DEEP DOZEN FOR THE OAKS

Today's 129th renewal of the GI Kentucky Oaks has drawn some of the best three-year-old fillies in training. California-based **Elloluv** (Gilded Time) suffered two losses to Composure over the winter at Santa Anita, but stepped out of that filly's shadow in wiring her foes in the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland Apr. 5. Finishing her behind her that day were the previously unbeaten **Lady Tak** (Mutakddim) and **Holiday Lady** (Deputy Commander). Having drawn the rail, the speedy



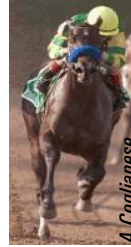

bay has her work cut out for her here, and she will likely have plenty of company from the start. The theme song for **My Boston Gal** (Boston Harbor) just might be My Old Kentucky

Home. The bay is unbeaten in two starts under the Twin Spires, winning the GII Golden Rod S. over 8 1/2 panels Nov. 30. She kicked off 2003 with a pair of losses at Gulfstream, but looked very sharp in winning the GII Beaumont S. down the road at Keeneland Apr. 10. She will be partnered by leading Churchill rider Pat Day. "It will be a jockeys' race," said trainer Carl Nafzger. "There is too much tactical speed and there is not really a closer in here. You let a speed horse get out there easy and you are not going to catch her." Also unbeaten in two starts at Churchill is Lady Tak, who kicked off her career impressively here late last fall. The chestnut added three stakes victories at Fair Grounds over the winter, including the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 8, but couldn't quite catch a loose-on-the-lead Elloluv in the Ashland.

20 TO LINE UP IN 2000 GUINEAS

After a 20-strong field was entered yesterday for Saturday's Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, connections of likely favorite **Hold That Tiger** (Storm Cat) and those of a bevy of other main contenders could take comfort in the fact that seven of the last nine winners on the Rowley Mile--the contest took place on the July Course in 1999--have been drawn in double figures. Departing from the 16 hole, Hold That Tiger is next door to **Tout Seul (Ire)** (Ali-Royal {Ire}) in post position number 17, while **Refuse to Bend (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) and **Lateen Sails (GB)** (Elmaamul) will break from 18 and 20, respectively. Godolphin's Simon Crisford is hopeful that the latter, who took a private trial at Nad al Sheba last month, can get the Dubai-based operation off the mark in the European Classics. "Sheikh Mohammed is quite sweet on our chances and Lateen Sails has got great acceleration at the end of his races," Crisford said. "Obviously on all the evidence he does need to improve a bit, but we are hopeful of a really strong run from him." While officials at Newmarket have taken measures in limiting the safety factor to avoid the heavy draw bias towards the high numbers last year, it is likely the field will split into groups again, with connections of **Indian Haven (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) and **Tomahawk** (Seattle Slew) hoping that post positions one and two are not the kiss of death. Michael Kinane will partner Hold That Tiger in the Classic, leaving Johnny Murtagh to pick up the enviable spare of Tomahawk. Last year Murtagh stepped in to take the ride on supposed Aidan O'Brien second string Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), but had the last laugh as the "Rock" beat stable companion Hawk Wing by a neck.

Final Move for Outta Here

Outta Here (Dehere), fourth last time in the G2 UAE Derby at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29, was given a final tightener Thursday for Saturday's Kentucky Derby. In the only serious Derby work yesterday morning, the colt blew out a quarter-mile in :24.60 with jockey Kent Desormeaux aboard.

Day Takes Off Thursday's Mounts

Jockey Pat Day remained on the sidelines Thursday as he continues to recover from nagging lower back pain. The Hall of Fame rider, who went down with Quick Draw in an allowance event last Sunday at Churchill, reportedly wrenched his back recently while doing yard work at his home. According to Day's agent Doc Danner, "His back stiffened up this morning from walking around the back stretch and he went for more therapy." Day has been undergoing contrast therapy, consisting of alternating hot and cold treatments, since Tuesday. The 49-year-old, who stated that he would not ride this weekend if he is not 100 percent, is slated to ride My Boston Gal in today's Oaks and Ten Most Wanted in tomorrow's Derby.

Empire Maker Back on Track at Churchill

Morning-line Kentucky Derby favorite **Empire Maker** (Unbridled) was given the green light for Saturday's classic by Bobby Frankel Thursday morning after the Hall of Fame trainer decided that the bay was ready for a jog over the Churchill oval. "Dr. Reed had a look at the foot this morning and he said it looked fine," Frankel stated. "I checked him myself and made the decision to put him on the track. I thought it would be better for him." On the advice of Dr. Ken Reed, Empire Maker was walked around the shedrow Wednesday after a bruise on his right front foot was discovered following a gallop Tuesday morning. According to Frankel, the Juddmonte-owned colt will gallop today and tomorrow.

Third in last year's G1 Kentucky Oaks, **Take Charge Lady** gave a big scare to Azeri in the G1 Apple Blossom H. Apr. 5, losing by just a head to the reigning Horse of the Year while making her first start in four months. A victory here would take her earnings over the \$2-million mark. **You** will hope to kick off a big weekend for trainer Bobby Frankel and jockey Jerry Bailey. Winner of four Grade I races in 2002, the dark bay hasn't raced since finishing second in the G1 Santa Maria H. Feb. 16.

Millenary bids to win this for the second time, having prevailed under a penalty in 2001, but may struggle under an extra burden against progressive rivals. He was unpenalised when finding only Godolphin's subsequent Arc winner Marienbard (Ire) a neck too strong 12 months ago and that winner's connections are represented again with **Highest** this year. Purchased by the Dubai-based operation after finishing runner-up to Bollin Eric (GB) in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster in September, he took well to Nad al Sheba, winning the G3 Dubai City of Gold Mar. 8 before finishing seventh in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic Mar. 29. He is the type with which the boys in blue excel and Saeed bin Suroor was sweet on him prior to his last start. **Bandari** trailed **Highest** by two lengths when third in the St Leger on his final start of 2002, but is arguably better over this trip, as he proved when beating that colt by a head in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York in August. He will need to be at his sharpest to hold that rival on three-pound worse terms here and that also applies to **Balakheri**, who was impressive when winning the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot last June.

Dandoun finally gained a well-deserved group success by getting the better of Domedriver in a thrilling finish to this contest. Unraced at two, Dandoun quickly made up into a smart performer in 2001, beating Aldebaran in the Listed Heron S. at Kempton before disappointing when unplaced in the G1 St James' Palace S. at Royal Ascot and G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville. He returned to take the Listed Doncaster Mile last term, but training setbacks meant he did not add to that score until taking the same race Mar. 20. Always perfectly placed by Olivier Peslier in this contest, he shadowed the early leader before taking command with a quarter mile remaining. Domedriver, who had been lurking in rear travelling easily under Thierry Thulliez, was delivered wide in the straight and quickened to within a neck with 100 yards remaining. He could not close the gap under a considerate ride as Dandoun gained the upper hand in the drive to the line.

"Domedriver is a very very good horse," winning conditioner John Dunlop commented. "We perhaps had an advantage today because we had had a race, but we also had a very very good jockey. The G1 Prix d'Ispahan [at Longchamp May 18] is a possibility." Connections of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Domedriver were far from despondent. "When the horse moved on halfway down the straight, I thought he had the race won, but the winner found more," conditioner Pascal Bary commented. "Probably the fact that the winner had had a run and the pull at the weights made the difference. Everything being well he should go on to the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. [at Newbury May 17]." Now trained by Christophe Clement, Shaanmer will get Lasix for his American bow. This one could be a presence on the U.S. turf scene this year.
