RECORDS FALL AT TATTERSALLS

The New York-based Anstu Farm of Anita and Stuart Subotnick set a new European breeze-up record when they bought a Danehill colt through Irish agent John Hassett Jr. for 260,000gns on the opening night of the Tattersalls Breeze-Up Sale in Newmarket. Hip 72 is out of Silver Bubble (Silver Hawk), a full sister to three-time Grade 1 winner Hawkster, and cost €50,000 as a yearling at the Goffs Orby sale. He was offered from Con Marnane's Co. Tipperary-based Bansha House Stables. Gordian Troeller, representing Kentucky-based owners, lasted to around 150,000gns for the April 13 foal, but it was left to Taki Muryama of the

Japanese J S Company, seated with trainer Kenji Yamauchi, to fight out the final battle with Hassett Jr., whose father John trains in Ireland. "He's going to ship to America, but it's still undecided where he will be trained," said Hassett. "He was bought for Anstu Farm and it was the pedigree that we really liked. He was bought for not much more than the price of a Danehill nomination." The price easily eclipsed the previous European breeze-up record of 180,000gns paid for a Selkirk colt at Tattersalls 12 months ago. John McCormack shook off trainer John Gosden to secure the only other six-figure price when going to 115,000gns for hip 48. Consigned by former jockey Malcolm Bastard, the Singspiel (Ire) colt out of French G3 winner Faribole (Ire) (Esprit du Nord) hails from the female family of Mtoto (GB). "He is for a Hong Kong owner and will be joining Luca Cumani," said McCormack. "It's to be decided later on whether he'll eventually end up in Hong Kong. He had the frame to make a nice three-year-old." The turnover of 2,362,500gns beat last year's record by one percent and the 24,000gns median was up nine percent although the average dipped by 10 percent. The sale concludes tonight with a session following racing at 5:45 p.m.

Having finished five-lengths third to Keltos (Fr) in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury last May, 2001's G1 Prix Jean-Prat winner Olden Times was found to have fractured a pelvis and missed the rest of 2002. He did not return to training until this year, but showed no signs of ring rust as he returned to the winner's circle for the first time since his G1 win to secure a third stakes success under a power-packed Kieren Fallon ride. He will now point to the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. (Newbury May 17) and the G2 Queen Anne S. (Royal Ascot June 17). Champion jockey Fallon settled his mount in a midfield fourth as Desert Deer and Potemkin dueled for the lead and moved his mount closer upon passing the three-eighths pole. The joint favourite seized the initiative from market rival Desert Deer at the quarter-mile marker and was expertly driven to the wire thereafter to deny that game opponent in decisive fashion. "We've had a long time getting him right," conditioner John Dunlop commented. "A race was needed this year, as he has had a long time off, so he'll go to the Lockinge and then hopefully the G1 Queen Anne S. He likes a straight track and good fast ground, and he's a very good horse."

Battle Chant's six-length score in the Listed Silver Tankard S. at Pontefract in October evoked memories of Bandari (Ire)'s demolition job in that 12 months earlier. Like that colt, Battle Chant was a fast-improving two-year-old, stepping up on an impressive Chepstow maiden win the previous month. His main threat may prove to be **Maghanim**, from the stable responsible for both winners of the Group races on the first two days of this meeting. He was runner-up to Almushahar in a Newmarket maiden in August before winning a Doncaster conditions race the following month. He failed to settle when 13th behind Hold That Tiger in the slowly-run G1 Grand Criterium at Longchamp on Arc day and deserves another chance. **Saturn** collected a competitive Newbury conditions event in September before finishing a fair fifth in the G1 Dewhurst S. at this track in October and he does not need the ground to firm up further.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

Trainer Bobby Frankel appears to have a very strong hand in the GI Kentucky Derby following the weekend victories of his charges Empire Maker in the GI Wood Memorial and Peace Rules in the Blue Grass. While this pair are in the same stable and are aiming at the same target, their backgrounds are very different.

Empire Maker is an impeccably bred product of the Juddmonte Farms operation, while Peace Rules, a \$35,000 OBS March purchase. Unbridled, the sire of Empire Maker, has sired as many Grade I winners as Jules, the sire of Peace Rules, has had stakes winners of any kind, and Empire Maker's dam, Toussaud, has produced more stakes winners by herself than are found in the first four dams of the pedigree of Peace Rules.

That is not to say that the pedigree of Peace Rules is without interest; in fact, when a horse outruns his pedigree to this degree, there is usually some noteworthy pedigree patterns to be found. Peace Rules is a member of the second crop of Jules, a Forty Niner son who owns an outstanding pedigree, and who also produced some more than creditable efforts at the track. In fact, at one time, Jules himself was considered classic material.

He opened up his career in spectacular fashion, winning a six-furlong maiden race at Belmont Park by no less than 14 lengths and earning one of the highest Beyer Speed Figures set by a juvenile that year. Beaten a nose by Just a Cat in the GII Cowdin S. on his second start, Jules then captured the GIII Nashua S. over a mile. He ended his juvenile campaign with a luckless third in the nine-furlong GII Remsen S., the winner being The Silver Move, whom Jules had beaten in the Nashua.

That performance gave Jules' connections the impression that he might well be a classic type horse, but four spring defeats ended any Triple Crown aspirations. Dropped back to six furlongs, Jules took an allowance race at Monmouth in June, then captured the 8 1/2-furlong Long Branch S. at the same venue. Jules started just once more, injury forcing a retirement following a third in the six-furlong Housebuster S.

Retired to Bridlewood Farm in Ocala, Florida, Jules took to stud a pedigree which looked to give him the potential to outsize himself. By Forty Niner, who was on the verge of earning a "sire of sires" tag, he was out of the Devil's Bag mare, Bonita Francita. A four-time winner herself, Bonita Francita was 3/4-sister to Coup de Folie (by Halo), a group winner in France who at the time of Jules' retirement had already produced four group winners, headed by French champion juveniles Machiavellian and Coup de Genie. This pair were both by Jules' grandsire Mr. Prospector, and so were extremely closely related to Jules. Machiavellian was already off to a bright start as a sire, which gave another boost to Jules' attractiveness as a stallion prospect. Of course, Jules' granddam Raise the Standard was half-sister to none other than Northern Dancer, and was bred on very similar lines to the dam of another stallion star from this family, Danehill. Peace Rules' dam Hold to Fashion, who won twice over sprint distances, is a daughter of Hold Your Peace, a Prince John-line stallion who is best known as the sire of Meadowlake. Peace Rules is the fifth foal and third starter produced by Hold to Fashion, the others including Peace Rules' first foal, Wild Fashion, a daughter of Once Wild who captured a pair of stakes at Charles Town as a six-year-old.

Peace Rules' granddam, is the Greek Answer mare, Toga Toga, was a two-time sprint stakes winner. Remarkably, Peace Rules, Wild Fashion and Toga Toga are the only stakes winners under the first four dams. That said, there is some quality in the sires in the female line, as Peace Rules' third dam is by Never Bend and his fourth dam is by Native Dancer. The fifth dam, Berelia, is by the obscure sire Auralia (a top-class English long-distance horse who was a grandson of The Tetrarch, an unbeaten two-year-old in England who was christened "The Spotted Wonder"). Berelia won only two small races, but she made it to the court of Native Dancer through the achievements of the only other foal produced by her dam, champion Berlo.

Since Jules is a Mr. Prospector-line sire who is free of Northern Dancer, has a half-sister to Northern Dancer as his granddam, and is out of a mare inbred to Northern Dancer's own granddam Almahmoud, one might have expected him to be suited by mares carrying Northern Dancer. In this case, the theory has been borne out by the facts. Jules sired three stakes winners in his first crop, foals of 1999, and two were out of mares by sons of Northern Dancer (Nijinsky II and Dixieland Band). Jules' second crop has already produced two stakes winners, Peace Rules and OBS Championship winner The Name's Bond, who is out of a mare by Northern Dancer's grandson, Baldski.

Jules also shuttled to Brazil (where he now stands full time) and his first crop in that country has produced four stakes winners, three of them graded. Three of his Southern Hemisphere-sired stakes winners are out of mares by another Northern Dancer grandson, Ghadeer (by Lyphard), and the fourth has a second dam by Nijinsky II.

Peace Rules also has a Northern Dancer strain, albeit a relatively distant one, as Greek Answer, the sire of his second dam, is by Northern Dancer's son Northern Answer. There are some similarities here with the pedigree of another Florida-bred who distinguished himself on the Triple Crown trail: Captain Bodgit. He is by Saint Ballado, a brother to Devil's Bag, the broodmare sire of Jules, and is out of a Greek Answer mare. There a couple of other connections worth noting in this pedigree. Jules has Halo through Devil's Bag, and Peace Rules' dam, Hold to Fashion, is by a grandson of Prince John. Halo and Prince John frequently combine well as Halo's broodmare sire Cosmic Bomb is a half-brother to the dam of Prince John. It's also interesting that Jules' grandsire Mr. Prospector is by a son of Native Dancer out of a mare by Nasrullah, while Peace Rules' granddam is a product of a reverse of that cross, as she is by a son of Nasrullah out of a mare by Native Dancer.

This is not a pedigree which one would instantly associate with ability to get the Kentucky Derby trip of 1 1/4 miles, but it's worth noting that Captain Bodgit, who we mentioned had some pedigree similarities to the dam of Peace Rules, came within a head of beating Silver Charm in the 1997 Run for the Roses.

'Ats' Works Beneath The Twin Spires

B. Wayne Hughes and Biscuit Stable's **Atswhatimtalknbout** (A.P. Indy) turned in his first timed drill over the Churchill Downs main track, going an easy four furlongs in :49 3/5 for trainer Ron Ellis. The dark bay colt, working for the first time in blinkers, went his opening quarter mile in :25 2/5 before galloping out five-eighths of a mile in 1:04 1/5. "I didn't really know what to expect," said Ellis, who was on hand to supervise the breeze. "I'm not used to training here and I didn't know what he would do with the blinkers on, so I told the rider to just kind of let him go off on his own. He started off just looking around and gawking a bit. He finished okay, but I think he's still looking around." Ellis has so far employed blinkers with a minimal cup and explained that **Atswhatimtalknbout** keeps trying to peek around the cup. "He's getting used to [the blinkers]," the conditioner continued. "He didn't really accept them and think it was the greatest thing ever. But I think as time goes by, he'll get used to them. This horse is really just kind of a young kid and even with the races he's had, he's come around kind of slow." A hard-charging second to **Buddy Gil** (Eastern Echo) in the Mar. 16 GII San Felipe S., he comes into the Derby off a lackluster fourth to that rival in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 5.

Ten Most Wanted Drills in Lexington

Ten Most Wanted (Deputy Commander), impressive winner of the GII Illinois Derby Apr. 5, returned to the track yesterday morning for the first time since his victory, breezing a half mile at Keeneland. "I caught him in :48 2/5," commented Keeneland clocker Tom Bridges. "It wasn't the fastest work of the morning, but I liked the way he did it. He was really going well at the wire." Later in the afternoon, it was announced that J. Paul Reddam, one of the primary clients of trainer Wally Dollase's son Craig, has acquired an interest in the colt from an ownership group including James Chisholm, Michael Jarvis and Horizon Stable. Details were not disclosed, but the *Blood-Horse* reports that Reddam, who races GI Ashland S. winner Elloluv, owns more than any single partner, but less than 50 percent. **Ten Most Wanted** has been ridden in his last two starts by jockey Pat Day, but could get a new pilot for the Derby, should Day choose to stick with GI Toyota Blue Grass S. third-place finisher **Offlee Wild** (Wild Again).

Domestic Dispute Gets One More Chance

Despite subpar efforts in the GII San Felipe and GI Santa Anita Derby, Gary Garber's **Domestic Dispute** (Unbridled's Song) will get one final chance to earn his way into the Kentucky Derby field when he goes postward in Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland. "We're gonna take one final shot at the Derby," trainer Bob Baffert said. "With Midas Eyes out, it makes it more appealing." Jerry Bailey, who guided the chestnut colt to victory in the GII Santa Catalina S. at Santa Anita in January, will be back aboard on Saturday.

Scrimshaw Fires Churchill Bullet

Scrimshaw (Gulch), unraced since a distant fourth-place finish to **Lion Tamer** (Will's Way) in the GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 15, zipped four furlongs in :46 3/5 yesterday morning at Churchill Downs and makes his return to the races in Saturday's Lexington S. at Keeneland. The move was the fastest of 45 at the distance. "It was an impressive work," commented trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "It was encouraging to see him have that zip. He came home in 11 flat and he went off in 12-and-2, so that was encouraging." Owned by Bob and Beverly Lewis, **Scrimshaw** underwent what Lukas described as "minor throat surgery" following the Hutcheson and missed three weeks of training while recovering. In his only other two-turn experience, the \$550,000 Keeneland April two-year-old purchase was third as the favorite in the GII Santa Catalina. Should **Scrimshaw** make it to the Derby, his trainer has no problems taking on divisional leader **Empire Maker** (Unbridled). "He's done the most lately, but I don't see Spectacular Bid or Seattle Slew here," Lukas commented. "I think that the race is going to be more competitive than that."

WILD APPLAUSE DIES Multiple graded-stakes winner and producer **Wild Applause** (Northern Dancer--Glowing Tribute, by Graustark) died from foaling complications Apr. 2 at Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky. She was 22. Wild Applause had foaled a Pulpit colt week prior to her death; the colt has been placed on a nurse mare. Bred by Paul Mellon's Rokeby Stables in Virginia, the bay captured the GII Diana H. and the GIII Comely S. in addition to running third in the GI Mother Goose S. She earned \$240,136 in winning five of her 10 career starts and headed to the breeding shed as a very promising prospect. Her dam, Broodmare of the Year Glowing Tribute, produced Kentucky Derby victor Sea Hero (Polish Navy) and GISW Hero's Honor (Northern Dancer) as well as GSWs Glowing Honor (Seattle Slew), Coronation Cup (Chief's Crown) and Mackie (Summer Squall). Wild Applause's fourth foal was GISW Eastern Echo (Damascus) and she followed up with GSW Blare of Trumpets (Fit to Fight). AFFIRMED SUCCESS INJURED **Affirmed Success** (Affirmed) has emerged from his last-place finish in last Saturday's GI Carter H. with some filling in his right front ankle, rendering his future uncertain. "Right now, I'd say it's 50-50," trainer Richard Schosberg told *Daily Racing Form* about the prospects of returning to the races. "He owes us nothing. We've always tried to make the right decisions with him and he's always come through for us." The nine-year-old gelding has been sent to owner Albert Fried Jr.'s Buttonwood Farm in Rhinebeck, New York, and will be evaluated in 30 to 45 days before a final decision is made regarding the continuation of his career. A three-time Grade I winner, Affirmed Success has 17 victories from 42 career starts and earnings approaching the \$2.3-million mark.
