ALEXANDER LOOKING FOR GOOSE REPEAT

It could be deja vu all over again for trainer Frank Alexander, when he saddles **Rhumb Line** (Mr. Greeley) to take on graded-stakes winners **Final Round** (Storm Cat), **Yell** (A.P. Indy) and **Roar Emotion** (Roar) in Saturday's GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont Park. It was only a year ago that the silver-haired conditioner sent out Nonsuch Bay, another daughter of Mr. Greeley, to win the nine-furlong event. Though the latter came into the Mother Goose with a graded-stakes victory to her credit, Alexander still thinks very highly of the less accomplished Rhumb Line. "She loves to train, she's very strong and she has a great mind," the conditioner commented. "Anyone can gallop her. She's quiet. She's got a great disposition." The chestnut filly, bred by Dixiana Farm and owned by Thorn Stable, has been impressive in winning each of her three career starts to date, including a four-length victory versus second-level allowance company going a flat mile at Belmont June 12. "She's been very impressive so far," he commented. "Only the good ones win their first three starts. Still, this is a big step up for her. She's going to have to improve." And as for comparisons to last year's winner? "I think this filly might be better than Nonsuch Bay," Alexander commented. "I think she can be a little better at nine furlongs. She's out of a Pleasant Colony mare [Rose Rhapsody]. She's just a pleasure to be around." The Mother Goose is the first leg of the revamped Triple Tiara Series. Subsequent races include the GI Coaching Club American Oaks over 1 1/2 miles July 19 and the 10-furlong GI Alabama S. at Saratoga Aug. 16. The New York Racing Association will award a \$2-million bonus to the connections of any filly to sweep the series.

NAYEF INCREASINGLY LIKELY FOR ECLIPSE

Nayef (Gulch) looks likely to tackle next Saturday's £350,000 G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown. Despite initial doubts as to the four-year-old's participation following his success in last Wednesday's G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot, trainer Marcus Tregoning told the *Racing Post* that he was "90 per cent certain" to start in the second leg of the £1-million BHB's Summer Triple Crown. The Sheikh Hamdan colorbearer is likely to be re-opposed by the Michael Jarvis-trained **Rakti** (GB) (Polish Precedent) and Luca Cumani-trained **Falbrav** (Ire) (Fairy King), second and fifth, respectively, in the Royal Ascot feature. South Africa will have their first representative in the Sandown showpiece when the Mike de Kock-trained **Victory**

Moon (SAf) (Al Mufti) bids to improve on his eighth-placing in last Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot. Tom Dascombe, assistant trainer to De Kock, commented yesterday, "He's extremely fast out of the gates and when he got in front there, he just pulled too hard so I think we'll probably just try and settle him in a bit. His main aim is the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. [at Ascot July 26], so we still don't want to get him ready too soon." Regular jockey Wayne Smith will replace Johnny Murtagh, who rode Victory Moon at Royal Ascot. Mark Johnston is looking to drop **Bandari** (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}) back in trip after his disappointing fourth-placing in Saturday's G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot, while the Henry Cecil-trained **Burning Sun** (Danzig) will bid to improve on his fifth placing in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 25. While **Norse Dancer** (Ire) (Halling) is to be supplemented, Clive Brittain was yesterday looking for "good or good to soft" ground before deciding whether to bolster the sophomore challenge with **Dutch Gold** (Lahib).

YAVANA'S PACE RETIRED Trainer Mark Johnston yesterday announced the retirement of **Yavana's Pace (Ire)** (Accordion {Ire}--Lady In Pace {Ire}, by Burslem {Ire}), the oldest horse to win a Group 1 event. Connections made the decision after the 11-year-old gelding failed to recover from a suspensory injury suffered when third in last September's G1 Canadian International at Woodbine. Last August, he rewrote the history books by securing his first success at the highest level in the G1 Credit Suisse Private Banking Pokal at Cologne. "Yavana's Pace is going home and has been retired," Johnston told the *Racing Post*. "We are still having bother with the old injury from last year and [owner and breeder] John Keaney had said very firmly that if it reared its ugly head at all then the horse had to finish. He's probably the most fun horse I've ever trained. Winning the Group 1 was the obvious high point." Also among Yavana's Pace's 16 career wins was the G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris in October 2001, one of five group-race victories.

The 4-5 favorite attended the speedy fractions (:21.99, :44.34 and :56.29) set by Rockin On Ready (Smoke Glacken) before sticking a head in front in upper stretch and forging clear late to score by one length over his persistent rival. "He hated the slop at Belmont last time," trainer Patrick Biancone said of the winner. "Today we picked out a beautiful day at Monmouth Park. This was exactly what we were looking for. We're on target for the Summit of Speed [at Calder July 12]. Our ultimate goal is the Breeders' Cup Sprint and today was the first step on that long journey." CDI Raises Over \$75,000 For TRF:

In a pair of events held in Louisville and Miami earlier this month, Churchill Downs Incorporated raised \$77,300 for the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation. All of the proceeds are to be earmarked for the care and feeding of horses retired to or being rehabilitated at TRF farms. The second annual Out to Pasture Party was held at the Kentucky Derby Museum June 13. The benefit dinner, which included both a live and silent auction, raised a grand total of \$75,200 for the TRF. The top price at the live auction was the \$6,000 bid for a commissioned oil painting by acclaimed equine artist Leslie Priggen. On June 14 at Calder Race Course, a trip for two to the 2004 Kentucky Oaks and Derby was raffled off for \$2,100. "CDI is pleased to partner with the TRF in support of the horses that are the heart of our industry," said Cathy Z. Rutter, CDI vice president of community relations. "We're committed to working with racehorse rescue and retirement organizations across the country to help secure a safe and healthy retirement for these hard-working equine athletes."

Morluc Recuperating Back Home:

Mike Cloonan's **Morluc** (Housebuster), who was injured in the GI Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot after pressing the early pace, has returned to trainer Randy Morse's barn at Churchill Downs and is awaiting further examination. The international turf star, a graded stakes winner who has earned over \$1 million, quickly faded to finish last of 17 in the Golden Jubilee and came out of the race with a badly swollen left front foot. Morse initially feared the severity of the injury would end the seven-year-old's career, but by the following day the swelling had subsided and the foot appeared "almost normal." Currently awaiting X-rays taken after Morluc's arrival at Churchill Wednesday, Morse added, "Maybe we'll get lucky. The [British veterinarians] looked at him over there. They X-rayed him and said the X-rays showed that he didn't break anything."

Churchill Pick Six Yields Record:

A single ticket holder walked away with the big prize Wednesday, \$1,168,136, after correctly selecting all the winners in the day's Pick Six wager, thus establishing an all-time Churchill Downs record. The winning ticket, processed through a wagering hub in Maine, was purchased at a simulcast outlet in Idaho. According to the Maine hub, the ticket holder invested \$6,720 for various combinations in the winning Pick Six ticket. The Pick Six grew over six consecutive days, which resulted in a carryover of \$329,989 heading into Wednesday's program and driving the total Pick Six pool to a record \$1,709,656. Tickets that contained five of Wednesday's six winners were worth a consolation payout of \$3,407. The previous record payout in a Churchill Downs Pick Six was \$417,389 on May 10, 1995.

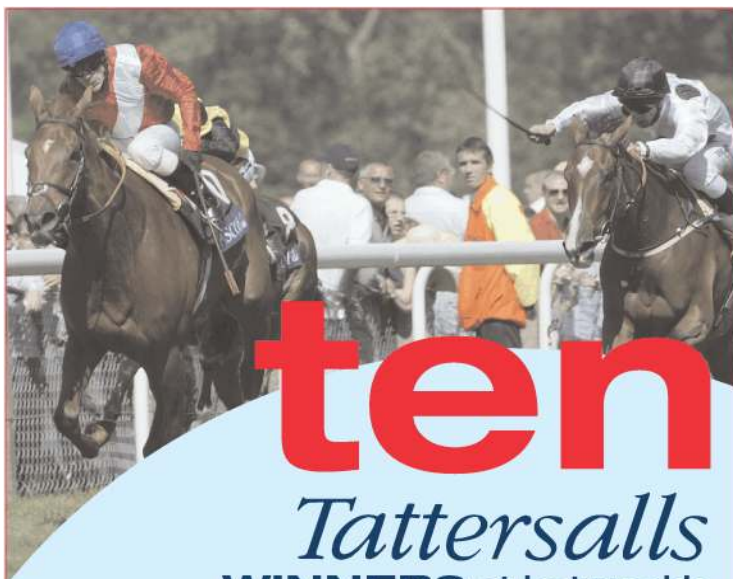

Surf N Sand has progressed into a very nice filly after finishing fifth in her lone three-year-old start last November, notching her fifth straight as the crowd's choice. After taking all three of her starts at Santa Anita earlier this spring, the bay proved she was a bi-coastal gal with a gate-to-wire victory at Churchill May 22. Things looked a bit grim early in this one as she swerved badly out of the gate, but she quickly recovered and was soon contesting the pace from a difficult five-wide position. Still well wide through the stretch, she gained control and outgamed Beat Your Feet to the wire under spirited handling.

BATTLER BOB (c, 4, Shuailaan--Dancing Deen, by Spend a Buck), a \$7,500 KEENOV weanling and \$55,000 KEESEP yearling who blossomed into a \$425,000 FTFFEB two-year-old, got past the NW1X level in his most recent as the 3-5 pick and was sent off the 6-5 choice to make it two straight. Stalking the leaders from an off-the-rail perch, he wrested command at the top of the stretch from a reluctant Smokin' John (Smoke Glacken) and bested that one by a 1 1/4-length margin. Brushing aside that foe on the turn, the first-time Lasix user was full of run through the stretch and won with ease by 4 1/4 lengths. Longshot Apple Crisp (You and I) completed the exacta. Researchers Closer to Solving Caterpillar Mystery:

Last year several studies produced solid evidence that the presence of Eastern Tent Caterpillars is strongly associated with the foal loss problem known as Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome. Research this spring has brought the equine industry closer to finding out how the caterpillars were causing the mares to lose their pregnancies. Results from the University of Kentucky's first-reported 2003 research trial indicate the causative agent may be associated with the caterpillar's exoskeleton. This trial looked at what happens when different parts of the caterpillar are fed to pregnant mares, and the only treatments that caused abortions were the ones involving the outside cuticle. "This is certainly evidence that we're moving in a forward direction to narrow our search for the exact cause," said Nancy Cox, associate dean for research in the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture.

Study Links Heart Size and Racetrack Performance:

A six-year study conducted by Equine Biomechanics and Exercise Physiology and involving over 7,000 horses, has shown a correlation between the heart size, strength and efficiency of yearlings and two-year-olds and future earnings performance on the racetrack. "Our study controlled variables by sex, age and weight--no study has ever done that with such a large sample size," said EQB Inc. President and CEO Jeffrey Seder. "In fact, most models were poor at best. The data was just not there, the database sample sizes were just too small to make any real claims." EQB's research for the study took place in the field, inside commercial operations and at public horse auctions. Two-dimensional echocardiograms were obtained as part of a pre-purchase evaluation, including Thoroughbreds offered for sale as potential racehorses at U.S. and European auctions and private breeding farms. The data was collected and analyzed against pedigree, conformation and subsequent racing performance results. "We learned that larger horses generally had larger hearts, regardless of their racetrack results," explained Charles Vickery III, who assisted Seder in statistical analysis. "And we learned that the definition of what were good heart measurements was especially sensitive to the sex and to the chronological age in the number of days. So we put a tight grip on those variables and only compared horses that were on the same playing field in every way, so to speak. In the end, the normalized data showed a strong and simple relationship between the two things we were left with--heart measurements and subsequent racing performance." The study found that heart size was a significant indicator of, not only distance running ability, but of ability at any distance. Other findings in the study: horses at the Keeneland July Select Yearling Sales (first two days) had consistently larger hearts than horses at other U.S. sales year after year. The average heart size differed at different auctions, showing a correlation to the average sale price at each auction. Certain sires and dams consistently produced offspring with a specific type of heart. EQB is a provider of bloodstock and Equine evaluation services for the Thoroughbred racing industry. The company currently maintains a database of gait and cardio information on over 35,000 racehorses. The study has been published in the Journal of Equine Veterinary Science, Vol. 23 #4.
