### IT'S OFFICIAL: SANTOS CLEARED

Churchill Downs stewards yesterday announced their conclusion that jockey Jose Santos carried nothing other than a whip in his hand during the Kentucky Derby. The decision was unanimous among stewards Bernard Hettel, Jack Middleton and Richard Leigh, who launched an investigation based on a photo published in the May 10 *Miami Herald*. The

Video Technical Services Unit of the Louisville Metro Police Department conducted a forensic study of the photograph, enlarging it to 250 times its original size, as well as examining as other images.

"We have carefully examined dozens of photographs taken from a number of different angles at various points during the race, re-viewed several videotapes, and conducted a thorough interview with Mr. Santos himself," said Hettel. "Based on the information that we have gathered and reviewed, we are confident that Jose Santos carried nothing more than a whip in his right hand." Santos, attorney Karen Murphy and agent Mike Sellito met with the stewards for 90 minutes at Churchill yesterday morning. Asked during a subsequent press conference if the allegations had taken away some of the luster of the victory, Santos said, "Definitely, it spoiled my happiness. I am very happy that the racing community was behind me the whole time. They knew I was innocent and that has been proven. I'm pretty sure the people in racing will understand. But the public is always going to have questions about it. They will know that Jose Santos won the 129th Kentucky Derby, but he was questioned about carrying something in his hands...we'll have to deal with that." Hettel also said that the *Herald's* story's co-author, Frank Carlson, was "selective in his quotation" of steward Leigh, who was quoted as calling the photograph "suspicious." Said Hettel, "What he actually said was, 'it's suspicious, however we need to find additional information, have larger scrutiny and investigate this more fully.' He took parts of everyone's statements to make it fit an article that he wanted to publish."

### RIDGEWOOD PEARL DIES

Sean and Anne Coughlan's world-famous racemare **Ridgewood Pearl (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}--Ben's Pearl {Ire}, by Tap on Wood {Ire}) died last week after suffering complications while foaling. According to the *Racing Post*, the 11-year-old hemorrhaged after producing a dead foal by Bahri, one of the few horses to ever finish in front of her when the pair ran one-two in the 1995 G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Ridgewood Pearl's high-profile international successes include the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas, G1 Coronation S., G1 Prix du Moulin and G1 Breeders' Cup Mile. "She was a marvelous racehorse and the first filly to win a Group 1 in the four major countries," Anne Coughlan told the *Post* on Sunday. "She was the quietest horse in the world before a race. She didn't like fuss, as she knew what she was there to do. After the race, though, you could do what you wanted with her. It's heartbreaking, but we'll never forget the days we had traveling the world with her. She's got a Rainbow Quest yearling colt and a Daylami two-year-old filly with John Oxx called Sacred Pearl--please, God, could she turn out to be good." Oxx also paid tribute, adding, "The best testament is that she still holds the record for the round mile at Ascot. When you think of all the great horses that have run in great races since, it really is a marvelous achievement." Ridgewood Pearl won six of eight starts and earned over \$1 million.

"I am very satisfied with his performance today and I am very hopeful." Marble Chief was coming off a ninth-place finish in the G3 Mainichi Hai in March. Frankie Dettori dropped in to Saint-Cloud on his way to Windsor's evening meeting and that proved a wise move as Sweet Folly captured this trial for the G1 Prix de Diane Hermes (French Oaks) at Chantilly June 8. The filly had been unfortunate to come across the smart Humouresque (GB) in both the Listed Prix Rose de Mai Mar. 20 and the G3 Prix Penelope Apr. 8 over course and distance, finishing the 1 1/2-lengths runner-up on both occasions. Reserved off the steady early pace by Dettori, she was asked to quicken at the top of the straight and responded to edge ahead at the furlong marker. Joined instantly by Baie on the far rail, she looked beaten as that rival quickened to the front, but rallied under strong driving to regain the lead in the shadow of the post. Vallee Enchantee, caught flat-footed when the sprint began, came on in eye-catching style in the closing stages to get up for third.

**Funny Cide Plans to Ship Saturday**

Kentucky Derby hero **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor), who is scheduled to work this morning in New York, will likely wait until Saturday morning to ship to Pimlico for the Preakness. "I have many horses that need attention in New York," said trainer Barclay Tagg. "I've won many races when I shipped the same day. Still, I might decide to come earlier if it seems the best thing to do."

**New York Hero Joins Preakness Cast**

It has been confirmed that GII Lane's End S. hero **New York Hero** (Partner's Hero) will contest the Preakness. for trainer Jennifer Pedersen. The Maryland-bred, fifth in the May 3 GIII Withers in his most recent at Aqueduct, is scheduled to work today at Belmont. "If he comes out [of the workout] okay, we're planning to ship to Pimlico around 7 a.m. Wednesday," said Pedersen.

**Baffert Swings for Fifth Preakness**

Trainer Bob Baffert's **Senor Swinger** (El Prado {Ire}), a confident winner of the GIII Crown Royal American Turf S. over Churchill Downs' lawn May 2, worked five panels Monday in 1:00 2/5 at Santa Anita in preparation for the Preakness. "We know that he loves the turf, but we're also hoping he can deliver a special effort on the dirt," said Baffert. "From what he's telling us now, the trip should be worthwhile." The gray, owned by Bob and Beverly Lewis, is scheduled to fly to Baltimore Wednesday.

**Warrior a 'Go' for Saturday**

Also on yesterday's worktab was Sondra Bender's **Foufa's Warrior** (Jade Hunter), a confirmed starter for Saturday's event. Trained by Lawrence Murray, the lightly raced gelding worked a half-mile bullet in :47 1/5 at Laurel, but won't ship to Pimlico until Saturday. "There's no reason to rush over there," said Murray. "As long as we're not late for the race, we won't have missed a thing." Ramon Dominguez, enjoying his third straight Preakness mount, will ride.

**Everybody's Working for the Weekend**

Churchill Downs' clockers caught trainer Neil Howard's **Midway Road** (Jade Hunter) breeze five-eighths in 1:01 1/5. The colt is expected to arrive at Pimlico Tuesday along with stablemate Mineshaft, who'll likely be one of the favorites for Friday's GI Pimlico Special.

**Buddy Gil on the Mend**

Santa Anita Derby victor **Buddy Gil** (Eastern Echo), who finished sixth behind Funny Cide in the Kentucky Derby May 3, will miss at least two months of training after undergoing surgery last Wednesday to remove a bone fragment from his left ankle, reports the *Daily Racing Form*. According to trainer Jeff Mullins, the surgery was performed in Kentucky by Dr. Larry Bramlage, who commented that the surgery was a "100-percent success." Buddy Gil will remain in Kentucky during his convalescence before a projected return to Mullins barn later this summer. "They [owner Desperado Stables] know he's a good horse and we're doing the right thing with him," Mullins told the *Daily Racing Form*. "He's not a colt and doesn't need to run in the Preakness or Belmont." The gelding, who also scored in the GIII Baldwin S. and the GII San Felipe S. earlier this year, has won five of 10 starts and \$729,455.

**Awesome Humor Returns Wednesday**

Undefeated **Awesome Humor** (Distorted Humor), last year's winner of the GI Spinaway S. and GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga, and the GIII Debutante at Churchill, is set to return to competition tomorrow in Churchill Downs' featured eighth race, a six-furlong allowance/optional claiming event for three-year-olds and up. Sent to the sidelines last summer after bone chips were found in both front ankles, the WinStar-owned filly was a finalist for the Eclipse Award for champion two-year-old filly. Originally slated to run in Thursday's GIII Miss Preakness S. at Pimlico, trainer Elliot Walden elected to keep his prize filly at home instead. "We just wanted to get her to the GI Acorn S. [Belmont Park, June 6] without having to go to a ship," said Walden. "She's doing great and we are looking forward to running her." Installed as the even-money choice in first start in almost a year, the filly has been "working satisfactorily," according to Walden. The chestnut daughter of leading freshman sire Distorted Humor is a winner of all four lifetime starts and \$309,115 in earnings.

**Fracture Sidelines Vintage Tippie**

The Paddy Mullins-trained **Vintage Tippie (Ire)** (Entrepreneur {GB}), runner-up in the Athasi S. at The Curragh Apr. 27, will miss the G1 Entenmann's Irish 1000 Guineas at that track May 25 after being found to have a hairline fracture to a hind leg cannon bone. "The fracture is very small and she will be x-rayed again in a few weeks," Mullins told the *Racing Post*. "It should be only a short-term problem. She's in the Irish Oaks, but it doesn't leave us with a lot of time to get her ready for that race."

**Statue on the Move**

Aidan O'Brien's unbeaten **Statue of Liberty** (Storm Cat), the forgotten horse of the Ballydoyle stable, is ready to return to the track according to his trainer. Not seen since winning the G3 Coventry S. Royal Ascot in June, he is currently on schedule to run in the G1 Entenmann's 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 24. "He was definitely our best two-year-old last season, an unbelievably impressive worker," O'Brien told *PA Sport* yesterday. "He has had muscle problems and then tore a fetlock joint, which was quite a serious injury. He seems fine again now and hopefully we can get him back. It was a big shock when that happened." He may be joined in the mile Classic by G1 2000 Guineas disappointment **Tomahawk** (Seattle Slew) and Sunday's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains runner-up **Catcher in the Rye (Ire)** (Danehill). O'Brien also confirmed that **Yesterday (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) and **L'Ancrese (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}), eight and 15th, respectively, in last Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, will run in the fillies' equivalent of the Irish Classic the following afternoon.

**O'Brien Defends Boru**

Aidan O'Brien yesterday expressed himself satisfied with the performance of **Brian Boru (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) in Sunday's G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown. Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner was attempting to give five pounds to his opponents in Sunday's contest, in which he filled third place. "Trials are there as trials," O'Brien told *PA Sport*. "You can train for the trial, but you sometimes have to sacrifice them if you are looking ahead to the big picture. Brian Boru had to give five pounds to very eligible horses on Sunday in Alamshar and The Great Gatsby. The pace wasn't 100 percent to suit him either. If we were running in the trial and not thinking about the Derby, we'd have popped it to him, he'd have followed the pace and he'd have got into a battle a furlong out. He ate up well in the evening and he seems fine after the race." O'Brien was also unconcerned that **Alberto Giacometti (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), **Balestrini (Ire)** (Danehill) and **The Great Gatsby (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) were beaten in their respective trials. "We are as happy as we can be," O'Brien added. "We haven't won any of the trials, but we haven't panicked. We've accepted it. For whatever reason the horses have just been slow to come to hand. Maybe I was too hard on them in December, when they were still recovering from the virus. It might have taken its toll in February, March, April. But we never panicked and we didn't rush them. But that's why I was pleased with Alberto Giacometti's run [when third in Sunday's G1 Prix Lupin at Longchamp]."

**Gardens Rosy**

Mark Tompkins yesterday confirmed that **Franklins Gardens (GB)** (Halling) will be aimed at the G1 Epsom Derby June 7. Following Saturday's success in the G3 Lingfield Derby Trial, Tompkins reported him to be "fine," adding, "He had just a little exercise this morning and everything's all right, so we're pleased enough with him. He's won at Epsom now and Lingfield and he handled them. He won't mind what the ground is like, it's just whether he's going to be up to winning a Derby."

## PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

When Jean-Luc Lagardere retired his Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Linamix to his Haras du Val Henry at the end of 1990, his desire to give his homebred stallion every possible chance led to his supplementing his flourishing broodmare band with quite a few purchases at the sales.

While it isn't easy to summarise Lagardere's purchasing policy, he didn't seem to demand highly fashionable bloodlines as long as the mare was well-performed and reasonably priced.

For example, he paid only 37,000gns for Cloche d'Or, a mare who had won the G3 Princess Margaret S. as a two-year-old; he paid only \$165,000 for Saganeca, a Sagace mare who had earned the excellent Timeform rating of 120; and he paid only \$110,000 for Slipstream Queen, a stakes-placed daughter of Conquistador Cielo.

Also, for a mere \$50,000, he snapped up Bernique, a stakes-winning daughter of Affirmed; for \$80,000 he acquired Fairlee Wild, a substantial earner by Wild Again; and for 60,000gns he picked up Armarama, a Persian Bold filly who had won the G2 Ribblesdale S.

Some of his other purchases, such as the 105,000gns Fragrant Hill and the \$190,000 Amen,

were far more conventional selections, as they were talented, well-connected daughters of Shirley Heights and Alydar, respectively.

One significant link between these acquisitions stands out: their pedigrees all lack the name of Northern Dancer. Considering how pervasive Northern Dancer's blood has become, you would have to think that this was a deliberate policy, even though Northern Dancer appears no closer than the fourth generation in Linamix's pedigree.

Whatever the rationale behind these purchases, they have proved inspired, with Amen, Fairlee Wild, Fragrant Mix, Saganeca and Slipstream Queen all producing Group-1 winners to Linamix, including the Arc-winning Sagamix and the top-class miler Slickly. For their part, Armarama, Bernique and Cloche d'Or have all produced at least one Group winner to Linamix.

Cloche d'Or's contribution, from only two runners, was Clodora, who improved so much during her only year on the track that she ended up defeating the future American Grade-I winner Squeak to land the G2 Prix de l'Opera on Arc day in 1997. Now Clodora has excelled herself with her second foal, Clodovil, who improved his record to five wins from five starts when he followed in Linamix's footsteps to win the Gainsborough Poule d'Essai des Poulains – a race which provided a notable one-two for Danehill.

Cloche d'Or's purchase has clearly paid tremendous dividends, yet how many leading breeders would have shown much interest in her? Her sire, Good Times, was a classic winner – he took the Italian 2000 Guineas in 1979 – but that was his only Group win during a 24-race career. And, although he lived to 21 years of age, Good Times' only Group winner was Cloche d'Or.

Cloche d'Or's price wasn't helped by the fact that her dam, Chrysicabana, was only a minor winner, or by her second dam, Copocabana, being a slow staying maiden. However, Copocabana's parents were the champion sire Petingo and the smart racemare Argentina, which meant that she was a half-sister to the high-class colts Averof and Falkland, and to the good broodmares River Plate and Flogera.

Argentina was herself a half-sister to Malcolmia, another influential broodmare whose descendants include Bellypha, the grandsire of Linamix. This branch of the family also produced the G1 Yorkshire Oaks winner Catchascatchcan, who sold for \$4,700,000, in foal to Danzig, in 2000. By then Clodora had already visited Danzig's son Danehill to produce Clodovil.

Clodovil's victory over his paternal half-brother Catcher In The Rye provided yet another tribute to Danehill, who also numbers the very talented 1000 Guineas third Intercontinental among his current crop of three-year-olds. This reinforces the impact he made last year by siring the winners of the 2000 Guineas in England, France and Ireland.

Clodovil's emergence as a top-class miler also bodes well for Linamix's broodmare daughters, the eldest of which are now 11 years old. As none of Linamix's first four crops numbered as many as 40 foals, his daughters haven't had a great number of runners so far, but they also include last year's Group-winning juvenile Zinziberine, who was sired by Zieten, another son of Danzig. The Listed winners Massalani and Fairly Ransom are others out of mares by Linamix, who ranks as the broodmare sire of eight of the two-year-olds currently in training with André Fabre. It could be that Clodovil represents just the tip of the iceberg.

Challenging that rival in the straight, he lengthened well under pressure from Fallon to get on top with 100 yards remaining before asserting for a comfortable score.

**WATERHOUSE HEARING DATE SET** Following a preliminary hearing Monday night, Sydney bookmaker Rob Waterhouse had his "show cause" hearing with NSW Thoroughbred Racing Board set down for June 24. Waterhouse, whose suspension for the extravagant odds affair ends Thursday, will operate at Scone racecourse on Friday. He has until June 10 to submit evidence to the NSWTRB showing cause as to why his licence as a bookmaker should not be cancelled or NSWTRB chief executive Merv Hill will not take part in any further hearing in relation to Waterhouse after the bookmaker's counsel argued he had a conflict of interests because of comments he has made publicly about Waterhouse. Counsel for Waterhouse, Paul Brereton, QC, argued that Waterhouse's 27-year history as a bookmaker, which includes his warning off and 17-year exile over the infamous Fine Cotton affair, should not be part of the proceedings.
