six-year-old **Millenary (GB)** (Rainbow Quest) faces a stiff task in defying a five-pound penalty for his success in the G2 Princess of Wales's S. at Newmarket last July. He was a shade disappointing thereafter, finishing four lengths back in third behind Yavana's Pace (Ire) in the G1 Credit Suisse Private Banking Pokal at Cologne in August before finishing fifth behind Vinnie Roe (Ire) in the G1 Irish St Leger at The Curragh Sept. 14. He filled the same spot behind

Black Sam Bellamy (Ire) in the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club in Milan in October prior to his runner-up finish, beaten 1 1/2 lengths, to Warrsan (Ire) in the G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket May 2. **Martaline (GB)** (Linamix {Fr}) beat **Loxias (Fr)** (Saumarez {GB}) by a neck, with **Snow Cap (Fr)** (Bering {GB}) back in fourth, in the G3 Prix d'Hedouville at Longchamp Apr. 17 and should confirm that form with those rivals. **Foreign Affairs (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}) benefitted from the step up in trip to finish fourth behind Asian Heights (GB) in the G3 September S. at Kempton in September. He found two miles beyond him when sixth in the G3 Jockey Club Cup at Newmarket in October, but drops back to a more suitable distance in this contest.

**Empire Maker & Ats Work Towards Belmont**

Kentucky Derby runner-up **Empire Maker** (Unbridled) worked six furlongs at Belmont Park yesterday in 1:12.04, while **Atswhatimtalknbout** (A.P. Indy), a fast-closing fourth in the race, went the same distance at Churchill Tuesday in 1:16.20. The two colts will try to turn the tables on Derby and Preakness winner **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) in the June 7 G1 Belmont S.

**Duo Added to Guineas**

**Desert Destiny (GB)** (Desert Prince {Ire}) and **Indian Haven (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) were yesterday supplemented to Saturday's G1 Entenmann's Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh. Connections of both colts paid €40,000 at yesterday's stage as they seek to compensate unlucky runs in the first European Classics. While the former met trouble in running when fifth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) at Longchamp May 11, Indian Haven was hampered when only 14th in the Newmarket Classic May 3. Rick Bowman, assistant to Desert Destiny's trainer David Loder, told *PA Sport* yesterday, "We are hoping for big things. He just got trapped on the inside [last time] and never got a clear run. We have got belief in the horse and we think he's in the right race and I'm sure he'll run a big race." Bookmakers Paddy Power make **Catcher In The Rye (Ire)** (Danehill) their 5-2 favourite, with G1 2000 Guineas runner-up **Zafeen (Fr)** (Zafonic) quoted next best at 5-1.

**Six Perfections Favored**

**Six Perfections (Fr)** (Celtic Swing {GB}) will face a maximum of 13 rivals in Sunday's G1 Entenmann's Irish 1000 Guineas. Cashmans yesterday introduced the Pascal Bary-trained filly as the 4-7 favourite to make up for her luckless runner-up placing in the Newmarket equivalent May 4. With the going currently soft, track manager Paul Hensey does not expect further rain to have much effect. "I have to say, if you were looking for good, fast ground you won't get it here, but it won't be a bog either," he explained yesterday. "It'll be somewhere in the middle hopefully."

**THAT 25-YEAR GAP**

You don't need me to tell you we saw two outstanding performances over the weekend: first Hawk Wing went some way to redeeming his reputation in a hot renewal of the G1 Lockinge, then Funny Cide enhanced his reputation with an equally impressive 9 3/4-length score in the Preakness, leading many observers to declare that this one really has got a chance to be the first Triple Crown winner since Affirmed. For followers of patterns, it would be an interesting irony: there were 25 years between Citation's Triple Crown sweep in 1948 and Secretariat's in 1973. Now there have been exactly 25 years since Affirmed in 1978.

Funny Cide, of course, has much better claims than numbers theory: he ran a Beyer 114 in the Preakness, and if he runs the same race in the Belmont, probably only Empire Maker has a chance to stop him. Yes, the Belmont is 12 furlongs, not 9 1/2; big difference. But Funny Cide has three big things going for him. First, he is a rapidly improving three-year-old, peaking at exactly the right time. Sometimes those horses just forget to quit. Second, he has the right style to see out the Belmont distance. Like the Kentucky Derby, the Belmont does not play to come-from-the-clouds closers like we might think. Third, his fellow three-year-olds are not an especially strong bunch. I know, I know, that sounds like the knockers looking for something to knock, but it's true. Empire Maker proved himself a class horse with his wins in the Florida Derby and the Wood (over Funny Cide), but otherwise this crop looks like it has quite a few nice horses with few stars. Mind you, Funny Cide doesn't know any of this, just like he doesn't know that Distorted Humor was a sprinter and his damsire Slewacide stood in Oklahoma.

**The Young Guns: European Version...**

I've spent much of the spring tracking the second-crop North American sires (first foals 2000). The last time we looked at the cumulative earnings figures, we could say that at least eight of these young sires were looking quite good. That's still the case, but Funny Cide's Preakness win pretty much means his sire, [Distorted Humor](#), has gone beyond recall as this group's leader. It's great news for WinStar Farm, which stands him, and it's pretty safe to say his 2004 stud fee will reflect these successes. That's two Grade I winners, including (so far) a dual Classic winner, in his first crop, after all.

Partially because the European season gets under way later, we haven't caught up yet with the situation with the younger European sires, so today we're publishing the top 15 European second-crop sires and first-crop sires as well, because there has been some action on that front.

Last week we discovered how few sons of [Danehill](#) with runners there actually are at stud in Europe just yet. [Danehill Dancer](#), whose first crop of four-year-olds includes Lockinge second Where or When, has risen from being a cheap sprint sire to one of the leaders of his sire group (European third-crop sires), with a stud fee now of €30,000. Similarly Danetime, who never even won a stakes race--he was third in the G1 July Cup as a three-year-old and third in the G1 Haydock Park Sprint Cup as a four-year-old--is also advancing Danehill's claims as a sire of sires. With 28 winners thus far and progeny earnings over £577,000, he still leads the triple Group 1-winning miler Desert Prince (24 winners, over £515,000) among European second-crop sires. It seems just a matter of time before Desert Prince takes over. He has seven stakes horses, after all, whereas Danetime has just three, but, for the moment, Danetime still holds the lead. Compton Place (22 winners, over £496,000) is still less than £20,000 behind Desert Prince in third.

But the two most remarkable stories among this group may well be the sires occupying the fourth and fifth slots at the moment. Air Express, by Topsisider's son Salse, progressed from winning the Italian and German 2000 Guineas (both Group 2 races) to an upset win in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot late in his three-year-old year. Averti, a son of Warning, was a hard-knocking sprinter who raced into his eight-year-old year. He never won a stakes until he was six, though he placed in seven others, including a second in the 1997 G1 Prix de l'Abbaye at age seven. These two had pretty small crops. Whereas Danetime, Desert Prince, and Compton Place have had 67, 70, and 56 runners, respectively, Air Express has had only 14 runners, and Averti 27. Air Express has 12 winners from those 14 runners, including Airwave, who beat Russian Rhythm in last year's Cheveley Park and is a leading candidate for sprint honors this year. Averti has 15 winners, including six stakes horses, second only to Desert Prince's seven among this sire group so far.

**Euro First-Crop Sires...**

As it's not even the end of May yet, it's of course very early days to be making any pronouncements about who is and who isn't, among first-crop sires. But there have been a few developments, possibly significant, thus far. Daggers Drawn won the G2 Richmond and G2 Champagne at two, but didn't win again--just like his sire Diesis and grandsire Sharpen Up. His yearlings last year looked the part and sold accordingly. When these figures were compiled Monday, he had five winners of seven races already, then had his sixth winner Monday night. Intikhab, a son of Red Ransom, was only out of the first two on his final career start, his only run at five. He looked a real class horse when destroying his field in the G2 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot as a four-year-old, and he has come out firing, with four winners already, and another win since Monday. So Daggers Drawn and Intikhab are the early leaders. Off to the quickest start in France is Verglas, winner of the G3 Coventry--always a good race--at Royal Ascot as a two-year-old, and second in the 1997 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. **cont. p. 5**

But Verglas had a largely fruitless campaign in America later at three and four. The same could be said of Dr Fong, winner of the 1998 G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. He made seven starts in America at three and four, and didn't win, though he did run second in two Grade IIs, the Oak Tree Derby and the Strub.

**Stravinsky**, champion sprinter of 1999 when, as a three-year-old, he won two Group 1 sprints, the July Cup and Nunthorpe, stands in Kentucky, but does have two winners thus far in Europe and is looking pretty promising from early returns. Cape Cross won the G1 Lockinge at four and the G2 Queen Anne at five; he has four winners thus far. **Fasliyev** was unbeaten in five starts at two, including three group race wins at six furlongs: the G3 Coventry at Royal Ascot, then the G1 Phoenix S. in Ireland and G1 Prix Morny in France.

**Orpen**, a half brother to Peace Rules's sire Jules by Lure, won the G1 Prix Morny the previous year and was third in the Irish 2000 Guineas at three. There's a lot of racecourse form among this group, so it will be interesting to follow their progress as the stakes races get underway.

In winning the Preakness S., Funny Cide not only completed a sweep of the first two jewels of the Triple Crown for himself, but also a GII Black-Eyed Susan/GI Preakness S. double for sons of Forty Niner. A champion two-year-old who also won the GI Travers S. and was beaten only inches in the Kentucky Derby, Forty Niner was a very consistent stakes sire (he now has 44 stakes winners from 516 starters), but was exported to Japan due to a shortage of scorers at the very highest level. He was more or less anointed as the next sire of sires in 1998, when End Sweep took the champion freshman sire title while setting a new world record for two-year-old winners in a single season, and other sons Tactical Advantage, [Twining](#) and Marked Tree all sired stakes winners. Two years later another son, Gold Fever, looked set for stardom after getting the outstanding filly Gold Mover in his first crop. Oddly enough, through a variety of circumstances, this "first wave" of Forty Niners didn't end up having anything like the impact that might have been anticipated. End Sweep, who events revealed to have been potentially a very good sire, was exported to Japan and died last year, while 2002 also saw the premature demise of Tactical Advantage. Twining followed End Sweep to Japan, but following some good efforts from crops sired prior to his export, he was repatriated for the 2002 season. He now stands at Vinery Kentucky and has sired 19 stakes winners from his first five crops, including graded-stakes winners Two Item Limit, Top Hit, Connected and Dawn of the Condor. Gold Fever never really capitalized on his bright start and was sent to New York, having sired just three stakes winners from his first three crops.

Since then, however, there has been something of a Forty Niner revival, with some of the best runners coming from unexpected sources. Apart from the sires mentioned above, at least another 17 Forty Niner sons have sired stakes winners. This very varied collection is headed by [Distorted Humor](#), whose first crop includes not only Funny Cide, but also the Grade I-winning filly Awesome Humor; the recently deceased Jules, whose son Peace Rules finished third to Funny Cide in the Kentucky Derby; Chilean-based Rich Man's Gold, whose son Lido Palace was a Chilean Triple Crown winner and won back-to-back renewals of the GI Woodward S. when brought to the U.S; Luhuk, who started very well in Argentina, where his first crop included the extremely rapid Avanzado, a multiple graded stakes winner in North America who is now in Kentucky; and the Florida pair of Cyberspace--sire of this year's multiple graded-stakes winning filly Cyber Secret in his first crop--and West Acre, an unraced horse whose second crop has supplied Florida filly star Ivanavalot.

Roar, the sire of this weekend's Black Eyed Susan heroine Roar Emotion, was one of Forty Niner's better performed and better bred sons. Winner of a maiden race at Saratoga at two and the GIII Swale S. and GII Jim Beam S. at three, Roar owns an extremely impressive pedigree. He is a half brother to the GI Futurity S. winner Eastern Echo (sire of this year's GISW Buddy Gil), and to graded-stakes winners Blare of Trumpets (Fit to Fight) and Yell ([A.P. Indy](#)). Roar's dam, the MGSW Northern Dancer mare Wild Applause, is a sister to the MGSW Hero's Honor and half sister to several other good stakes winners, headed by Kentucky Derby victor Sea Hero. Incidentally, since Roar is by a son of Mr. Prospector out of a sister to Hero's Honor, he is bred on somewhat similar lines to hot young second season sire [Elusive Quality](#), who is by a son of Mr. Prospector out of a Hero's Honor mare.

Roar and the previously mentioned Gold Fever retired to Lane's End Farm for the same breeding season (1997) and like Gold Fever, Roar has also moved on to new pastures, in his case, the Rancho San Miguel in California. In his first two Lane's End crops, Roar sired two stakes winners. The MSW filly Madame Roar was in the first, and SW & MGSP distaffer Roaring Blaze was in the second. The third crop, in addition to Roar Emotion, also includes the MSW colt Coach Jimi Lee.

Roar has also been shuttling to Argentina for the Southern Hemisphere breeding season, and like several other sons of Forty Niner, has done well with his South American runners. He has been represented by at least eight stakes winners, five of them graded, in Argentina, and currently sits second to Southern Halo on the Argentine sire list.

Roar Emotion is from a family which has improved rapidly in the last two years. She is the fourth foal and first winner for her dam, the Capote mare Emotional Outburst. A daughter of the SP mare Joy to Raise (by Raise a Man), Emotional Outburst is a 3/4-sister to the very talented Mayakovsky, who is by Capote's son Matty G out of Joy to Raise. On his two-year-old debut, Mayakovsky broke the Saratoga track record for 5 1/2 furlongs when scoring from subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Sprint runner-up Thunderello. A good second to the more experienced Came Home in the GI Hopeful S. on his next outing, Mayakovsky was sidelined by an injury for the rest of the two-year-old season. He returned at three to take one of the fastest renewals of the Gill Gotham S., but again his season was derailed by problems in training. It was recently announced that Mayakovsky, who added a turf allowance win to his record this year, would retire to stand the 2004 breeding season at Mill Creek Farm in Stillwater, New York.

Prior to the appearance of Mayakovsky and Roar Emotion, the only black-type victory for a horse in the first three dams of this pedigree was that earned by Roar Emotion's third dam Joy to Tell, who captured the Atokad Futurity. The fourth dam Flower Bonnet was stakes-placed and is ancestress of numerous (mostly minor) stakes winners, although one of her granddaughters, Diorissimo, was a G1SW in South Africa and also produced Scented Royal, a champion two-year-old filly in that country. Flower Bonnet's third dam Nectarine is a stakes-winning sister to the multiple champion sire Bull Lea, who was the sire of such champions as Citation, Coaltown, Armed, Twilight Tear, Bewitch, Two Lea and Real Delight.

We mentioned that both Funny Cide and Roar Emotion are by sons of Forty Niner, but the similarities between their pedigrees doesn't end there: both sires--Distorted Humor and Roar--are products of a Forty Niner/Northern Dancer cross, and both dams are by sons of Seattle Slew. What is rather interesting is that while Mr. Prospector/Seattle Slew in general has been a very successful cross, it had not been working at all well via Forty Niner. In fact, prior to Funny Cide and Roar Emotion, the cross had produced only two unrestricted stakes winners, neither of them graded. With this in mind, we would be tempted to say that the modifying effect of Northern Dancer in the broodmare sire line of Distorted Humor and Roar has been important. With the specific case of Roar Emotion, we can also note that Roar's fourth dam Searching is a member of the La Troienne family, and is a 3/4-sister to the siblings Busher and Striking, who both appear in the dam of Seattle Slew.

### HAWK SOARS IN THE RATINGS

**Hawk Wing** (Woodman) was yesterday handed an official rating of 137 pounds by the British Horseracing Board's handicappers, making him the joint highest-rated horse since Dancing Brave in 1986. Rated only four pounds behind that champion, the Aidan O'Brien-trained colt's 11-length success in Saturday's G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. at Newbury is also rated the best mile performance since El Gran Senor took the 1984 G1 2000 Guineas. Mile handicapper Dominic Gardiner-Hill explained to *sportinglife.com* yesterday that "mathematically, Hawk Wing's run could be anything you want to make it if you look at the previous form of those in behind him." Runner-up **Where or When (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was judged to have run to 119 pounds, which is four pounds below the rating he achieved in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot in September. "We obviously had reservations--such as the way the race was run with Hawk Wing having it all his own way, the performances of those in behind and the fact that it's still very early in the season," he added. "Where or When was yesterday described by trainer Terry Mills as "brilliant" after Saturday's race and is set to re-oppose if Hawk Wing lines up in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 17. "We're going for different tactics--we're going to have a little bit of a street fight next time," Mills said. "We're not going to let Hawk Wing have everything his own way."

### HUGHES IN GOODWOOD CONTROVERSY

Jockey Richard Hughes has been ruled out of action on the weekend of the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) at Chantilly after picking up a five-day suspension at Goodwood yesterday. Hughes, who is retained by owner Khalid Abdullah, was judged by stewards not to have ridden the Roger Charlton-trained Summer View to obtain the best placing in a handicap at Sussex yesterday. His ban runs from May 29 to June 2 inclusive, ruling him out of possible rides on **Etoile Montante** (Miswaki) in the G2 Prix de Sandringham and **Illustrator (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) in the G1 Prix Jean Prat on the Jockey-Club undercard June 1.

### NAYEF HEADS CUP 24

**Nayef** (Gulch) heads a list of 24 remaining in the £300,000 G1 Vodafone Coronation Cup at Epsom June 6 at yesterday's forfeit stage. The Marcus Tregoning-trained five-year-old is set to make his 2003 European debut in the 12-furlong contest, having finished third in the G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad al Sheba last time Mar. 29. Aidan O'Brien has left in Saturday's G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. winner **Hawk Wing** (Woodman), although he is bound for Royal Ascot, while Godolphin have a team of five headed by **Highest (Ire)** (Selkirk), third in the G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket last time May 2. He may re-oppose fellow entries **Warrsan (Ire)** (Caerleon) and **Bandari (Ire)** (Alhaarth {Ire}), first and fourth, respectively, in the Newmarket contest. Overseas interest is represented by the Andreas Schutz-trained **Next Desert (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}) and **Polish Summer (GB)** (Polish Precedent), from the stable of Andre Fabre, who has taken this contest five times. "The 2003 Vodafone Coronation Cup is all set to be a great race," commented Stephen Wallis, managing director at Epsom Downs racecourse.
