LUKAS' LEXINGTON

Can his luck possibly continue? Trainer D. Wayne Lukas won his third GII Coolmore Lexington S. yesterday at Keeneland with **Scrimshaw** (Gulch), and that Lewis colorbearer could find himself in the starting gate two weeks hence in the GI Kentucky Derby. Lukas' previous two Lexington heroes--Charismatic in 1999 and Proud Citizen last year--went on to distinguish themselves at boxcar odds in the Run for the Roses: Charismatic won at 31-1, while Proud Citizen completed the exacta at 23-1. Scrimshaw hadn't raced since Feb. 15, undergoing throat surgery after a fourth in the GII Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream. But the dark bay had opened his career with promise at Santa Anita, capturing his Nov. 3 debut by two lengths, then defeated **Eye Of The Tiger** (American Chance) in a swiftly run allowance Dec. 26, earning a 104 Beyer while covering six furlongs in 1:08 1/5. Asked to tackle two turns, he was three wide throughout the GII San Felipe S. Jan. 18, finishing third to **Domestic Dispute** (Unbridled's Song) as the 9-5 chalk. Scrimshaw broke awkwardly in the Hutcheson and never figured when fourth in a six-horse field, prompting the decision to have a minor throat operation. He posted a bullet half in :46 3/5 at Churchill Wednesday for his return and was sent off as the fourth choice in this field full of Triple Crown nominees.

How the Race Was Won

Breaking from the rail, Scrimshaw bobbled a bit at the start, but quickly recovered to secure a ground-saving position behind pacesetter **Trust N Luck** (Montbrook). He was moving well heading into the far turn and got the racing room he needed when favorite **Ministers Wild Cat** (Deputy Minister) began to back up nearing the top of the stretch. Once in the clear, he responded to Edgar Prado's urging and opened up on his rivals. "It was a little crowded in the first turn, but I was patient and just waited," said Prado, who piloted Peace Rules to victory in last Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. "Things kind of split open at the quarter pole and I got through. He was looking around at the end, so I just tried to keep his mind on business."

Lukas, who saddled Charismatic for the Lewises, will likely send Scrimshaw on to the Derby. "I have to talk to Bob and Beverly Lewis," he said. "I knew I was behind the eight ball with this horse. I always thought he was our best horse, but now we have to put it all together in a couple of weeks. It is a challenge. I am the old man of Derby trainers now and I hope I am bringing him around." As for the others, trainer Neil Drysdale said that Ministers Wild Cat didn't handle the track, adding, "I can't say what we're going to do next with him." **Ocean Terrace** (Saint Ballado) was eased in his second straight start and looks to be off the Derby trail.

Grand Armeé returned from a four-month absence to take a 1200-meter event at this track Mar. 8 before getting beat by a pair of noses when third in the G3 Newmarket H. at Newcastle Mar. 26. The brown gelding charged home to win last Saturday's G3 Ajax S. at Rosehill by 3/4 of a length and was in search of his first victory past 1500 meters here. Prominently placed beneath jockey Danny Beasley in the early stages of Australia's premier event over 1600 meters, Grand Armeé, in receipt of a 1.5-kilogram penalty, was given his cue approaching the final furlong and kicked clear to win convincingly. "It was lovely to go into the race with no pressure, do our own thing quietly and get on with the job," commented trainer Gai Waterhouse, who was winning her sixth Doncaster. "It was a lovely race, a good test of a great miler and nowadays it is much harder for a younger, aspiring horse to win this race." Highweighted Defier (Aus) (Dehere) was among those scratched, while favored Lonhro (Aus) (Octagonal {NZ}) struggled in the heavy going and finished fourth.

Snowland added a Group 1 success to his resume and more than doubled his lifetime earnings with a hard-fought victory over arch-rival Star of Florida, who set the pace and held on willingly until the waning strides. The three-year-old fought on gamely to finish a length second in the G3 Liverpool City Cup Mar. 15 and was coming off a runner-up finish to Star of Florida in the G2 Challenge S. at Warwick Farm Apr. 6, but was able to turn the tables this time around as the lukewarm favorite among the 45,000 on hand. "Star of Florida ran us off our feet last start," commented winning conditioner Gai Waterhouse. "But today we had a home track advantage, he handled the wet track and Chris Munce is the man right now," she said of the jockey who has ridden three Group 1 winners in as many weeks. Snowland was purchased for just A\$90,000 at the Magic Millions sale by Eduardo Cojuangco, who sponsors the A\$8-million raceday at Randwick and won the AJC Derby a year ago with Don Eduardo (Aus).

The winner of the GII Honeymoon Breeders' Cup H. last June, Megahertz finished second in the inaugural running of the American Oaks at Hollywood last summer, but was promoted to the win when she was struck with the whip by the rider of Dublino. The diminutive chestnut renewed acquaintances with that one in the GI Del Mar Oaks Aug. 24, falling a nose short, but concluded her sophomore campaign with a sixth-place finish in Keeneland's GI Queen Elizabeth II Cup Oct. 12. In a pair of starts this term, the chestnut was second, beaten 3/4 of a length, by stablemate Tates Creek in the GII San Gorgonio H. Jan. 11 and was most recently a tough-luck third behind Noches de Rosa in the GII Santa Ana H. Mar. 22. Angled in to save ground as her stable companion Trekking set steady fractions on the front end, Megahertz came off the fence on the far turn, split horses in upper stretch, took over at the eighth pole and inched clear. "She got bumped around good the last time, so all I wanted today was a clean trip and we got it," commented winning rider Alex Solis. "I just wanted to stay close to the pace and I knew she'd make her run. She's a great mare and likes this turf course."

Raging Fever got away with an easy opening half, then turned back a bid from MGSW Smok'n Frolic to earn her first victory since last June. The Edward Evans homebred had enjoyed a great first half of the year in 2002, winning four graded stakes, including the GI Ogden Phipps H. at Belmont June 22. She went winless in her next four starts, however, and was given some time off following a third to Shine Again in the GII First Flight H. Oct. 26. Returning to action Mar. 29, she was given the thankless task of chasing Carson Hollow in the GII Distaff Breeders' Cup H., running second every step to that sprinter. She broke alertly under Aaron Gryder and went straight to the front, dictating through fractions of :23.78 and :47.05. Smok'n Frolic came after her in the stretch, but Raging Fever held her at bay as they raced under the wire. "Forty-seven is about as slow as she'll ever run a half in her life," said winning trainer Mark Hennig. "The Shuvee H. [GII, 1m, May 17, Belmont] is probably next."

Fight for Ally ran his winning streak to five with this game victory. The Indiana-bred kicked off the skein in the restricted To Much Coffee S. at Hoosier Park in November, then was dropped in for a \$50,000 tag and won again at Turfway Park Dec. 27. He started 2003 with a victory in the Ides Of March S. at Hawthorne and made it four in a row in an optional claimer at the Chicago oval Apr. 5. A 7-1 chance after the step up into the graded-stakes ranks, he pushed 2-1 chalk Keats (Hennessy) along through six furlongs in 1:12.52, put that one away in the stretch and held on with determination to the wire. Owner Frank Calabrese bought the winner just days before the Ides Of March S. "When the opportunity came up to be able to buy him, we jumped on it," trainer Wayne Catalano said. "We paid \$60,000 for him on Mar. 12. He vetted out well and physically he looked good." Fight for Ally has now won \$196,080 for his new connections. He is scheduled to get a little vacation.

Perfections May Dodge Guineas

Six Perfections (Fr) (Celtic Swing {GB}) may miss the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 4 if the equine influenza outbreak has not relented by next Saturday, it was revealed yesterday. After connections of Intercontinental (GB) had decided to swerve this week's Craven meeting due to the risk of the virus, conditioner Pascal Bary expressed concern for Six Perfections. "If I thought there was a possibility of bringing the equine flu to France, I would hesitate to send Six Perfections to Newmarket," he told the *Racing Post*. "We will make a decision at the end of next week." Six Perfections is currently quoted as the 11-4 favourite for the mile Classic after her impressive score in the Listed Prix Imprudence at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 7.

Dunlop Stable Update

John Dunlop yesterday reported that Tuesday's G3 Nell Gwyn S. winner **Khulood** (Storm Cat) "looks fantastic" after her impressive score. Having made all in the seven-furlong contest, the half sister to Elnadim will bid to become the first winner of that trial to win the G1 1000 Guineas (at Newmarket May 4) since Oh So Sharp (GB) in 1985. "She looks fantastic and has really taken it all in her stride," the Arundel conditioner said. He also had news of Saturday's G3 Greenham S. winner **Muqbil** (Swain {Ire}). "He's come out of the race well, but he's not a great big heavy horse and he lost weight. He was light enough before the Greenham, but he hasn't put much back on and is a bit hungry looking." Gerard Butler revealed that **Elusive City** (Elusive Quality), who was fifth in the Greenham as the 11-4 favourite, would revert to sprinting, with the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene (at Chantilly June 1) the next target. "We had a bit of a kick when he got beat, but he's very well and we will come up with another game plan with him." he commented.

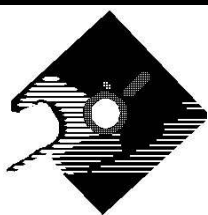
