Funny Cide Confirmed for Haskell

Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. winner **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) is being pointed for the GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park Aug. 3, trainer Barclay Tagg told *Thoroughbred Times*. "Yes, definitely," the conditioner said. "It's next in line." A rematch looms in the Haskell with **Peace Rules** (Jules), who Funny Cide defeated into fourth in the Preakness.

Swaps Possible Next Start For Ten Most Wanted

Ten Most Wanted (Deputy Commander), second to Empire Maker in last Saturday's GI Belmont S., has safely returned to his Southern California base to begin preparations for his next start, which could come either at home or back on the road, according to trainer Wally Dollase. "He should make his next start in the [GII] Swaps S. here [July 13] or the [GI] Haskell Invitational H. [at Monmouth Park Aug. 3]." Whichever race Dollase settles on will be used as a prep for Saratoga's Mid-Summer Derby, the GI Travers S. Aug. 23, a race which Dollase won with Deputy Commander in 1997. "He's like his father; he just maturing into a good horse now," the conditioner continued. "He's not precocious. The more he runs, the better he gets."

Atswhatimtalkbout Out 'Til Fall

Atswhatimtalkbout (A.P. Indy), forced to miss last Saturday's GI Belmont S. with a quarter crack in his right front foot, will get about a month off and will not make his return to the races until the fall, trainer Ron Ellis told *Thoroughbred Times*. "I'll have to start from scratch with him with all that time off, so he won't be ready until at least late October," the conditioner said. "He's a big horse and just developing into his frame. The time off will give him a chance to grow up. We want to make sure that foot grows in." A hard-charging fourth, beaten about two lengths by Funny Cide in the Kentucky Derby, Atswhatimtalkbout's main objective will be the Strub Series at Santa Anita, which kicks off with the GI Malibu S. Dec. 26.

Godolphin were in a bullish mood yesterday as they prepare **Dubai Destination** (Kingmambo) for a clash with the imposing **Hawk Wing** (Woodman) in Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. After defeating Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster two years ago, the bay suffered a series of setbacks, but finally returned to win a conditions race in impressive fashion at Nottingham June 4. "This year we have started slowly with him in a conditions race and he needed the race," trainer Saeed bin Suroor commented. "He was only around 85 percent and he came back from that really well. He would like good rather than fast ground, but is improving all the time and he has the class to win a Group 1." With the official going at good to firm at present, the "real Hawk Wing" will have his surface again. "He is in good form, but we haven't done a lot with him since [his win in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 17]," trainer Aidan O'Brien told *PA Sport* yesterday. "He is the not the sort of horse who needs to do a lot of work, he is a real natural. We always felt that he wanted fast ground and as long as it is good and safe he will run." **Victory Moon (SAf)** (Al Mufti), winner of the G2 UAE Derby at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29, will also take his chance in the mile contest, which saw 16 entries remaining at yesterday's stage. Hawk Wing's vanquished Newbury rival **Where or When (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was another notable in the list, as was the Sir Michael Stoute-trained **Right Approach (GB)** (Machiavellian), who is set to represent the Queen after winning the Listed Royal Windsor S. at Windsor May 12.

BELMONT TOPS RATINGS NBC Sports' coverage of Saturday's Belmont S. was the week's number one rated show on network television, while generating the event's highest national rating since 1981 and the best rating for any horse race since 1990. NBC Sports Research estimates that 24 million viewers tuned in, an increase of 33 percent over last year's audience of 18 million. The 1 1/2-hour telecast produced a 9.5 national rating/23 shares in figures released yesterday by Nielsen Media Research. The 10.7/25 for the Belmont race segment (from 6-7 p.m.) ranks first among the 122 prime time programs for the week of June 2-8. The overall telecast ranked fourth. "This rating underscores the continuing re-emergence of horse racing in general and the Visa Triple Crown in particular," said Ken Schanzer, president of NBC Sports. "What's most encouraging is that the star of this year's drama, Funny Cide, is likely to be a star in racing for years to come. The unbelievable saga of Funny Cide brought all kinds of new fans to horse racing, which bodes well for the future." NBC's coverage of the 2003 Visa Triple Crown earned a 6.8/18 combined rating for exclusive broadcasts of the Kentucky Derby, Preakness S. and Belmont S.

Campaigned exclusively in Dubai over the last two seasons, the chestnut's fortunes improved, winning four of his eight trips to the post and finishing runner-up in the Listed Jebel Ali Mile Mar 21. Adding Lasix for his U.S. bow, the gelding sped to the early lead, carried a 10-length advantage past the eighth pole and was ridden out to the win.

Walden Playing 'D' With Ipi Tombe:

Trainer Elliott Walden, who has said all along that his new stable star **Ipi Tombe (Zim)** (Manshood) would be pointed for the GI Arlington Million this summer, is now leaning towards a start in the GI Beverly D. on that same Aug. 16 program. "I don't have a decision right now, but I am leaning toward the Beverly D.," Walden said yesterday from Churchill Downs. She could prove very difficult to handle if she runs against her own sex. The five-year-old mare is coming off a scintillating victory against males in the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. on the Dubai World Cup undercard Mar. 29. The bay, owned by Team Valor, WinStar Farm and her original owners, Sunmark Partners, has been in Walden's hands since early spring and has done little wrong in her morning work, including a five-furlong breeze over the Churchill turf course June 5 in 1:01 1/5. "She's doing very well and has been doing very well since she came to me April 4," the conditioner commented. "Every time she steps on the racetrack she does well."

Arlington Reverts To Regular Post Time:

After experimenting with a 1:30 p.m. first post, officials at Arlington Park have decided to return to a 1:00 p.m. first race beginning Wed., June 25. "We felt that starting a half an hour later at 1:30 p.m. would allow more people to come to Arlington Park for a few races at the end of the day," explained Cliff Goodrich, president of the track. "However it is obvious that Arlington's on-track and off-track fans prefer the earlier post time." Post time for twilight racing on Fridays remains 3:00 p.m.

Miss Bridget Jones Runs For New Connections in Oaks:

Miss Bridget Jones (Peaks and Valleys), undefeated in three starts, has been purchased privately and will make her first start for trainer Laura de Seroux in Saturday's GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks. The chestnut, a three-length winner of the May 24 Stonerside S. at Lone Star Park, was acquired for a partnership including Marsha Naify, Robert Geringer and Berry Gordy's Vistas Stable. "She arrived Monday on a Tex Sutton charter, galloped Tuesday and breezed [Wednesday]," de Seroux said from her base at San Luis Rey Downs. Formerly owned by Turf Express Inc. and David Hulkewicz and trained by Cole Norman, Miss Bridget Jones will face a field of eight in the Oaks, headlined by GI Kentucky Oaks runner-up **Santa Catarina** (Unbridled).

Bare Necessities Could Try Azeri in Vanity:

Bare Necessities (Silver Deputy), winner of three straight starts, including the GIII Sixty Sails H. at Hawthorne Apr. 26, could take on reigning Horse of the Year Azeri (Jade Hunter) in the GI Vanity H. at Hollywood Park June 21. The four-year-old filly worked a bullet six furlongs in 1:12 4/5 in Inglewood Wednesday morning and is a good possibility to get her first crack at a Grade I stakes-placing next weekend. "I might run her in there," trainer Wally Dollase commented, citing a likely short field and an expected significant break in the weights from Azeri.

Sarafan To Pass on Japan:

Sarafan (Lear Fan), a nose second to Falbrav (Ire) in last year's G1 Japan Cup, will not be making a return trip to the Orient for the G1 Takarazuka Kinen at Hanshin June 29. The six-year-old would have been eligible for a bonus in excess of a half million dollars had he won the race. No reason was immediately available for the change in plans. Trained by Neil Drysdale and owned by Gary Tanaka, the gelding has made just one start this season, finishing third behind Mister Acpen (Chi) in a May 21 allowance event at Hollywood Park.

Outta Here Works for Affirmed:

Outta Here (Dehere), most recently a creditable seventh in the Kentucky Derby May 3, worked six furlongs in 1:13 yesterday morning at Hollywood Park and remains on track to make the June 22 GIII Affirmed H. at the Inglewood oval. "We're going in the Affirmed and the [July 13 GII] Swaps," said trainer Bill Currin, who added that he hopes he can lure jockey Kent Desormeaux back from Japan for the ride. "Otherwise I'll have to fly Lester Piggott in from England," he deadpanned. The winner of the inaugural Delta Jackpot S. last December, Outta Here was fourth to Victory Moon (SAf) in the G2 UAE Derby Mar. 29 prior to his Derby effort.
