FATAL ATTRACTION

Despite a troubled trip, the 4-7 favorite **Attraction (GB)** (Efisio {GB}) delivered her killer kick with devastating effect to win yesterday afternoon's G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket. Her conformation has drawn widespread attention, with TV pundit John Francome hailing her "desperate pair of front legs," but in full flight here she managed to post an excellent time. In doing so, she took her career record to a perfect five for five, having scored at Nottingham and Thirsk before winning the Listed Hilary Needler Trophy at Beverley June 4 and beating Catstar by three lengths in the G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot last time June 18. Yesterday, Attraction came away from the stalls awkwardly and was forced to sit in behind the leaders in a departure from her customary trail-blazing style. When a gap opened up on the far rail approaching the final quarter, jockey Kevin Darley pointed her towards it and she quickened with relish to pass the field in a matter of strides and put daylight between her and her rivals. "Much has been made of the legs, but she moves brilliantly when she's asked to go," conditioner Mark Johnston commented. "She was locked up and was pulling for a bit, which was the last thing we wanted, and then she dropped back a length, but Kevin said she switched off and when the gap opened he couldn't believe it. He said that was Plan C, but it's great and I could never have imagined she would win that way. It has opened up so many possibilities--we were looking at the G1 Nunthorpe S. [at York Aug. 21] and the G2 Robert Papin [at Maisons-Laffitte July 27] because we were thinking of five furlongs, but now there's the G2 Lowther S. [at York Aug. 21] and G1 Cheveley Park S. [at Newmarket Oct. 2] over six as options." *Race chart p. 2. IRON FOAL TOPS JRHA FINALE

A colt from the second crop of Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), Europe's Iron Horse, topped yesterday's final session of the Japan Racing Horse Association's Select Foal Sale at the Northern Horse Park. The foal is out of Red Velvet (Avenue of Flags), a 3/4-sister to MGISW General Challenge (*for more on General Challenge see ATW p. 1*), and was consigned by Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm. He was purchased for ¥160 million by Fusaro Sekiguchi, who also bought Monday's sale-topping son of Sunday Silence. "Honestly, I do not know where he is going to run," Sekiguchi said when asked about the colt's future. "He has the pedigree to do well on dirt in America, but I would like to see how he grows up. If he proves to be good enough to compete in America, I will try it."

ALLUMETTE TOPS TATTS OPENER Allumette (GB) (Rainbow Quest), an unraced three-year-old out of G2 E. P. Taylor S. runner-up Flame Valley (Gulch), topped the bill yesterday at day one of the Tattersalls July Sale when bought by agent Paul Arnold for 90,000gns. The fledgling mare, offered from Cheveley Park Stud with a Medicean (GB) covering, was bought on behalf of Patrick Churchward's Westerlands Stud near Petworth in West Sussex. "She'll come back to Westerlands Stud and we usually breed to sell, so I would think the Medicean foal will be offered at some stage," said Churchward. "I've no idea who she'll be covered by, but she is free of Northern Dancer blood which gives us a lot of options." Earlier **Cassilis (Ire)** (Persian Bold), the eight-year-old dam of stakes-placed Gold Guest (GB) (Vettori {Ire}), was offered from Angmering Park Stud with a Desert Prince covering and a Pivotal colt foal at foot. Patrick Cooper of BBA Ireland outbid Frank Barry for the mare, securing her at 88,000gns. "I'd imagine pretty well everything will be resold at some stage," said Cooper, buying the mare for Ruari O'Coileain's Ennistown Stud in Co Meath. "When you think that Pivotal is standing for £25,000 this year and Desert Prince for €30,000 and that both will probably go up next year, it's not such an expensive package overall." Dual winner **Remedy (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) was another of Medicean's first book of mates and she earned 80,000gns for Cheveley Park Stud. Bought by the Curragh Bloodstock Agency's Eamonn Reilly, she will join Lady O'Reilly's Irish farm Castlemartin Stud, already home to the filly's half sister On Call (GB). The sale continues today at 9:30 a.m.

Millenary has become a stable stalwart at Arundel since taking the G1 St Leger at Doncaster in 2000, with subsequent highlights including successes in the G2 Jockey Club S. at the Rowley Mile and in this contest 12 months ago. Under a power-packed ride from the soon-to-be-retired Pat Eddery, he became the first horse to win back-to-back renewals since 1966. Blinkered for the first time to eradicate a tendency to hang in his races, he was able to direct his energy towards the wire to record his sixth career stakes success. Trainer John Dunlop said, "He's a grand horse who's done us very well indeed. He's not a great big robust horse, but has a lovely pedigree as he's from a Weinstock female family." Held up in last place throughout the early stages dominated by Zindabad (Fr) (Shirley Heights {GB}), Millenary responded to strong driving to catch Bandari at the furlong marker, where he jinked right towards the rail. Despite his characteristic wandering, he was kept true by the fence and powered up the rising ground to win with authority. Byron bids to emulate his sire Green Desert, who took this in 1985, and provide David Loder with his fifth renewal since 1994. He lived up to his pedigree when making an eye-catching debut in a course-and-distance maiden June 20, but needs to overcome a host of more experienced rivals in this contest. Heading those is **Holborn**, another son of the famous speedster, who had Byron's stable companion **Howick Falls** back in third when winning the Windsor Castle S. in impressive fashion at Royal Ascot last time June 21. Others hardened at the Royal meeting are **Nevisian Lad**, third in the G3 Norfolk S. June 18, and **Milk it Mick**, third in the Listed Chesham S. the following afternoon. **Parkview Love** beat the smart Cedarberg (UAE) and **Cape Fear** in the Listed Woodcote S. at Epsom June 7 and hails from a stable packed with juvenile talent this season. Trainer Richard Hannon, three-time winner of this event, saddles the maiden **Farewell Gift**, who was far from disgraced when runner-up to the smart Grand Reward at Newbury May 17.

Proudwings (Ger) was one of several campaigners who cemented the arrival of German-breds on the international scene when winning this two years ago. This year **Walzerkoenigin** picks up the baton and sets the standard in this renewal. She is not averse to flag flying herself, having won the G3 Prix Chloe at Chantilly on one of her French sojourns last June. She returned to native soil to take the G2 Euro-Cup at Frankfurt in September en route to finishing sixth behind Bright Sky (Ire) in the competitive G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp the following month. She had too many guns for group winners Salselon (GB) and Gateman (GB) in the G2 Premio Emilio Turati in Milan May 18 and stands out on that form despite the three-pound penalty she carries as a result. **Macadamia** steps up markedly in class having won the Royal Hunt Cup at Royal Ascot last time June 18 and completes the duo of older horses taking on the sophomores here. The pick of those may be **Hold to Ransom** (Red Ransom), who showed the benefit of a drop back to this trip when powering away with the Listed Sandringham S. at Royal Ascot last time June 21.

Sunday Silence Dominates

The second-highest priced lot at yesterday's final session of the JRHA Foal sale was lot number 178, a bay colt by Sunday Silence out of group and graded stakes winner Fanjica (Ire) (Law Society). Kazuhisa Okawa, racing manager to Takaya Shimakawa, made the winning bid while speaking to the owner by telephone. Shimakawa, who owns a natural foods company based at Sendai City, paid a sales-record ¥335 million for a Sunday Silence colt at this sale last year. Riichi Kondo, underbidder on the session topper, was able to take home lot 223, a son of Sunday Silence out of Japanese graded stakes winner Promotion (Jpn) (Hector Protector) for ¥139 million. "I missed hip number 180, but my assessment on 223 is as good as 180, so I am happy," Kondo said. While no trainer has been decided for the foal, Kondo added, "I believe a long list of trainers will want to train him." The chestnut was consigned by Northern Farm.

The Final Figures

The two-day sale showed a 12.8-percent increase in average and a 10.5-percent increase in median. The 23.6-percent buyback rate is the lowest in the sale's six-year history. "This is an amazing result," said Teruya Yoshida, vice chairman of the JRHA. "I do not think there is any other sale in the world which sells ¥7.073 million for two days," he added, referring to the auction's record gross. "I understand the power of the last crop by Sunday Silence was great, and it is true that the market was boosted by the offspring of Sunday Silence," Yoshida continued. "On the other hand, I am very glad to see the sons and daughters of young sires were also sold very well. And what was also pleasing for us was to see a lot of money from newcomers was invested in the market."

BREAK'S OVER

As recently as 1997, the Fasig-Tipton July sale grossed less than \$10 million, averaged \$52,708, and had a median of \$37,000. Five years later, in 2002, the gross was just under \$31.8 million, and the average and median had each nearly doubled, to \$97,815 and \$70,000, respectively. In fact, average and median had reached those levels in 2001, when 455 yearlings were catalogued, of which just 237 sold (52 percent of those catalogued), grossing \$23.1 million. Last year, an even 600 were catalogued, of which 325 (54 percent) sold; so Fasig's achievement in 2002 was that they increased the catalogue by a third, yet still sustained a \$97,000 average and \$70,000 median.

The loss of roughly a third of this year's early Kentucky yearlings to the MRLS caterpillars is, as everyone knows, having a huge impact on this year's summer sales. It's already delivered the KO punch to Keeneland's storied July sale, already weakened by the inexorable rise of its sister September sale. Fasig July will be the only show in town next week, and its catalogue is down almost a quarter in number from 2002. There are 463 catalogued this year, versus 600 last year, though it's almost the same number as the 455 in 2001.

It's difficult to know exactly what impact no Keeneland will have on Fasig. Keeneland's gross had plummeted from \$80 million in 2000 to only \$42 million last year. As prices of racehorses on the private market seem sky-high right now, I'm projecting a 10-percent rise in average for Fasig, plus I'm projecting a five-percent improvement in the clearance rate (58 percent of the catalogue, which would be 266). These projections would result in a gross of \$28.3 million, but even if Fasig is that good--strong demand combined with scarcity of value being the two principal factors--the week's gross will be down \$46 million from last year, and down nearly \$80 million from 2000. Total receipts for the four main North American sales-- Keeneland July, Fasig July, Saratoga, and Keeneland September--were \$440 million in 2000, \$402 million in 2001, and \$320 million last year. MRLS and the canonization of the September Sale make it unlikely last year's figure can be matched, but Fasig July was a better barometer of the market last year than Keeneland July anyway. If the average and the clearance rate are up at Fasig, it could mean we'll see a strong yearling market, even if gross receipts do fall.

Fasig Sires...

One feature of Fasig July the last few years has been its New Sire Showcase, and this year almost the whole first day consists of yearlings by sires with their first yearlings or two-year-olds. This isn't the sale for the big guns; there are two each by [Fusaichi Pegasus](#) and [Lemon Drop Kid](#), one by [War Chant](#), and none by [Giant's Causeway](#). Airdrie has always used this sale to introduce their young sires, and this year the 2000 Met Mile winner Yankee Victor, a son of Saint Ballado, is the top first-year stallion, represented by 16 yearlings. Two Grade I-winning sons of A.P. Indy, Lane's End's [Stephen Got Even](#) and Adena Springs's Golden Missile, have 10 and nine catalogued, respectively. [High Yield](#), a triple Grade I winner by Storm Cat, is among four who each have eight entered. The others are Belmont winner Commendable, two-time Grade 1-placed two-year-old Chief Seattle and the very fast Yes It's True. He is a Florida-based grandson of Raja Baba by Is It True.

Ashford's [Honour and Glory](#) was leading freshman sire of 2000 and he leads all sires with 17 representatives at Fasig. Ashford also stands [Thunder Gulch](#), whose first-crop daughter Spain won the 2000 Breeders' Cup Distaff; he has 13 in the sale. Spendthrift's [Mr. Greeley](#), who has been steadily working his way up the ladder, has 12.

Five sires with their first two-year-olds showed the Fasig judges enough to merit the inclusion of 7-10 yearlings from their second crops. These were: Artax (10), Old Trieste (9), [Tactical Cat](#) (9), Mazel Trick (7), and Real Quiet (7). More established sires [Forest Wildcat](#), [Gilded Time](#), and [Meadowlake](#) have eight each, while [Distorted Humor](#) is another with seven. Bet those sell well.

Four Sprinters, Three Deputy Ministers...

The stars were in the right alignment for [Grand Slam](#) on Sunday afternoon, because he had his first two graded stakes winners within about 15 minutes. First, three-year-old Strong Hope, a \$1.7-million yearling out of a Deputy Minister mare, led all the way to win the GII Dwyer, then two-year-old Limehouse captured the GIII Bashford Manor on closing day at Churchill. Interestingly, both the Dwyer second Nacheezmo and the very unlucky Bashford Manor third, favorite Cuvee, are both by [Carson City](#). But that's another story. Grand Slam also had a spate of winners over the weekend, and two more two-year-old fillies place in graded stakes. He's still just fourth on the cumulative earnings list for second-crop North American sires, but in the last month he has closed the gap behind third-placed [Eusive Quality](#) from \$380,000 to just \$12,000.

Seven sires from this group have now topped the \$2-million mark in progeny earnings, headed of course by Funny Cide's sire [Distorted Humor](#), who has two Grade I winners, four graded stakes winners and seven stakes winners in all. [Tale of the Cat](#), a stablemate of Grand Slam, had the winner of Churchill's GIII Debutante, his second stakes-winning two-year-old filly this year, and first graded stakes winner. He has 13 stakes horses, and is still in second among this group, with Elusive Quality (11 stakes winners) in third and Grand Slam (15 stakes horses) in fourth. Then come the three Deputy Ministers. Awesome Again has had a \$500,000 month, and is back up to fifth, just ahead of Deputy Commander and Touch Gold. But what a salty bunch.

Indian Charlie has steadily maintained eighth place among this group the last couple of months. He only

has one stakes winner, but with eight stakes-placed so far, he's a good bet for his \$10,000 stud fee. Stormy Atlantic (10th), who moved from Florida to Kentucky this year, has four stakes winners, two graded. [Cape Town](#) (13th) has only one stakes winner, but it is the country's top three-year-old filly Bird Town. And [Swain](#) has worked his way up to 21st, thanks to Dimitrova, who dominated Saturday's American Oaks. Significantly, she was third in the Irish 1000 Guineas last time out, beaten by Yesterday and Six Perfections; yet more evidence of the exceptional group of three-year-old fillies in Europe this year.
