NICE RALLY ON INGLIS' FINAL DAY

After a bullish middle session Wednesday night, the Inglis Australian Easter Sale rallied in the third and final session to conclude on a solid note with 379 horses averaging A\$145,430 for an aggregate of A\$55,118,000. A total of 119 horses were passed in over three days with Southeast Asian purchasers conspicuously absent. But Thursday's session sparkled when the average climbed to A\$160,092 with 163 sold for a session gross of A\$26,095,000. "Vendors adopted a more flexible attitude and buyers who had previously been holding back suddenly realized that time was running out," said Inglis' Managing Director Reg Inglis. "These factors, combined with an outstanding lot of horses led to a resounding comeback on the final day." Not surprisingly, Sunday Silence and Danehill were between them responsible for 12 of the 13 horses sold for better than A\$500,000 over the course of the three-day sale.

Day Three Gains Early Momentum

The sale picked up pace mid-morning when Mike Shannon gave A\$1 million on behalf of Hong Kong trainer Ivan Allan for lot 329, a Danehill--Savana City (Aus) (New Regent) brother to MSW Rose O'War and

half-brother to champion Hong Kong sprinter Mr. Vitality (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}), who was prepared by Allan. "Ivan inspected him earlier and really liked him; he was here until Tuesday, and he just loved him," said John Jeffs of Tyreel Stud, which consigned the colt to the sale.

"In this market, we didn't know what he would bring. We were hopeful of a A\$500,000, but he was a quality colt and everybody loved him, and we went in to the sale cautiously optimistic. He would have fetched a million on his ear last year, but this is a different market. He has a wonderful stallion's pedigree," Jeffs added.

Second Seven-Figure Horse For Silence

Soon afterwards, English agent Grant Pritchard Gordon gave A\$1.3 million for lot 335 on behalf of an undisclosed Northern Hemisphere owner/breeder. The leggy Sunday Silence--Sensation (GB) filly is a

half-brother to G3 Cumberland Lodge S. winner Systematic (GB) (Rainbow Quest). "The purchase is for a person who races and breeds extensively in the Northern Hemisphere, and he really appreciates this family, and this will be the first horse he has raced in Australia," said Pritchard Gordon. "The blood is totally international, it is a fabulous family, a sweet filly with a wonderfully strong pedigree. She is by the greatest stallion out of Japan, and she has a half-brother to a horse in England who could go on to be really good. I am delighted to get her for this price. Two years ago, Godolphin paid US\$5.5 million for a close relation; it is a family in big demand in the world."

Consignors' Comeback**

While the sale was down on last year's final figures, many vendors who were devastated in the wake of Tuesday's lacklustre first session were pleased with their results last night. Hong Kong purchasers will return to Easter with renewed enthusiasm in 2004, according to Hong Kong based agent Apollo Ng, who was among a sprinkling of Hong Kong-based purchasers active at the three-day sale. Ng bought a lot 90, a Danzero (Aus) colt offered by Willow Park, for \$75,000; lot 110, a Last Tycoon (Ire) colt from Newhaven Park; and lot 483, a Zabeel (NZ) for A\$210,000, from Cambridge Stud. "It is a good time of year for people in Hong Kong to come here and relax, and this year we have seen horses sold at realistic prices," Ng commented. "Usually Hong Kong trainers and owners are all here and they are competing against each other, but this year the only trainers present were Ivan Allan, Tony Millard and David Hayes. The market really suffered, and agents who rely on Hong Kong owners also suffered. But the brighter side is that is a buyers' market; I paid less than I thought I would." Three Sunday Silence youngsters that sold at Easter for an aggregate A\$3,350,000 ensured he took top honors again from Danehill, who had 38 go under the hammer for an aggregate of A\$13,015,000, or an average of A\$342,500. Red Ransom was among star performers with 27 sold for an aggregate A\$3,490,000, or an average of A\$151,739.

Ten Cents A Shine In The Mix?

Most would look the apparent dismal performance turned in by **Ten Cents A Shine** (Devil His Due) in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. and bet their last dollar that he would not make the gate for the Kentucky Derby. Then again, not everyone is as optimistic as trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who seems to be leaning towards starting the Ohio-bred colt in the Run for the Roses. The conditioner thinks the colt was bothered by a sore tooth during his eighth-place finish in the Blue Grass and, with the problem now resolved, is considering running the dark bay colt in the race. "I've made a lot of changes and they were all positive," Lukas said of the colt, who worked a bullet five furlongs in :58 4/5 last Saturday, just a week after the Blue Grass debacle. "I really feel like I might have been too soft on him. He has some quirks--he's got an attitude. I was trying to help him work himself through it, but the more I fooled with him I thought that maybe I'd better have some 'tough love' here and I went after him. Boy, did it make a change and he is responding."

Outta Here Works on West Coast

With assistant trainer Pat Seeley aboard, **Outta Here** (Dehere) worked a solid five-eighths of a mile in :59 4/5 yesterday morning just before the renovation break at Hollywood Park. "I told Pat to shade a minute and he went 59 and 4 and he was never touched," said trainer Bill Currin. "I was very pleased with the work and that was the last major thing we had to do. Now we are ready to ship Sunday." The winner of the \$500,000 Delta Jackpot S. last December, the chestnut colt has started just once this season, finishing a respectable fourth in the G2 UAE Derby Mar. 29. Jockey Kent Desormeaux has the call in the Derby.

Evolving Tactics Out

Moyglare Stud homebred **Evolving Tactics** (Ire) (Machiavellian) has been removed from Kentucky Derby consideration. The bay colt, who broke his maiden at Cork Apr. 21, will reportedly ship to the United States, but will pass on the Derby. "Everyone jumped the gun on that simply because I was looking for space on the place," trainer Dermot Weld told *Thoroughbred Times*. "I think this year's field is pretty weak, so we considered it, but he would still need preparation." Weld won the 1990 Belmont S. with Go and Go (Ire). (cont. p4)

The winner of her first two starts in her native country in 2001, Lilac Queen fell a neck short in that year's G1 Preis der Diana June 3 before being acquired privately by owner Gary Tanaka. She took her U.S. bow in Santa Anita allowance company by an easy two lengths Jan. 24, 2002, but went missing after that event and returned to register a 5 3/4-length score over course and distance Apr. 6. Unhurried beneath jockey Jerry Bailey for most of the first circuit, the dark bay mare was asked to take closer order turning up the backstretch for the final time, circled five wide into the stretch and kicked clear under moderate hand encouragement. "She acclimated well," said winning trainer Bobby Frankel. "She looks like she could be one of the top fillies going long. [Jockey] Jerry [Bailey] let her win so big, they are gonna start putting weight on her."

Bailey Takes Over on Tak

Trainer Steve Asmussen has named jockey Jerry Bailey to replace Donnie Meche aboard Heiligbrodt Racing Stable's **Lady Tak** (Mutakddim) in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 2. Meche is currently the subject of an investigation in Louisiana, which could preclude him from riding the chestnut filly. The winner of the GII Fair Grounds Oaks and second to **Elloluv** (Gilded Time) in the GI Ashland S. Apr. 5, Lady Tak visited the starting gate yesterday before galloping a mile. In other Oaks news, trainer Bob Baffert confirmed that Gary Stevens will ride Bob and Beverly Lewis' **Santa Catarina** (Unbridled) in the race.

Weld Refuses to Budge

Conditioner Dermot Weld continues to keep his cards close to his chest over the participation of **Refuse To Bend (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) in next Saturday's G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. Last year's G1 National S. winner made a successful reappearance under a seven-pound penalty in the Listed Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trail S. Apr. 13, after which Weld suggested the G2 Derrinstown Derby Trial at Leopardstown May 11 was a more likely option. He confirmed to *Irish Racing online* yesterday that a decision would be made nearer the Classic. "He is in great form and the race the last day seems to have helped him, but we are not even close to a decision," he said. "There's no hurry and we probably won't decide until a few days before the Guineas. It will depend on several factors, including the make up of the race and the ground." Meanwhile, **Six Perfections (Fr)** (Celtic Swing {GB}) was confirmed a definite runner in the fillies' version the following afternoon by conditioner Pascal Bary. After overseeing an impressive gallop on Les Reservoirs on Wednesday morning, Bary told the *Racing Post*, "During the last 50 metres, she took four lengths off the others. I am happy, and that was her last serious work before the 1000 Guineas. Six Perfections will stay the Newmarket mile. It would be better for her if the going didn't turn out to be too firm."

Hills to Appeal

Jockey Richard Hills will appeal against a 21-day ban which means that he would miss next weekend's Sagitta Guineas festival. The suspension, meted out by the Newcastle stewards for failing to ride out to the line on a dead-heating winner, means that he would not partner **Muqbil** (Swain {Ire}) in the G1 2000 Guineas on Saturday and **Khulood** (Storm Cat) in the G1 1000 Guineas the following afternoon. His appeal will be heard on Tuesday at the Jockey Club headquarters at Portman Square.

BROODMARE TOUSSAUD HONORED Juddmonte Farms's blue hen mare **Toussaud** (El Gran Senor--Image of Reality, by In Reality) was named 2002 Broodmare of the Year by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association Wednesday. The 14-year-old mare, a Grade I winner on the track, is the dam of Grade I winners Chester House, Honest Lady and Chiselling, as well as Kentucky Derby favorite Empire Maker. She has also been represented by Grade II winner Decarchy. Juddmonte Farms was also honored with the TOBA Award. Among the other KTOB honorees are: juvenile filly **Storm Flag Flying** (Storm Cat), juvenile colt **Vindication** (Seattle Slew), three-year-old filly **Farda Amiga** (Broad Brush) and three-year-old colt **War Emblem** (Our Emblem). In the handicap divisions, KTOB named **Azeri** (Jade Hunter) the top mare and **Left Bank** (French Deputy) the top horse. **Astra** (Theatrical {Ire}) was named top turf mare and **Good Journey** (Nureyev) was top male turf horse. **Orientate** (Mt. Livermore) was top sprinter and **Nayef** (Gulch) was top foreign runner. The late Allen Paulson, founder of Brookside Farms, was the recipient of the P.A.B. Widener Trophy, while Alice Chandler, who operates Mill Ridge Farm, earned the William C. Coman Humanitarian Award. The Charles Englehard Award was given to the TVG Network. Charles Nuckols, Jr, co-breeder of Kentucky Derby winner War Emblem, and Virginia Kraft Payson, breeder of 2002 champions Vindication and Farda Amiga, received the Hardboot Breeders Award. Storm Cat was the leading sire in the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund, while **Pure Prize** (Storm Cat) was leading KTDF earner. Bernard Flint was the top trainer and Overbrook Farm was top breeder and owner.

The dark bay filly was purchased for \$105,000 by Jaime Carrion from the consignment of Terry Oliver, agent. Through three days, OBS has sold 528 two-year-olds for \$11,068,200. 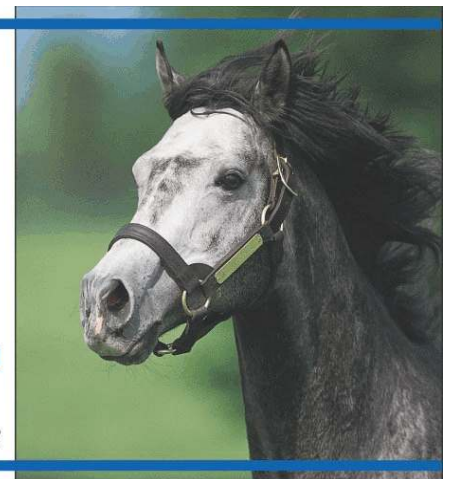
