### LOXIAS LUCKS OUT

It was no surprise to racegoers when **Loxias (Fr)** (Saumarez {GB}), who finished a nose second to **Millenary (GB)** (Rainbow Quest), was awarded the G2 Prix Jean de Chaudenay by stewards at Saint-Cloud yesterday after the colt met with continued interference from the original first-place finisher in the home straight. "I would have been surprised if they had not disqualified the other horse," commented winning conditioner Carlos Laffon-Parias. Twice successful at Listed class last year, Loxias won a conditions event at this track Mar. 8 on his seasonal debut before finishing second to **Martaline (GB)** (Linamix {Fr}) in the G3 Prix d'Hedouville at Longchamp Apr. 17, but surpassed all previous form to secure a career best win here. Jockey Olivier Peslier settled Loxias in third as Millenary made much of the running, then pushed his mount into second at the top of the stretch run. Millenary and Loxias had the race between them from the quarter-mile marker and hooked up for a battle. Millenary was headed briefly by his chief rival at the distance, but persistently hung into Loxias' challenge. The pair fought in determined fashion in the closing stages with only a nose separating them at the wire. Laffon-Parias added, "Loxias has not stopped improving since the start of the season and now that he has won a Group 2, we will go for the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud over course and distance June 29." Of the disqualified Millenary, jockey Pat Eddery said, "Unfortunately my horse was hanging right throughout the straight, so I put my whip in my right hand and tried everything possible to avoid trouble. I don't think I was to blame for the incident and the stewards agreed because they didn't suspend me. It's too bad because it was his day and it would have been nice to win it." *Chart p. 2*

#### Storm Flag Flying Preps for Acorn

Juvenile filly champion **Storm Flag Flying** (Storm Cat), who finished 5 1/2 lengths behind Cyber Secret in her 2003 debut in the GIII Comely S. at Aqueduct Apr. 18, covered a half-mile in :49 1/5 Tuesday morning at Belmont Park. The filly is expected to start next in the June 6 GI Acorn S. at Belmont. The Phipps filly, who is trained by Shug McGaughey, won all four starts last term, including a convincing 12 3/4-length score in the GI Matron S., run over the same track and distance as the Acorn. Also working Tuesday at Belmont Park, **Zavata** (Phone Trick) went five furlongs in a bullet :59 2/5. The colt, winner of last year's GII Saratoga Special, has been off since being eased in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last October at Arlington Park.

#### Funny Cide Back on Track

Kentucky Derby winner **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) returned to the track yesterday for the first time since his victory in Saturday's GI Preakness S. The New York-bred gelding jogged once the wrong way around Belmont Park's 1 1/2-mile oval. "You can't keep him in the stall forever," trainer Barclay Tagg commented. "I think he's doing great. He came out of the race very good." Funny Cide will continue to jog or gallop for five or six days and will work in about a week's time.

#### Empire Maker OK After Bullet Work

Kentucky Derby runner-up **Empire Maker** (Unbridled) exited his six-furlong work Tuesday at Belmont in fine shape, trainer Bobby Frankel reported yesterday. The colt completed the drill in a bullet 1:12 with jockey Aaron Gryder in the irons. "The work went well and he's fine this morning," Frankel commented. This will be a keenly contested affair and **Bezrin**, representing the in-form partnership of Andre Fabre and Christophe Soumillon, will be hard to beat in his quest for a first group win. He was Listed-placed last year and started 2003 with a conditions win over today's track and trip Apr. 3, prior to landing the Listed Prix de Montretout, again over course and distance, Apr. 24. Last year's winner **Frenchmans Bay** confirmed his well-being with a fifth placing in the G2 Sandown Mile Apr. 26.

**Holding Steady at 31**

All of the main contenders remained on course for the June 7 G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom after yesterday's final forfeit stage, with 31 horses still engaged in the £1.2-million classic. Heading the acceptors is the Dermot Weld-trained unbeaten G1 2000 Guineas winner **Refuse to Bend (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), who will bid to become the first colt since Nashwan in 1989 to win both classics. Irish conditioner Aidan O'Brien is seeking to make history this year by becoming the first man ever to train three consecutive winners of Epsom's Blue Riband. The Ballydoyle maestro still has seven to choose from, including Group 1 winners **Alberto Giacometti (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), **Brian Boru (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) and **Hold That Tiger** (Storm Cat). The strong hand of the Irish this year is further strengthened by the presence of the John Oxx-trained **Alamshar (Ire)** (Key of Luck). The Godolphin juggernaut has a quartet of entries, including **Lateen Sails (GB)** (Elmaamul). The next confirmation stage is the five-day stage June 2 when there is also a £90,000 supplementary entry stage.

**PREAKNESS A SUCCESS DESPITE BAD**

**WEATHER** Last Saturday's 128<sup>th</sup> Preakness S. was a major success as attendance topped the 100,000 mark for the fourth time in five years and betting figures exceeded \$60 million for the third consecutive year. Even the cold and rainy conditions didn't scare anyone away from Pimlico Race Course, as, at 100,268, it was the fourth largest crowd in Preakness history. "Considering that it was the coldest Preakness ever, we are delighted that attendance exceeded 100,000 for only the fourth time, and that wagering was just off last year's all-time record," said Joe De Francis, Maryland Jockey Club president and chief executive officer. NBC's telecast earned a 5.6 overnight rating and 13 share, both down from a 6.5 overnight rating and 15 share in 2002. The coverage peaked between 6:00 and 6:30, the half hour slot that featured Funny Cide's near record performance, earning a 7.7 overnight rating and 17 share.

**INTERNATIONAL DERBY WAGERING UP** International wagering on the Kentucky Derby through the Churchill Downs Simulcast Network rose 20.2 percent to \$1.7 million and international wagering on the entire Derby Day card totaled \$4.3 million, an increase of 47.6 percent from a year ago. Wagers came in from Australia, Canada, the Caribbean, Central and South America, South Africa and the United Kingdom. Total wagering on the 12-race Derby card, including on-track and simulcast betting, totaled \$140,250,590, an increase of 13.8 percent over the previous record established in 2002 on an 11-race card. "Accessing these international markets entails working through tax treaties, currency exchanges, signal transfers and much more," explained Karl Schmitt, Jr., president of CDSN. "We are fortunate to offer the Kentucky Derby to overcome such barriers and help us deliver our product to a broader audience, as we did in 2003. And we will continue working to expand our reach, so that more race fans worldwide can participate in, not only the Kentucky Derby, but in the high-quality racing content offered throughout CDSN."

Globetrotting Lunar Sovereign has been a solid performer through a career that has spanned three continents. A two-year-old winner in Britain in his debut back in 2001, he came stateside last year after a brief stint in Dubai. Following a pair of runner-up finishes in off-the-turf affairs at Saratoga last August, he looked very impressive in two Belmont turf efforts, winning both by a combined 10 1/2 lengths. The dark bay was unsuccessful in a subsequent start in Dubai in January, but made his triumphant return to the States as the crowd's slight pick here. Kept in the clear several lengths off the leaders by jockey Jerry Bailey, Lunar Sovereign began his run leaving the turn and rolled confidently down the middle of the lane to take this one with verve.

**Lone Star Lowers Pick 4 Takeout On Million Day:**

Lone Star Park will lower its Pick 4 takeout from 25 percent to 15 percent for its fifth annual Lone Star Million program May 26 and will also add a second Pick 4, pending final approval from the Texas Racing Commission. "Lone Star Million is one of the premiere events of our racing season," Lone Star Park Vice President and General Manager Jeff Greco said. "We're hopeful that a lower takeout and second Pick 4 will bring horseplayers nationwide an added interest to Monday's outstanding program." The 11-race holiday program, which features seven stakes cumulatively worth \$1 million, annually attracts top horses from California, Florida, Kentucky and New York as well as locally based runners.

Sand Springs has been a paradox since breaking her maiden at first asking over a yielding Spa lawn last August. She followed that effort with an honest third in the GIII Natalma S. over Woodbine's sod, then ran ninth, beaten 55 1/2 lengths, in the GII Alcibiades S. in the slop at Keeneland in early October. Second in the Green River S. at Keeneland in her return to the grass, she bore out on the turn and was eased in a grassy allowance test in mid-November. A five-month respite did a world of good, and the dark bay romped by 7 1/4 lengths in her return at Churchill Apr. 26. Made the second choice by bettors to the 2-1 chalk Ebony Breeze (Belong to Me), winner of the GIII Florida Oaks in March, Sand Springs sprinted from the gate and was in front by two lengths at the first call. After speedy fractions in :45 2/5 and 1:10 1/5, it looked as though she might tire in the stretch, but jockey Mark Guidry's urgings were well heeded and she cruised home a driving winner. The favorite never got going over the rain-softened ground and finished fourth.
