MR. GREELEY FILLY TOPS F-T FINALE

A filly by Mr. Greeley attracted a bid of \$500,000 from Robert E. Courtney on behalf of Jaime S. Carrion to top Thursday's session of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Summer Yearling Sale in Lexington. "She absolutely fills your eyes," said Carrion, who survived a bidding war with Stan Fulton and Japanese interests to secure the chestnut. "I was dead set on buying her. I knew that I was going to buy her the second that I saw her. She's absolutely beautiful and of course she is very well bred, which helps." Selling as [hip 449](#) from the consignment of her breeders John and Jane Mulholland, the February foal is out of SW Good for Her (Topsider) and is a half sister to SW Chris's Bad Boy (Marquetry), and has GSW Sweet and Ready (El Prado {Ire}) under her

second dam. Carrion was immediately taken with the filly, according to his trainer Eddie Plesa, Jr. "Jamie saw her from a distance, walked all of us over to her and that was it," said the Florida-based Plesa, who trains approximately 10 horses for Carrion. "I really didn't think I'd have to go that far to get her," said Carrion. "But I had to have her." The underbidder on the filly was Nama Imamura, the daughter of Japanese owner Toyomitsu Hirai. **Top Lots, p2-3**

By the Numbers...

Working with a smaller catalogue this year, Fasig-Tipton improved the RNA percentage to 29 percent overall for the sale, compared to 39 percent last year. The cumulative average was down slightly from \$97,815 to \$93,076, while the cumulative median also dipped from \$70,000 to \$67,000. "There's one reason the average and the median were down, said Walt Robertson, president of Fasig-Tipton. "This market was just as good as last year. The difference in the not-solds dropped the average down. We found the buyer for \$50,000 this year more often than we were able to last year. Therefore, the \$50,000-\$60,000 horses were reported as sold this year and those did not last year, and so that did not have a negative impact on the average." **Full Sale Statistics, p2**

Weathering the Storm...

Fasig-Tipton officials were satisfied with the results of the sale, especially in light of the effects of Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome. The sale, which had traditionally followed Keeneland's boutique July Sale, became the first yearling auction to take place this year. "This was the one sale that we've known for 18 months is our MRLS sale," said Boyd Browning, Executive VP and Chief Operating Officer for the sales company. "We had a dramatic segment of our population, our quota to draw from, gone. Gone were the strong early foals. That's how we were dramatically affected by MRLS. If you would have told me on Derby Day last year that these were the results you were going to have in 2003, I can't speak for anyone else, but I would say absolutely, positively yes. I think we survived MRLS." Those sentiments were echoed by Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "MRLS did not help us," he stated. "The pool shrank. The early ones are the big ones. That segment of the market was cut pretty deep. Nonetheless, what we ended up with was a very vibrant sale."

CORRECTION: The data contained in our Fasig-Tipton July recap box on the front page of today's edition was incorrect. Specifically, buy-backs were not 43%, as we reported, but 30% (66 RNAs from 218 offered). Last year's buy-back rate was not 69%, but 41% (115 RNAs from 281 offered). We regret the error. Thunder Rumbles...

Ashford's Thunder Gulch had two of the top five highest-priced colts yesterday, including the \$400,000 [hip 302](#), who topped all colts at Thursday's session. Agent Mark Reid, who has made a name for himself by acquiring GISWs Medaglia d'Oro, Spoken Fur and You for trainer Bobby Frankel's owners, signed the ticket for the colt on behalf of an unnamed client. "This is a client

who would prefer to remain nameless," said Reid. "He's not a new guy—he has horses now. First thing this person sent me with the assignment to find a horse that will get the Derby distance. I love Thunder Gulch. I like the fact that one dam down you see Spain; she was by Thunder Gulch and she is as genuine as they come." The colt was produced by the Kissin Kris mare Satin and Lace, a half sister to the dam of leading distaff earner Spain (Thunder Gulch). "This was a typey, athletic horse," Reid added. "I just liked him and I thought he was very well priced. I had him between \$350,000 and \$400,000. He's a nice colt. The horse will stay here and then go to Florida to be broken this winter and I'm not certain yet who will be the trainer." Reid has recently gotten into the bloodstock business after training horses for 25 years and feels that this is a good time for him to "expand his field of play" as his association and success with picking out horses for Bobby Frankel continues. "People always go with what they see and read and that has certainly had a positive effect on our business," he said. The bay colt was consigned by Gainesway as agent. "He's a super colt and he's done everything right," said Gainesway's Michael Hernon. "He's a 3/4 brother in blood to Spain, he's got good strong color, a beautiful head and I had confidence in him all along. Mark [Reid] is a very good judge of horses. The cream rises to the top. This colt was accepted to the Saratoga Sale and the Keeneland September Sale, but we thought he could do very well here. We were very pleased with the price." Hernon bought the colt's dam, Satin and Lace, for \$80,000 at Keeneland last November carrying a foal by Gilded Time. The mare is now in foal to Officer, who entered stud this spring at Gainesway. "She's the kind of mare that we wanted to get Officer off to a good start," Hernon commented.

This colt from the penultimate crop of Triple Crown winner and leading sire Seattle Slew was the second-highest priced colt at \$350,000 during Thursday's session. "We've had very good luck over the years with the Slews," said Maurice Miller, III, who purchased the Canadian-bred bay. "He's a very good horse and we will aim him for the two-year-old sales next year. He's a little more forward than a lot of Seattle Slews and we think he'll be well suited to the two-year-old market. Also, there aren't many of these left, so we were happy to get him." The colt had been purchased as a weanling for \$100,000 last November by Ed Turlington and his son Stuart. "We loved the individual from the time we bought him," said Turlington. "He's a very intelligent individual. Very easy to handle. He's got a lot of class about him." The colt's pedigree was a key factor for Turlington. "[Being by] Seattle Slew is what made this sale," he said. "I hope they do well with the colt. I hope Maurice [Miller III] doubles his money with him or better. I think they'll really do well with him. There's a lot of upside left in him."

This filly was a late scratch from Thursday's session. "She spiked a little bit of a fever [this] morning and she was a little bit dull today, so we thought it was best that we take her out," said Gainesway's Michael Hernon. "There will be another day for her. She's a lovely filly and she has a lot of residual value and a great family." Hernon indicated that plans for the filly are up in the air at the moment.

This full sister to GISW Trust N Luck sold for \$240,000 to California-based owner B. Wayne Hughes. "Well, obviously the pedigree was what attracted us to her," said Seth Semkin, bloodstock adviser to Hughes. "She's a little bit immature at this point. We're hoping that she develops physically; we're sort of taking a gamble that she does. We also liked her conformation. She's got some growing to do and because of that, we thought that the price was very fair for her. Mr. Hughes likes to buy pedigrees with his fillies and if she turns out to be a runner, then you've got something. As it is, her residual value is already established and not only in her first dam, but also in her second." The filly will be sent either to South Carolina or to Florida to be broken and a training decision will be made thereafter.

What They're Saying At The Sales...

MAURICE MILLER, buyer

"I think that it's been a fair market. [Fasig-Tipton Director of Yearling Sales] Bill Graves did an outstanding job of rounding up nice horses for the sale. I think that the market has been very solid for my needs."

NIALL BRENNAN, buyer

"I think it's been a very strong sale. There were a lot of good individuals. It is obvious that people here really did their homework. The horses that had pedigree and vetted out well, those ones that don't fall through the cracks. The average horses were always going to be in trouble. We feel like we had to pay a little more this year for basically the same horses we bought last year because the buyers were ready. Considering the pedigrees, I thought the horses sold well."

JOHN FULTON, bloodstock agent

"The good individuals are selling well. Fasig-Tipton has done a good job of filling the catalogue with nice horses. They're cutting out a nice little niche for themselves here. I think the atmosphere is good here and the bidding is competitive. I've bid on a couple of lovely individuals today that brought more money than their pedigrees said they should. I think it's been a good sale."

FRANK TAYLOR, Taylor Made Sales Agency

"It's been a little bit tough, but we've gotten a lot of these horses sold after the sale and I think it's been stronger today than it was the first day. I think it's going to end up being OK. We've had a better sale [Thursday] than [Wednesday]. We were close to 50 percent yesterday in RNAs, but we turned around and got a bunch sold. Today we've got about 80 or 90 percent that we'll get sold today. This is a good sale and there are some nice sales here, being this is the first time that this sale has kicked off the sales year, I think people are maybe sitting back and being a little more cautious."

MARK REID, Mark Reid Bloodstock Agency

"I've been coming here for three or four years and this looks to me to be a pretty representative group. It's always tough to buy. There are a lot of people here. It's always tough to get exactly what you're looking for. But overall I don't think it's anything out of the ordinary."

WALT ROBERTSON, Fasig-Tipton President

"My goal is to always beat last year. To me as an auctioneer, this thing felt a hell of a lot better than it did in the past. I felt like I was getting more horses sold and I thought I was getting them sold for more money, even though, as it turns out, I wasn't. The top of the market was terrific, we all saw that. The pinhookers changed that not-sold figure quite a bit. But if you think it's completely pinhookers, just look at the sheets. The sheets say that we have a broad base."

BOYD BROWING, Executive VP and COO, commenting on the recruiting of buyers to the sale

"What you're seeing some evidence of is that greater selectivity among the top end-users than ever before. Satish Sanan said, 'Last year, my group looked at every horse in the sale. This year, we came with 60 pages in mind. We've changed our buying philosophy. We're trying to buy horses with a great emphasis on colts and any fillies are going to have to have residual value to go to the broodmare band.' We've never sold horses to [John] Ferguson or the Godolphin group. Their philosophy is a lot the same. They are looking to buy colts with stallion pedigrees or collectable broodmares. You'd love to say that that's the bread and butter of this sale, but it just isn't."

If, at the start of the year, we were to have predicted that the GII Swaps S. would be won by a Bob Baffert-trained son of Cherokee Run, no one would have been surprised. After all, one the stars of the Baffert stable was the Cherokee Run colt Kafwain, winner at two of the GII Norfolk S. and GIII Best Pal S. and runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, which is run over the nine-furlong Swaps trip. However, if we had added the information that Kafwain would be retired by the time the Swaps came around, we might have caused some headed scratching. As it turns out though, Kafwain was not the only talented Cherokee Run in Baffert's barn.

While Kafwain was making headlines at two, another Cherokee Run colt in Baffert's care, During, remained unraced. In fact, During didn't win his first race until the first of February this year, taking a 6 1/2-furlong Santa Anita maiden on his second start. Runner-up in an 8 1/2-furlong allowance next time out, During claimed a second win in an optional claimer at Santa Anita in March. From then on, it was on the road and into stakes company. Off the board in Aqueduct's GIII Bay Shore S., During showed improved form with a second in the Sir Barton S. at Pimlico and a third in the Northern Dancer S. at Churchill Downs. This form still left him looking a little overmatch against a Swaps field which included the GI Belmont S. runner-up Ten Most Wanted, the GIII Affirmed S. winner Eye of the Tiger and SW and MGSP Outta Here. Sent off at 8-1, During set slow fractions, and looked beaten when tackled by Ten Most Wanted and Eye of the Tiger in midstretch. However, During fought back with considerable resolution, and at the wire he had a head to spare over Ten Most Wanted, with Eye of the Tiger and Outta Here deadheating for third.

A \$350,000 Keeneland September yearling, During was the most expensive of his sire's offspring sold at that age in 2001. The majority of that price must be attributed to his looks, rather than his family, as the female line has been a pretty quiet one in recent years. His dam Blading Saddle was twice stakes placed and did earn \$130,782, but she is the only stakes horse under During's second dam, the Tentam mare Marlodge. Blading Saddle had produced seven foals prior to During, of which three had won, and only one, the GSP Oakhurst (Dynaformer), had shown more than average ability. The family becomes rather more respectable under During's third dam Silver Betsy. This daughter of Nearctic won seven times and produced the GIII Gallorette S. heroine La Reine Elaine (dam of last year's NTRA Great State Challenge Invitational Turf S. winner, La Reine's Terms) and the Toddler S. victress La Reine Rouge (dam of SW and GISP Lucky Lavender Girl and GSW Green Alligator).

During and Kafwain are two of the five stakes winners to appear from the fourth crop sired by Cherokee Run, the others including this year's GII Arkansas Derby hero Sir Cherokee. The champion sprinter of 1994, Cherokee Run has been a force to be reckoned with since his first runners reached the track. His first crop produced four stakes winners, headed by champion two-year-old filly Chilukki, and in his second crop came another Grade I-winning juvenile, Yonaguska. Cherokee Run's current two-year-old crop is out the first mares to visit him after Chilukki's championship season, so we can expect more good things.

Cherokee Run is a son of champion Canadian three-year-old and GI Travers S. winner Runaway Groom, and a grandson of Blushing Groom. When it comes to how his pedigree works, though, he seems to be more his own man than just a Blushing Groom-line sire as he has sired stakes winners out of mares from a number of sire lines which have not typically been outstanding with Blushing Groom-line stallions in general. For example, Chilukki and Kafwain represent two of the only three Northern Hemisphere graded stakes winners bred on a Blushing Groom/Damascus cross. Similarly, During is a product of the Blushing Groom/Bold Ruler cross, and this has also had a strike rate which is well below opportunity, especially when one takes Seattle Slew-line mares out of the equation.

In During's case, the Bold Ruler strain comes into the pedigree through During's broodmare sire, the modestly performed Blade (Bold Ruler) and Round Table's full sister Monarchy. Overall, Bold Ruler comes into four of Cherokee Run's first 14 stakes winners (29 percent) and three of eight graded stakes winners (37 percent), which might be significant when one considers that nicking information would have discouraged bringing in Bold Ruler.

If Cherokee Run does have any affinity for the Bold Ruler strain, it is probably due to the presence of Tom Fool in his pedigree. The Horse of the Year for 1953, Tom Fool almost certainly has a major role in the success of Cherokee Run as both a racehorse and a stallion. Tom Fool was by Menow out of a Bull Dog mare, and that is the same cross which produced Spring Run, the dam of Blushing Groom's sire, Red God. Cherokee Run has Spring Run/Tom Fool 4x5 in his own pedigree, and Tom Fool reappears in the dams of eight of his stakes winners (57 percent) and five of his graded stakes winners (63 percent). Tom Fool and Bold Ruler are linked by some common strains in their background, as both are male line descendents of stallions bred on the Phalaris/Chaucer cross (the 3/4-related Pharamond II and Pharos), and Tom Fool's third dam Laughing Queen is a sister to champion two-year-old Pompey, sire of the second dam of Bold Ruler. Tom Fool and Bold Ruler didn't work well together close up in pedigrees (witness the tremendously disappointing cross of Tom Fool's son Buckpasser with Bold Ruler mares), because the combination generated a lot of unsoundness, probably generated from Pompey. Further back in pedigrees, however, multiple combinations of the pair have been working well, and During has not only Bold Ruler, but also a double of Tom Fool.

Uncertainty Continues in New Jersey:

The New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, which runs Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands, has informed the Thoroughbred horsemen that, while the purses at Monmouth are guaranteed to be \$300,000 a day through Labor Day, there will only be enough money left in the NJSEA purse account after Labor Day to support daily purse distribution of a dismal \$145,000. While the NJSEA would like horsemen to agree to a reduction in the number of fall racing dates at the Jersey tracks, members of the New Jersey Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association who met at Monmouth Wednesday disagree with that solution. On the current racing calendar, Monmouth will continue racing five days a week until Sept. 28. The Meadowlands meet is set to run Tuesday through Saturday, Oct. 1-Nov. 8. That schedule reflects a cut that horsemen agreed to earlier this year, reducing the number of dates in 2003 from 141 to 120. "We did it their way and now, in the middle of the meet, they are telling us that purses are going to be a disaster this fall," Dennis Drazin, the NJTHA's legal council, said. "They want us to give up days in order to get the purses up." According to Drazin, the NJSEA could save money by moving the Meadowlands meet to Monmouth, making it possible to take as much as \$800,000 from stakes purses and use it to bolster the purses for allowance, claiming and maiden races. Although NJSEA officials did not attend the meeting, Vice President Bob Kulina commented earlier Wednesday, "Our position has always been the same--we feel it's very important to stress quality racing and, obviously, in order to have quality racing, you have to have the purse dollars. We'd rather run less days and maintain the purse structure than run the allotted days for a lot less money."
