FINAL BELMONT PREP FOR SCRIMSHAW

Scrimshaw (Gulch), third in the GI Preakness S. last time out, had his final prep for the June 7 GI Belmont S. yesterday morning. Exercise rider Stacy Maker

guided the colt through five furlongs in 1:00.20 over a fast main track at Churchill Downs. "I never try to put too much stock into a work, but I thought it was good," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "I was extremely pleased with the energy he showed and the way he finished up. He came home in :23 flat. He looked

awfully good." Lukas added that the three-year-old, who is scheduled to ship to New York today, has shown marked improvement since the second jewel in the Triple Crown. "I think even his weight has picked up a little bit," he said. "I thought the Derby [where he finished 11th] was a little bit tougher on him and understandably so, because he probably wasn't as tight as I would have liked for him to have been. We're moving forward and that's all we can ask." But, he added that beating Funny Cide will be no easy task. "If he can put together the Derby run and the Preakness run in the Belmont and carry it another quarter of a mile, I think it's his race to lose," Lukas said.

Midway Road Out of Belmont

Midway Road (Jade Hunter) will skip the final leg of the Triple Crown and instead point for the June 21 GII Ohio Derby, trainer Neil Howard confirmed yesterday. "We feel like this is the best thing for our horse," Howard said. "He made such a jump from an allowance race to a Classic race that we just thought it would be smarter, knowing what we know about the horse and the way he's improving, to just be careful to do whatever we can to keep him going in that direction." He added, "He's a lighter, immature type of colt and he's really starting to fill out now. Everything is starting to come together, mentally and physically. We think he is going to be better in August, September and October and it would be more prudent to look at other options than to go a mile and a half with him right now."

Derby Boosted By Trio

As expected, **Dutch Gold** (Lahib), **Norse Dancer** (Ire) (Halling) and **Kris Kin** (Kris S.) were yesterday supplemented to Saturday's G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom, bringing the total of colts entered to 24. With connections paying £90,000 each, the total purse will stand at £1,470,000, which makes it the richest race ever run in Europe. Aidan O'Brien has left in his four main contenders **Brian Boru** (GB) (Sadler's Wells), **Alberto Giacometti** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), **Balestrini** (Ire) (Danehill) and **The Great Gatsby** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), as well as **Handel** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), withdrawing **Hold That Tiger** (Storm Cat). Brian Boru, third behind **Alamshar** (Ire) (Key of Luck) in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown May 11, looks likely to edge out that rival for favouritism on Saturday. "We were happy with his run," O'Brien said. "It was his first competitive race this year--it was a little bit slower than we would have liked, but he came home well and we've been happy with him since. He's a clever, very intelligent horse with a lot of natural ability." John Oxx reiterated slight stamina concerns regarding Alamshar, but reported the colt in good shape ahead of the Classic. "There is not a lot of evidence, but Key of Luck has had mainly speedy horses so far so we are into the unknown with him," Oxx commented. "His dam stayed two miles in the Leopardstown November H. on soft ground so he's likely to get a mile and a half, but you can't be sure." Clerk of the course Andrew Cooper is waiting on the weather before committing to further watering of the track. "We got four millimetres of overnight rain, which is about half of what we were forecast," he said yesterday. "The going is unchanged at good, good to firm in places. I'm perfectly happy with the ground at the moment, but in a way I would have preferred to have a little more rain last night because it is forecast to be dry for the next 48 hours. It is now looking like we might get some rain later in the week. We will just have to keep an eye on it and see how things go, but at the moment I'm perfectly happy."

This year's edition of the Japanese Derby turned into a procession for the offspring of Japan's fallen hero Sunday Silence, who was represented within the first two generations of the initial five horses across the wire. Neo Universe proved best on this day as he extended his winning streak to five with a narrow win over graded-stakes winner Zenno Rob Roy. The winner of the G3 Kisaragi Sho in February and the G2 Spring S. in March, the bay came into this event hot off a head score in the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) Apr. 20 and was installed the race favorite to complete the Satsuki/Derby double. "Neo Universe is really a great horse," said winning rider Mirco Demuro. "I think he is a very talented horse, so if I have the opportunity to ride him again, I would like to." The three-year-old is expected to sit out the summer session and return for an autumn campaign.

Quote of the Day...

Trainer Neil Howard, after declaring Midway Road out of the Belmont S.

"I've got to be honest with you--I was going to be cheering for Funny Cide anyway. Obviously, you want to win any race you're in, but this is such a great thing for [trainer Barclay Tagg] and the industry. Being in the Preakness with him and watching the way he ran...you've got to feel great for [the Funny Cide connections]."

Outta Here Outta Belmont

Outta Here (Dehere), who worked a mile in 1:43 3/5 around the dogs at Hollywood Park Sunday with an eye on the Belmont, has been ruled out of that race by his connections and will instead target the July 13 GII Swaps S. at Hollywood. "If my reason for deciding to go to the Belmont was based solely on [Sunday's] work, he would be going," trainer Bill Currin told *Blood-Horse*. "However, he has been on the airplane a lot lately and I have decided to stay home and run a fresh horse in the Swaps. My interest in this horse goes way past how much money he can quickly make, but what happens to his future career." Outta Here, winner of the \$500,000 Delta Jackpot S. last December, finished seventh in the Kentucky Derby.

Ten Most Wanted Works; Belmont Next

Belmont-bound **Ten Most Wanted** (Deputy Commander) worked five panels in :59 3/5 yesterday at Hollywood Park. "It was a very nice work," said his trainer, Wallace Dollase. "He galloped out very strong. He's been training sensationally since the [GI Kentucky] Derby." Ninth as the crowd's third choice in the Derby, his most recent start, Ten Most Wanted is slated to depart Ontario, California for New York at 5:30 this morning.

Best Minister Works Towards Belmont

Trainer Ken McPeek's **Best Minister** (Deputy Minister), hero of the Sir Barton S. on the Preakness undercard, put up a sharp half-mile move in :47 flat yesterday over a Belmont oval labeled wet fast. McPeek indicated the work was quicker than he would have liked, though was pleased with the colt's overall performance. "It was a little faster than I expected," he said. "[But] he needed to get something out of the work. That was the purpose of coming in here [to Belmont] early." Best Minister's regular exercise rider, Hanne Jorgensen, added, "[He] did it so easy and sort of got bored toward the end of the work, as if to say, 'Come on, guys, come and catch me.'"

Fifteen years ago I had the privilege of conducting a lengthy interview with the Aga Khan for a feature in *Pacemaker* magazine. The line that has always stuck in my memory from that meeting was His Highness' assertion that he remained "convinced that the Never Bend male line is going to be a very, very powerful line. We have used it and used it and I would like to continue using it. I am a great believer in this male line, to the point of saying that 10 years from now it may be as influential as the Northern Dancer line, if not more."

While this last prediction has yet to be realised, the Aga's faith in Never Bend has been amply rewarded, as the stallion team at his Giltown Stud shows. Daylami, a seven-time Group 1 winner, is by Never Bend's grandson Doyoun; Kalanisi, winner of the 2000 Breeders' Cup Turf, is inbred 3x4 to Never Bend, through his main standard-bearers, Mill Reef and Riverman; and Sinndar, the outstanding three-year-old of 2000, has a granddaughter of Mill Reef as his dam.

Many other breeders must now be looking forward to the Aga Khan adding Daylami's unbeaten half-brother Dalakhani to his stallion team, because this colt looks a ready-made replacement for his much-missed sire Darshaan, a grandson of Mill Reef.

Dalakhani's victory in Sunday's Prix du Jockey-Club came 19 years after Darshaan had defeated Sadler's Wells and Rainbow Quest to win the same Classic. In the meantime, Darshaan has--together with other members of the Never Bend male line--become one of the greatest contributors to Sadler's Wells' exceptional record as a sire, as was underlined by Yesterday's recent victory in the Irish 1000 Guineas. This filly became the seventh Group 1 winner that Sadler's Wells has sired from his first 31 foals out of Darshaan mares. Altogether, Sadler's Wells has 11 stakes winners among those 31, plus another 14 (including 10 Group winners) out of mares by Darshaan's sire Shirley Heights and a further eight out of daughters of Shirley Heights' sire Mill Reef.

With the Derby just four days away, it's worth pointing out that it was a Darshaan mare that provided Sadler's Wells with last year's winner, High Chaparral, and that Aidan O'Brien's challengers by Sadler's Wells this year include Alberto Giacometti (out of a Shirley Heights mare) and The Great Gatsby (out of a mare by Shirley Heights' Derby-winning son Slip Anchor).

As Darshaan himself sired the Derby second City Honours from a Sadler's Wells mare, this is a proven Classic combination, and Dalakhani will surely be on the short-list for many of Sadler's Wells' good daughters as soon as he retires. Indeed, with no Northern Dancer blood in his pedigree, he will have tremendous appeal as an outcross for many European mares, especially as Darshaan sired Group winners from mares by Northern Dancer's sons Ajdal, El Gran Senor, Northfields, The Minstrel and Try My Best, as well as Sadler's Wells.

Rather surprisingly, Dalakhani--a member of his sire's 15th crop--officially ranks as the first Group 1 winner that the Aga Khan has bred by Darshaan. I use the word "officially" because Darshaan also sired Aliysa, who was stripped of her victory in the 1989 Oaks after a derivative of camphor was detected in her post-race test. The Aga has also bred quite a few other Group winners by Darshaan, including Zayyani, Arzanni, Khalafiya, Sharamana and Narwala, Narwala being the second dam of Sunday's impressive Group 2 winner Maiden Tower.

I asked Darshaan's breeder for his views on the horse back in 1988, when Darshaan was just completing his fourth season as a stallion. The Aga explained that:

"Darshaan represents a lot of things I like: he represents the Never Bend male line; and he represents a bringing in of a major Boussac family, namely Tourzima, which of course hasn't been the case in the past in my operation. So he brings to my operation two aspects which I consider very, very exciting indeed. If you look at the Boussac female lines I think you'd conclude that Tourzima is probably to Boussac what Mumtaz Mahal is to my bloodlines. If that's the case, then we have to watch all the descendants of Tourzima and how they are influencing our breeding."

Dalakhani's female line was also introduced to the Aga's studs through the purchase of the Boussac mares in 1978. His dam, Daltawa, traces to Zariba, an outstanding filly born in 1919. Zariba produced several top winners, including the dual Arc-winning filly Corrida, who in turn produced Coaraze, winner of the 1945 Prix du Jockey-Club. Zariba was also the fourth dam of Philius, winner of the same Classic in 1956, and of Galcador, who took the Epsom Derby in 1950.

Among the members of this family that the Aga acquired from Boussac were Crepellana, winner of the 1969 French Oaks, and Crepellana's non-winning half-sister Rose Ness, who is the fourth dam of Dalakhani.

Dalakhani could be said to have been bred to win a Derby. Rose Ness, a daughter of the French Derby winner Charlottesville, was mated to the Derby winner Crepello to produce his third dam, Denia (a three-parts sister to Crepellana). Denia in turn was bred to the French Derby winner Crystal Palace to produce his second dam, the talented Damana. Although steps were then taken to inject some speed by sending Damana to Miswaki, the resultant foal, Daltawa, stayed well enough to win over 1 1/4 miles as a juvenile and to become a Group-placed stakes winner over 1 5/16 miles at three.

No wonder Dalakhani looked so much at home in his first attempt at 1 1/2 miles, but his stamina is clearly allied to an ample measure of speed, as he showed with his three wins at up to a mile as a juvenile.

Of course, the Derby links also run strongly through the top half of Dalakhani's pedigree. Darshaan won the French Derby, while his sire Shirley Heights and grand-sire Mill Reef won the Epsom Derby, so Dalakhani is the fourth consecutive generation to have won the Epsom Derby or Prix du Jockey-Club. What is fascinating is that these four Derby winners made a total of 18 starts at two and won no fewer than 12 of them, with all four recording at least one important victory. Could it be that they owe this ability to shine at two to Never Bend, the Guggenheim colour-bearer who won seven of his 10 juvenile starts to head the two-year-old class of 1962?

Godolphin Wait On Weather

Godolphin yesterday confirmed both **Graikos GB** (Rainbow Quest) and **New South Wales (GB)** (In the Wings {GB}) for Saturday's G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom, but both need rain to run, it was announced. Graikos appeared unsuited to the fast conditions when fifth in the G2 Dante S. at York May 14, three days after New South Wales had struggled to get on terms in the G1 Prix Lupin at Longchamp on ground considered faster than the official good to soft. "We are not sure yet whether Graikos or New South Wales will run," Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford commented. "It all depends on the state of the ground, as both horses prefer slightly softer conditions than prevail at the moment."

XTRA HEAT IN FOAL TO GONE WEST Champion **Xtra Heat** (Dixieland Heat--Begin, by Hatchet Man), who won a North American distaff record 25 stakes, has been confirmed in foal to Gone West and has been retired, reports the *Thoroughbred Times*. Campaigned by John Salzman Sr., Harry Deitchman and Kenneth Taylor through much of her career, Xtra Heat was purchased privately by ClassicStar for \$1.5 million after failing to meet her reserve in 2002's Keeneland November Sale. The diminutive five-year-old, acquired for just \$5,000 as a Fasig-Tipton Midlantic two-year-old, won hearts over as one of the nation's premier sprinters and earned Champion Three-Year-Old Filly honors in 2001. She retires with a record of 34-26-5-1 and earnings of \$2,174,635.
