SLOPPY TRACK DOESN'T SLOW FUNNY CIDE

Triple Crown hopeful **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) didn't let the muddy Belmont Park surface slow him down, working five furlongs in a bullet :59 2/5 on the main track yesterday morning. On the tab for the first time since taking the May 17 Preakness, the chestnut galloped out six furlongs in 1:13 3/5. "He's a superior work horse," trainer Barclay Tagg said, adding that the gelding likely would have his final prep for the June 7 GI Belmont S. Tuesday. He added, "He has a big job ahead of him. I'm trying to keep him at his peak and, right now, we look good. It's been a pleasant surprise that I haven't seen any wear and tear." As for his chances in the 1 1/2-mile Belmont, Tagg said, "You just never know how they are going to handle that extra quarter mile. From what I've seen of him, there's no reason for me to believe he won't do it, but...there could be someone out there in the woodwork who is just dying to go a mile and a half and wins the Belmont easily."

Slow Work for Ats

Trainer Ron Ellis hoped his colt **Atswhatimtalknbout** (A.P. Indy), recovering from a bruised foot, would work a mile at Churchill yesterday in the range of 1:40 or 1:41. Instead the Derby fourth-place finisher completed the work in 1:46.80, raising new questions about his participation in the Belmont. "It wasn't what I wanted by any means," Ellis said. "He went awfully slow, but we'll see. He lost a shoe during the work and that probably didn't help him much." Atswhatimtalknbout was wearing glue-on bar shoes on both front feet and lost the shoe on his uninjured left front. "We'll regroup and see how he is the next couple of days and maybe come back on Sunday if he looks good," Ellis added. "If he doesn't, we'll pack him up and take him home and fix him up. The big thing is I don't want to get him hurt trying to train up to this one race because he's a really good horse and he's going to develop as he gets older." If all goes to plan, Atswhatimtalknbout will work five furlongs in company Sunday.

Soumillon to Ride for O'Brien

Christophe Soumillon, current darling of the French racing circuit, has been booked to ride one of Team Ballydoyle's horses in the G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom June 7. Belgian-born Soumillon told *Racing Post*, "It gives me great satisfaction to have been selected to ride. It has been an enormous dream of mine to ride for Aidan O'Brien as I have already ridden for most of the best trainers. It is a great chance to have a ride on a good horse in the Epsom Derby and will give me a lot of pleasure."

Extra Pair for Derby

As expected, G3 Chester Vase winner **Dutch Gold** (Lahib) will be supplemented to the G1 Vodafone Derby after working well in a racecourse gallop before the races at Yarmouth yesterday. Trainer Clive Brittain, encouraged by the gallop, told *PA Sport*, "We're very pleased. That was very much what we wanted him to do, have a trip to the seaside. We just gave him a spin round the track, so we are delighted with it. It was an exercise and a case of having a day out without racing. He has come on for his run at Chester and goes to Epsom with a real live chance." According to Brittain, Philip Robinson will replace Frankie Dettori aboard Dutch Gold. "We booked Philip, as they was no certainty that Frankie would be available," said Brittain. "We had to book a top-class jockey and he's been booked." Also a supplementary entry, **Kris Kin** (Kris S.), winner of Chester's Dee S. May 8, will wait for Epsom rather than take in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby). He will have the assistance of in-form jockey Kieren Fallon. Joe Mercer, racing manager to owner Saeed Suhail, told *PA Sport*, "Kris Kin is going to Epsom, as there's only one Derby. [Suhail] is a sporting owner who thinks that if the horse is good enough to win a French Derby, he's good enough to win at Epsom. I think this year's Derby is a wide-open affair. [Trainer Sir Michael Stoute] has been very pleased with him since Chester. He's a fit horse, so he's not doing anything spectacular on the gallops, just ticking over."

Lone Star to Cut Purses:

Officials at Lone Star Park in Grand Prairie, Texas, have announced that they will cut the track's purse structure by 9 percent, effective Thursday, June 5, due to slower than usual business levels since the start of the year. Since the oval opened the doors on its 2003 live meeting Apr. 3, on-track attendance is down by 5.8 percent and handle is off by 6.7 percent from the corresponding figures a year ago. "Obviously, the economy has been tough on all businesses, especially to those of us in the sports and entertainment industry," said Lone Star Park General Manager Jeff Greco. "This adjustment was not an easy decision; it was a last resort." In addition to a decrease in overnight purses, five stakes have had their purses reduced by \$25,000: the Assault S., Walmac Lone Star Oaks, Bogan Memorial, Silver Spur Breeders' Cup and Middleground Breeders' Cup. The Bob Johnson Memorial's purse has been cut by \$15,000.

PARADE LEADER TO SOUTH AFRICA

Parade Leader (Kingmambo--Battle Creek Girl, by His Majesty), winner of the 2002 GII New Orleans H., has been purchased by Lammerskraal Stud in South Africa for \$1 million, the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. The six-year-old, who was bred and raced by William S. Farish and E.J. Hudson Jr., will stand the 2003 Southern Hemisphere season for a fee equivalent to \$2,463. "We think that Kingmambo has a tremendous chance to be a fantastic sire of sires, and Parade Leader's female line is exemplary," Lammerskraal Director Sally Jordaan told *Thoroughbred Times*. "He's exactly what we're looking for. He performed well on turf and dirt and he went long. We want to start racing our horses internationally, and we think [Parade Leader] could be competitive in several arenas." Parade Leader compiled a record of seven wins, four seconds and five thirds from 30 starts for earnings of \$712,507. Parade Leader is a half brother to Star of Valor (Phone Trick), a graded stakes winner of \$293,516; multiple graded stakes winner Tricky Creek (Clever Trick), who earned \$873,278; Canadian champion two-year-old filly Wavering Girl (Wavering Monarch); Speed Dialer (Phone Trick), a graded stakes winner of \$384,601; and the stakes winning Everhope (Danzig). He is also a full to Parade Ground, a multiple graded stakes winner of \$712,507, and to King's Consul, who sold for \$5.3 million at Keeneland September in 2000.
