STORM FLAG FLYING RETURNS

Last year's champion two-year-old filly **Storm Flag Flying** (Storm Cat) makes her first start since a gritty victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in this afternoon's GIII Comely S. at Aqueduct. The dark bay won the GI Matron and GI Frizette before taking her record to a perfect four-for-four in the Breeders' Cup. Explaining the long absence, trainer Shug McGaughey said, "I wanted to have a fresh horse for the summer." McGaughey's summer plans for Storm Flag Flying include NYRA's Triple Tiara series which offers a \$2-million bonus to the connections of any three-year-old filly that can sweep the June 28 GI Mother Goose, the July 19 GI Coaching Club American Oaks and the Aug. 16 GI Alabama. The conditioner also left the door open for a possible start in the May 2 GI Kentucky Oaks. In the one-mile Comely, Storm Flag Flying will face a field of six, including GIII Cicada S. winner **Cyber Secret** (Cyberspace). "I'm not going into this hoping we're second best," the filly's trainer Richard Dutrow, Jr said, but he admitted, "I'll be satisfied with a win or if our filly runs huge and just gets beat."

SADLER'S WELLS FILLY TOPS TATTS FINALE

There were more fireworks at the Tattersalls Breeze-Up Sale in Newmarket last night when a daughter of Sadler's Wells fetched 150,000gns to become the top-priced filly sold at a European breeze-up sale. The juvenile was purchased by Fusao Sekiguchi, who raced Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus. Californian-based Mikki Tsuge represented the Tokyo owner and outbid Irish agent Ross Doyle and trainer Nick Littmoden for the filly out of Mountain Holly (GB), consigned from Con Marnane's Bansha House Stables and bred by Robert Sangster's Swettenham Stud. She cost Marnane €45,000 as a yearling at Goffs. "I was in London last night when Mr Sekiguchi asked me to come and look at some horses here," said Tsuge. "This filly and the two others I bought tonight will all go to Japan and we have some top trainers lined up. The pedigree was the real attraction with this filly, we thought she would make a nice mate for Fusaichi Pegasus eventually." The 4,115,700gns turnover bettered last year's record aggregate by five percent. The 25,000gns median was also a new best, but the 31,904gns average fell six percent shy of the 2002 figure. **Tattersalls coverage p. 4**

Tattersalls Pleased With 2003 Breeze-Up Sale

Yesterday, at the conclusion of a record-breaking auction, Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony commented, "In 2002, our Breeze-Up produced truly extraordinary figures with an average up 44 percent and turnover up an even more remarkable 52 percent. We suspected that such a spectacular sale would be a hard act to follow, especially bearing in mind the global uncertainties, caused not only by the conflict in the Gulf, but also by the virus outbreak in Southeast Asia, but trade over the past two days has yet again produced record-breaking figures. The obvious highlight was Bansha House Stables' Danehill colt whose price of 260,000gns comfortably broke last year's European Breeze-Up record of 180,000gns, but in addition we have also seen records for median and turnover and more lots breaking the 50,000gns mark than ever before.

Mahony, explaining the recent strength of the auction, added, "The sale-topping colt emphasised how the Tattersalls Breeze-Up has transformed the European breeze-up market in recent times, with new buyers from the USA fighting off strong opposition from Japanese competition for a colt by one of the world's best sires. We have seen the average at this sale more than double in the last five years and this has encouraged the vendors to send us some serious two-year-olds with pedigrees to match. The catalogue was well-received from the word go and has attracted new faces from throughout the world, including Japan, North America, Dubai, and Hong Kong as well as a strong Greek contingent accompanying our newly appointed Greek representative Chris Imirziadis and a party from Kazakhstan, and strong support from the traditional European markets."

Reddam Purchases Interest in Ten Most Wanted

J Paul Reddam has purchased an interest in GII Illinois Derby winner **Ten Most Wanted** (Deputy Commander) from trainer Wally Dollase's Horizon Stable. "I watched the Illinois Derby and was impressed with the way Ten Most Wanted smoked them down the lane," Reddam told *The Blood-Horse*. "I know the time was slow, but I read where the track was really dead that day. Then when I saw his Beyer of 110, I looked at the race again and it was a lot better than I originally thought." While Dollase trains Ten Most Wanted, Reddam's **Elloluv** (Gilded Time), likely favorite for the May 2 GI Kentucky Oaks, is trained by Dollase's son Craig.

Kafwain Touches Down

Kafwain (Cherokee Run), coming off a third-place effort in the GI Santa Anita Derby, arrived at Churchill Downs yesterday. The colt was accompanied on his flight from Southern California by fellow Bob Baffert trainees **Atlantic Ocean** (Stormy Atlantic) and last year's GI Belmont S. victor **Sarava** (Wild Again). Also on the flight was trainer Nick Canani's Kentucky Oaks hopeful **Island Fashion** (Petionville).

Awesome Humor Likely for Acorn

Awesome Humor (Distorted Humor), undefeated winner of last year's GI Spinaway S., continues to make progress toward her first race since last summer. The filly underwent surgery last year to remove bone chips from her ankles. Trainer Elliott Walden said **Awesome Humor** is being pointed towards the June 6 GI Acorn at Belmont Park. "I'm excited to get her going again and I'm real pleased with her," Walden commented.

LUKAS SITS OUT HOLLYPARK, DEL MAR Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas will not race at Hollywood Park or Del Mar this summer, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Instead, the conditioner will ship 14 horses to Arlington Park in early May, following the exodus of 20 horses shipped to Kentucky earlier in the spring. Lukas will also operate stables at Churchill Downs, Belmont Park and Saratoga. 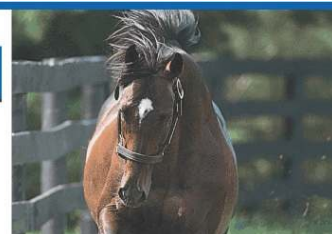
