**FREAK OR UNIQUE?**

**Choisir (Aus)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) provides another chance for the British crowds to witness his impression of Halley's Comet in this afternoon's G1 Darley July Cup over the six furlongs of Newmarket's July Course. While the majority of the racing world is still reeling from the imposing chestnut's incredible double of the G2 King's Stand S. and G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot, Australia's new icon is ready to go again. He already has the measure of 12 of his rivals today and somebody up there must really like him as he is even drawn in the one hole. While he had the luck of the draw when easily beating **Acclamation (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) and **Oasis Dream (GB)** (Green Desert) by a length and 1 1/2 lengths, respectively, in the first leg of his double at the Royal meeting June 17, a wide hole failed to stop him from beating the flying filly **Airwave (GB)** (Air Express {Ire}) four days later. While that filly was in season, her performance in defeat suggests she ran to her best and it may be that she has to return to the minimum trip over which she produced one of the displays of the 2003 campaign in the G2 Temple S. at Sandown May 26. She shared the plaudits in the fall with Oasis Dream, who covered the same strip of ground to beat **Tomahawk** (Seattle Slew) to win the G1 Middle Park S. in course-record time. While the latter has gone the mile Classic route Aidan O'Brien used for 2001 winner Mozart (Ire), Oasis Dream has been pointed firmly at the sprinting championships. His third placing behind Choisir on his return over the inadequate trip of the G2 King's Stand S. last time was all the more creditable as he raced under a penalty for his Group 1-winning exploits. The extra furlong will be in his favour and he must be respected as he bids to emulate last year's winner **Continent (GB)** (Lake Coniston {Ire}), who was placed in the King's Stand before winning this. Continent led home a one-two for David Nicholls 12 months ago when beating **Bahamian Pirate** (Housebuster), but both need to improve markedly on their efforts so far this term to cope with this stronger renewal. **Membership** (Belong to Me) may need further than this six, but showed he is not far off top-class when dealing impressively with his rivals in the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot last time June 18. (*Field p2*)

**BAHRI FILLY TOPS TATTS WEDNESDAY**

**Littleton Arwen (Bahri)**, a three-year-old filly who picked up black-type with a second in the Eternal S. at Warwick last month, is returning to trainer Terry Mills after the Epsom handler opted to bid 110,000gns to see off agents James Delahooke and the BBA Ireland's

Patrick Cooper at the Tattersalls July Sale yesterday. "It was just in my gullet that I couldn't let her go to someone else having done all the work with her and nearly landed a Listed race," said Mills, who had consigned the filly to settle a debt. "I'll win a Group race with her." **Barney McCall (Ire)** (Grand Lodge), a dual winner over 10 furlongs at Windsor this season for

Amanda Perrett, had stepped up the tempo shortly beforehand, when Delahooke outlasted first owner Bernard Gover and finally French agent Crispin de Moubray to secure the colt for 95,000gns. "She is for a new English owner with Richard Phillips," said Delahooke. "But may go back to Amanda Perrett to run at Goodwood before going jumping with Richard." The sale finishes today with a session at 9:30 a.m. when recent Italian G3 winner **Clifden (Ire)** (Gold Away {Ire}) is expected to lead the way. (*Wednesday toppers p2*)

**King Hesperus** has to defy a three-pound penalty picked up for winning the Listed Rochestown S. at Leopardstown June 11 and meets a clutch of unexposed types in this competitive event, upgraded from Listed status for the first time. **Bayeux** was barely visible when he beat seven subsequent winners in a fog-bound Goodwood maiden May 21 and will make his presence felt here. He is the choice of jockey Frankie Dettori over all-weather scorers **Manntab** and **Romarc**. The former was runner-up behind the smart One Cool Cat in a maiden at York June 14 before following up in impressive fashion in a Wolverhampton maiden two weeks later.

Macadamia had proven herself as a top-class handicapper and a stakes winner previously, but she finally established her name among the finer performers of her sex in powering to success in this contest. She started this term with a maiden and conditions score to her name, but shaped as though there was more to come when finishing a neck runner-up to Akshar (Ire) in a conditions race at Goodwood May 29. After beating the smart Monturani (Ire) by 3½ lengths in the Listed Pipalong S. at Pontefract June 9, she defied a penalty to win the prestigious Royal Hunt Cup at Royal Ascot last time June 18. Positioned in a stalking role by Jamie Spencer throughout the early stages, she was asked to quicken approaching the final quarter and picked up to grab the lead with 1½ furlongs remaining. Stretching out well up the rising ground, she was comfortably clear as Waldmark overcame a troubled trip to close under Kieren Fallon. "She has done nothing but improve and has got stronger from three to four," Fanshawe commented. "I gave her an entry in the G1 Nassau S. [at Goodwood Aug. 2] this morning, so we may step her up to 10 furlongs, but the ultimate aim is the G2 Sun Chariot S. [at Newmarket Oct. 4]." Two similarly bred sons of Seattle Slew sired G1 winners bred on the same cross over the holiday weekend. The sameness in pedigree patterns and status of victory stands in an intriguing counterpoint to the locations--on opposite coasts--and the extremes of distances involved.

On the East Coast, Mineshaft, regarded by many as the best older horse in the country, took his U.S. record to seven wins in nine starts with an impressive victory in the GI Suburban H., run over 10 furlongs, a distance which passes for a test of stamina these days. Just a few hours later on the West Coast, Joey Franco took the seven-furlong GI Triple Bend H. by a hard-fought head.

Mineshaft is an impeccably bred son of A.P. Indy out of the multiple Grade I-winning Mr. Prospector mare Prospectors Delite and is a brother to multiple Grade I winner Tomisue's Delight. Although nowhere near as fashionably bred, Joey Franco owns a very similarly structured pedigree, as he is by Avenue of Flags--like A.P. Indy, a Seattle Slew son whose pedigree combines Buckpasser and Bold Ruler--and his dam is by a son of Mr. Prospector.

While A.P. Indy retired as Horse of the Year and with a reputation of being his sire's best son, Avenue of Flags never won a stakes race. He did, however, show well above average ability in his brief career. From two juvenile outings, he captured a maiden race at Hollywood Park and finished second in the GII Hollywood Juvenile Championship. Seen just once more in public, Avenue of Flags ended his career with a win in 6 1/2-furlong Hollywood Park allowance race at three.

He retired to Golden Eagle Farm in Ramona, California, in time to sire five foals that year. Three of these reached the races and two won, neither scoring in a black-type event. It was with his following year's crop that Avenue of Flags began to show his worth. From 28 foals and 20 starters, he was represented by five stakes winners, headed by the GII La Canada and GII El Encino S. winner Belle's Flag and the GII Fall Highweight H. winner Victor Avenue. Avenue of Flags's progress has continued (slightly interrupted by a one-horse crop in 1997) and his tally of stakes winners now stands at 18. In addition to Joey Franco, these also include additional Grade I winner Notable Career and other GSWs Fleet Lady and Really Happy.

Joey Franco's dam Susan Powter, a daughter of the Mr. Prospector horse Native Prospector, started four times without ever achieving a place. She has, however, been a much better producer than runner. From her first five foals, she is the dam of four starters and four winners. The best of these prior to Joey Franco was her first foal, the Present Value filly Miss Lawless, winner of the restricted Bay Meadows Matron H. Susan Powter was herself half-sister to three stakes-winning sprinters, the best of which was What Luck's son What a Spell, winner of the Baldwin S. Susan Powter's dam Spell Victory was a winning half-sister to the black-type winning and graded stakes placed Mimi Baker, and also to Loose Wire, the dam of graded scorers Wire Me Collect and Scottish Monk and granddam of graded stakes winner Scott the Great.

Since Spell Victory was by the Northern Dancer horse Dance Spell, she owned a rather interesting pedigree. Spell Victory's granddam is the famed tap-root mare Nangela, a daughter of Northern Dancer's sire Nearctic. This gives Spell Victory Nearctic 3x3 at the top and bottom of her pedigree. What is more interesting, however, is that Nangela's third dam Sybil's Niece is a 3/4-sister to Nearctic. The fact of having 3/4-siblings 1x3 in her pedigree didn't seem to negatively impact Nangela as a racehorse, as she was one of the better Canadian juvenile fillies of her generation, winning the Carleton S. and finishing second in both the Mazarine S. and Natalma S. Of course at stud, Nangela has become ancestress of a veritable legion of top-class horses. The majority of these descend through her Canadian Oaks winner Square Angel and include Canadian champions Kamar and Key to the Moon; Swain and Fantastic Light, both champions in Europe; North American champion two-year-old filly Golden Attraction; and other Grade I winners Gorgeous, Cape Town, Cuddles and Tap to Music. *(cont. p5)*

Nangela's unusual pedigree becomes particularly pertinent when we come to look at Joey Franco, the first Grade I winner from the branch of the family which stems from Nangela's daughter Miss Nanith. Joey Franco's sire Avenue of Flags is free of Northern Dancer and Nearctic, but when we look at his broodmare sire Pass the Glass, we see that he is out of the mare Amerigo Lady. An outstanding runner who earned over \$400,000 back in the late 1960's, Amerigo Lady is by Amerigo (by Nearco and with a second dam by Hyperion, where Nearctic is a Nearco/Hyperion cross), and is out of a mare by the New Zealand-bred Count Rendered, whose dam is not only a 3/4-sister to Nearctic, but also a sister to the fourth dam of Nangela.

As far as Joey Franco is concerned, this means he has two genetic relatives to Nearctic in the middle of his own pedigree and two crosses of Nearctic along with a 3/4-sister to Nearctic in his granddam. In closing, we should mention that Joey Franco is a long way from being the only good Avenue of Flags to benefit from the sire's connection to Nearctic. Avenue of Flags' other GISW Notable Career has a second dam by Northern Dancer, and Nearctic through Northern Dancer appears in Avenue of Flags' graded stakes winners Belle's Flag, Victor Avenue and Really Happy as well as stakes winners Avenue Shopper, Avenue of Style and Danceoftheflags. Nearctic also makes an appearance in stakes winner Wild and Wise via his grandson Icecapade, and so is in nine of 18 Avenue of Flags stakes winners and five of six graded stakes winners.

Nevisian Lad weaved through the gaps under Kieren Fallon to beat Cape Fear by a length yesterday at Newmarket. Showing the same tardiness from the gates he had displayed on his two previous starts, the 4-1 second favorite appeared boxed in on the rail behind pacesetter Parkview Love and was not traveling like the winner before halfway. As Byron struck the front at the eighth-pole, the gap appeared for Nevisian Lad and he showed impressive acceleration to burst through and hit the front with 100 yards remaining before holding the rally of Cape Fear and jockey Eddie Ahern. "He has a funny sort of action and it takes him time to warm up, but he hasn't shown yet what he is going to do," Fallon explained. "He won easily there when he got out and came back on the bridle, beating a decent field. He has a big future and is a horse that's progressing all the time." Conditioner Michael Bell added, "He had a tiny stress fracture of the tibia before Ascot [and] needed three weeks off, so I was delighted to finish so close to Kheleyf as I know David [Loder] thinks a lot of that colt. Kieren [Fallon] said he'll get seven furlongs, but six suits him well so we'll consider either the G1 Prix Morny [at Deauville Aug. 31] or the G2 Gimcrack S. [at York Aug. 20]."

**KAFWAIN OFFICIALLY RETIRED** The Thoroughbred Corporation's **Kafwain** (Cherokee Run--Swazi's Moment, by Moment of Hope), withdrawn days before the Kentucky Derby with a strained tendon in his right foreleg, has been officially retired from racing. Bred in Kentucky by Dr. & Mrs. R. Smiser West, the dark bay colt was purchased out of the Keeneland September Sale for \$170,000 by Becky Thomas, who successfully resold him for \$720,000 at the Fasig-Tipton February Sale the following winter. The winner during his juvenile campaign of the GIII Best Pal S. and GII Norfolk S., the Bob Baffert trainee was second to stablemate and eventual champion Vindication in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile and crossed the line second by a head in the GI Hollywood Futurity, only to be disqualified to fourth. In three starts at three, Kafwain was the impressive winner of the GII San Vicente S., was disqualified to 10th from a runner-up finish in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 9 for a clenbuterol overage, and was third in the GI Santa Anita Derby in what would be his final start Apr. 5. He retires with a lifetime record of 11-4-2-2 and earnings of \$715,848. A Wild Rush half brother to Kafwain, consigned by Dr. & Mrs. West's Waterford Farm, is scheduled to be sold next Thursday at Fasig-Tipton.

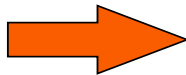
