HERE WE GO AGAIN

As **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) drew on even terms with front-running **Peace Rules** (Jules) at the five-sixteenths pole of yesterday's GI Preakness S. at Pimlico, announcer Tom Durkin echoed the sentiments of many when he exclaimed, "And the race is on!" In a matter of about five subsequent strides, the race was history, as the Kentucky Derby winner blew past the Bobby Frankel-trainee en route to a 9 3/4-length victory. The winning margin was the second biggest in the 128-year history of the Classic and puts the Thoroughbred world on the brink of a Triple Crown for a remarkable fifth time in the last seven years. "Everyone thought there was going to be a Triple Crown horse this year--nobody

thought it would be Funny Cide," said Sackatoga Stable's Jack Knowlton.

The Beginning of a Dream...

Purchased out of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga New York Preferred Sale for \$22,000, Funny Cide was ultimately sold to trainer Barclay Tagg on behalf of Sackatoga Stable for a reported \$75,000. The chestnut wasted little time in giving his owners an immediate return on their investment, crushing a field of state-bred maidens by 14 3/4 lengths last Sept. 8. He continued his dominance over the New York-bred ranks with a nine-length trouncing of Spite The Devil, among others, in the Bertram F. Bongard S. at Belmont three weeks later, but had to work a bit harder to beat that rival in the Oct. 19 Sleepy Hollow S., his final start of the year. The following afternoon, on the final day of the Belmont fall meet, a colt named Empire Maker broke his maiden and had racing aficionados whispering Triple Crown. The blue-collar hometown hero and the regally bred colt from the powerhouse Bobby Frankel stable would soon have their paths collide.

Everything Comes Up Roses...

A gritty third (ultimately placed second) behind Peace Rules in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 9, Funny Cide met Empire Maker on home turf in the GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct Apr. 12. The latter, coming off his rousing victory in the GI Florida Derby, was the talking horse, the one everyone seemed to have bestowed greatness upon and he did not disappoint that Saturday afternoon. While jockey Jose Santos was all over Funny Cide during the stretch drive of the Wood, jockey Jerry Bailey aboard Empire Maker aimed to have his mount do just enough to win the race while saving something for the Kentucky Derby three weeks later. But Tagg was thoroughly satisfied with Funny Cide's performance and indicated that they would be making the trip to Louisville. Sent off at odds of 12-1 beneath the Twin Spires, a legend was born as the gelding sat a perfect trip from third before tipping out for the drive, overtaking Peace Rules and holding off Empire Maker to become the first horse bred in New York to win the Run For The Roses. The feel-good story of the year had been born. The glass slipper fit. But would Funny Cide's clock strike twelve in the Triple Crown's second jewel?

HAWK WING FLIES HOME AT NEWBURY

Hawk Wing (Woodman), described by Aidan O'Brien as "a horse that would always quicken up your heart," put on a heart-stopping performance yesterday. The four-year-old made all to outclass the best milers in Europe in the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. at Newbury by an incredible record 11 lengths. Despite the persistent rainfall, a headwind and the withdrawal at the start of a guaranteed lead from **Desert Deer (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), his time of 1:36.78 was just over the record. "Some guys are going to have to eat a lot of humble pie," an ebullient jockey Mick Kinane said.

Silencing The Doubters

Despite the colt's rattling late finish when runner-up to Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket in May and his game effort when chasing home High Chaparral (Ire) in the G1 Epsom Derby the following month, Hawk Wing's ability was habitually probed by the press in 2002. He took the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown in July, but finished runner-up to Grandera (Ire) in Leopardstown's G1 Irish Champion S. in September and to **Where or When (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot in September. His reputation was in question by the time he finished seventh trying dirt in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Arlington, but he answered the critics in the finest fashion in this contest. "He's in good shape this year and very sound and well, so I wasn't afraid to go on," Kinane said. After leading the Lockinge field every step of the way, the jockey was on his own at the finish. "The wind was blowing in my face and it was a bit quiet so I was afraid to look around," he said.

Leaving Them Breathless

"He always worked like a good horse," said an almost breathless O'Brien. "He's an amazing horse and he never ran a bad race, but circumstances went against him in the spring and maybe because of that, the little problems may have told on him on his last two runs. I shouldn't have taken him to America...but over the winter I sorted the little things that were bothering him. This year he was working like a dream and the lads who rode him were jumping off the ground. He's an unusual horse--as Mick just said there, he would win a July Cup. He just has an unbelievable amount of natural ability." As for what's next, the trainer said, "He could go to Royal Ascot for either the G1 Prince of Wales's S. [June 18] or G1 Queen Anne S. [June 17]--he has a lot of options." As a measure of this monstrous performance, GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Domedriver (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) was never able to land a blow, finishing 20 lengths adrift with no excuses.

Overcoming Adversity...

Through yesterday's race, post position numbers eight and higher had yielded just three victories from a total of 57 races at the current meet. Connections were last to select their post during Wednesday's draw and Funny Cide was relegated to the nine hole, but good horses overcome adversity. Peace Rules broke alertly and dueled for the lead first time past the stands with **Scrimshaw** (Gulch) as an eager Funny Cide raced in close attendance to that early pace from third. The second flight consisted of local favorite **Cherokee's Boy** (Citidancer) followed by fellow Maryland-bred **New York Hero** (Partner's Hero), Wood Memorial third **Kissin Saint** (Kissin Kris) and **Midway Road** (Jade Hunter). The early trailers were **Foufa's Warrior** (Jade Hunter), **Ten Cents a Shine** (Devil His Due) and **Senor Swinger** (El Prado {Ire}). Peace Rules held the call as the field turned up the backstretch but could feel the presence of the Derby winner who raced three wide outside Scrimshaw approaching the far turn. Midway Road made a smart move into contention leaving the half mile pole and was a close third as the field rounded the far turn. Jockey Jose Santos asked Funny Cide for his best leaving the three-eighths pole, pulled alongside Peace Rules approaching the stretch and it looked like the two would fight it out the rest of the way. But when Edgar Prado in the Edmund Gann red-and-blue got little response from a left-handed whip to the flank of Peace Rules, the final result was clear and Funny Cide sprinted clear as much the best. Midway Road overcame tight quarters down on the fence to earn the place from Scrimshaw, who was a nose ahead of Peace Rules for third. "I thought Jose did a super job of getting him in position without losing any ground," Tagg said. "The nine hole isn't a favored hole you would want, I don't think, in this race, but still it worked out fine today." The winning jockey discussed how the unfavorable draw proved to be a non-issue. "That was a piece of cake," he explained. "The horse sprung better today than ever. On the backside, I just took him into the clear to avoid all the traffic, but there was no traffic. It was an open road for him and nobody could catch him. [Peace Rules] was leading by the three-eighths pole and I knew I was going to go by him." And now the stage is set. A date with destiny on the first Saturday in June and a \$5 million bonus for a sweep of the Triple Crown. Santos, who helped derail Charismatic's Classic sweep aboard Lemon Drop Kid in 1999, thinks it's possible. "I've been riding for 27 years and this is the best horse I've ever ridden in my life. Peace Rules "Will Live To Fight Another Day"....

The remarkably consistent **Peace Rules**, who had a four-race winning streak stopped by Funny Cide in the Derby, had company on the front end for the early portion of the race which may have compromised his chances, according to jockey Edgar Prado. "[Trainer] Bobby [Frankel] said the horse was good enough to do something on the front [end] of the race," he commented. "He broke sharp again today, but that horse inside of me [Scrimshaw] didn't help me going into the first turn. He fought as good as he could, but today just wasn't his day." Added Frankel, "I have nothing to say. What can I say? He just got beat. He out-broke the field and got beat. What else can I say?" The conditioner has indicated that Peace Rules would likely pass the Belmont.

Midway Road Completes Fine Weekend For Farish...

Following Mineshaft's dominating win in Friday's GI Pimlico Special, owner William S. Farish and trainer Neil Howard had to feel that a positive outcome in the Preakness would be icing on the cake. **Midway Road**, the only member of the field without a previous stakes win or stakes placing, did his barn more than proud, launching a sharp mid-race rally before outfinishing Scrimshaw and Peace Rules for a cool \$200,000 pay day. "He ran an awesome race," said jockey Robby Albarado, who also guided Mineshaft to his Friday success. "He got squeezed a little bit in the first part of the race, but he really squared himself away quickly. He's a very athletic little horse. He's still a little immature though. You've got to be careful with him going through those tight spots, but once he got through there, he was a game second." Howard, who saddled Summer Squall to victory in the 1990 Preakness, remained non-committal about a trip to the Belmont.

There had been talk of retiring Bel Esprit, but that plan is likely to be put on hold after this brilliant win. His trainer, John Symons, only decided to run his charge at the last minute, as the track seemed to be drying out after heavy rains during the week. The three-year-old had lost nine straight starts after winning the G3 McNeil S. at Caulfield last August, but led nearly every step as a 12-1 outsider yesterday. What does his future hold? "Eliza Park Stud have taken over his management rights and I'm not sure if he'll go to stud at the end of the season or race on another year," senior co-owner Michael Duff told *Australian Associated Press*. Eliza Park rep John Miller added, "We're in no hurry to retire him to stud and, if he keeps on running like that, he'll race on."

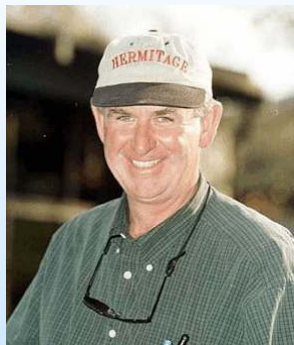

Tragically, Thoroughbred breeding lost a superstar in Danehill earlier this week, but his legacy will live on and on and on. The stallion added yet another Group 1 winner to his legendary resume as Larrocha drove through from the inside before holding off stablemate Jameela for the narrow score here. "Larrocha has been doing everything right, has trained on nicely and has started to act like a stayer in recent runs," trainer Tony McEvoy, celebrating his first Group 1 score, told *Australian Associated Press*. "It's a thrill to finally win a Group 1, but to quinella the race is something special."

A respectable fourth in this event a year ago, Dr. Brendler relished the bog-like conditions, holding off Perfect Soul for a narrow success in the Dixie. Second in the G3 Killavullan S. in his final start at two, the bay got his sophomore season off to a flying start, accounting for Mozart (Ire), among others, in the Listed Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial S., but he was winless in four subsequent European starts and was transferred to the U.S. in late 2001. The Maryland-bred scored back-to-back allowance victories at Gulfstream early the following season, but lost each of his next 10 starts before rediscovering the winner's circle with a 3/4-length success going 12 furlongs over the Keeneland turf Apr. 5. "This is a real good filly," winning jockey Javier Castellano said. "She was a champion in Chile. I've been on her in the mornings and she works really well. I had a lot of horse on the turn and I knew I had the long stretch to make one strong run." Added Jose Cuevas, assistant to trainer Bobby Frankel, "They told us she was better than Lido Palace (Chi), but we didn't believe it. She had to prove it in America first." Favored You, coming off a 7 3/4-length tally in the May 2 GII Louisville Breeders' Cup H., tired in the stretch to be third. "Maybe You came back too quickly," Cuevas said. "She still ran a big race. Despite his stop-start career, connections of **Dandoun** have never relinquished in their faith in his ability. That inherent talent has been in evidence since his belated debut score in the Wood Ditton S. at Newmarket in May 2001. While his sophomore campaign tailed off with disappointing shows in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot and G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano at Deauville in August, his four-year-old season was an even greater anti-climax. If she does so, she will become the first of her sex to win this since Indian Skimmer in 1989. Falbrav, now with Luca Cumani in Newmarket, put up an encouraging performance on soft ground when third behind Fair Mix (Fr) and **Execute** in the G1 Prix Ganay here Apr. 27.
