### PAT EDDERY TO RETIRE

Pat Eddery, 11-times champion jockey and the second winning-most jockey of all time in Britain, has announced that he will retire at the end of the current season. Sitting 286 career successes short of the record holder Sir Gordon Richards, Eddery has decided to give up riding at the age of 51 and set up the Pat Eddery Racing Club. During a press conference at Windsor racecourse yesterday, Eddery, who boasts 4,585 winners, explained his reasons. "Obviously, I am going to miss the riding, but I've got to get on with my life and this is something new and exciting," he explained. "It's a wrench. I will miss the excitement of riding winners. I still feel I am happy riding, but the time has come to say that I can't go on for ever. This is a big day for me, to say that I am packing up. Horses and racing have been great for me all my life and I have enjoyed every minute of it. I've got no regrets." Eddery, who sprang to prominence in the mid-1970s when partnering Epsom Oaks and Derby winners Polygamy (GB) and Grundy (Ire) for Peter Walwyn, has partnered 14 English Classic winners and came within a length of winning a fourth Epsom Derby on The Great Gatsby (Ire) June 7. His successes in the English Classics were supplemented by international triumphs, including four renewals of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe between 1980 and 1987, two Breeders' Cup winners--aboard champions Pebbles (GB) and Sheikh Albadou (GB)--and an Arlington Million winner.

### BREEDERS' CUP ADDS SPONSORS, MONEY

The NTRA and Breeders' Cup Limited announced yesterday the addition of two corporate sponsors to the eight-race Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships, as well as a \$500,000 increase to two of the events, the G1 Bessemer Trust Breeders' Cup Juvenile and the G1 NetJets Breeders' Cup Mile. Automaker Dodge will assume the roles of title and divisional sponsor of the G1 Classic, renamed The Breeders' Cup Classic, Powered by Dodge. Nextel will assume those duties for the G1 Distaff, renamed the Nextel Breeders' Cup Distaff. In addition, Dodge will title the "Road to the World Thoroughbred Championships, Powered by Dodge" series of televised races leading up to the Breeders' Cup, to be aired this summer and fall on ESPN.

#### *The Coffers Swell...*

This is the third purse increase to the Breeders' Cup since its 1984 inception and the first since the purse for the Distaff was increased from \$1 million to \$2 million in 1998. "Boosting purses for the Mile and the Juvenile enables us to keep these races preeminent among other national and international events held during the fall season," said Breeders' Cup President D.G. Van Clief, Jr. The purse increase, which was approved by the Breeders' Cup and NTRA Boards of Directors at their spring meetings, will be funded by an increase in entry fees on all Breeders' Cup races from two percent to three percent effective this year.

#### *Big Apple Gets 2005 Breeders' Cup...*

Officials also confirmed yesterday the venue for the 2005 Breeders' Cup, to be hosted by Belmont Park in Elmont, New York, the site of the 2001 Breeders' Cup held just weeks after the 9-11 terrorist attacks. "The New York Racing Association is pleased and proud to welcome back the Breeders' Cup," said Barry Schwartz, Chairman of the Board and CEO of NYRA. "Belmont Park is a fitting site in its 100th anniversary season to showcase the best of Thoroughbred racing. New Yorkers showed their strong support of [the] Breeders' Cup in the wake of the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center in 2001." It will mark the fifth time the Breeders' Cup has been held at a NYRA track and the fourth at Belmont.

**A Long List of Greats...**

Eddery was quick to pay tribute to the horses and the people with whom he was associated throughout his distinguished career. "I've ridden for some great trainers over the years, had great jobs and worked with great people," he continued. "Winning my first Breeders' Cup, my first Derby and also my first Arc--they are all good memories. Horses like Golden Fleece, El Gran Senor, Dancing Brave, Pebbles, Bosra Sham, all stick in the back of my mind--they are all just as good as each other. It's difficult to pick out any one horse because there were so many good ones. The best Derby ride I ever had was Golden Fleece; he was fantastic the way he came from off the pace. And then Dancing Brave did the same at Longchamp. I've been lucky because we had the great [Lester] Piggott, Yves Saint-Martin, [Willie] Shoemaker--I rode against all of those guys and now we have got Frankie Dettori and Kieren Fallon, who are tough to beat. I'd have to say that in his heyday, Piggott was the hardest to beat. Socially he is great fun, but when you were riding against him he was very tough." With only 30 winners to his name so far this term, Eddery admitted, "It's difficult to keep on the best horses now," adding that it would have taken at least four years to get to Sir Gordon Richards' landmark. He also announced that bloodstock advisor Grant Pritchard-Gordon and established syndicate managers John Newman and Simon Double will form part of the Pat Eddery Racing Club, a joint venture with his wife Carolyn which will begin next year. "The first season we will be hoping to have about 20 horses and then build it up from there," he revealed. "I've got six yearlings of my own at home and I hope that some of them will join the syndicates. I am still going to be involved in what I really like--horses."

When I paid a visit to see Danehill Dancer three years ago, he was located at Kilsheelan Stud, a Coolmore substation where his services were priced at only 3,500 Irish guineas. When I saw him again at the end of last month, he was resident in Coolmore's main stallion yard, close to Sadler's Wells, and his fee had risen to 30,000 euros, or roughly £20,000.

It has been a similar story in Australia. Having started his Southern Hemisphere career at AUS\$7,500, he will be available at AUS\$27,500 when he returns to Coolmore's New South Wales branch later this summer.

Last week's Royal Ascot meeting showed exactly why Danehill Dancer has come so far in so short a time. Represented only by offspring sired during his bargain-basement years, he finished second to Kingmambo on the meeting's sires' table, with four of his progeny

finishing in the money. They were, of course, led by the sensational Australian sprinter Choisir, who is reportedly the result of a season which cost as little as AUS\$4,500.

Two of Danehill Dancer's Ascot earners were the two-year-olds Barbajuan (winner of his first two starts) and Fancy Foxtrot. These two, along with Rosina May, an unbeaten three-time winner, are members of a crop which will show just how effective their sire is. They were conceived in 2000, not long after 46 weanlings from Danehill Dancer's first crop had achieved a sales average of only 8,146 guineas. With only two of the 46 selling for over 20,000 guineas, his book in his third season was notable more for its quantity than its quality.

Certainly there was the occasional daughter of such good broodmare sires as Persian Bold, Darshaan, Shareef Dancer, Bering and Alleged, but these were considerably outnumbered by daughters of stallions whose cumulative Average Earnings Indices stand at less than 1.00 - stallions like Rainbows for Life, Tirol, Elbio, Cyrano de Bergerac, Maelstrom Lake, Waajib, Batshoof, Paris House, Masterclass, Interrex, Jareer, Nordico, Roi Danzig, Astronef and Shalford. There are even a few broodmare sires, such as Baba Karam, Naiyli and North Summit, which would test the knowledge of even the most enthusiastic of pedigree buffs. *Cont.p 4*

At this stage it is worth pointing out that Danehill Dancer's best Irish son, the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. winner Where or When, is out of an inexpensive Super Concorde mare which won only four of her 59 starts. His other Northern Hemisphere group winners are Lady Dominatrix, whose dam failed to win in 17 starts, and Ziria, whose dam retired winless after four starts. Bright Edge, another of Danehill Dancer's stakes winners, is out of a Beveled mare which gained the only win of her 18-race career as a four-year-old. Then there's his talented son Monsieur Bond, a good second to Zafeen in the G2 Mill Reef S., who is out of a non-winning mare and Lahinch, a head second in the G2 Rockfel S., who is out of an unraced mare.

It's fair to say, then, that Danehill Dancer has had to make his name the hard way. Perhaps it would have been a slightly different story had his racing career ended after his first five starts. At that point his record stood at four wins, including the G1 Heinz 57 Phoenix S., G1 National S. and G3 Greenham S., and a second, to Alhaarth, in the G1 Dewhurst S.

Unfortunately, the remainder of his career wasn't nearly as productive, yielding nothing better than a third in his last six starts. It looks now as though he should be judged on the first half of his career, rather than the second.

Could it be that history is repeating itself, because his record isn't dissimilar to that of his broodmare sire, the excellent Sharpen Up? Sharpen Up was a G1-winning two-year-old, unbeaten in five starts at that age, but he failed to win at three. Handicapped by the fact that his sire, Atan, was a virtual unknown, Sharpen Up plied his trade at the lower end of the market in his early years as a stallion, with seasons selling for as little as £300. He did so well, though, that he ended up commanding a fee of \$75,000 at Gainesway. Sharpen Up's rise to fame saw him sire performers of the calibre of Diesis, Kris, Trempolino, Pebbles, Sharpo, Selkirk and Sanglamore. It is going to be interesting to see whether Danehill Dancer can come close to accumulating such a star-studded collection, but he is going to have every chance now that he is covering quality mares at Coolmore. He is also bound to benefit from the tragic loss of his remarkable sire, Danehill.

It is hardly surprising that five of Danehill Dancer's six Group winners – Choisir, Lady Dominatrix, Ziria, Private Steer and Jar Jar Binks – have all excelled at distances short of a mile. His third dam, Lianga, was one of the fastest fillies of her generation, as she showed as a four-year-old in 1975. Although this formidable daughter of Dancer's Image stayed a mile well enough to run away with the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, she also won the Prix de l'Abbaye over five furlongs and the July Cup and the Vernons Sprint Cup over six. I doubt that it is just coincidence that Lianga ranks as the second dam of Mr. Greeley, another young stallion who has risen sharply through the ranks.

Although Choisir carries the (Aus) suffix of an Australian bred, both his sire and his broodmare sire, Lunchtime, were trained in England. Lunchtime was an easy winner of all three of his starts at two, including the G1 Dewhurst S., but his second season was very much an anti-climax and he was sent to Australia after three failures. This grandson of Tom Fool left his mark, especially through his son Snippets, who took the title of champion three-year-old sprinter. Snippets has done well this year with the G1 winners Hasna and Snowland.

Choisir's second dam, Pensive Mood, was by an Australian-bred sire in Biscay, an important stallion who created a flourishing branch of the Star Kingdom male line. However, Choisir's third, fourth, fifth and sixth dams were all by stallions imported from Britain and his seventh dam, Cohesion, was imported from Britain many years ago. Choisir's bloodlines are therefore predominantly European or American, but he still represents something of an outcross to many European mares, so it is hardly surprising that offers have reportedly been made for him to stay in Europe.

**Ipi Tombe to Debut in Locust Grove:**

South African champion **Ipi Tombe (Zim)** (Manshood {GB}), who won the G1 Dubai Duty Free at Nad al Sheba last time out Mar. 29, will make her American debut in Saturday's GIII Locust Grove H. at Churchill Downs, according to trainer Elliot Walden. "The timing of it is good, too, because you've got four weeks back to the [GI] Diana H. [at Saratoga July 26] and then three weeks back to the [GI] Beverly D. [at Arlington Park Aug. 16]," said Walden. "We're kind of looking at it as a three-race series. It allows me the chance to be flexible. If they put too much weight on her in the Diana, then we could just wait for the Beverly D." Pat Day will partner the four-year-old mare in this weekend's nine-furlong turf event.

**Mineshaft's First Work after Foster:**

**Mineshaft** (A.P. Indy), who was narrowly defeated by Perfect Drift in the GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill Downs June 14, breezed four panels in :50.60 over that track Monday as he prepares for an upcoming start in the \$500,000 GI Suburban H. at Belmont Park July 5. Exercise rider Annie Finney was aboard for the work. "He went nice--he went 11 and three [fifths] the last eighth," said trainer Neil Howard.
