SUNDAY SILENCE COLT SETS INGLIS RECORD

The Australian bloodstock industry celebrated Wednesday night as visionary breeder John Messara's Arrowfield Stud created history with Japanese owner-breeder Shigeyuki Okada of Big Red Farm giving an Easter record A\$1.7 million for a commanding Sunday Silence--Phantom Creek (GB) (Mr. Prospector) colt during the middle session of the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale. Bidding on the colt, lot **268**, began at A\$500,000, with as many as five parties involved, including agent Rob McAnulty who

stopped at A\$1.5 million, as Okada and his team stood in a prominent position on the edge of the ring and bid boldly. The colt is a result of Messara's four-year Sunday Silence project, in which he sent several mares each year to be covered by the late champion stallion on Southern Hemisphere time. The Sept. 26 foal will depart for Japan as soon as possible as a potential stallion prospect. "I am not surprised he fetched that price," Messara said. "We thought he would fetch between \$1.5 million to \$2 million and he would have sold for significantly more in any international market. In a way it is sad for Australian racing that he is not going to race in Australia. I would have loved for him to stay here and I would have loved to have kept some interest in him, so I do have mixed feelings that he is going to Japan," he added. "It is exciting; we took a big risk doing what we did with Sunday Silence, but I felt he was an exceptional stallion and it has created international interest in our horses. But I am sorry to see him leave our shores," he said. Of the record colt, Messara commented, "He is perfect in every way, physically, a great pedigree and temperament, the presence and the class you look for in an elite athlete, and you don't often get the whole combination. He is a very, very special horse, one of the best three colts we've ever bred."

XTRA HEAT ON THE FARM ClassicStar Stables' **Xtra Heat** (Dixieland Heat--Begin, by Hatchet Man) has been sent to owner David Plummer's farm near Versailles, Kentucky, where she will be bred. The five-year-old mare has not been officially retired and could return to racing if she does not get in foal. "She looks great, she feels great and is not injured," ClassicStar Racing Manager John Freston told *The Blood-Horse*. "We're going to attempt to breed her and the success or failure of that could determine her future plans." From humble beginnings, the diminutive bay has gone on to achieve greatness. Sold for just \$4,700 at the 1999 OBS August Yearling sale, she was purchased for \$5,000 by a group headed by trainer John Salzman at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Sale the following May. In four years at the track, Xtra Heat has won no fewer than 25 added-money events. The winner of the GI Prioress S. at three and second in that year's GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, Xtra Heat was named champion filly of her generation. She ran third in the 2002 G2 Golden Shaheen and was entered in the Mar. 29 renewal of the Nad al Sheba race, but was scratched the day before the race after becoming cast in her stall. Consigned to last year's Fasig-Tipton November Sale, she failed to meet her reserve at \$1.7 million, but was acquired for a reported \$1.4 million by ClassicStar shortly thereafter in a private transaction. She leaves the racetrack with a lifetime record of 35-26-5-2 and earnings of \$2,389,635.

TALE OF THE CAT TO COOLMORE AUSTRALIA **Tale of the Cat** (Storm Cat--Yarn, by Mr. Prospector) will join the stallion line-up at Coolmore Australia for the upcoming Southern Hemisphere breeding season. Off to a flying start at stud, the sophomore stallion has already been represented by Group 2 winner **Inamorato** and multiple stakes winners **Catalissa** and **My Trusty Cat**. In the Southern Hemisphere, Tale of the Cat has been represented by New Zealand Group 3 winner **Ubiquitous (NZ)**. "We're absolutely delighted to be able to offer Tale of the Cat's services to Australian mare owners this season," said Coolmore Australia General Manager Michael Kirwan. "He is a superbly bred horse with a top-class race record and is already a very exciting young proven sire, both in Australia and the USA." Tale of the Cat's stud fee, along with the fees for all Coolmore Australia horses, will be set at the conclusion of the Inglis Easter Yearling sale on Thursday.

CHAPARRAL SUFFERS SETBACK High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) faces a spell on the sidelines after suffering a training setback. Last year's dual Derby and Breeders' Cup Turf winner had been due to reappear in either the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. at Newbury May 17 or in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 25 before a possible tilt at the G1 Vodafone Coronation Cup at Epsom June 6, but has reportedly been found to have a bruised shoulder. "High Chaparral has been held up because of a bruised shoulder, so any plans for his first run of the season are on hold," trainer Aidan O'Brien told the *Racing Post* Tuesday. "It seems to be only a slight problem that is niggling him, but we will just have to wait and see how long it takes him to recover." However, the Ballydoyle conditioner provided a more upbeat update yesterday. "He is a bit better this morning and we will just have to see," he told *PA Sport*. "It depends upon how quickly it heals. It could be seven to 10 days or it could be as long as three weeks. He could have his first race at Epsom, but it is too early to be making those kind of decisions." O'Brien also announced that **Hawk Wing** (Woodman) "might wait a bit longer" before making his seasonal return, despite his entry in Sunday's G3 Golan EBF Mooresbridge S. at The Curragh.

Easter Sale OK with Okada

Shigeyuki Okada's spokesman, New Zealand-based Hajime Kaneko, said Okada was "prepared to go a little higher" than the \$1.7 million final bid for the Sunday Silence colt. Kaneko commented, "He is a really impressive colt. Because he is bred to southern hemisphere time he will take a little while, he'll be a junior high school kid racing against senior high kids. He would be worth a lot more in the Northern Hemisphere." Okada has 130 horses racing under his Big Red Farm banner and is a major purchaser, spending US\$3.2 million on another Sunday Silence colt at the Hokkaido foal sale a couple of years ago. Big Red Farm has five stallions and runs the Ruffian Racing Club, which has 5000 members, but Okada will not syndicate the colt. Inglis & Son Managing Director Reg Inglis said credit for Okada's first trip to Easter was due to multi-lingual Inglis marketing manager Melissa O'Gorman, who worked in the Thoroughbred industry in Japan. "She went up there on many occasions and got to know this man and he wasn't coming and she persuaded him to come down," said Inglis. Of the record colt, Inglis said, "I thought he would make between \$1.2 and \$1.3 million, probably \$1.2. I am delighted; I am probably not quite as delighted as John Messara." The colt's second dam is Danseur Fabuleux, who produced champion American two-year-old and Cartier Horse of the Year Arazi, as well as Group 1 winner Noverre.

Other Lots of Interest

Melbourne trainer David Hall gave A\$625,000 for Lot 288, a Danehill--Procrastinate colt, who is a brother to champion South African mare Laiserfaire (Aus). Sydney-based agent James Bester gave A\$500,000 for Lot 280, a Danehill--Prawn Cocktail filly, who is a sister to SW Langoustine (Aus) and to Lizard Island (Aus). The latter is an A\$800,000 Easter saletopper of 1998 when knocked down to Bester on behalf of South African Sabine Plattner, possibly the purchaser of this filly. "It is yet to be decided whether she will remain in Australia. This is a stallion family, of Royal Academy and Storm Cat, the best stallion family in the entire world; she is a Danehill filly and they will soon be in short supply," said Bester. "She was a magnificent filly with plenty of size, scope and strength, she really looked as though she would fly."

By the Numbers

After Tuesday's shaky start to the sale, the market rallied yesterday with an improved clearance rate and cumulative average significantly boosting the mood of vendors who walked away from the first session dispirited by a basic lack of buyers for their yearlings. The average climbed from A\$131,772 for the opening session to A\$147,537 for 67 sold at a gross of A\$9,885,000. The two-session cumulative average was A\$134,366, nearly 14 percent off the pace of a year ago, but optimism remains. Reg Inglis commented, "There is a real buzz about the sale tonight, it's on a roll. Buyers are bidding with a lot of confidence and sellers are meeting the market."

Kim Loves Bucky had been winless since taking last year's GIII Elkhorn S. and, in his six starts since that two-length win, the gelding's best placing was a fourth in the July 21 GII Sunset H. and another in the Sept. 29 GI Turf Classic Invitational. He ended 2002 with a sixth-place effort over this course and trip in the Oct. 6 Sycamore Breeders' Cup S. Lightly regarded in his return, Kim Loves Bucky stalked the pace while racing four wide. He closed gamely down the stretch to overtake Man from Wicklow in the final strides. "It seems to me like he is better with a target, so I just let him lope along," said winning rider Kent Desormeaux. "I knew I could catch the leader, but when we got to the front, I was hoping nobody else was coming." Winning trainer John Glenney added, "I've been worried all spring that he might be a little short, but between Bucky and Kent, they got the job done. He ran huge. When we worked him last week, it gave Kent and I a lot of confidence. Kent rode a great race and Bucky, well, he's his own horse."

Baffert Duo Work In Company

Trainer Bob Baffert's two confirmed Kentucky Derby starters **Kafwain** (Cherokee Run) and **Indian Express** (Indian Charlie) worked six furlongs in company yesterday morning at Churchill Downs in 1:13 1/5 and 1:13 2/5, respectively. "It was a nice work," said Baffert, who was on hand for the move. "They're not known to be very good work horses, so I worked them together. The surface wasn't as glib as it has been, so it was a good work for them." For Kafwain, it was his first breeze since finishing third to Buddy Gil (Eastern Echo) in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 5. The dark bay colt took ill following that race and missed nine days of training. "Kafwain needed a nice stiff hard work and I think we accomplished that," Baffert commented. "He was probably blowing harder than the other horse. He never really tries very hard in the morning. [Exercise rider] Dana [Barnes] said he was bouncing off the track after that work." Indian Express, a Panamanian champion at two, set the pace in the Santa Anita Derby, a scenario the conditioner thinks will repeat itself a week from Saturday. "He's a very talented horse," he said about the Utah-bred colt. "I have a young rider on him in Tyler Baze and he's going to be very nervous and all, so I'm going to tell him to ride him like he did at Santa Anita; just get him out there and take him as far as you can." Baffert added that **Senor Swinger** (El Prado {Ire}) remains possible for the Derby, but is more likely for the GIII Crown Royal American Turf May 2.

Supah Blitz Stays Sharp

Supah Blitz (Mecke), runner-up in the GI Fountain of Youth S. and Aventura S., worked a solid six furlongs at his Calder base yesterday morning in 1:13 and is scheduled to arrive at Churchill by van Friday morning. "He went really good and we are ready to go," said trainer Manny Tortora, who confirmed Tuesday that jockey Rosemary Homeister Jr. will retain the mount in the Derby. She will become the fifth female jockey to ride in the big race. "It's a most awesome feeling. I can't put it into words," the 30-year-old rider told *Thoroughbred Times*. "I just have to focus. I have to stay calm and cool. It's a big race, but I have to treat it like just another race."

Ten Most Wanted Impresses

Ten Most Wanted (Deputy Commander), four-length winner of the GII Illinois Derby Apr. 5, breezed seven-eighths of a mile yesterday morning in 1:25 3/5 with jockey Pat Day in from Lexington for the ride. Trained by Wally Dollase, the colt covered the opening three panels in :37, got the half in :49 and six furlongs in 1:11 4/5. "I caught him galloping out in 1:38 and change," Dollase said. It was a nice work, but the main thing is that Pat Day was very happy." Added the jockey, who won the 1992 Derby aboard Lil E Tee, "He went about his business in professional fashion, finished up nice and well within himself. I got him pulled up about the half-mile pole and he wasn't even blowing." From the first crop of his Grade I-winning sire, Ten Most Wanted is bred to relish the Derby distance and is out of a half sister to MGISW Cutlass Reality, who counts the 10-furlong Hollywood Gold Cup among his 14 victories. "I am pretty sure he will get that last eighth of a mile," his trainer said. "He has plenty of energy. I didn't walk him around the barn; he walked me. It's exciting to have a horse of that kind of quality."

No Surprises At Forfeit Stage

All the major contenders for next Saturday's G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket stood their ground at yesterday's forfeit stage. Aidan O'Brien, who has the likely favorite **Hold That Tiger** (Storm Cat), accounts for seven of the 35 remaining entries. O'Brien expressed himself satisfied with the preparation of Hold That Tiger, who may be aimed at the G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom June 7 afterwards. "He is working well and he is relaxing more, which is important," O'Brien told *PA Sport* yesterday. "He has stamina in his pedigree as well as speed and if he ran a big race in the Guineas it is well possible that [owner] Michael [Tabor] might want to go to Epsom with him. If he keeps relaxing in his races, he has every chance of getting a 1 1/2 miles."

Hills To Miss Guineas Rides

Jockey Richard Hills will miss the rides on Muqbil and Khulood in the Newmarket Classics as well as the May meetings at Chester, York and Goodwood after picking up a 21-day suspension at Newcastle on Tuesday. Hills was judged to have failed to ride out to the line on his mount, who eventually dead-heated, and is considering an appeal against the decision.

Tout Seul, Zafeen To Get Their Chance

Conditioner Fulke Johnson Houghton issued an upbeat bulletin regarding last year's G1 Dewhurst S. winner **Tout Seul (Ire)** (Ali-Royal {Ire}). "Tout Seul is just coming on nicely and we're very pleased with him," he told *PA Sport* yesterday. "We'll be doing a bit today and we'll be doing a couple of bits of work before the race. He goes on any ground and he's run well on firm ground, but he prefers it softer really." Mick Channon also confirmed that **Zafeen (Fr)** (Zafonic), runner-up to Muqbil in the Greenham S., would take his chance in the mile Classic. "Zafeen is in good form and we've decided to have a crack as I think the race is there for the taking," Channon said.


Six Perfections, Intercontinental on Crash Course

The Pascal Bary-trained **Six Perfections (Fr)** (Celtic Swing {GB}) and Andre Fabre-trained **Intercontinental (GB)** (Danehill) head the 32 remaining fillies in next Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas, with strong domestic representation led by **Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) from the James Fanshawe yard, the Sir Michael Stoute-trained **Russian Rhythm** (Kingmambo) and G3 Nell Gwyn S. winner **Khulood** (Storm Cat), from the Arundel stable of John Dunlop. Godolphin have left in four fillies, while Aidan O'Brien's team of four is topped by **Yesterday (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). One notable withdrawal at yesterday's stage was the Barry Hills-trained **Geminiani (Ire)** (King of Kings {Ire}), not seen since winning the G3 Prestige S. in August. Hills told the *Racing Post*, "She has grown since and she hasn't quite come to herself. I'll give her the time she needs."

Godolphin at the Ready

Trainer Saeed bin Suroor was in ebullient mood yesterday as he continued the preparation of main Guineas hopes **Lateen Sails (GB)** (Elmaamul) and **Mezzo Soprano** (Darshaan {GB}). Both will figure among the team being shipped to Newmarket on Monday by the Dubai-based operation. Lateen Sails, who took the private trial for the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 3, and UAE 1000 Guineas winner Mezzo Soprano, who heads to the G1 Sagitta 1,000 Guineas a day later, pleased the conditioner in their final workouts in Dubai yesterday. "They worked nicely over seven furlongs," he said. "They needed this work today and will now be ready for the Guineas. We have not yet made the final decision about the runners in the Guineas, with five still in the 2000 Guineas and four in the 1000 Guineas. The horses are sound, healthy and in good condition."

LARRUPIN' FILLY LEADS OBS SESSION She worked a bullet quarter mile in :21 during the Apr. 17 under-tack show and that fast breeze paid dividends yesterday as the filly by Larrupin' led the proceedings on the second day of trade at the OBS Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. Cataloged as hip [467](#), the bay was purchased for a session-topping \$175,000 by prominent owner Peter Karches from the consignment of Halcyon Hammock Farm, agent. The Maryland-bred filly is out of the multiple stakes-placed Irish and Foxy (Irish Open), herself a produce of Fat and Foxy, a two-time stakes winner on the Maryland circuit. A colt by leading Florida stallion Montbrook was next popular on the afternoon. Consigned by Ocala Stud Farms, which stands the son of Buckaroo, hip [614](#) was sold to the Our Sugar Bear Stable for \$125,000. Overall, 170 head were sold for gross receipts in excess of \$3 million. The session average of \$18,838 represented a near 13-percent decline from the corresponding session last year, though the cumulative average through the opening two sessions is off by just over three percent. The sale continues this morning at 10:30 a.m.
