IN DREAMS

In yesterday's exceptional renewal of the G1 Darley July Cup, **Oasis Dream (GB)** (Green Desert) battled past the indomitable **Choisir (Aus)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) up Newmarket's hill to win by 1 1/2 lengths. Sent off at odds of 9-2 behind the Australian hero, who headed the market at 9-4, the Juddmonte sophomore showed fine early speed to move across from his middle berth and tackle that trailblazer inside the final quarter. "The plan was to ride a positive race," winning trainer John Gosden commented. "We had to ride an aggressive race so that when we attacked Choisir up the hill we only had two lengths to make up. There was no point in trying to come at him from six back, because he comes again." Three-year-old filly **Airwave (GB)** (Air Express {Ire}) was trapped in traffic before closing with a rush to be third. **Cont. p2**

SPEED TO BURN

Calder Race Course will host its fourth annual Summit of Speed Saturday afternoon when four graded stakes worth \$1.6 million will be contested. In 2003, Orientate won the GIII Smile Sprint H. on his way to the Eclipse Award as the nation's top sprinter, while 2001 champion three-year-old filly Xtra Heat ran second to **Gold Mover** (Gold Fever) in the GII Princess Rooney H.

"We raised the bar last year getting Orientate and Xtra Heat to come in for these races," Calder's racing secretary Bob Umphrey told *Daily Racing Form*. "And while we might not have a marquee name of their caliber this year, overall from top to bottom this is definitely the finest renewal yet." Gold Mover will face seven rivals in her title defense

of the \$500,000 Princess Rooney, while New York shipper **Shake You Down** (Montbrook) has a four-race winning streak on the line in the \$500,000 Smile. Eleven three-year-old males will contest the \$300,000 GIII Carry Back S., including local standout Awesome of Course (Awesome Again). "He's a horse that you have to keep busy to keep him fit...this one has been our goal for a long time," said his trainer, Jim Hatchett. Hatchett will also saddle sophomore **Hear No Evil** (Carson City) in the Smile as well as **Crimson and Roses** (El Prado {Ire}) in the \$300,000 GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup S. for three-year-old fillies. **Previews cont. p4**

A DREAM COME TRUE While jockey Richard Hughes was asking the question of **Oasis Dream (GB)** (Green Desert) in the G1 Darley July Cup, Johnny Murtagh was pressing the panic button aboard Choisir and, despite the Aussie giant's game response to the call to arms, he could not find as much as the winner on the notorious uphill climb. "I actually missed the kick as he was standing so quiet," explained Hughes, completing an afternoon stakes double. "Rather than give him a slap on the shoulder to get out in front, I left him be and he pinged away from the gate. Having been a length down on the horse beside me within 50 yards he was in front of him. Johnny was going well on the fence, but I was going equally as well. When I got to him he went again and the two of us were level pegging for a good 50 yards but then I outstayed him." For conditioner John Gosden, it was vindication of the plan to bypass the mile Classics and concentrate on the sprinting route. Despite being a half to G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine Zenda (GB), there was bountiful evidence that speed was Oasis Dream's forte when he broke the six-furlong track record at the Rowley Mile in winning the G1 Middle Park S. in October. He reportedly needed the race when returning to be third to behind Choisir under a penalty for that success in the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 17, and moved forward off that effort to just miss Stravinsky's 1999 track record. As for the colt's next start, Gosden said, "We'll be looking at the G1 Nunthorpe S. [at York Aug. 21]." He is unlikely to meet Choisir in that five-furlong test and the Australian colt's trainer Paul Perry was philosophical afterwards, commenting, "He's been beaten by a horse that was trained for the race. The winner was on his way up, while we were probably just on the way down. He's done the job he came here for and it was a very courageous effort to finish second in a race that was really just an afterthought." Trainer Henry Candy, however, is pointing the 11-4 second choice **Airwave (GB)** (Air Express {Ire}), who overcame a troubled trip to finish third, at a rematch over five furlongs. "Kieren [Fallon] had some trouble getting a run and she might have been a bit unlucky, although she would not have have beaten the winner," he said. "We will train her for the Nunthorpe."

Kings Point was left trailing by the smart Kheleyf when runner-up in a five-furlong York maiden on his debut May 13 before finishing fourth behind Parkview Love in the Listed Woodcote S. at Epsom June 7. Stepped up to six furlongs for his maiden score last time at Kempton June 29, he showed enough there to prompt connections to make this swift return to the track and he justified that decision to grind out his first stakes score. Settled in a stalking role on the far fence by Richard Hughes as Chester Le Street was sent to the front by Darryll Holland, he made smooth progress to challenge that rival and reeled him in up the hill to assert in the final strides. "It took a while to get past the Mark Johnston horse, as usual, but he's a very brave little horse," Hughes commented. "The only concern was that it was a little bit fast. CLIFDEN TOPS TATTERSALLS Sheikh Rashid bin Mohammed al Maktoum, son of Sheikh Mohammed, bought the top lot at the 2003 Tattersalls July Sale yesterday when paying 170,000gns through agent David Metcalfe for the Italian Group 3 winner **Clifden (Ire)** (Gold Away {Ire}), who sold as [Lot 498](#). Sheikh Rashid, who won Wednesday's G2 TNT July S. at Newmarket with Nevisian Lad, will keep the juvenile with his present trainer Mark Wallace for the rest of the season. "We liked the horse very much and he's already a Group 3 winner," said Metcalfe, who saw off David Redvers to get the colt. "He will go back to Mark, who has done really well this season." Wallace, who has made a great start to his training career, was happy with the transaction and said, "I'm delighted, especially as he's coming back to me. The owners have had a good touch and I still get to train the horse." The July Sale turnover fell by 11 percent from 2002, although the 11,285gns average was a new high and the 6,000gns median, although never bettered, had been achieved five times before. Edmond Mahony, the Tattersalls chairman, said, "It is hard to draw too many conclusions from a mixed sale such as the July Sale, but as ever we have seen a truly cosmopolitan cast of buyers at Park Paddocks this week which has produced a record average and turnover second only to last year's sale, which was significantly larger. There have been a number of individual highlights, most notably the 170,000gns for the Group 3-winning two-year-old Clifden, which is a record for a two-year-old at this sale, but the crucial element has been the clearance rate. Very few horses have failed to find buyers which is a massive endorsement of the enduring popularity of this sale. Quality consignments from so many of the major owner/breeders, including Cheveley Park Stud, Darley, Juddmonte, Gainsborough Stud Management and Shadwell Estates, have made a huge contribution to the continued development of the July Sale and it is great to see such support rewarded."

Conditioner Paddy Mullins yesterday reported **Vintage Tipple (Ire)** (Entrepreneur {GB}) on course for Sunday's G1 Darley Irish Oaks at The Curragh. Jockey Frankie Dettori will take the ride. Sidelined after finishing runner-up to Walayef in the G3 Athasi S. at the track Apr. 27, she has continued to please connections ahead of Sunday's Classic. "Vintage Tipple worked this morning and did it well," Mullins's son Tom told *Irish Racing online* yesterday. "We're very pleased with her." Apart from the **Yesterday (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), **L'Ancrese (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) and **Snippets (Ire)** (Be My Guest), the domestic team looks likely to be bolstered by **Juliette (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), **Miss Nashwan (Ire)** (Nashwan) and **Jakarta Jade (Ire)** (Royal Abjar). Officials at The Curragh are hoping that the track will dry from its current state of yielding by Sunday.

CHAMPION WAYWARD LASS DEAD *Wayward Lass* (Hail the Pirates--Young Mistress, by Third Martini), champion three-year-old filly of 1981, died in late June at Contemporary Stallions in Coxsackie, New York. She was 25. The Flying Zee Stables colorbearer won two-thirds of the Triple Tiara as a three-year-old in 1981, capturing the GI Mother Goose S. and GI Coaching Club American Oaks, via disqualification, on her way to championship honors. A winner of six stakes events, she finished on the board in 22 of 25 starts while earning \$435,237 for trainer Jose Martin. She was retired after her sophomore campaign and went on to produce 12 winners from 14 starters. Wayward Lass was in foal to Contemporary stallion City Zip when she died. She was buried on the farm.

★ **NEW YORK** ★

Wednesday Spill Update:

Jockey Luis Chavez sustained a broken right collarbone and a cut right hand in a three-horse spill during Wednesday's ninth race at Aqueduct. It is uncertain how long he will be out of action. The other two riders involved were Javier Castellano and apprentice Shannon Uske. Castellano walked off the track uninjured, while Uske was taken to North Shore University Hospital with abdominal pain. She was released Wednesday night. "She's just beat up," said her agent, Ralph Theroux Jr. "They did a CAT scan, internal sonogram and x-rays, and everything came back negative." Uske is expected to be back in the saddle within a week. The three horses which fell are all doing well, according to NYRA's chief examining veterinarian Dr. Celeste Kunz. "We gave them a good look over after the race," she said. "They were more shocked than anything else."

Midnight Charlie finished a distant fourth going a mile through the Aqueduct sloop Apr. 26, but atoned for that effort two back, upsetting a local allowance field over this trip by a neck at nearly 20-1 May 15. The dark bay came back to Earth in his latest, checking in an even fifth to Posse and Midas Eyes in the GII Riva Ridge Breeders' Cup S. June 7, and was the second longest shot in this quintet. Content to trail for the opening half mile, the dark bay colt charged five wide off the far turn, caught Turn Back the Time nearing the eighth pole and held gamely for another narrow decision.
