EVERYTHING'S COMING UP ROSES

What horseman wouldn't want to be Bobby Frankel right now? Currently the season's top money-winning trainer by a margin of more than \$1.5 million, Frankel will saddle two of the favorites in the 129th running of the GI Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs this afternoon. **Empire Maker** (Unbridled), the morning-line choice at 6-5, will have to overcome a bruised foot and an outside post, but looked more than capable after a resounding 9 3/4-length win

in the GI Florida Derby. The dark bay was never asked for his best in his final Derby prep, the Apr. 12 GI Wood Memorial, but won comfortably, if a shade cozily, beating **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) by a half length. In the process, he earned a 111 Beyer, the best of his career and tops in the Derby field. "I believe the script is already written," Frankel said. "I think he's meant to win." He added, "The foot is not an issue. In fact, I might run him in a full shoe. I'll look at it in the morning and decide." The colt caused a bit of a stir yesterday morning, making for the gap as he galloped around the main track. "He pulled one of his acts," his Hall of Fame conditioner said. "But it's not a big deal, believe me. The whole family does it. Bet against him at your own risk." Empire Maker will be joined in the gate by **Peace Rules** (Jules).

The chestnut seemed to be making his career on the grass after taking the GIII Generous S. and the Hill Rise S. on the West Coast at two, but he has been perfect since switching to the dirt for his sophomore campaign, winning the GII Louisiana Derby and the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. "Don't forget about this horse," Frankel said. "If he's in front turning for home, they'll pay hell getting by him." **Sir Cherokee scratched from Derby, p9**

Who could rain on Frankel's Derby Day parade? Even if Empire Maker and Peace Rules are on top of their games, **Ten Most Wanted** (Deputy Commander) could have a say in the outcome. The eye-catching colt was the buzz of the backstretch as he trained toward the "Run for the Roses," and he caught a lot of attention with his four-length win in the GII Illinois Derby, an effort that earned him a 110 Beyer. "All's well," trainer Wally Dollase said. "It is all falling into place. Everything since we've been here [in Louisville] has been good. We just need to keep it going." But it could be up to the field's biggest bargain, \$4,500 FTKOCT yearling **Indian Express** (Indian Charlie), or its most expensive, \$900,000 FTFEB juvenile **Atswhatimtalknabout** (A.P. Indy). Indian Express made his two-turn debut in the GI Santa Anita Derby and just missed, finishing a head behind dead game **Buddy Gil** (Eastern Echo). Atswhatimtalknabout disappointed in that race, running fourth at 3-2, but was only a nose behind Buddy Gil in the GII San Felipe S. in March. **The Thorograph 'Race of the Week' is the GI Kentucky Derby. KENTUCKY OAKS IS FOR THE BIRDS

Bird Town (Cape Town) was let go at 18-1 in the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs yesterday afternoon and stumbled badly at the break, but flashed past the leaders in the stretch and pulled away to post the 3 1/4-length upset over **Santa Catarina** (Unbridled). "To me, this is the same feeling as winning the Derby," trainer Nick Zito told *Thoroughbred Times*. Zito captured the 1991 Kentucky Derby with Strike the Gold and took the 1994 edition with Go for Gin, but earned his first Oaks score yesterday. Added winning owner Marylou Whitney, "This is a homebred and Nick knows I love my homebreds. I just love her." **More on the Kentucky Oaks, p5**

O'BRIEN HOPES TO HOLD THAT TITLE

Trainer Aidan O'Brien, who saddled the one-two last year, will deserve high praise if **Hold That Tiger** (Storm Cat) or **Tomahawk** (Seattle Slew) provide him with a third G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket this afternoon. Both colts already have more miles on the clock

than a customary Guineas winner after making the trans-Atlantic trip to contest the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Arlington in October. While Tomahawk reportedly failed to stay and finished eighth, the enigmatic Hold That Tiger delivered a startling run to grind out third place, closing from an im-

possible position in rear. That performance suggests he is an outstanding colt, an impression first hinted at by his dramatic last-to-first sprint in the G1 Grand Criterium at Longchamp three weeks before the Breeders' Cup. But he makes his seasonal debut here and, if he slouches in the gate here as he did on those last two occasions, he may not be competitive, as his blazing acceleration may be blunted by recent heavy rain. Tomahawk was racing at the top level for the third time within a month at Arlington, having finished runner-up behind Oasis Dream (GB) in the G1 Middle Park S. and second to **Tout Seul (Ire)** (Ali-Royal {Ire}) in the G1 Dewhurst S. at this track. Despite two promising efforts this term, an easy score on his return in the Listed Loughbrown S. at The Curragh Mar. 23 and a luckless fourth in the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau at Longchamp Apr. 20, the jury is still out as to whether he will leave his mark in this Classic.

Bend and Stretch

Dermot Weld has long argued that **Refuse to Bend (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) will show his best over further than this Rowley Mile. Nevertheless, the unbeaten colt showed early dash as well as staying power to see off speedier-bred types when winning the G1 National S. at The Curragh in September. Last time out, the Irish-bred and trained three-year-old captured the Apr. 13 Listed Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial under a seven-pound penalty, prompting Weld to say he was more that of a Derby horse, but Refuse to Bend had the race won before the furlong marker. His sire has already produced 2000 Guineas winners **Entrepreneur (GB)** and **King of Kings (Ire)**. **Lateen Sails (GB)** (Elmaamul) was not introduced by Henry Cecil until October, when he quickened impressively to beat Powerscourt (GB) in a course and distance maiden. Purchased by Godolphin at the end of the season, he took the private trial at Nad al Sheba early last month, although in a time slower than the fillies' equivalent. He has a similar profile to the operation's past winners **Mark of Esteem (Ire)** and **Island Sands (Ire)**, but lack of race experience is against him. **2000 Guineas field, p4**

On the board in all seven prior starts, Bird Town had broken her maiden by 6 3/4 lengths over the Churchill main track last November. She picked up checks in her next three starts, then cruised to a 12 1/2-length tally in the Feb. 23 Charon S. at Gulfstream Park. Freshened after that impressive effort, the bay came back in the Apr. 10 GII Stonerside Beaumont S. at Keeneland and, after taking the lead in the stretch, succumbed to My Boston Gal (Boston Harbor) late and had to settle for second. Overlooked vs. Classic company as My Boston Gal went off a well-backed 5-1, she stumbled at the start, then settled off the pace as 5-2 Elloluv (Gilded Time) took them along through fractions of :46.08 and 1:10.15. Bird Town kicked it into gear with three furlongs to race, split horses as they sped past the quarter pole and finished with good energy to win going away. "She showed tremendous determination and a great will to win when she rallied," jockey Edgar Prado told *Thoroughbred Times*. Slight favorite Lady Tak (Mutakddim) was bumped around as they negotiated the first turn. The chestnut sat just off the leaders down the backstretch, put in her run to join the leaders while between horses in the stretch, then was jostled again and dropped back to be sixth. "She got banged around pretty good," jockey Jerry Bailey said. "For a little filly, that's pretty hard to take. It really takes a lot out of a horse." Winless since taking the GI Test S. at Saratoga last July, You was on the board in the GI Alabama S., GI Ruffian H. and GI Overbrook Spinster S., but skipped the Breeders' Cup in favor of a vacation. The dark bay tired to be fifth in her return, the Dec. 28 GI La Brea S., then took another short break before finishing second in the Feb. 16 GI Santa Maria H. last time out. The odds-on favorite to get back on track after Take Charge Lady (Dehere) was scratched from this race because of a bruised foot, You broke on top, exchanged the lead with longshot Fly Borboleta as they raced through six furlongs in 1:10.03, then put that one away and opened it up en route to an easy score. "[Larry Melancon, aboard Flying Borboleta] pushed me pretty hard, but I'd have done the same thing if I'd been him. He had to see how far he could go--guess he caved first," winning jockey Jerry Bailey said. "Let's cut to the chase," trainer Bobby Frankel remarked. "When Take Charge Lady came out, You just outclassed those other fillies. The only way she was going to lose today was to fall down." As for what's next on the agenda for the winner, the Hall of Fame horseman said, "I'm not sure what I'll do with her next--probably take her to New York for a race up that way." He added, "I'll probably keep her running between seven-eighths and a mile and an eighth. I let her have an easy winter and now I've got her for the whole year." There is no substitute for experience, and the established combination of Warrsan, trainer Clive Brittain and jockey Philip Robinson maximised their opportunities to collect this prize. After watching the improving five-year-old score in the G3 John Porter S. at Newbury Apr. 12, the conditioner seized the initiative by declaring Warrsan against rivals making their 2003 European debuts here. Robinson showed the same enterprise by stalking Bandari (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}), who was committed too early in the rain-softened ground, before taking his mount to the middle of the track and past that rival with 2 1/2 furlongs remaining. Maintaining the advantage over the game Millenary up the rising ground, he pulled clear of Highest, who stayed on despite struggling in the going. "I kicked with 3 1/2 [furlongs] to go because I knew the one thing we had was fitness on our side and he is a real galloper," explained Robinson, adding, "and he maybe better over further." Warrsan is a half-brother to Luso (GB) and Needle Gun (Ire), who both improved with age, staying competitive at the highest level until the end of their long careers. He will be campaigned in similar company now, pointing for the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 6 before a possible tilt at the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. July 26. 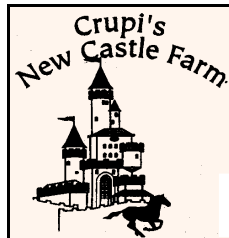

An impressive maiden winner at first asking, the gray colt dead-heated with Derby starter Ten Cents a Shine in a Gulfstream allowance Jan. 31. A respectable 6-1 in the G1 Florida Derby Mar. 15, the colt turned in his worst performance to date, finishing a distant fifth behind Empire Maker, after which he was sold to his current owners. He was most recently relegated to fifth behind the Derby morning-line choice in the G1 Wood Memorial in New York Apr. 12. Appearing with front wraps for the first time, Señor Swinger was reserved in the early going while racing four wide, bided his time on the turn, eased out six wide for the drive and swooped by favored Remind to win going away. "I really didn't feel confident about running him in the Derby," trainer Bob Baffert told *Thoroughbred Times*. "He's bred for the turf. He trains great on the turf." Added jockey Pat Day, "I had worked him on the grass last week and he took to it just fine. He went to the gate a little excited today, but he broke well and galloped easily. At the three-eighths pole...I asked him for his run and he responded very gamely." The grand old man of the grass, **With Anticipation** makes his eight-year-old bow this afternoon. The snow white gelding was quite spritely at seven, running first or second in six of his eight starts and finishing as the runner-up behind High Chaparral (Ire) in both the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and the Eclipse Award voting. The Augustin Stable homebred made his second start of 2002 in this event, finishing second. He could need a tune-up to be at his best, but has been working sharply at Gulfstream Park. "This race is not his primary objective, but I'm not going to treat it with disdain, either," trainer Jonathan Sheppard told *Daily Racing Form*. Last year's G1 Prix Jean Prat winner **Rouvres** started his U.S. career with a Gulfstream Park allowance win Feb. 17. The 13-10 chalk in the Mar. 23 GII Explosive Bid H. at Fair Grounds, the dark bay closed well, but was outfinished by Candid Glen, running second by a neck. **Perfect Drift**, third in the 2002 GI Kentucky Derby, ended the season with a 12th-place effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. He tried turf for the first time in his four-year-old bow and took to the surface like you'd expect from a son of Dynaformer, leading every step to win a Keeneland allowance test going a mile Apr. 11. The added furlong should not pose a problem.

PERFECT GROUND FOR SIX PERFECTIONS

Significant rain at Newmarket has eased the going to good-to-soft ahead of tomorrow's G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas, which should comfort connections of **Six Perfections (Fr)** (Celtic Swing {GB}). Described as "very well" after her mid-week exercise at Chantilly by conditioner Pascal Bary, the juvenile filly highweight of 2002 has drawn post position number one of 21, against the stands' rail. Next door is **Russian Rhythm** (Kingmambo), who was finally given the go-ahead by connections after lengthy scrutiny as to her well-being. "We have always said that the race comes a week to 10 days too early for her," warned Chris Richardson, managing director for owners Cheveley Park Stud. Godolphin will be double-handed in the Classic, sending out **Mezzo Soprano** (Darshaan {GB}), 19, and **Gonfilia (Ger)** (Big Shuffle), drawn in post position 18. Frankie Dettori, who rides the former, expressed concern at the high draw yesterday. "I think the best ground is definitely on the stands' side," he said. "Newmarket is notorious for drying very quickly, but it must dry very quickly because right now the ground is very tiring and soft." Dettori added, "My filly has a mountain to climb on form. Unfortunately, the horses with tremendous acceleration are drawn on the stands' side, so they will have the speed to get out of trouble and kick on. It will be a lot more difficult for me, but she's a lovely big filly with a lot of class and if she runs close I will be delighted." Racing manager Simon Crisford was more upbeat, saying, "She's very fit and well and has travelled nicely. She's a lovely filly with a great temperament, a high cruising speed and acceleration." **Khulood** (Storm Cat) has been able to grab the rail and dominate from the front on her last two successes at this track, including a win in the G3 Nell Gwyn S. Apr. 15. However she will have to overcome an unfavourable draw in post position 14. Still, jockey Willie Supple was undeterred yesterday. "The fillies' race looks a strong race this year, but she's done nothing wrong and has to have a big chance," he said. "She has a nice cruising speed and has the pace to jump out and go."
