy)--ran well in his debut, but stakes-level three-year-olds should be forging forward, not struggling to return to a top, and in general should be running a top at least every other race. He's relatively slow compared to others as well, although a forward move now would at least give him a small shot.

New York Hero (Partner's Hero)--is another that didn't start at two, and will have to deal with the effects of a tremendous amount of development in a short period of time. The history of bearing out (BO) is also not a good sign.

CHURCHILL TO PARTNER IN PITTSBURGH TRACK?

Churchill Downs Incorporated yesterday announced that they will have entered into a letter of intent to join Charles J. Betters in the development and construction of Pittsburgh Palisades Park, a new Thoroughbred facility to be built on the city's south side. The Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission is currently reviewing an application for a license to operate the track. According to the proposal, CDI will develop and manage racetrack operations and will become an investor in Pittsburgh Palisades Park. In addition, if an agreement is reached between the two companies and alternative gaming is legalized in Pennsylvania, CDI will be an investor in the company that operates gaming at the racetrack.

THREE WEEKS UNTIL PINCAY DECISION

Jockey Laffit Pincay, Jr. will wait another three weeks to determine whether he will continue his career or retire. The 56-year-old Hall of Famer, recovering from two fractures in the same bone in his neck, has been wearing a halo brace for two months. Pincay was injured in a Mar. 1 spill at Santa Anita. "I still don't know what I'm going to do," said Pincay. "I don't have any pain, I walk really good. I feel great, actually. When I see the doctor and I'm told to take the halo off, I'll have to do an MRI and then ask the doctor's opinion. Based on that, I'll make a decision." Pincay, the winningest jockey in racing history, currently has 9,530 career victories. His family has urged him to retire.

A New Twist traveled past six furlongs for just the second time in her career in this contest and found the journey much to her liking, splashing home a confident victress against a small but contentious field. Winner of the \$100,000 Old Hat S. at Gulfstream last January, the chestnut was badly overmatched in her next two races, including a sixth in the GI Test S. that wrapped up her 2002 campaign. Second in a Gulfstream \$75,000 optional claimer Jan. 17, then looked very good when knocking off that level by 1 3/4 lengths Feb. 27. This race, which lost morning-line favorite You (You and I) and two others as rain soaked the region, was controlled early by Flaxen Flyer, who sped through fractions of :21 4/5 and :44 1/5 with A New Twist keeping a watchful eye a length back in second. Just as Flaxen Flyer began to edge clear nearing the quarter pole, A New Twist came again at the leader and took control of things with a furlong to run. "We think this filly has all the talent in the world," the winning conditioner commented. "She's a very fractious filly. She's very tough to work with. The effort is worth it when she comes out and performs like this in the afternoon." Click [here](#) for the video replay.

The scholarship drawing is a collaborative project between Keeneland and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association.

Cullen Businessman of the Year:

Jim Cullen, owner and president of Cullen Bloodstock Services in Lexington, Kentucky, has been selected one of the 2003 Businessmen of the Year for Kentucky by the Business Advisory Council and the National Republican Congressional Committee.
