On any other day, Roger Clemens going for a 300th career victory would attract the attention of every New York sports junkie, but that won't be the case on Saturday when **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) goes after

racing's first Triple Crown in a quarter century in the GI Belmont S. The chestnut drew post position number four yesterday morning and was installed the slight even-money favorite over Juddmonte Farms' Kentucky Derby runner-up **Empire Maker** (Unbridled),

who will start from the rail at odds of 6-5. As oddsmaker Don La Place put it, "I gave Funny Cide the popular vote and Empire Maker got the electoral college." The two rivals first met in the Apr. 12 GI Wood Memorial, when the Bobby Frankel-trainee basically had his way with Funny Cide, winning by a measured half-length. But the New York-bred exacted his revenge with a 1 3/4-length score in the Kentucky Derby and on Saturday looks to become the first Triple Crown winner since Affirmed in 1978. "He seems to be getting bigger and stronger every day," trainer Barclay Tagg commented. "He's been bucking and squealing in his stall every day. I feel very good about my horse." Added Jack Knowlton, managing partner of Sackatoga Stables, "I hope we get a perfect ending to the perfect story. And if it doesn't happen, it's still a great story." The 61-year-old Frankel, second in two of the last three renewals of the Belmont, wouldn't mind upsetting the apple cart. "I hope everybody hates me after the race--then I'll know I did well," he quipped. "They love me here in New York. It's not like I'm a foreigner--I was raised in New York," added the Brooklyn native.

Bailey Drops the Gauntlet

Jockey Jerry Bailey, who won his only Belmont in 1991 aboard Hansel, believes he and Empire Maker will pose for the winning picture on Saturday. "I think my horse is the best horse," he commented. "He won the Wood with five or six lengths to spare. The only problem is he didn't have a very smooth road into Churchill," he added, referring to a foot bruise which plagued Empire Maker in the days prior to the Derby. Having passed the Preakness in favor of training up to this race, Frankel is pleased with the progress of his pupil. "I didn't overdo it with him, but I think he's dead fit for this race," he said. "I didn't baby him. He's ready now." Gentlemen, start your engines. *(cont p3)*

FIFTEEN FILLIES FOR OAKS

Irish raider **Yesterday (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) heads a group of 15 fillies going postward in tomorrow's G1 Vodafone Oaks at Epsom. The Aidan O'Brien-trainee bids to emulate the stable's Imagine (Ire) in following up her success in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas with a victory in the Oaks and looks likely to start favourite in the second-biggest line-up since 1986. Her victory in The Curragh Classic May 25 was obtained on yielding to soft ground, but conditions figure to be livelier Friday. The Ballydoyle conditioner is unperturbed by the ground, which is currently good to firm on the Downs. "Obviously she handles a bit of dig better than most, but she ran a fine race on good to firm at Newmarket last back end," O'Brien commented. "If it is safe, we will be happy." Godolphin provide the main opposition in **Hi Dubai (GB)** (Rahy) after withdrawing Mezzo Soprano from the Classic, which they have won three times since 1994. The James Toller-trained **Hanami (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}), fifth in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 4, is another who may be inconvenienced by a fast surface. "I didn't want firm ground for her because we know she operates well on soft," jockey Darryll Holland explained. "It was a bit of a worry with that hot spell of weather last week. Provided we get some luck in running, I honestly believe my filly is the one to beat and I'll be going there full of confidence." Trainer James Given is hoping the rain stays away for **Summitville (GB)** (Grand Lodge), seventh in the 1000 Guineas before finishing a disappointing eighth in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary at Longchamp May 18. "I'm pleased to hear they've turned the taps off for the last time," he said yesterday. "I hope it just dries out as good to firm or fast ground will be ideal for her. She should be able to settle in and get a nice lead and that will help switch her off."

Wiseguys Say 'never

While most of the attention will be squarely focused on the two favorites, **Dynever** (Dynaformer) lurks in the shadows and would be no surprise in the role of upsetter. The 5-1 third choice breaks from the five hole. The dark bay colt, owned in partnership by Dr. Catherine Wills and Peter Karches, is undefeated in three starts since the addition of Lasix in March, including a visually impressive 1 1/2-length victory in the GIII Lone Star Derby May 10, after being blocked behind a wall of horses for most of the stretch drive. "He's a lightly raced and fresh horse," said Karches, who also sits on the New York Racing Association Board of Trustees. "The only question I have is whether he's fast enough to run with these horses."

Finished With Masseur, Ten Most Wanted Back

Ten Most Wanted (Deputy Commander) impressed enough racegoers with his win in the GII Illinois Derby to be sent off the 6-1 third choice in the Kentucky Derby, but suffered a displaced vertebra in a bumping incident at the start. Having received treatment for those ailments, he is back with a legitimate shot in the Belmont. "We think he has a very good chance, otherwise we wouldn't be here," said trainer Wally Dollase, who will be saddling his first horse in the Belmont. The dark bay colt, a 10-1 chance on the morning line, will be the last to load in the field of six. "That's good for him," the trainer explained. "He sometimes gets a little anxious in the gate, but he wants to break fast, so being the last one in the gate will help him."

Best Minister Declared

Philips Racing Partnership's **Best Minister** (Deputy Minister), who was going to be supplemented to the Belmont for \$100,000, was declared from Saturday's race early yesterday morning. "He left a significant amount of feed this morning when we came in," trainer Ken McPeck said. "We took him out to the track and he galloped well, but we heard him cough three times. We figured it would be best to scope him before we entered him. He didn't scope clean. It's a lot of money to put up so I recommended to the owners that we not run. In this game timing is everything. Unfortunately, this is very poor timing. It's just not our turn." The bay colt was coming into the Belmont off a three-length score in the Sir Barton S. on the Preakness undercard May 17. Owner John Phillips will remain in New York to watch his Wonder Again in the GIII Just A Game Breeders' Cup on the undercard.

SUNNY'S HALO DIES Kentucky Derby winner **Sunny's Halo** (Halo--Mostly Sunny, by Sunny) died Tuesday at Double S Thoroughbreds in Tyler, Texas. The 23-year-old stallion was found lying down in his paddock Tuesday morning and was euthanized after efforts to help him rise to his feet proved futile. "He was such a tremendous horse and we did not want him to suffer," said Billy Hanna, majority partner in the group that brought the stallion to Texas in 1998. Named Canada's champion juvenile of 1982, Sunny's Halo won the 1983 GI Kentucky Derby, GI Super Derby Invitational H. and GI Arkansas Derby. He began his stud career in 1984 at Domino Stud in Kentucky and moved to Walmac International in 1989. He shuttled to Brazil in 1995-97 before his relocation to Texas. From 17 crops of racing age, Sunny's Halo has sired 442 winners from 682 starters, including 36 stakes winners. Among the stallion's 13 graded-stakes winners are millionaires Dispersal, Sunny Sunrise and Gaily Tomahawk. He is also the sire of Grade I winner Irgun. Sunny's Halo was buried at Double S Thoroughbreds.

Kempton racecourse have announced the end of 127 years of turf flat racing as they prepare to open a new all-weather track in 2005, while the Racecourse Holdings Trust (RHT) has revealed that Newmarket will also build an all-weather track next year. Both measures may coincide with the development of further dirt tracks at Newbury, Sedgefield and the new venue of Great Leighs next year. While the new track at Kempton will be a 10-furlong right-handed oval, Newmarket's new track will be over a straight 12 furlongs and will run alongside the Rowley Mile. Kempton's racecourse managing director Julian Thick told *PA Sport* yesterday, "The plan is to switch across as many of the Flat fixtures to the all-weather as possible. It would be the end of an era, but also the start of a new phase and hopefully high quality all-weather racing." Meanwhile, officials at Newmarket are hoping that their new surface will help local trainers as well as stage racing. "We would be looking to race between November and April, with two or three midweek afternoon fixtures each week," Lisa Hancock, managing director at Newmarket, told *PA Sport*. "It's in the early stages, but the initial feedback I've had from Sir Mark Prescott and William Haggas, two well-respected Newmarket trainers, has been extremely positive. I would think the track would be put in during summer 2004, ready to open in 2005."
